Hearing

The Brick Township Board of Education met on Tuesday, June 13, 1978 in the Board of Education Office, Brick Township High School at 7:30 p.m. to conduct a hearing to study the matter of juvenile K.S., and to pass on the merits of same with formal action as may be required.

Present were: Mrs. Riley, Mr. Bertrand, Mrs. Frake and Mrs. Riley.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Sunshine
Law

Mrs. Riley, Vice President, announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Observer Courier-Sun, and Municipal Clerk on June 8, 1978.

Mrs. Riley announced that the purpose of this meeting was to hear student personnel matters, and also read a resolution authorizing the Board of Education, under the Sunshine Law to go into executive session. The following resolution moved by Mrs. Frake, seconded by Mrs. Fox was carried unanimously:

Executive
Session

WHEREAS, C. 231, P.L. 1975, also known as the Sunshine Law, authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

WHEREAS, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive session or private session;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Brick:

1. That it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session on this date to discuss matter involving student K.S.
2. That the matter discussed will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

This hearing was conducted by Mr. Anton, Counsel for the Brick Township Board of Education. The hearing was concluded at 8:30 p.m. at which time they deliberated the facts presented at the hearing. At 8:33 p.m., motion was made by Mrs. Frake, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously that they return to public meeting.

After some deliberation, the Board decided that no decision would be made regarding K.S. until a final report has been received

from the Child Study Team. In this regard, Mrs. Frake, seconded by Mrs. Frake with unanimous approval so moved.

At 9:45 p.m., motion was made by Mr. Bertrand, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously that the Board of Education adjourn this meeting.
