Motion was made by Mrs. Frake, seconded by Mr. Bertrand and carried unanimously that the Board of Education approve the resolution prepared by the Board Attorney urging the passage of the proposed bill with regard to use of "non-public" places as polling places for school elections. Resolution is as follows:

Whereas, the Brick Township Board of Education, a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, with offices at 101 Hendrickson Avenue, in the Township of Brick, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, is mandated pursuant to N.J.S. 18A:14-4 to designate polling places for school elections in schoolhouses or other convenient public places within the district; and

Whereas, the Brick Township Board of Education has recognized the need for polling places in non public places to expand voter participation in the school elections, more specifically, to increase accessibility to the polls among the elderly; and

Whereas, Assemblyman John Paul Doyle introduced on June 9, 1980, Assembly Bill # 1749 amending N.J.S. 18A:14-4 to permit the establishment of polling places in non public places; and

Whereas, the Brick Township Board of Education most strongly supports said Bill as being in the best interests of the community; and

Whereas, the Legislature of this State has recognized in the past the need for polling places in general elections to be in other locations besides schoolhouses and public buildings by the enactment of N.J.S. 19:8-3 which permits the establishment of polling places in non public places for the convenience of the elderly; and

Whereas, the above set forth statutory provision does not apply to school elections; and

Whereas, the Brick Township Board of Education feels the Legislature should give equal importance to school elections as they have to general elections.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brick Township Board of Education most strongly urges that the Legislature make every effort to give this matter its immediate attention because of the present law's adverse impact on voter participation in school elections.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Secretary of the Brick Township Board of Education to the Legislative representatives of the Legislative District and to the Honorable Brendan T. Byrne, Governor of the State of New Jersey.

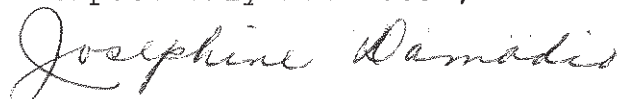

The Brick Township Board of Education held a Special Public Meeting on Tuesday, September 23, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. in the Administration Building for the purpose of discussing and/or acting upon school building facilities' reports and school building needs, and any other matters to be presented to the Board of Education.

Present were: Mrs. Fox, Mr. Bell, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Frake, and Mr. Hancock.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Wolf (9:25), Mr. Anton, and Mr. Sendzik.

Mrs. Fox announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News on September 18, 1980.

Mrs. Fox read the agenda items proposed for discussion at this meeting.

It was agreed that the appointment of an architect for the proposed building program should take precedence at this time. The appointment of Mr. Gatarz was recommended and after discussion a consensus vote was in approval of his employment except for Mr. Hancock who stated he preferred a local architect be interviewed before decision was made.

It was further discussed and agreed that a motion should be made for board approval for the appointment of an architect at this time. Motion was then made by Mr. Hancock, seconded by Mr. Bell and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education employ and retain Mr. Don Gatarz, Architect subject to negotiation of mutually agreeable contract between the Board of Education and the subject architect for the contemplated building program.

Gatarz

The Task Force recommendations in their report were referred to in an approach to coming to some decision as to what will be submitted to the voters for approval. Each board member gave their views, and after considerable discussion and considerations it was agreed that they will consider a 600 pupil school on the McCormick tract and possibly an addition of a Cafeteria to the Veterans Middle School. Mr. Stutts was authorized to have Mr. Gatarz look into the possible cafeteria addition to Veterans Middle. Mr. Gatarz will be requested to meet with the Board to discuss the proposed 600 pupil school and possible addition.. Mr. Bell suggested that if the plans for Veterans Middle are available, they should be given to Mr. Gatarz for review to assist in his determination regard addition of a cafeteria to that school.

Motion was made by Mr. Hancock, seconded by Mr. Bell and carried unanimously that Mr. Stutts be authorized to have Mr. Gatarz look into the possible addition to Veterans Memorial, and the 600 student school to be constructed on the North side of Brick.

Mr. Stutts was directed to get costs for having a projected demography study for Brick in order to update the Master Plan.

Motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Donofrio and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve construction for a 600 pupil elementary school to be erected on the McCormick tract which referendum will be held December 2, 1980, and that a formal resolution is to be prepared by the Business Administrator to be submitted to the Board pursuant to and in accordance with Statute N.J.S.A. 18A:22-39.

The letter from our County Superintendent with regard to substandard teaching stations was referred to, and discussed as to how these classroom deficiencies can be corrected. Mr. Bell recommended that Mr. Gatarz be asked to prepare a cost projection for necessary changeovers on referred to classrooms. He would have to review the report and make recommendations as to what must be done to bring these areas up to standard to comply with state requirement.

Suggestion was made that our maintenance staff should go over this list to ascertain which items they can do to alleviate some of the existing conditions. After lengthy discussion, it was agreed that this report be turned over to the Building and Grounds Committee, that they should meet with Mr. Gatarz, and make recommendations to the Board of Education on possible corrections at their earliest convenience.

Discussion of designating Greenbriar Clubhouse as a polling place for December 2, 1980 Special Election was held. It was agreed that the Greenbriar Association should prepare a resolution stating that their Clubhouse will be open to the public on December 2, 1980 for voting purposes. Our insurance company will be requested to include Greenbriar under our insurance for that one day. It was agreed that Greenbriar Clubhouse be added to our list of voting places for district 23 for December 2, 1980.

Mr. Stutts discussed his efforts to secure time for the Hockey Team at the Ocean Ice Palace for both Brick Township High School and Brick Township Memorial High School. By a concensus vote, the board agreed unanimously that he could go ahead and secure Ice Time and that the item would be formally approved at our October 8, 1980 meeting.

At 9:50 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Hancock, seconded by Mr. Bell and agreed to unanimously that the Board of Education adjourn this meeting.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, Mr. Pagano, and Mr. Sendzik.

Mrs. Fox announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News on September 25, 1980.

Mrs. Fox referred to correspondence received by the Board during the month and questioned if board members had any questions on any of the letters. Mr. Stutts answered Mr. Bell's questions on two items.

WHEREAS, C. 231 P.L. 1975 also known as the Sunshine Law authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

WHEREAS, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive or private

session;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BRICK TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session on this date, August 13, 1980 to discuss matters involving personnel, and (2) that the matters discussed will be made public if and when confidentially is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

The items under Teaching Personnel were presented by Dr. Aragona and explanations and details given where requested. Mr. Hancock again asked for information on salary for Classroom Aides.

Non-Teaching Personnel items were presented by Mr. Stutts and explanations and details given where requested. By an unanimous consensus vote proposed by Mr. Hancock and seconded by Mr. Bell it was agreed that the item on Mr. Messemmer be held until the Board has the time to discuss same.

Mrs. Burgess is to be invited to attend our October 14th Work Session.

Mr. Stutts discussed the overpayment to CETA Security Guard and salary that they are now getting. It was agreed that the deductions being made for overpayment shall be held pending Mr. Hancock contacting Mr. Kemper and discussing this item with him.

A Civil Service desk audit request was presented by Mr. Stutts and Board Members agreed that he is authorized to contact Civil Service and request an desk audit for secretarial-clerical employees and the Maintenance and Grounds personnel.

At 8:37 p.m. motion was made by Mr. Hancock, seconded by Mr. Bell and agreed to by all that the Board of Education conduct an Emergency Special Meeting at this time. A waiver of notice was signed by the attending six board members.

The reasons stated for this Emergency Meeting are to discuss items of such urgency and importance that delay in order to provide adequate notice would result in substantial harm to the public interest and it was stated that the teachers' organization met last Thursday night and broke off negotiations, and this morning there is an article in the newspaper that indicated possible strike action, and tonight, at this very time, while we are meeting, the teachers are meeting to the best of the board's knowledge to consider possible strike action, and that this meeting will be limited to discussion of these matters.

After the board members agreed that the purpose of this Emergency Meeting was for the reasons set forth in the foregoing paragraph, Mrs. Fox again read the motion to go into executive session as proposed by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Donofrio and agreed to unanimously. The reason for the need for executive session at this Emergency Meeting was stated as for discussing matters relative to pending and anticipated litigation on contract negotiations.

It was noted that notice would be sent out from the Board Secretary tomorrow morning advising of this Emergency Meeting.

Mr. Pagano was present and brought the board members up to date on contract negotiations and the point at which the teachers had walked out on completion of contract agreements.

Dr. Aragona gave the board factual information as to the directions that would be followed if strike action was taken by the Professional staff. Mr. Anton would be directed to go to the courts for an injunction. It was agreed by the board members that Dr. Aragona should answer media, etc. questions with Mr. Wolf also designated as a spokesperson.

Mrs. Frake made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hancock, and carried unanimously by roll call vote to approve the following resolution read by Mr. Anton:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick and the Brick Township Education Association, Inc. entered into an Agreement on the 15th day of June, 1977, and

WHEREAS, said Agreement became effective as of July 1, 1977 and remained in effect until June 30, 1979, and

WHEREAS, said Agreement was extended with certain agreed to modifications for a period of one year, and

WHEREAS, the parties have entered into extensive negotiations for a new Agreement pursuant to and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 34:13A-1 et seq, and

WHEREAS, said negotiations have gone to impasse and mediation, and

WHEREAS, as a result of said mediation said negotiations have continued but have subsequently once again failed, and

WHEREAS, as a result of said failure the Board of Education recognizes the possibility that there may be a strike or other job actions which are constitutionally prohibited, and

WHEREAS, any job action, including a strike or any other act that withholds employees' services from the Board would prevent them from carrying out its obligations as aforesaid under Title 18A of the New Jersey statutes pursuant to and in accordance with Article VIII, Section IV of the New Jersey Constitution, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick, having its principal place of business at 101 Hendrickson Avenue, in the Township of Brick, County of Ocean and State of New Jersey recognizes its obligation under New Jersey State Law, Title 18A and pursuant to and in accordance with Article VIII, Section IV of the New Jersey Constitution to educate the children of the community, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said statutory obligation, the Board of Education is desirous to make every effort to keep schools open,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorizes the filing of a Complaint, together with an Order to Show Cause for Temporary Restraints and any supplemental proceedings for relief pursuant to the rules governing Courts of the State of New Jersey, namely, Rule 1:10-5 and any and all other

legal actions as may be necessary to insure the orderly, proper and necessary education of the student body in accordance with law as aforesaid against the Brick Township Education Association, Inc. and any and all of its agents and officers and any and all of its members and teachers of the school district to prevent any aforesaid strike or similar job action from having a deleterious effect on the aforesaid educational system, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent or his designee to take such immediate emergency steps as he deems necessary to insure the safety and well-being of the students and employees, to protect the property of the district, and to continue to operate the schools in an orderly manner. Said authority shall extend to those manners not contrary to law that the Superintendent feels, in his best judgment as an educator, are necessary to carry out the wishes of the Board. Said authority shall include the authorization to take any additional or appropriate legal action to deal with any strike or job action.

There being no further business, motion was made by Mrs. Frake, seconded by Mr. Hancock and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting at 9:45 p.m.
