Mrs. Fox announced the necessity of going into a ten minute executive session. Mr. Schue made a motion to approve the following resolution read by Mrs. Fox. Mrs. Frake seconded it and it was unanimously approved.

WHEREAS, C. 231, P.L. 1975, also known as the Sunshine Law, authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

WHEREAS, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive or private session:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BRICK TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT: (1) that it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session on this date, June 12, 1980 to discuss matters involving anticipated litigation. (2) that the matter discussed will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

At said executive session, Mr. Anton noted to the board members that Mr. Carney's attorney had indicated that a meeting should not be held this evening and that a law suit has been instituted against Mr. Bertrand and Mr. Williams. He further stated that this meeting is being held to gather information and that our experts should respond where necessary.

He cautioned the board members to have restraint in making comments, and that they should not become involved in debates. He further advised that our experts should be directed to report back to us in the near future. He directed that the audience be advised that there is a board office tape machine taping this meeting, and that said tapes would be considered the only official record of this meeting; that it should be announced that the purpose of this meeting tonight is to listen, gathering information and that our experts will advise of their determinations.

Mr. Williams stated that he had brought slides for the board members and audience to view.

Mrs. Fox asked Mr. Vaughn to introduce the construction representatives he had in his group. The following were present: Mr. Helmuth Reich of Vaughn Organization, Mr. John Karl and Mr. Daniel Stone of the firm of DiStasio and Van Buren, and Mr. Lieberman, Clerk of the Works employed by the Brick Township Board of Education.

Mr. Williams began showing slides at 8:25 p.m. and completed same 9:32 p.m. during which time he made comments on most of the slides shown.

Discussion of the slides followed with comments made by Mr. Ronald Vaughn, Mr. Birdsall, Mr. Reich, Mr. Karl, Mr. Stone and Mr. Lieberman and all board members. Mr. Vaughn requested a duplicate of the slides be sent to him in order that his group could review them and sent the Board of Education a written report on same within 30 days. Mr. Williams was asked if he agreed to this and he replied that he would check with his attorney and advise. Mr. Bell qualified the 30 day time schedule for receiving Mr. Vaughn's report to add after receipt of slides from Mr. Williams.

Mr. Crammer, Architect, present with the Congress of Concerned Citizens stated that the structural engineering firm of DeStasio and Van Burean was one of the best firms he was ever associated with, and he deemed Vaughn Organization an excellent architectural firm.

At 10:40 p.m. Mr. Bertrand made a motion to adjourn. This meeting was seconded by Mr. Schue and carried unanimously.
