1. A special election of the legal voters of this School District shall be held on February 5, 1980, at 4:00 o'clock P.M. in the School District at the places and for the purposes herein-after provided.

2. The Secretary is hereby directed to post at least ten days before the date of the special election a copy of the notice calling the same on each schoolhouse in the School District and at each of the following public places in the School District, namely:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the legal voters of the School District of the Township of Brick, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, that a special election of the legal voters of the District will be held on Tuesday, the fifth day of February, 1980, at 4:00 o'clock P.M.

The polls will remain open until 9:00 o'clock P.M. and as much longer as may be necessary to permit all the legal voters then present to vote and to cast their ballots. This Board of Education hereby acknowledges and confirms that, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:24-16 and 18A:24-17, a supplemental debt statement has been prepared as of the date of this resolution by the chief financial officer of the Township of Brick, being every municipality comprised within the School District, giving effect to the proposed authorization of bonds of the School District in the amount stated in the proposal set forth in the notice and that the supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Clerk of the Township of Brick and in the office of the Secretary of this Board of Education prior to the adoption of this resolution. This Board of Education hereby directs the Secretary of the Board of Education to have the supplemental debt statement filed in the offices of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs prior to the date of the special election authorized herein.

6. It is hereby found and determined that the School District is unable without the benefits of Chapter 74 of the Laws of New Jersey (N.J.S.A. 18:58-32.22) to provide suitable general purpose education facilities for the residents of the Township of Brick.

7. The Secretary of the Board is hereby directed to submit a certified copy of this resolution to the State Department of Education for endorsement in accordance with the provisions of the Additional State School Building Aid Act constituting Chapter 74

of the laws of 1978 of New Jersey (N.J.S.A. 18A:58-32. 22, et seq.)

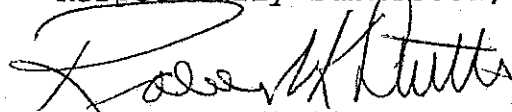
