

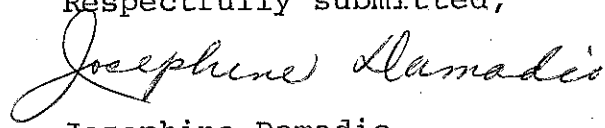

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mrs. Fox, and Mrs. Frake.

Also present: Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, and Mr. Sendzik. (Mr. Pagano for BTEA Negotiations)

President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted, as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, and Municipal Clerk on February 14, 1980.

Motion was made by Mrs. Riley, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education petition the Commissioner of Education of the State of New Jersey to certify in writing the necessity; grant permission for and direct that a Special School Election be held within the time period proscribed by N.J.S.A. 18A:14-3.

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mrs. Fox, and Mrs. Frake.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Sunshine Law

President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer and Municipal Clerk on February 28, 1980.

The withholding of monies due Thomas Carney was discussed by Mr. Stutts and he was given direction by Mr. Anton on the action to take with regard to payments to be made.

The agenda discussion began with the items listed under Non-Professional Personnel by Mr. Stutts. The questions from board members were answered in detail by Mr. Stutts.

The need for the preparation of a resolution for the proposed new elementary school was discussed. It is anticipated that Mr. Gatarz will have something formulated by this coming Thursday which will change the size of the school and location from the last two referendums.

It was also brought to the board's attention that there is a meeting in Trenton on Thursday, with Mr. DeMarco, Bureau of Controversaries and Disputs, State Department of Education with regard to our petition for permission to have a third election with the six month period. At this time, if approvals are given in time, it is anticipated that we will have a Special Election on Tuesday, April 29, 1980 from 2:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The size of the new school to be included in the new proposal was discussed at length as far as what it will actually accomplish in alleviating our crowded schools.

Mrs. Riley proposed consideration of changing the location of the Polling Place for Greenbriar residents because of the problems they have in getting to the polling place. The Attorney was asked for his opinion as far as using a private clubhouse for a polling place. He quoted the law as saying "a public place".

There was further consideration given to using Veterans Memorial Elementary for Districts 1, 3, and 24, and having District 23 (Greenbriar residents mainly) vote at Lanes Mill to help ease that overcrowding.

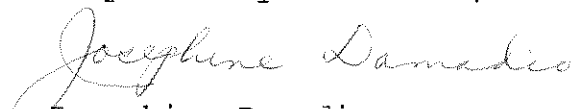

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on February 19, 1980, the Board of Education of the Township of Brick authorized the filing of a Petition with the Commissioner of Education of the State of New Jersey petitioning the Commissioner pursuant to and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:14-3 to certify in writing the necessity; and grant permission for and direct that a special school election be held on a date between April 14, 1980, and May 13, 1980, even though same would be within the six month period prescribed by N.J.S.A. 18A:14-3; and

WHEREAS, the officials of the aforesaid school district met with a representative of the Commissioner of Education in Trenton, New Jersey on Thursday, March 6, 1980 to review and discuss the necessity for and the particulars of the proposed third special election; and

WHEREAS, by letter of March 10, 1980, attached hereto and made a part hereof as though more fully set forth at length herein, Commissioner Fred G. Burke granted conditional approval to this Board to seek approval of the voters of Brick Township at said third special school election to expend monies for a new elementary school building referendum. Said approval being subject to compliance to those conditions agreed upon at the aforesaid March 6, 1980 meeting as attached hereto and made a part hereof as though more fully set forth at length herein; and

WHEREAS, the proposed elementary school to be submitted to the voters of the district at the aforementioned third special election would be for the construction of a new K to 6 elementary school as originally proposed, however, this school house will house 600 pupils as opposed to 1050 but will be for the same purpose as originally proposed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:14-3 in that it will serve to eliminate split sessions in the district and will reduce the number of substandard classrooms although not entirely eliminating same as originally proposed thereby serving the same purpose but to a more limited degree.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Brick that a third special election be held on Tuesday, April 29, 1980, for the construction of a new elementary school as aforesaid.

Funding

Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mrs. Riley, and carried unanimously by roll call vote, that the Board of Education accept Adult Vocational Education funding under the provisions of Title 18A:54-9 or 18A:54-32 in the amount of \$7,500.00.

Curriculum Changes

Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mrs. Riley, and carried unanimously by roll call vote, that the Board of Education approve the Program of Studies and Curriculum changes for Brick Township High School and Brick Township Memorial High School for the school year 1980-81.
