

B. After compiling a schedule of all sporting event, both intramural and intercholastic, as well as all exhibitions and practice sessions, the principal shall transmit same to the first aid squad providing service in the area in which his school is located. Likewise, any changes in said schedule shall be forwarded to said first aid squad as soon as practicable. The principal shall inform all coaches of the appropriate telephone number or numbers to be utilized in reaching the first aid squad servicing the area in which the school is located.

C. The principal shall insure that non-pay telephones and/or radio devices will be placed in close proximity to all sports and athletic event sites in order to permit emergency communication.

D. It shall also be the duty of the principal to assure himself that the school board or boards in charge of the school district or districts of any away from home events have complied with State mandates and enacted both a policy and regulations relative to emergency medical procedures for athletic events. The principal shall request copies of same which will be disseminated to the appropriate head coaches for their review so that they will be familiar with the emergency facilities and procedures to be used in an away from home event.

E. IDENTIFICATION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. The following emergency medical services shall be used in the event of a medical emergency:

FIRST: If a team physician is available at a sporting event, he should be immediately notified by the head coach or his designee and placed in charge of any emergency medical situation.

SECOND: Any other physician in attendance shall be requested to attend to the emergency and if he does so, shall be placed in charge of the emergency medical situation.

THIRD: If a team physician is unavailable, then the school nurse shall be immediately contacted by the head coach or his designee and placed in charge of the emergency medical situation.

FOURTH: The local first aid squad shall be notified by the head coach or his designee and requested to respond.

FIFTH: The above duties of notification of appropriate personnel shall be the responsibility of the head coach or his designee and in his absence, any assistant coaches who may be available, or their designee. It shall also be the responsibility of the student athlete to notify the head coach or assistant coach of any injury immediately upon its occurrence.

F. It shall also be the duty of every student athlete suffering any injury as a result of an athletic event to report to the school nurse to arrange for the completion of certain forms relative to such injury and its documentation.

G. All emergency medical services may be reached by means of the police emergency number (201) 477-8300. This will give access to first aid squads, fire departments and police departments. This number shall be distributed by the Superintendent or his designee to all principals who shall in turn distribute same to all coaching staff.

H. CHAIN OF AUTHORITY. There will be a chain of authority in regard to a medical emergency situation. The personnel identified in Paragraph "E" herein shall take charge of the situation in the priority listed therein.

I. IMMEDIATE CARE AND SERVICES.

FIRST: Immediate first aid treatment shall be rendered first by the team physician if available and/or any physician attending the event, if available, and/or the school nurse, if available, and/or the head coach or his assistants, if none of the above are present or available.

SECOND. In the event that the medical emergency requires movement and/or transportation of an injured pupil, same shall be performed by the first aid squad serving the area in which the school is located or upon the direction of a physician.

THIRD: The head coach or his designee shall be responsible for notifying the parents or guardians of the injured pupil as soon as practicable.

FOURTH: The head coach or his designee shall also be responsible for notifying the Director of Athletics as soon as practicable and the principal of each school shall provide all head coaches with the telephone numbers of the Director of Athletics.

FIFTH: District reports of a medical emergency shall be filed through the school nurse who shall be notified by the head coach as soon as is practicable. As noted elsewhere in these regulations, each student has his independent duty and responsibility to notify the school nurse in respect to any injury and must cooperate in the completion of any reports required.

J. SCOPE OF THE ABOVE REGULATIONS. These regulations shall only apply to medical emergency situations and /or matters of serious injury. In the event of minor injuries that do not rise to the level of medical emergencies or serious injuries, the appropriate care for each pupil will be left to the sound discretion of the head coach of each team or such other person in charge of the athletic event. The school nurse will, of course, be notified as soon as possible of any and all injuries including those beyond the scope of this policy. Each pupil shall have an independent duty to report injuries within or outside of the scope of this policy to the school nurse.

Dr. Aragona discussed the report received from Mr. Joseph F. Zach, Ocean County Superintendent of Schools, regarding the Analysis of Results for the 1984-85 Local District Planning Model. This is an analysis of the objectives to be established by school districts. The report includes a review of the action plans, the results and the implications of these results. The Brick Township School District received commendation in several areas.

Another item discussed was the authorization of the Superintendent of Schools to award salary credit for staff who completed the training programs in the essential elements of teaching. These are volunteer staff members who attend three extensive workshops and then come back to train teachers techniques for effective teaching. A total of six credits will be granted for this training.

Finance and Business was the next category presented. A short discussion followed whereby the Business Administrator would be authorized to contract with Princeton Testing Laboratory to conduct all inventories and provide for employee training to meet the requirements of the New Jersey Worker and Community Right-to-Know Act. This Act requires the disclosure and dissemination of information about hazardous substances in the workplace and environment. School districts must comply with this Law. The deadline for this compliance has been extended from June 30, 1985 to October 30, 1985.
