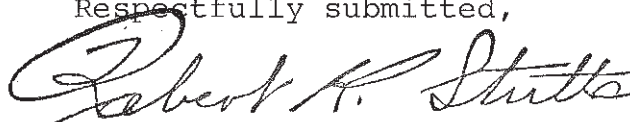
Present were: Mrs. Benton, Mr. Roblenski, Mrs. DeConde, Mr. Laura, Mr. Readell and Mr. Stites.

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

Under Curriculum & Instruction, Item (a) is a request for authorization to accept Vocational Education funds for the handicapped program.

C & I

Item (b) is a request for approval for the application and receipt of the ECIA Carry-Over funds from Fiscal Year 1985 to be used for salaries of staff members in the BSI Program.

Finance & Business was the next category presented. The amount to be approved for the payment of Vouchers was in order. The next request was for the adoption of the 1986-87 school budget. This represents a no-tax increase budget for the school year. Any changes to be made will be at the Public Hearing. Mr. Stutts noted that this is a tentative budget; if State Aid changes, budget amounts will also change.

One of the items, a request for approval of an Occupational Therapist, was discussed. Mr. Wolf requested if this could be approved this evening so that the Therapist would be able to finalize her leave at her place of employment. Dr. Aragona and the Board were in agreement. Motion was made by Mr. Readell, seconded by Mr. Roblenski, and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve the appointment of an Occupational Therapist, for eleven months at a salary of \$28,000.00 (pro rata \$13,363.60), effective January 27, 1986 to June 30, 1986:

Mr. Anton gave the Board background on property at the Laurelton School site which the State Department of Transportation is interested in purchasing, and he distributed maps to Board Members for their information. A negotiator from the State Department of Transportation has met with Mr. Anton, Dr. Aragona and Mrs. Benton and made an offer.

The Board was in agreement to have James Birdsall appraise this property. Mr. Birdsall was present, gave his qualifications and background, and his opinion on the offer made by the New Jersey State Department of Transportation.

After a lengthy discussion regarding this property, Mr. Anton requested authorization to meet with Dr. Aragona, Mrs. Benton, Mr. Laura, Mr. Birdsall and the negotiator from the New Jersey State Department of Transportation to inform her that the Attorney met with the Board, to raise the question as to whether the offer made by the State includes the replacing of curbing and sidewalks, and refuse the offer as being inadequate. It would then go into condemnation and another negotiator would be appointed.

It was also noted that the State has a Right of Preliminary Entry, N.J. Statute 2316. They may enter upon the property for the purpose of making studies, surveys, tests, etc. However, at the above noted meeting, the negotiator requested the Board to give them a Right of Entry Permit. A consensus of the Board was taken and it was agreed to refuse the Right of Entry. A consensus was also taken on Mr. Anton's request for authorization to meet with the above said people and the negotiator and all were in agreement.

At 8:52 p.m. open session was again resumed.

Motion was made by Mr. Roblenski, seconded by Mrs. DeConde, and unanimously carried by roll call vote that the Board of Education refuse the Right of Entry requested by the New Jersey State Department of Transportation.

Motion was made by Mrs. DeConde, seconded by Mr. Williamson, with all in favor to adjourn this meeting at 8:54 p.m.
