 when he served as Director of Pupil Personnel. Said sum
 totalling \$2,120.00.
2. Mr. Racanelli will be placed on Step 7 of the B.T.A.S.A. guide
 for the 1984-85 school year in a 12-month Supervisor of

of Guidance position. The base salary under those conditions would be \$39,200.00 plus \$1,500.00 Masters plus 30 plus \$1,020.00 longevity. Said placement would be retroactive from July 1, 1984. Effective July 1, 1984, Mr. Racanelli would be subject to all the terms and conditions of the B.T.A.S.A. contract including, but not limited to, sick days, vacation days and the like.

3. Payment of the above monies will be made within thirty days, the initial decision becomes final.

All of the above is subject to the approval by the Board of Education. Upon the Board's approval, the petition will be dismissed with prejudice.

Working under the B.T.A.S.A. contract, Mr. Racanelli's vacation days will be reduced from 24 to 10 in his first year as a 12-month Supervisor of Guidance.

Before placing the above on record, the attorney discussed same with the Superintendent of Schools and he recommended acceptance.

It should be further noted that placed on the record was the fact that the settlement was the same as that offered by the Board of Education on July 20, 1984 to the attorney for the petitioner, N.J.A.S.A. attorney, Carl John Kerbowski.

A consensus of the Board was taken regarding the above settlement and everyone was in agreement.

At 8:30 p.m. a motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Readell with all in favor to go back into open session.

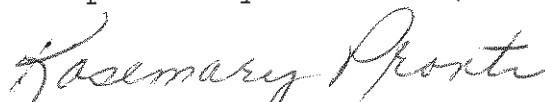

The Brick Township Board of Education held their Pre-Agenda Meeting on Thursday, February 7, 1985 at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building, 101 Hendrickson Avenue for the purpose of reviewing items presented to them for the February 14, 1985 Regular Meeting.

Present were: Mr. Roblenski, Mrs. Benton, Mrs. DeConde, Mr. Readell, Mr. Stites, Mr. Tremper and Mr. Williamson.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Mayer and Mr. Anton (7:30 p.m.).

SUNSHINE LAW

Mr. Stutts announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meeting Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted on February 4, 1985 as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News.

At this time Mr. Roblenski read a letter from Mrs. Oneta Noferi, a recently retired teacher after 21 years of service, thanking the Brick school system for many memorable years as an employee.

ASBESTOS REIMBURSE- MENT

Finance & Business was the first item presented for discussion. In addition to the items listed, the Board of Education is authorizing the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to file an application for reimbursement for asbestos removal July 1980 and July 1984 in the amount of \$166,459.00.

BUDGET L.R.M.S. BOILER SYSTEM

The Business Administrator presented a recommendation to the Board that at the Budget Hearing scheduled for March 7, 1985, \$150,000.00 be included in the Capital Outlay Budget for the replacement of the boiler system at Lake Riviera Middle School. This cost would also include meeting all the new code requirements which include a sprinkler system in the boiler room and all new doors to Capital A fire-rated doors. The affect of this addition to the budget will be approximately a 1¢ per \$100 assessed valuation reducing our 8.5¢ decrease by approximately 1¢ to a new figure of 7.5¢.

Personnel Teaching Items (a) through (k) were presented and accepted. A discussion followed for the employment of a teacher to serve at Brick Township Memorial High School in the Guided Alternate School Program (GASP). The Board consensus was in agreement.

Personnel Non-Teaching Items (a) through (v) were also presented and accepted. An additional item was added requesting a Medical Leave of Absence for a Civil Service employee for a three-month period without pay.

Policy #6145, Academic Requirements for Student Extracurricular Activities Eligibility, was presented again for first reading because of the adjustments and upgrading made in the policy that was previously recorded last month on first reading. This revision will not allow a student to continue in an activity if he/she fails more than one course. Also, to meet eligibility student would have to pass 30 credits from the prior year, totalling 120 credits at graduation, five more than the minimum required. Revised policy will follow.

POLICY
#6145

Policy #6201 for Inter-Generational Education Pilot Program was presented for first reading. This policy would allow adult citizens in the community of Brick Township to participate with students in selected courses. One of our Board members has been working on this pilot program for over two years and reports that in several areas where it is being applied, it is a successful program. The Board consensus was in favor of this policy.

#6201

Auxiliary Items were presented and agreed upon. After a discussion, the Board was in agreement to employ a professional planner for completing the mandated five-year long-range facility plan.

At 8:07 p.m., motion was made by Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Stites and unanimously carried to go into closed session. Mr. Stutts read the appropriate Resolution. Discussion was held regarding extension of a sick leave for a professional staff member. Consensus of the Board was not to grant the request.
