

A discussion followed on a request from a citizen to distribute flyers to students to be brought home to their parents indicating availability of the self-help group for parents under stress. This request has an endorsement from the Director of Volunteer Services of the Division of Youth and Family Services. It was the consensus of the Board that the Administrators refer this to the School Attorney for examination to see whether a disclaimer should be attached to the flyer before it is sent home to parents. A consensus vote was taken with the following results: Mr. Williamson-no, Mr. Stites-yes, Mr. Roblenski-yes, Mrs. DeConde-yes, Mr. Laura-yes, Mr. Readell-yes, and Mrs. Benton-yes.

Mr. Wolf explained the 1985-86 School Year Bus Schedule being submitted for approval. Last year one schedule was used (for instance Schedule A), this year another schedule is being used (for instance Schedule B), and next year we will revert back to Schedule A - a flip-flop type schedule. It is two different schedules and the schools affected by the flip-flop schedule are the elementary levels - K-6.

All other items under Auxiliary were discussed and agreed upon.

Important Dates were reviewed and agreed to. Dr. Aragona pointed out that the High School Graduations are being held on June 24 with the rain date being changed to June 26 rather than June 25. This will allow the Middle School Promotionals to be held on June 25 with no conflict.

He also noted that flyers are being sent to parents regarding Special Education Week, May 12 through 18, with the hope that parents will participate in the activities and meetings that are being offered during this week for these classified children.

At this time several questions were raised by the audience as to the Bus Schedule for the coming school year and snow days that were not used. These questions were answered by the Administration.

Before going into closed session, Mr. Williamson wanted to make the Board aware of his recent visits to seven schools in the district. The appearance of these schools was clean and neat, and the noise level was the hum you get when people are busy. He was very pleased with his visits.

At 8:55 p.m. Mr. Stutts read the appropriate Resolution to go into closed session. Motion was made by Mrs. DeConde, seconded by Mr. Williamson, and unanimously carried to approve this Resolution.

After the interviews were completed, the Committee was in favor of one negotiator in particular feeling that he was competent and because of his past experience. A consensus was taken in favor of employing this negotiator and all were in favor.
