Audience participation followed. An Art Teacher from Veterans Memorial Elementary School expressed her concern over the recent cancellation of the "Unicorn Carnival" which the children at Veterans Elementary had been preparing for during the school year. She asked that the Board reconsider the cancellation of this Carnival. Dr. Aragona will review this matter with the Assistant Superintendent, the Principal and the School Attorney and then get back to the Board and Teaching Staff.

Several elementary school teachers and parents expressed their concern and disappointment with the time schedule for the 1985-86 school sessions. Mr. Wolf explained that the Board of Education maintains four school runs and that this schedule is the best possible solution for all concerned.

Another concern expressed was the use of fields at Brick Township High School and Brick Township Memorial High School. Girls are not being permitted to use the fields for Soccer and Field Hockey, but instead are playing their home games in Lakewood. Dr. Aragona noted that both boys and girls have had to play their games at Ocean County Park; however, changes will be coming thanks to the Board of Education wherein athletic fields will be utilized in all areas in addition to more play areas.

It was also brought to the Board's attention that contracted buses being used for class trips in some cases are not reliable and have broken down. The Transportation Department will check into this matter.

Motion was made by Mr. Roblenski, seconded by Mr. Williamson, with all in favor to adjourn this meeting at 9:37 p.m.
