The Brick Township Board of Education held their Pre-Agenda Conference on Tuesday, October 3, 1978 at 7:30 p.m. in the Board Office, Brick Township High School for the purpose of discussing items presented for approval on October 11, 1978.

Pre-Agenda
Conference

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. D'Ambola, Mrs. Fox, Mrs. Frake, and Mr. Hancock.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, and Mr. Sendzik.

President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Sunshine Law Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, and Municipal Clerk on September 28, 1978.

Agenda items were discussed by the Board of Education. The board authorized President Schue to send letters to necessary Assemblymen and Senators opposing Bill A-794.

The board discussed the Williamsburg trip.

Williamsburg
Trip

Dr. Aragona proposed two possible solutions for the raising of money for the Williamsburg trip: (1) for outside groups to raise money; and (2) for the board to become involved in various fund raising activities.

The board authorized the Superintendent to notify the Principal and/or the P.T.A.'s that outside groups will be permitted to raise the money for the Williamsburg trip.

It was also the position of the board that once the funds have been raised, they should be presented to the board as a donation for this trip. In addition, these groups responsible for raising money may do so on an individual basis, or on a district-wide basis.

In either case, schools who raise funds must do so in sufficient amount to provide monies for each and every 5th Grader in that particular school who wants to participate.

If funds are to be raised on a district-wide basis, then sufficient monies must come in to cover all 5th grade students in Brick Township Public Schools who want to participate.

No child shall be denied an opportunity to go on this trip even though he, she, or family is unable to provide the necessary funds.

Bids

After their discussion of bids listed, the Business Administrator was given permission to rebid for Out-of-District Transportation.

The board continued their discussions of items listed on the agenda in the various categories.

It was noted that Mr. Strauss would be present on October 17th at the board conference for Policy discussion.

Post-Office

The board after their discussion of the safety problem on Chambers Bridge Road due to the new location of the Post Office authorized Mr. Schue to write letters to the Township Council with copies to the County Engineer and Freeholders expressing their concern for students traveling Chambers Bridge Road, including school buses, because of the dangerous situation that has been brought about by the location of the Post Office on Chambers Bridge Road.

Green Briar

The board discussed using Greenbriar as a polling place at election time and the result was that the board cannot consider this since it would be in violation of Title 18:A.

Expulsion

Expulsion of a student, MB, was discussed and it was directed that a motion, in this regard, be put on the Action Agenda for October 11, 1978.

Dr. Aragona and Mr. D'Ambola gave a brief overview of current negotiations now in process with the BTEA.

Adjourn

At 10:15 p.m., motion was made by Mr. Hancock, seconded by Mr. D'Ambola and carried unanimously to adjourn this meeting.
