Dr. Aragona advised the board members that an extension in time had been given for receipt of bids for the new High School because there had been such an overwhelming response from bidders, and it was felt more time would grant bidders needed time to work out their estimates more accurately. It was noted that the date for receipt of bids was changed from October 16th to October 26th at 3:00 p.m. It is anticipated that award will be made in November, hopefully at the November 8th Regular Meeting.

Discussion of the Williamsburg trip and legalities as to board's responsibilities followed.

Dr. Aragona presented an additional motion with regard to a Transportation Jointure for transportation of children to the Katzenbach School, and the board members agreed that it could be added to the agenda for the Regular Meeting.

Military leaves of absence during the school year was questioned, and Dr. Aragona is to get an answer for Mr. Hancock in this regard.

Mr. Bertrand discussed his review of the vouchers to be approved, and questioned payment to the Architect at this time.
