The Brick Township Board of Education held their Regular Meeting at 8:55 p.m. on Wednesday, November 8, 1978 at Veterans Memorial Elementary School.

Regular Meeting

Present were: Mrs. Riley, Mr. D'Ambola, Mr. Hancock, Mrs. Fox, and Mrs. Frake.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Mrs. Riley announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

The undersigned agree to the following terms in settlement of all negotiations for the 1979-80 school year and agree to recommend the said terms to their principals for approval.

1. The Agreement shall be for one (1) year.
2. The 1979-80 Agreement shall constitute the 1977-79 Agreement except for the following changes set forth herein, plus attachments.
3. The 1979-80 total dollar package shall not exceed the amount of \$591,691.00.
4. \$440,691.00 shall be distributed to Salary Schedules "A" (Exhibit 1), and "D" (Exhibit 2).
5. \$430,868.00 shall be distributed to Schedule "A". The \$420,868.00 includes the cost of increments and a \$250.00 across the board additional raise in Schedule "A" for the school year 1979-80.
6. \$19,823.00 shall be distributed to Schedule "D" for the school year 1979-80.
7. \$151,000.00 shall be distributed to teachers covered by this Agreement, who are on step 15 (maximum) during the 1978-79 school year. The one-time adjustment shall be separate and apart from any salary schedules or guides. It shall be paid to teachers for 1979-80 school year only (Exhibit 3).
8. Included are Memorandums of Agreement attached hereto and identified as exhibits three and four.
9. The parties acknowledge that the Memo of Understanding comprises the settlement of their negotiations, and all issues, whether placed on the table or not, are deemed closed and barred for the period of the Agreement.
10. The parties represent that they will use their best efforts to have the terms herein accepted by their principals.

Furthermore, the Agreement is subject to ratification of the Association and the Board.
