

Brick Town, New Jersey

The Brick Township Board of Education held a conference meeting on Tuesday, December 19, 1978 at 7:30 p.m. in the Board Office, Brick Township High School for the purpose of discussing items as referred to in the following minutes.

CONFERENCE

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Hancock, Mrs. Fox, Mrs. Frake and Mr. D'Ambola.

Also present: Mr. Wolf and Mr. Stutts.

President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

Sunshine Law

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the time, date, and place thereof posted as follows: Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Bulletin Board and Municipal Clerk on December 14, 1978.

With relation to the new high school, the following items were discussion, with no action taken: Name, Colors, and Mascot. Other phases discussed was community involvement in selection of a name for the new school, student involvement on a high school level only, or participation by other grades.

Participation in the 1979 International Music Festival to be held in Toronto, Canada on May 19, 20, and 21, 1979 by the High School band was also discussed with no action taken.

Information as to weighting courses for class rank determination was presented to the board members.

A letter from a parent of a handicapped pre-school child in appreciation of transportation provided was read.

A letter sent by Mr. Robert Sparks to the PTA Presidents' Council with regard to one of our students being selected to attend a Washington Workshop Congressional Seminar was read and the question was raised as to whether the board would like to cover all or part of the cost to send the student to this Seminar. No action was taken.

This meeting was adjourned by motion of Mrs. Riley, second of Mr. D'Ambola and unanimous agreement, at 9:55 p.m.
