Policy 555

Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mr. D'Ambola and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education adopt, on first reading, the attached Policy with regard to requests for uncompensated leaves of absence for Professional Personnel, provided that the Board of Education is able to employ certified and qualified replacements to fill vacancies.

Personnel

Uncompensated Leave not Caused by Disability (One full school year)

The Board recognizes that in certain instances a certificated staff member may wish extended leave for personal reasons and that the district could benefit from the return of said employee. For that purpose the Board will promulgate policy for the award of uncompensated leaves of absence for reasons other than those spelled by statute, provided that, at the discretion of the Board, it is able to employ certified and qualified replacements.

The Board reserves the right to specify the conditions when not otherwise covered by the terms of the negotiated agreement under which uncompensated leaves may be taken.

A. Purpose:

Uncompensated leave may be taken for the following purposes:

- Study
- Travel
- Special work assignment
- Restoration of health
- Domestic reasons
- Child care.

B. Eligibility:

Uncompensated leave may be granted to tenured teaching staff members only, except that for emergency reasons, as determined by the Board of Education, nontenured teaching staff members may be granted leaves for good cause.

C. Application:

Request for uncompensated leave shall be made to the Principal at least twelve (12) weeks in advance of the desired starting date.

Special consideration will be given to emergencies, but in no case will leave be permitted to start at any time except the start of school year.
