The Brick Township Board of Education held a public meeting on Monday, August 4, 1980 at 6:30 p.m. in the Administration Building for the purpose of reviewing the opening of the high schools in September, and to receive the report of the recommendations of the Facilities Task Force, and to act upon Personnel matters.

President Fox announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News on July 31, 1980.

Mrs. Fox announced that the purpose of the meetings tonight was to discuss the opening of Brick Township Memorial High School and to receive the report of the Facilities Task Force. She further stated if the members had no objections that the following personnel items would be presented for consideration and approval.

Motion was made by Mr. Schue, seconded by Mrs. Frake and carried by vote of Mr. Bell, Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Frake, Mr. Schue, and Mrs. Fox (attending members at this time) that the Board of Education approve the appointment of Miss Carol Treger to the position of Assistant Principal - Elementary School, effective September 1, 1980, at a salary of \$21,210.00, Step 2, Guide A.

Motion was made by Mr. Schue, seconded by Mrs. Frake that the Board of Education approve the appointment of Mr. Richard Handschuch to the position of Supervisor of Instruction, effective September 1, 1980, at a salary of \$29,390.00, Guide B. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Mr. Bell - yes; Mr. Bertrand - Pass (He had not been present for the discussion); Mr. Donofrio - yes; Mrs. Frake - yes; Mr. Hancock - yes; Mr. Schue - no; and Mrs. Fox - yes.

The discussion of the potential date for opening of Brick Township Memorial High School was begun with a statement from Mrs. Fox to the effect that it is unlikely that it will be ready for September 1st. She further stated that all classes will be scheduled for Brick Township High School until a solution is reached as to the opening date for Memorial High. The students for Brick Township Memorial High School will share the existing high school facilities with Brick Township High School.

The split sessions will be set up for Brick Township High School from 7:35 a.m. to 12:15 Noon (4 hours and 40 minutes), and from 12:45 p.m. to 5:25 p.m. for Brick Township Memorial High School (also 4 hours and 40 minutes), with no lunch nor study hall periods, until our new high school can be opened. It was stated that it is more than likely that the new school will not be opened until the second semester of the 1980-81 school year.

At 7:00 p.m. Mrs. Fox read the following resolution. Motion was made by Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Hancock and carried unanimously that all members were in agreement.

WHEREAS, C. 231 P.L. 1975 also known as the Sunshine Law authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under certain limited circumstances; and

WHEREAS, said law requires the Board to adopt a resolution at a public meeting before it can meet in such an executive or private session:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BRICK TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That it does hereby determine that it is necessary to meet in executive session on this date to discuss matter involving anticipated litigation under Buildings and Grounds, and (2) that the matter discussed will be made public if and when confidentiality is no longer required and action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a public meeting.

Visits by board members with administrators over the weekend of August 2-3 to the Memorial High School site were discussed. Removal of panels by contractor in order that Mr. Birdsall may proceed with his inspection was also discussed at length and direction given to the Board Secretary. It was directed that a meeting be set with our architect, our Clerk of the Works and Mr. Birdsall in the near future, and after this meeting another is to be set for the board to meet with the five major contractors and attorneys.
