Special Meeting The Brick Township Board of Education held a Special Meeting on Tuesday, February 19, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Present were: Mr. Schue, Mrs. Riley, Mrs. Fox, and Mrs. Frake.

Also present: Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton, and Mr. Sendzik. (Mr. Pagano for BTEA Negotiations)

President Schue announced that the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted, as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, and Municipal Clerk on February 14, 1980.

A. Calogero Resignation Motion was made by Mrs. Riley, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education accept the resignation of Mr. Arthur D. Calogero, effective February 15, 1980, for personal reasons.

William Brouillette Principal Memorial H.S. Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mrs. Riley and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education appoint Mr. William Brouillette to Principal of Brick Township Memorial High School effective upon selection of his replacement.

The defeat of two referendums for the construction of an elementary school was discussed and a decision reached to petition the Commissioner of Education for permission to allow the Brick Township Board of Education to put a revised referendum to the voters for a third time within a six-month period.

Appeal to Comm.-Ref. Motion was made by Mrs. Riley, seconded by Mrs. Fox and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education petition the Commissioner of Education of the State of New Jersey to certify in writing the necessity; grant permission for and direct that a Special School Election be held within the time period proscribed by N.J.S.A. 18A:14-3.

Executive Session Motion was made by Mrs. Riley, seconded by Mrs. Frake and carried unanimously to approve going into executive session at 9:17 p.m. Mr. Schue announced that WHEREAS, C. 231, P.L. 1975, also known as the Sunshine Law, authorizes a public body to meet in executive or private session under
