WorkSession

The Brick Township Board of Education held a Work Session on Monday, July 28, 1980 at 7:30 p.m in the Administration Building for the purpose of discussing and/or acting upon matters under the categories of Building and Grounds (including retainages withheld from contractors on the Brick Township Memorial High School project, and testing of the high voltage system among other items), Curriculum and Instruction, Personnel and any other matters which may be presented.

Present were: Mr. Bell, Mr. Bertrand (7:35 p.m.) Mr. Donofrio, Mrs. Frake, Mr. Hancock and Mr. Schue.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Anton, Mr. Sendzik, and Mr. Crescenzo.

Sunshine Law

Mr. Bell announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk, and Brick Town News on July 24, 1980.

ElectricalSystemB.T.M.H.S.

Motion was made by Mr. Bertrand and seconded by Mr. Donofrio that the Board of Education authorize independent testing of the high voltage electrical system at the Brick Township Memorial High School, not to exceed \$2,500. with a stipulation that should a malfunction be discovered the cost of the testing shall be borne by the electrical contractor as well as the cost of making necessary repairs. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Mr. Bell - yes; Mr. Bertrand - yes; Mr. Donofrio - yes; Mrs. Frake - yes; Mr. Hancock - yes; and Mr. Schue - no.

Motion was made by Mr. Schue, seconded by Mr. Hancock and carried unanimously by roll call vote that the Board of Education approve an application for \$34,153.72 in matching funds under the Technical Assistance portion of the National Energy Act.
