

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS FOR
STUDENT EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES ELIGIBILITY

REGULA-
TIONS
POLICY
#6145

- PART A
1. Annually, at the beginning of the school year, each student shall be given a copy of the academic requirements for student extracurricular activities eligibility.
 2. Unsatisfactory achievement reports shall be issued at the mid-point of each marking period for those courses that a student is in danger of failing, These reports will serve as a warning notice to those students involved in athletics that loss of eligibility is imminent.
 3. The eligibility status of students participating in athletics will be determined upon issuance of report cards.
 4. A student who fails more than one subject during his/her sport season shall be declared ineligible for the duration of the next marking period.
 5. The high school principal shall be responsible for the enforcement of the athletic eligibility policy.

- PART B
1. The regulatory procedures outlined above for inter-scholastic athletics shall also apply for non-athletic activities.
 2. Specific extracurricular activities covered by this policy are:
 - a. Auxiliary athletic activities--cheerleaders, managers, and statisticians;
 - b. band and auxiliary marching units;
 - c. Fine Arts--chorus and play productions;
 - d. publications--school year book and school newspaper.

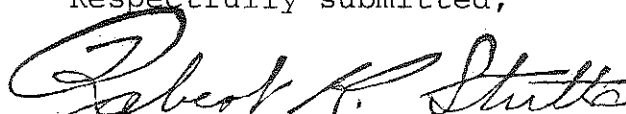

Dr. Aragona presented the item under Curriculum and Instruction relating to the participation of the two middle schools in the Introduction to Vocations Consortium Project conducted by the Ocean County Vocational-Technical School during the 1985-86 School Year at a cost of \$2410.00 for each school. In the past all costs have been defrayed with State Vocational Education funds.

Items under Finance and Business were presented by Dr. Aragona. Mrs. DeConde noted some adjustments be made to the payment of vouchers lessening the total to be approved by \$303.20. The milk contract for the 1985-86 school year was also presented.

A discussion followed as to why the bus chassis award was given to the high bidder. Dr. Aragona explained that the awards for the low bid bus body and the high bid bus chassis combined equaled the low bid and that this was a condition the vendors recorded when the bids were originally submitted.

The Personnel Section of the Agenda was held until the end of the meeting for closed session.

Policy #6145, Academic Requirements for Student Extra-Curricular Activities, was presented for approval on second reading. The policy would be adopted as presented on the first reading. However, it was suggested there be a delay on the implementation of the policy due to the fact that many students have already selected their courses for the coming school year with no knowledge of this policy and therefore may not be meeting the thirty credit requirement. Dr. Aragona said that tutoring students who are having difficulty in some of their courses has already begun on a voluntary basis by several coaches and teachers, and the Board expressed their gratefulness to these professionals for giving their time and effort to help these students. A consensus of the Board was taken for a second reading on this policy and all Board Members were in favor.

Policy #6201, Inter-Generational Education Pilot Program, was also presented for approval on second reading. It was noted that these adult citizens will be interviewed by the Principal and will meet with the teachers involved before entering the course. A consensus of the Board was taken for the second reading and all Board Members were in favor.
