POLICY #5131.8

NO SMOKING

In order to protect pupils from an environment which is potentially dangerous to their health, the Board of Education prohibits smoking on school premises and in vehicles owned or utilized by the school.

For the purposes of this policy, "smoking" means the burning of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or any other matter or substance for smoking, not covered under Policy 5131.6.

The Superintendent shall promulgate regulations for the administration of this policy as may be necessary.

REGULATIONS

Motion that the Board of Education adopt the Regulations to Policy #5131.8, No Smoking, on the first reading, as follows:

NO SMOKING POLICY REGULATIONS #5131.8R

Upon determining that a student has smoked on school grounds, the principal shall observe the following:

Grades 9 - 12

- First Offense - After school detention at the principal's discretion.
- Second Offense - Five school days in the GASP Program.
- Third Offense - Ten school days in the GASP Program.
- Fourth Offense - Ten school days out of school suspension.
- Fifth Offense - Administrative hearing with student and parents or guardians held by the Superintendent or designee.
- Sixth Offense - Board of Education hearing.

Grades K - 8

Smoking by students shall be dealt with by the principals in accordance with the No Smoking Policy.

Motion that the Board of Education adopt the amendment to Policy #5141, School Health Policy, on the first reading, as follows:

POLICY #5141 SCHOOL HEALTH POLICY AMENDMENT

- E. Accident or Sudden Illness - The Board of Education subscribes to New Jersey State Law concerning accident or sudden illness at schools as follows:
 - 1. State Mandate
 - c. The Brick Township Board of Education recognizes its responsibility for pupil safety encompassing all aspects of sports and athletic events in both intramural and interscholastic programs. The

Board directs the Athletic Director or such person as may be designated by the Superintendent to develop and implement emergency medical procedures to ensure delivery of appropriate emergency medical services for all practice sessions, competitive contests, games, events, or exhibitions with individual pupils or teams of one or more schools of this district or of other districts.

POLICY
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The Board further directs these emergency medical procedures be disseminated to appropriate personnel within this district and address practice sessions and both home and away events.

The Board directs the Superintendent or his designee to report the effectiveness of the emergency medical procedures to the Board annually for its review.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Brick Township Board of Education anticipates a shortage of classrooms for the 1985-86 school year, and

WHEREAS said Board of Education has entered the planning stage to provide adequate facilities for the pupils of Brick Township,

WHEREAS said Board of Education has investigated all possibilities for providing educational facilities within a regular school building,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Brick Township Board of Education hereby petitions the Superintendent of Schools in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, to approve, as an emergency facility for the school year 1985-86, the instructional areas listed below:

Rooms 13, 14, 15, 16
Library
Small Group Instructional Areas

LANES MILL SCHOOL:

Room 4A
Room 1A - 36

MIDSTREAMS SCHOOL:

Room 16
Room 17A

VETERANS MEMORIAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:

Room 33

VETERANS MEMORIAL MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Room F-2

BRICK TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL:

Storage Room in Room 24

LAKE RIVIERA MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Rooms 200-A, 200-B, 200-C
Rooms 27-28, 31-32, 17-18, 3-4

(Due to the fact that the inspectors visited our buildings and submitted to us additional necessary changes, we therefore need to officially pass the above Resolution indicating our emergency need.
