Organization Meeting

The Brick Township Board of Education held their Organization Meeting on Tuesday, April 14, 1981 at 8:00 p.m. at Brick Township Memorial High School.

Present were: Mrs. Fox, Mr. Bell, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Donofrio, Mr. Hancock, Mr. Schue, Mr. Bittmann and Mr. Williams.

Also present: Dr. Aragona, Mr. Wolf, Mr. Stutts, Mr. Anton and Mr. Sendzik.

Mrs. Fox announced that the Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Brick Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time, and place thereof posted as follows on April 9, 1981: Board Office Bulletin Board, Asbury Park Press, Ocean County Times-Observer, Municipal Clerk and Brick Town News.

Mrs. Fox spoke of the accomplishments and aims of the past year, and of the accomplishments of the outgoing board members, Mrs. Frake and Mr. Schue. Mr. Schue talked for a few minutes of his associations during his nine years of being a board member.

Mr. Hancock gave a brief talk in acceptance of the position of Board President and stressed, among other aims, board unity in purpose.

Motion was made by Mrs. Fox, seconded by Mr. Bertrand and carried unanimously that the Board of Education adopt the current policies of the Board of Education, including rules and regulations, until the next Organization Meeting.

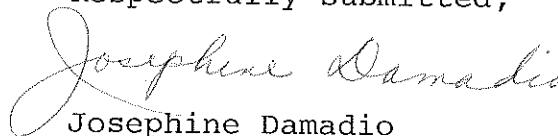
