

Toms River, N.J., April 28, 1998

A Combined Regular and Organization Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools took place at the Board Meeting Room, 54 Washington Street, Toms River, N.J., on Tuesday, April 28, 1998 at 6:30 P.M.

Board Secretary Jellets read the following Opening Statement:

Superintendent Ritacco took the opportunity to welcome Mrs. Clayton to the Board as the newly elected representative from Beachwood, and congratulate Mrs. Henninger on her election to the presidency and Mrs. Garvey on her election to the vice-presidency of the Board of Education.

Superintendent Ritacco announced that there is a very special guest in the audience this evening, Mr. Joseph A. Citta.

Superintendent Ritacco related that Mr. Citta's family moved to Toms River when he was four years old, and last week he celebrated his 90th birthday. He first served as a school board member on the Dover Township Board of Education before World War II and his enlistment in the U.S. Army. Discharged as a major after five years in the service, Mr. Citta was reelected to the Board and served his first term as president in 1946. Later, he returned to serve his community on the Toms River Schools Board of Education and in 1960 and 1961, he served as president of the Board.

Superintendent Ritacco conveyed that Mr. Citta is the oldest living former member of the school board and one of Toms River's most veteran residents. He distinguished himself in the record books of Toms River High School by making the first Indian touchdown against Lakewood in 1924 when Toms River beat Lakewood 6-0.

Superintendent Ritacco cited Mr. Citta's success as a businessman and in the legal profession, his civic leadership and his philanthropy. In 1975, the Boy Scouts of America recognized him as its First Annual Distinguished Citizen. This was followed in 1977 by the Greater Toms River Chamber of Commerce Citizen of the Year Award. In 1986, Ocean County College presented a tribute to him as their primary benefactor. He was one of the prime movers in the creation of the Novin's Planetarium and served six years as Chairman of the Board for the Ocean County College Foundation. In 1987, he was awarded the Silver Antelope Award, the highest Boy Scout award bestowed on only a few hundred men in the United States.

Board Member Rich Longo related that he has had the pleasure of not only knowing Mr. Citta for a number of years, but also knowing of his countless contributions to the community. He told Mr. Citta that it would be a great honor for him to ask the

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rest of the Board to agree and support his motion to name the new elementary school, which is to be constructed in the Pleasant Plains section of the township, the Joseph A. Citta Elementary School. Board Member Frank Sadeghi advised that he would consider it a privilege to second the motion, and he related that he could not think of a single individual in this community who deserves this honor more than Mr. Citta.

Their Lacrosse Team is rated #1, and both their softball and baseball teams are competing against High School East this evening. Their senior prom is scheduled for May 30.

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Mr. Pezzicola commented that he found it astounding that with no tax increase in three years and parents who continually applaud such students as all those who received awards this evening, that the school budget was defeated. Mr. Pezzicola felt that staying home and not going out to vote on a school budget is just the same as voting against it.

Mrs. Garvey was pleased to announce that Cathy Venskus has been named teacher of the year at Walnut Street, and her daughter Laura, has also been named teacher of the year at the elementary school she teaches at in New Egypt. Mrs. Garvey congratulated both of them. Mrs. Garvey advised that the Parent Involvement Workshops are in full swing and she was happy to attend two of them, one at East Dover and one at West Dover. She found both workshops very enlightening. Mrs. Garvey encouraged the Board to attend Parent Information Day scheduled for June 3rd, and advised that an invitation to that event was included with their agenda.

New Jersey School Boards Association

Mrs. Garvey reported that she had attended the New Jersey School Boards Association Legislative Conference. Mrs. Garvey advised the Board that she came away from that conference feeling that there are legislators out there who are friends of public education and who are friends of the New Jersey School Boards Association.

Policy Committee Meeting

A Policy Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools took place at the Board Meeting Room, 54 Washington Street, Toms River, N.J., on Monday, April 6, 1998 at 6:30 P.M.

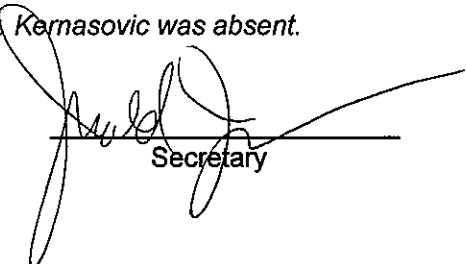

As per telephone conversation with your secretary, I am writing you this letter informing you that I have withdrawn my son Sal from High School South.

In the past month, my son has had 2 altercations with the same person - Vincent Surko. The first time was in 8th period woodshop. This student punched Sal in the head, before it went any further the teacher took both boys to the office and both boys were suspended for 10 days. When my son went back to school he was still having problems with this same student, so he told Mr. Fraiser the Asst. Principal and also went to Mrs. Kristy, his case manager in Child Study and had his schedule changed to try and avoid any further problems.

Unfortunately, they still shared the same 3rd period gym class, which is where the 2nd altercation occurred. On 2-25-98 toward the end of 3rd period gym this student Vincent Surko threw a ping pong ball and hit Sal in the head, my son Sal walked up to him, and before Sal could say a word to him, Vincent punched Sal in the face and broke his nose. Sal lost his temper and ^{this} resulted in a terrible fight and both boys were injured. Again both boys were suspended for 10 days with Sal being assigned I.S.S. and the Child Study Team recommended Alternate School as a permanent placement because he has a "behavioral problem".

He is now on Home Instruction and will remain on it, to my husband and I. Alternate was not an option and he will not be returning to High School South either.

I would like to meet with you to discuss this further, and also would like to thank you for taking the time to read this letter.
