Ms. Jillian Brady reported on events taking place at High School South which included a report on their pep rally which she described as very spirited and a huge success. Ms. Brady further reported that their freshmen orientation will take place on September 28 and their Alumni Courtyard dedication will take place on November 28.

Ms. Jennifer Sneed reported on events taking place at High School North. Ms. Sneed advised that the students are very happy with their great new principal, Mr. Coleman. She further reported that their Welcome Back Dance was well attended and a huge success; their sports teams have gotten off to a great start; and their spirit week is taking place this week and going very well.

Ms. Jen Fiore reported that High School East just had their first pep rally which was a huge success and everyone had a great time. A Finance/Budget Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools took place at the Administrative Offices, 1144 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, N.J., on Tuesday, September 8, 1998 at 6:00 P.M.

Chairperson Vasil read the following opening statement:

"Good Evening, Welcome to a Finance/Budget Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools."

"Notice of this meeting was published in the Asbury Park Press and the Ocean County Observer on August 24, 1998 which constituted at least 48 hours notice as required by law under the Open Public Meetings Act."

In attendance: Committee Chairperson Betty Vasil, Committee Members Beverly Clayton and Frank Sadeghi, Board Members Jamie Henninger, Meera Malik, Thomas Baxter and Linda Garvey, Business Administrator Mullins, and Assistant Superintendents Ciliento and Bartlett.

The previously approved Purchasing Agenda in the amount of \$86,160,650.89 was reviewed and approved for submission to the full Board.

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Technology

A Technology Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools took place at 1144 Hooper Avenue, on Monday, September 14, 1998 at 6:00 P.M.

Chairperson Vasil read the following Opening Statement:

"Good Evening. Welcome to a Technology Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools.

Notice of this meeting was published in the Asbury Park Press and Ocean County Observer on September 11, 1998 which constituted at least 48 hours notice as required by law under the Open Public Meetings Act."

In attendance were Betty Vasil, Chair; Committee members Meera Malik and Frank Sadeghi; Board members Thomas Baxter, Linda Garvey, Jamie Ann Henninger, Robert Kernasovic, and Richard Longo; Assistant Superintendents Garrabrant, Ciliento and Bartlett, Business Administrator Mullins, Board Secretary Jellets, Patricia Lewis and Robert Rapp.

Mr. Rapp shared with the committee a proposal to implement the next phase of the district's technology plan, to expand the technology infrastructure to all the elementary schools. The district could either contract out all the work required in the wiring project or utilize in-house staff to complete this phase of the work. It is estimated that contracting out this project would cost approximately \$600,000, while utilizing in-house staff would cost approximately \$97,000. The administration recommends going with completing this project in-house and contracting with AUS consultants to oversee the project. The consultant fees would be included in the \$97,000 cost figure.

The administration also recommends re-assigning Shawn Henrichs to the Tech Support Team as lead district person on this project. Funding for this project and for the necessary electronic components would come from Distance Learning Network Aid, the Technology Literacy Challenge Fund Grant, and contributions to the Technology Funds.

In addition, the administration recommends utilizing the \$90,000 raised by the PTO Walk-A-Thon to purchase computers for each of the elementary media centers. These computers would provide student and teacher access to e-mail and other on-line services, a requirement of the Literacy Challenge Grant.

The committee also reviewed evaluations from staff on the summer technology in-service. On behalf of the committee, Mrs. Vasil commended all the staff members who provided this training as well as the hundreds of staff members who participated.

Buildings & Grounds/Security & Safety Committee

As Chairman of the Athletic Committee, Mr. Baxter took the opportunity to congratulate the Toms River East Little League for winning the Little League World Series.

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New Jersey School Boards Association

Mrs. Garvey advised the Board and audience of an upcoming NJEA produced television series entitled *Classroom Closeup New Jersey* scheduled to air on September 19, which will feature two Toms River Schools' presentations: Homework Tips Workshop for Parents and a mock trial of the 1692 Salem Witch Trials performed by Maureen Cunningham's fifth grade students from East Dover Elementary.

Mrs. Garvey made the audience aware that New Jersey School Boards now has a web site which features topics such as legislative and State Board highlights, references on legal topics, policies, Critical Policy Reference Manual, job descriptions, contract settlements, data bases and links to other web sites. Mrs. Garvey advised that Board Members will all receive a user ID and password. She pointed out that there is a special members only area, however, some sites are available to the general public to inform them about Boards of Education, positions of the New Jersey School Boards, and also news of importance to public education. Mrs. Garvey advised that Mr. Jellets has promised the Board a Technology Workshop so that they can learn how to use this web site.

Mrs. Garvey updated the Board on the resolution they passed regarding impact fees being charged to developers to improve and enlarge schools. Mrs. Garvey reported that Bill A-494 just yesterday passed out of the Assembly Local Government and Housing Committee and its companion Senate bill has also been released from the committee and is now awaiting action by the full Senate.

Mrs. Garvey called the Board's attention to the Special Education Funding Resolution left at their place this evening. This resolution calls for the Legislature to delay the Biennial Report's recommendations. Mrs. Garvey highlighted the contents of the resolution for the Board and audience.

RESOLUTION CALLING FOR THE LEGISLATURE TO DELAY THE BIENNIAL REPORT'S RECOMMENDATIONS

A motion was made by Mrs. Garvey, seconded by Mr. Baxter and carried that the following Resolution be approved:

Resolution

Whereas, On March 15, 1998, the State Department of Education (DOE) released its Biennial Report which recommends for 1999-2000 a decrease in Tier III per pupil special education from \$6,104 to \$4,207, and an increase in Tier IV aid from \$8,470 to \$12,620; and

Whereas, DOE indicates in the report that this \$1,897 per pupil decrease in Tier III funding reflects the movement of pupils who receive intensive services into Tier IV from Tier III; and

Whereas, This recommendation is based on a survey DOE conducted with approximately 60 districts in November 1997 to determine intensive service criteria and the appropriate per pupil factor to be applied; and

Whereas, The relatively low number of districts in DOE's sample, and ambiguous intensive services criteria contained in the survey (which may have resulted in districts overestimating their projected number of Tier IV students) caused NJSBA's Special Education

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Committee to conduct its own survey of all districts in June 1998 using the same DOE criteria; and

Whereas, The Special Education Committee received over 300 responses to its survey, or approximately 500 percent of the number in DOE's random sample, raising serious doubts that the number of students ultimately receiving the higher Tier IV funding will offset the decreases in Tier III funding and could result in approximately \$10 million dollars in special education costs being passed on to districts and local taxpayers; and

Whereas, Recommendations in the DOE Biennial Report will be considered approved by October 15, 1998 and become the basis of future special education spending, unless the Legislature acts, prior to that date, to adopt a concurrent resolution stating that it is not in agreement with all or any part of the report; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools urges the Legislature to immediately conduct a public hearing and perform a critical review of the Biennial Report recommendations, including the DOE data underlying its conclusions; and, be it further

Resolved, That the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools urges the Legislature to delay the Biennial Report's recommendations regarding special education funding from taking effect until its thorough review is performed, and it is determined that the proposed tier funding amounts will not result in an overall special education funding deficit in the state and that adequate funding will be provided; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be sent to all legislators representing the 9th, 10th and 30th Legislative Districts, Members of the Senate and Assembly Education and Budget Committee, the New Jersey School Boards Association and the Ocean County School Boards Association.

Mr. Cilento advised that we have been putting our efforts into reducing out-of-district costs by bringing our students back into our schools. He related that the proposal by the state actually encourages districts to send their children out-of-district because the state is giving more funding back for children who are out-of-district in the Tier IV category than those that we educate within. Mr. Cilento pointed out that our Tier IV students receive occupational therapy, speech therapy, physical therapy, and counseling services. We feel we are entitled to as much state aid for those children that we educate in the district as those that we unfortunately have to send out to an appropriate placement. Mr. Cilento related that our concern is also that our most disturbed students and multiply handicapped students should be reimbursed as Tier IV students because of the amount of services that they require. He pointed out that the state now has them as Tier III students which significantly lessens the amount of state aid that we receive.
