INTRODUCTION OF THE REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE

Bond Counsel William R. Mayer from the firm of DeCotiis, Fitzpatrick & Gluck related that at the October 20, 1998 Board Meeting, the Board introduced the Refunding Bond Ordinance and approved an application to the Local Finance Board. The Local Finance Board approved the Refunding Bond Ordinance in an amount not to exceed \$19.5 million at their November 10, 1998 meeting. Mr. Mayer indicated that at the conclusion of this public hearing, the Board will consider adoption of the Refunding Bond Ordinance. Mr. Mayer explained how adoption of the ordinance would put in place the authorization to refund what is known as the callable bonds which were issued back in 1997. He recalled the 1997 \$21.6 million bond issue and related how adoption of this ordinance would authorize the refunding of the bonds that are subject to redemption, if the market is right to do that. Mr. Mayer advised that there is a general standard in the industry that you need to achieve 3% present value savings to do a refunding. He pointed out that we are close to that, but we are not there yet. He further pointed out that adoption of this ordinance would put the Board in a position to do the refunding, if the market got there. Mr. Mayer indicated he would be happy to answer any questions.

INQUIRIES FROM GUESTS & PRESS

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF A PORTION OF THE SERIES 1997 SCHOOL DISTRICT BONDS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOMS RIVER REGIONAL SCHOOLS, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$19,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT REFUNDING BONDS FOR FINANCING THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOMS RIVER REGIONAL SCHOOLS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools, County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Board") is hereby authorized to refund all or a portion of the outstanding principal amounts of the Board's School District Bonds, Series 1997 dated April 15, 1997, maturing on or after July 15, 2008, and to provide for the payment of the costs or expenses of issuing refunding bonds.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof, negotiable general obligation refunding bonds (the "Refunding Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$19,500,000 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.1 to 61.12.

Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$225,000 for costs of issuing the Refunding Bonds has been included in the aggregate principal amount of Refunding Bonds authorized herein.

Section 4. The purpose of the refunding is to affect an interest cost savings for the Board.

Section 5. A certified copy of this refunding bond ordinance as adopted on first reading has been filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey prior to final adoption, together with a complete statement in the form prescribed by the Director and signed by the Business Administrator of the Board as to the obligations to be refunded by the issuance of the Refunding Bonds authorized herein.

Section 6. This refunding bond ordinance shall take effect after the consent of the Local Finance Board has been endorsed upon a certified copy of this refunding bond ordinance as finally adopted.

ANNUAL AUDIT PRESENTATION

Mrs. Henninger introduced Mr. Don Cowan, from the firm of Cowan, Guteski & Co., P.A. Mr. Cowan advised that Mr. William C. McNamara met with the Finance & Budget Committee on November 10. During that meeting, Mr. McNamara and the committee reviewed in detail the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report and accompanying Auditor's Management Report and Corrective Action Plan. Mr. Cowan indicated that the Board has a clean opinion on the report and everything is presented fairly.

During his presentation, Mr. Cowan advised that the district's internal control over their financial records remains strong and he credited the staff of the Business Office led by the team of Mr. Jellets, Mr. Mullins and Mrs. Saxton and supported by the rest of administration. Mr. Cowan confirmed that the district's records demonstrated a high degree of accuracy. Mr. Cowan indicated that he would be happy to answer any questions and pointed out that the audit synopsis is available to the public this evening.

Mrs. Vasil referred to the audit report which indicated a net income of \$104,529 in the Corporate Center Enterprise Fund. Mrs. Vasil felt it was important for the public to know that in addition to the income that facility generated, how much we have realized in cost savings because we are no longer paying rent.

Mr. Cowan advised that the audit report shows a net income of \$104,529 in the Corporate Center Enterprise Fund. He pointed out that the Board did not pay rent. He did not know what the rent would have been in 1998 but he estimated somewhere in the area of a half million dollars. He also pointed out that the Board did not realize some rental income

they should have received and that case is currently in litigation. Mr. Cowan advised that if that case is settled, it is anticipated the Board will receive back rent and in the future when that space is rented, the district will see additional revenue. Mr. Cowan further advised that because the Board did not pay rent and still had \$104,529 in the Corporate Center Enterprise Fund, there is roughly about a \$650,000 potential difference in the financial statements.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Student Representatives

Ms. Jen Fiore reported on events taking place at High School East which included many service projects. The students and faculty are busy raising funds to help defray the cost of a bone marrow transplant for a former East student. The Interact Club held a very successful food and clothing drive and Peer Leadership is raffling off a gingerbread house, the proceeds from which will go to Oceans of Love. The coed cheerleaders are busy planning for the winter formal which they will hold on January 23. This year's theme will be "Hollywood Nights". Ms. Fiore further reported that the entire school is looking forward to playing High School North on Thanksgiving Day.

Ms. Jennifer Sneed from High School North recognized the accomplishments of their sports teams and gave special recognition to the gymnastics team who won both the South Jersey Group IV and overall championship for the second year in a row. She advised that their Annual Pep Rally and Bonfire will take place next week in preparation for the big football game against High School East. Ms. Sneed was happy to report that their band placed second in the Bloomfield High School competition. Their homecoming dance, held on November 7, was an overwhelming success with more than 700 students attending. They held the National Honor Society's fall inductions last week and the entire society is busy planning for many holiday projects.

Ms. Jillian Brady reported on events taking place at High School South. The Red Cross and Interact Clubs sponsored the Annual Italian Dinner on November 8. The food was delicious and the dinner was a great success. Last week was the sale of gobble grams headed by the National Honor Society which supports Thanksgiving Dinners for those in need. A fund raising event sponsored by the National Honor Society is taking place at Friendly's this evening. Fifteen percent of all sales will be donated to the Honor Society for their community efforts. Coming up at South this Thursday and Friday evening is Broadway's best "Cabaret". Wednesday, November 25, is South's alumni courtyard dedication, homecoming pep rally and their 9th annual homecoming dance. Ms. Brady also encouraged everyone to come out to the State Championship Football game playoff this Saturday at 1:00 P.M.

Technology

A Technology Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools took place at 1144 Hooper Avenue, on Monday, November 16, 1998 at 6:00 P.M.

Chairperson Vasil read the following Opening Statement:

"Good Evening. Welcome to a Technology Committee Meeting of the Board of Education of the Toms River Regional Schools.

"Notice of this meeting was published in the Asbury Park Press and Ocean County Observer on October 30, 1998 which constituted at least 48 hours notice as required by law under the Open Public Meetings Act."

Present were Betty Vasil, Chair, Committee Members Meera Malik and Frank Sadeghi. Also in attendance were Board Members Linda Garvey, Jamie Henninger and Rich Longo, Superintendent Ritacco, Assistant Superintendents Garrabrant, Bartlett and Gluck, Business Administrator Mullins, and Patricia Lewis and Robert Rapp.

Mrs. Vasil reported that the Technology Committee reviewed with the administration the status and cost of the elementary cabling project. At this point cabling for the media centers and technology labs has been completed at Beachwood, Cedar Grove, East Dover, Hooper Avenue and Silver Bay Schools. North Dover and Pine Beach are in progress, and South Toms River, Walnut Street, Washington Street and West Dover will be completed by December 11. Orders have been processed for file and proxy servers and the bids came in under estimates. 3-Com is providing the district with the electronics component, and as a business partner, they have agreed to train our in-house team on the installation and upkeep of these components. This will result in a considerable savings to the district because the going rate for outside contractors is \$125 per hour. Using our in-house team could save the district almost \$50,000 in outside contractor fees for this aspect of the project along.

Because of these cost saving measures, the funds available from Distance Learning Network Aid, the Literacy Challenge Grant, and Title VI will cover the cost of the elementary infrastructure project, and the Walk-a-Thon funds will allow us to put state-of-the art PC's with Internet access in all elementary school media centers.

The defeat of the district technology referendum required the committee and administration to make alterations to the original technology plan. Even though this funding source was not approved, the Board and administration believed that a commitment to technology education was imperative to our student's future. With this in mind, the Board asked administration to review all our options. Mrs. Vasil asked Mrs. Bartlett to outline these revisions.

Mrs. Bartlett advised that in order to find the money to fund the infrastructure project at the elementary level, we allocated funds which were originally earmarked to purchase computers at the elementary level. The Distance Learning Network Aid, Literacy Challenge Grant and Title VI monies were applied toward the infrastructure rather than using that money to purchase computers. We are using the funds that the PTO's raised with their Walk-a-Thons to purchase computers for the media centers at all 11 elementary schools. As mentioned last month, we did save considerable money in the district by using an in-house team to do the wiring for the infrastructure rather than out-sourcing that service. This wiring is extremely labor intensive and our team has done an excellent job of completing five schools. The target date for the rest of the project is December 11.

Mrs. Bartlett related that our existing technology plan calls for five computers in all the elementary classrooms. Obviously, because of funding problems and difficulties, we are unable to meet that goal. The Board was committed to making progress for students in technology and they directed us to look and make sure that we could provide services for all the students. What we are proposing at this point is for the next academic year, to use funds that were already allocated that we know we will be getting and to put one computer with one large monitor and a printer in all the classrooms. This technology will allow all the elementary students to participate in the Internet. As we are reviewing new text materials for future implementation in the district, technology is a significant component of all of them.

This large monitor, with access to the Internet, and all the technology support these new texts provide will definitely give us an advantage. We also wish to upgrade our technology labs and computers as needed in grades 7 thru 12. We do believe that even though it is a smaller project than originally anticipated, we will be able to keep Toms River up to speed with the high speed Internet access and in making use of the technology sources that are available all around us.

Mrs. Vasil advised that the committee recommends getting lease/purchase quotes for 1,000 computers to move forward with this initiative. This lease/purchase option will enable us to pay for this equipment with funds and donations which have already been committed for the 1999-2000 school budget.

Mrs. Vasil asked Mr. Ritacco to share with the public other technology donations the district has secured this month.

Superintendent Ritacco gratefully accepted a \$5,000 donation from Atlantic Coast Realty Advisory Group. He was also happy to accept a \$5,000 donation from Skrips Classic Vending Service.

Superintendent Ritacco was pleased to announce that the district came to an agreement with Pepsi Cola which he would like to propose to the Board this evening. Under the terms of this agreement, the district will sell Pepsi beverages. In return, Pepsi agreed to an initial donation of \$50,000 to the foundation. Annual revenue from a 50 cents per case rebate and other sales will yield additional funds for the Technology Foundation annually.

MOTION TO ACCEPT PEPSI AGREEMENT

A motion was made by Mrs. Vasil, seconded by Mr. Baxter and carried that the Board accept a donation in the amount of \$50,000 from Pepsi Cola and also an agreement with Pepsi Cola under which the district will sell Pepsi beverages.

All members present voting Aye.

Superintendent Ritacco was also pleased to announce the intention of prominent Toms River businessman Joseph A. Citta to establish a trust account from which the district can draw upon the interest over a 10-year period for the purchase of technology equipment. He indicated that this will provide exactly what the district wanted which is an annual revenue source to continue the technology funding. Superintendent Ritacco related that Mr. Citta sees the tremendous expense of computers, but also the tremendous need for our children.

MOTION TO MODIFY TECHNOLOGY PLAN

A motion was made by Mrs. Vasil, seconded by Mr. Longo and carried that the Board modify the 5 Year Technology Plan as outlined by Mrs. Bartlett.

School district personnel will be making presentations on Internet resources and the Toms River Regional Schools Website at the Ocean County Library. The first presentation will take place on December 9, 1998 at 6:30 p.m. at the main branch of the library. Any interested community member should contact the Toms River Technology Office to register.

Mrs. Bartlett shared with the committee the NJ nonpublic Schools Technology Initiative Program which allocates \$20 per pupil for Nonpublic school pupils and requires the Board of Education in each public school district to provide technology to all students attending a Nonpublic school located in the public school's district. Administrators are presently working with Nonpublic schools to review the guidelines.

The administration also informed the committee that they are reviewing a proposal from a firm which recycles laser and ink jet cartridges.

As previously reported, Mr. William McNamara, from the firm of Cowan, Guteski and Co., P.A. presented the committee with an in-depth review of the 1998 Annual Financial Report.

Transportation

INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

This Agreement made and entered into this first day of January, 1999 by and between the Department of Corrections, hereinafter referred to as the "Jail" and the Toms River Community Adult School, Toms River Regional School District, herein after referred to as the "School":

WHEREAS the Jail and the School recognize the need to establish an Inter-Governmental Agreement for the Adult Basic Education Program for Criminal Offenders; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

The School shall provide the Jail with three part time instructors to teach Basic Skills, General Educational Development, and English As a Second Language for a total of 486 hours at the cost of \$33.00 per hour. The Jail shall pay the school a sum not to exceed \$16,038.00. The program shall run from January 1, 1999 to December 31, 2000.

Payment will be made bi-annually on June 1, 1999 and December 31, 2000.

BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, that Director and Clerk of the Board are hereby authorized to execute an Inter-Governmental Agreement between the Toms River Regional School District and the Ocean County Department of Corrections to provide an Adult Basic Education Program for inmates in the Jail. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this amount will be charged to the Ocean County Department of Corrections, Account Number 016-200-0106-6600. Payment will be made bi-annually.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the Warden, County Department of Finance, County Auditor and the Toms River Regional School District.
