The Board recognizes that in certain instances a certificated staff member may wish extended leave for personal reasons and that the district could benefit from the return of said employee. For that purpose the Board will promulgate policy for the award of uncompensated leaves of absence for reasons other than those spelled by statute, provided that, at the discretion of the Board, it is able to employ certified and qualified replacements.

The Board reserves the right to specify the conditions when not otherwise covered by the terms of the negotiated agreement under which uncompensated leaves may be taken.

A. Purpose:

B. Eligibility:

Uncompensated leave may be granted to tenured teaching staff-members only, except that for emergency reasons, as determined by the Board of Education, nontenured teaching staff members may be granted leaves for good cause.

C. Application:

Request for uncompensated leave shall be made to the Principal at least twelve (12) weeks in advance of the desired starting date.

Special consideration will be given to emergencies, but in no case will a leave be permitted to start at any time except the start of a school year.

All applications are subject to final approval by the Board of Education

D. Period of Leave:

An uncompensated leave may be granted for a period of one (1) school year. THE CHILD CARE LEAVE MAY BE EXTENDED AT THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

E. Commitment of Employee:

The teaching staff member granted an uncompensated leave shall inform the Board within five (5) months of the scheduled return date as to his/her intentions.

F. Commitment of Employer:

At the expiration of the uncompensated leave, the teaching staff member shall be offered a position for which he/she is certified.

Time on uncompensated leave shall not count as time on the job.

Course credit obtained during uncompensated leave may be applied toward credit on the salary schedule.
