Dr. Nicastro presented Buildings & Grounds.

The Buildings & Grounds Committee and Administration made a presentation on the New School Construction Financing Act and school district building needs that would be eligible for State grants to fund up to 40% of total costs.

Mr. Woska thanked central administration and building administrators for putting this together, especially for the five-year facility plan.

Several questions were asked by the public.

- Dr. Nicastro explained that there are Level II building needs but at this time the district was concentrating on the highest priority, these Level I needs.

After the referendum election, pending on the specific site, we should be in these new facilities in 18 months. Several people felt administration was being too conservative. Dr. Nicastro explained that it is going to take a lot of work; it will be educating the community on the financing, educating the community on the need, having parents register to vote, convincing the adult communities that this is the time to do these renovations and additions. We want to get the referendum numbers that we think are obtainable. We want the community to believe and understand that we are conservative and not just looking to spend money for all our needs. This is not a wish list, but the highest priority needs in the district. We are going to work very hard so that we are successful for the referendum in the Fall.

This is the best opportunity Dr. Nicastro has seen in his 24 years in education, and in recent discussions with legislators, they felt we should be moving swiftly.

The cost will include architectural fees, movable and built in furniture and everything to fully fund this program.
