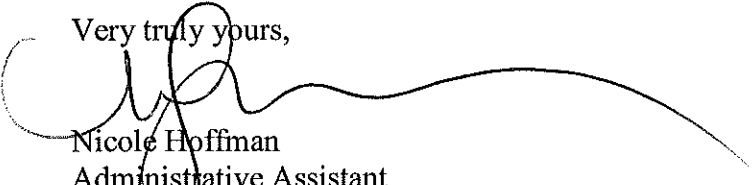
After consultation with the Borough Solicitor, your request is denied for the following reason(s):

Request for Information. Your request seeks information and does not identify specific government records, it is an invalid request and is therefore denied. *Doe v. Div. of Alcoholic Beverage Control*, 375 N.J. Super. 534, 546 (App. Div. 2005); *Bent v. Twp. of Stafford Police Dep't.*, 381 N.J. Super. 30, 37 (App. Div. 2005); *N.J. Builders Ass'n v. N.J. Council on Affordable Hous.*, 390 N.J. Super. 166, 180 (App. Div. 2007); *Schuler v. Borough of Bloomsbury (Hunterdon)*, GRC Complaint No. 2007-151 (February 2009); *Rummel v. Cumberland Cnty. Bd. of Chosen Freeholders*, GRC Complaint No. 2011-168 (December 2012); *Harris v. N.J. Dep't of Corr.*, GRC Complaint No. 2011-66 (August 2012); *Lopez vs. N.J. To the extent you are requesting specific government records, please clarify your request by identifying the specific records requested.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the seven (7) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the Borough of Glassboro to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
