- The book is not inclusive as it only discusses vaginal birth and traditional man-woman relationships.
- The book begins with a child questioning their origin after seeing a pregnant friend.
- It explains the baby's development, comparing its size to relatable objects like a gummy bear or pencil.
- The story includes a step-by-step explanation of conception, which is rare in books for younger children.
- The book describes physical differences between men and women and gives a simple explanation of sexual intercourse.
- The book lacks representation of diverse family structures, though it was published in 2019.
