Original Narrative

08/07/2024 21:29:51

On the above date and time, I responded along with Sgt. Perry to the area of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for the report of a female yelling for help and knocking on doors. While en route, patrols were advised the female yelling for help was wearing a black shirt and black pants and that she had walked down [REDACTED] towards the lower house numbers. As I arrived in the area, Sgt. Perry advised me that he was out with the female, at which time I observed Sgt. Perry to be stepping out with a female who was wearing black pants and a black shirt.

As I attempted to speak with the female, later identified as Katelyn E. Lewandosky, hereinafter referred to as the accused, I observed her to be very hyper, rambling and yelling. The accused was stating that she was attempting to go home for the past hour from a party in the area and that her phone had died. The accused stated that her phone died and she was attempting to get her dad to

come pick her up because she stated "I obviously am drunk". I asked the accused why she was yelling for help and she stated that she was waiting for her father and the people from the party on the street began pushing her into the street. The accused then got agitated by a passerby. The accused stated that she had gotten kicked out from the party and that she was trying to go home and that was all she needed. The accused stated she did not know if her ride was on the way because her phone had died. The accused stated that the people at the party were not letting her charge her phone to call for a ride and again stated that she was drunk. I then obtained the accused's demographics. The accused then provided me with her father's phone number and requested that patrols contact her father. I then provided dispatch with the phone number and asked them to make contact with the number so that I can speak with the accused's father. During this time, the accused continued to ramble about her phone being dead and stated "if you let me charge my phone I can show you proof of everything". The accused then stated that she was in Alcoholics Anonymous. I asked the accused if she was supposed to be drinking and she stated she was not drinking despite previously stating that she was drunk. The accused then stated she had one drink.

The accused then became agitated. I advised the accused I was contacting her father and she stated "what's my dad's phone number?". I advised the accused that she gave it to me and she stated "and what is it if you're actually calling him". The accused then began to not believe me and became irritated because she felt that I was not attempting to contact her father. I advised the accused several times that I was attempting to contact her father. Dispatch later advised that the phone number provided was going straight to voicemail. The accused then began ranting about an issue that she had with a different police department. The accused continued to be irritated and acting agitated. The accused continued to repeat that her phone was dead and that patrols were not letting her charge her phone. I advised the accused that the phone number she provided was going to voicemail and she stated, while irritated, "yes, and I wonder why. Because it's not saying Katelyn Lewandosky or Alexis Lewandowsky". The accused continued to be agitated and irritated. The accused was advised several times that patrols were attempting to get in contact with her father. I asked the accused if she needed any help other than a ride and the accused stated "and I just told you that I would like my father or my mother". The accused then began imitating a person crying while berating patrols about contacting her family for a ride. The accused then began asking for my name and badge number several times despite being told several times. The accused then began acting like she was recording me with her cell phone that was dead. The accused continued to yell and being instigative. I then requested dispatch to check her name and date of birth for a driver's license to attempt to send West Milford PD to her address to contact her father to come pick her up. As I was doing this, the accused continued to yell at Sgt. Perry asking how long each officer has been a police officer and continued to act as if she was recording. Dispatch advised they were able to locate the accused's address and were requesting West Milford PD to respond there. Patrols then attempted to direct traffic as the accused was located in the lane of travel and was not being cooperative.

During this time, the accused was speaking to her phone as if she was recording, despite it being dead, and reading license plates of the police cars and other cars that were passing by. Dispatch then advised me that the accused, was the same individual involved in a disturbance at the Shoprite Liquors where the accused was irate inside the store because they would not serve her more alcohol. I then asked the accused how old she was at which point she ignored me. I then checked her date of birth and confirmed that she was [REDACTED] years old. The accused continued to speak to her phone and began walking around the driver's side of the patrol vehicle. It appeared that the accused was going towards the driver's door but it was later determined she was going to read the rear license plate to her dead cell phone. I continued to direct traffic with Sgt. Perry while the accused continued to walk between the patrol vehicles speaking to her cell phone and holding it as if she was recording. Sgt. Perry then advised me that people at the party reported that the accused had taken forty dollars but that they did not need her arrested for it. The accused then stated that she wanted to know why liquor stores were selling alcohol to underage individuals and I advised her that she was [REDACTED] years old. The accused then stated "who cares". The accused then continued to state that she was a citizen and was allowed to make a phone call or charge her phone to make one. The accused then asked which phone she can use from either myself or Sgt. Perry to which I advised her that she was not using our personal phones. The accused then stated that was going to be a lawsuit and continued to state that she had the right to a phone call and that patrols were not

letting her while she was detained or arrested. I advised the accused that she was not under arrest at this time. I advised the accused several times that patrols attempted to make the phone call for her and attempting to help her. The accused continued to argue with patrols and mimicking a person crying when patrols advised that patrols were attempting to help her. I asked the accused if her phone was on because she was "recording" and she stated that it was. I then advised the accused to make the phone call and she stated "no, because actually I'm detained under your guys and I'm allowed as a citizen to make a phone call". At this time, several individuals from the party were gathered at the end of the driveway observing the situation. I continued to direct traffic for the safety of all involved while awaiting West Milford PD to make contact with the accused's father.

I then went and stood by the accused and asked where she lived. The accused then began attempting to instigate patrols and being sarcastic when I was attempting to help her. I advised the accused that I was attempting to get a ride for her and she stated that patrols did not. The accused continued to state that she was going to sue patrols and that her father was a sheriff's officer. The accused then began yelling that her dash came was recording and began walking around. I advised the accused to stand more near the shoulder and she stated she was not going to move. I advised the accused that she could get hit by a car and she stated "boo hoo that will be on you". I advised the accused I was attempting to help her and she stated "okay and you're not. You're obviously not". The accused then stated she had video of patrols not allowing her to make a phone call because patrols would not allow her to use our personal cell phones to make a phone call, however patrols were attempting to get in contact with the accused's father. The accused continued to mimic a person crying stating "so sorry, aw you have such a hard life aw". Bystanders then began stating "it's giving disorderly conduct". The accused then began yelling at vehicles that I was going to give it a ticket if it did not move fast enough. The accused continued to state that as a citizen she was allowed to make a phone call several times. Patrols did not acknowledge the accused as she was unable to be talked to reasonably. While patrols were not acknowledging the accused she continued to attempt to instigate and was rambling about a phone call being made and her right to do so.

The accused then asked if she could go to her car because she was not being read her Miranda Warnings. The accused then began walking away and I advised her to stop walking away. The accused then stated that she needs to be read her Miranda Warnings. I then read the accused her Miranda Warnings to keep her calm at which point she began yelling thank you as I continued to ask her to move to the front of my patrol vehicle. The reason I asked her to move to the front of my patrol vehicle was for her safety, as she was highly intoxicated and was walking around in the roadway and I did not want her walking into the active lane of travel that patrols were allowing cars to pass in. I then advised the accused to stand at the front of the vehicle again and she stated "I don't really give a fuck". I advised the accused that I was attempting to contact her father and get her ride and she stated "oh boo mother fucking hoo". The accused continued to not follow directions and would not move to a safe location. The accused then began arguing and yelling and acting irate. The accused was advised that I was concerned for her safety and she stated "I don't really give a fuck". The accused then began stating that patrols did not know her address and I advised her that we were aware of the address and she did not believe patrols. The accused then began asking for a different sergeant to respond and she was advised that she cannot choose who responds to the call for service. The accused continued to argue with patrols asking for a way to contact her father and she was advised several times patrols were attempting to call her father and get her a ride. At this time, West Milford PD was still en route to her address.

The accused then began walking around at this time and I advised her to stop. I then advised the accused several times to move and she stated "then put me in handcuffs". I advised the accused that I did not want to do that and she stated "oh then boo hoo" and began screaming in the roadway and acting irate. The accused then was advised patrols were attempting to get her a ride. The accused continued to walk away further down the street. I advised the accused that she was detained for her safety and I stood in front of her to prevent her from walking away. The accused continued to yell and act irate and attempted to walk around me at which time I shifted my body. I advised the accused that she was not free to leave for her safety. The accused then walked towards me at which time I used my right hand to stop her from walking towards me against her arm. I advised the accused several times to stop walking towards me. The accused then stated that patrols can walk with her to the car and that she has a right to contact her father who is a police officer. The accused then began stating that patrols were going to lose our jobs. The accused then

stated that her cousin shot herself, which was irrelevant and indicative of the accused not being logical or reasonable at the time of this incident. I advised the accused that she cannot go to her car because she is intoxicated. The accused then stated that patrols should let her call her father, at which time she was advised patrols were in the process of making contact with her father to come and get her. The accused continued to act disorderly and yelling in the street and instigating with patrols. The accused was then advised to stand back by the patrol vehicle. The accused then continued to ask about her phone call. I advised the accused that I did not have a phone to provide her and she stated "that's illegal". The accused then began yelling and acting disorderly in the roadway. Patrols then requested that Stanhope PD respond. The accused then proceeded to attempt to walk away from patrols quickly and suddenly. I then restrained the accused from walking away. The accused then suddenly stopped and then again attempted to walk towards me and attempting to get around me. I then restrained the accused again so that she could not walk away and put her hands behind her back. The accused then suddenly calmed down at which time, I let her go and again advised her to stop walking away several times. The accused then began yelling at patrols and eventually began screaming at me while walking towards me. The accused then began acting in a violent and tumultuous behavior as she walked towards me screaming and then started going chest to chest with me. I then attempted to push her back away from me and step back to avoid confrontation at which time she was flailing her arms. At one point, the accused grabbed my right upper arm briefly in an attempt to struggle with me. Patrols then attempted to arrest the accused at which time she began tensing her arms and still attempting to move away and was not complying. Patrols then used arm bar techniques to gain compliance as she continued to tense her arms and resist arrest. When the accused was flailing her arms and bumping my chest, my BWC had fallen off and landed on the pavement but remained activated. As I was attempting to handcuff the accused she was interlocking her fingers and tensing her wrists so that the handcuffs could not be appropriately fastened on her wrists.

Once the accused was handcuffed, I then escorted her to the rear passenger seat of my patrol vehicle. During this time, the accused continued to act irate and screaming in the roadway, drawing attention of several people from the party. I then placed the accused in the rear of the patrol vehicle. When I attempted to close the door, the accused kicked the door extremely hard causing it to jolt back out as Sgt. Perry was walking towards it. I then was able to close the door at which time I retrieved my BWC that had fallen off. I then transported the accused back to Post One in Car 5. Once at Post One, the accused was escorted inside to the processing room. While attempting to secure the accused to the bench seat in the processing room she continued to attempt to instigate patrols. The accused was then secured to the processing room bench seat via ankle shackle. I advised the accused to take her phone out of her shirt near her breast and she stated that she could not and advised patrols to get it. Due to the fact that the phone was dead and not able to be used, patrols advised the accused that she could keep it and that we were not retrieving it from it's current location. The accused then began requesting a female officer to be present because she felt it was required by law. Patrols then awaited West Milford PD to arrive to make contact with the accused's father. The accused was then observed using the processing room portable camera to record a video. I then went into the processing room and handcuffed the accused's arm to the bench to prevent her from doing so. The accused then began stating that a female officer needed to be present by law and patrols advised her that was not true. The accused then stated "what are you gonna fucking rape me, is that why?". Patrols then exited the room and ensured the processing room camera was activated at all times.

While in the patrol room attempting to complete the paperwork for processing, the accused was noted to be banging on the wall. I then went into the processing room and she stated she wanted to make a phone call. I then contacted the accused's father's number that she had provided. The phone call began ringing with no answer once it stopped ringing. I advised the accused that she gave me a different phone number than the one provided me. I asked the accused if she wanted to try another number. I then contacted the phone number she provided for her father. The accused continued to state that patrols were not allowing her a phone call. The phone call went immediately to voicemail. I then called the number back again and she stated "he's not going to answer you guys" as it again went straight to voicemail. I then left a voicemail as the accused began yelling over me. I then called back again, at which point the accused's father David answered. The accused began speaking to her father. I then spoke with David Lewandosky and advised him she was under arrest and to respond to the police department. The accused continued to ask me to tell her father

she had her phone in her pants and is recording everything and that her phone died. I then provided the accused the phone to speak to her father. Once the phone call was concluded, I left the processing room.

Later during processing, while awaiting the accused's father to arrive, the accused began banging on the wall with her hand. I then went into the processing room where the accused was yelling for a female officer to be present. I advised the accused a matron was responding. The accused continued to be yelling and banging her hand consistently on the wall and would not stop. Once the matron arrived, the accused was still screaming for a female officer and banging her shoe on the wall. I then asked for her shoe as I considered it a weapon. I then retrieved the accused's shoes from the room. The accused continued to bang the wall with her hand as she yelled for a female officer despite the matron being present. I then left the room as the accused was not satisfied. I then served the accused with her copy of the following summonses and advised her of her mandatory Andover Township Joint Municipal Court date of August 7, 2024 at 0900 hours:

1902-SCJ-002339 Disorderly Conduct 2c:33-2a(1)

1902-SCJ-002340 Obstructing the Administration of Law 2c:29-1a

1902-SCJ-002411 Resisting Arrest 2c:29-2a(1)

The accused's father later arrived at post one. I made contact with David Lewandosky, who stated he was not a police officer like the accused had stated. I advised Mr. Lewandosky that the accused will be released to him. Mr. Lewandosky advised that the accused does have behavioral issues. I advised Mr. Lewandosky If in the event that he is unable to handle her behavior upon being released and needs the police to respond, to pull over and request the police. I then released the accused to Mr. Lewandosky. I observed the accused get into the car and aggressively slam the door. Patrols cleared at this time.

I then began responding to another high priority assignment at which time I observed Mr. Lewandosky turning around in the parking lot. I spoke with Mr. Lewandosky and they were on the phone with the police. Mrs. Lewandosky stated that the accused got mad, got out of the car and stated she was walking home to West Milford. Due to the accused's current state, it was not safe for her to walk home on her own accord, especially at the current time and distance from her residence. I then began driving down Mansfield Drive at which time, I observed the accused walking down the sidewalk. I then requested an ambulance be placed on standby for a mental health transport.

I then made contact with the accused. I advised the accused to stop walking and she would not stop walking. I then stood in front of the accused and told her to stop walking. The accused then began yelling and acting irate stating her parents kicked her out of the car. I advised the accused that she was going to the hospital. I advised the accused that she cannot walk home because she is a danger to herself due to her behavior. The accused continued yelling and acting disorderly as she screamed in the middle of the street. The accused then began yelling that she has borderline personality disorder. The accused then stated "obviously I'm mentally not okay". I then requested Ptl. Popelka from Stanhope PD respond to assist. I again advised the accused that she was going to the hospital. LES then arrived on scene. The accused then began walking quickly down the street between myself and Sgt. Perry. I then grabbed the accused's arm to prevent her from walking down the street. The accused then began screaming and in a violent and tumultuous behavior was resisting police officer control causing my BWC to fall but remain activated. The accused at one point, proceeded to lunge towards me with an open mouth while acting tumultuous. I believed the accused was attempting to bite me at which time I used my forearm under her chin to lift her head up from coming at me. Patrols continued to struggle with the accused in an attempt to gain compliance and handcuff her as she continued to flail, attempt to move away and tense all of her upper body. Ptl. Popelka arrived on scene at which time the accused was handcuffed. The accused was then escorted into the ambulance. Sgt. Perry later retrieved my BWC. While attempting to secure the accused in the ambulance via handcuffs and cravats as leg restraints to the stretcher, the accused lifted her shirt and exposed her breasts. The accused then left her breasts out and would not cover them. I then covered the accused with a sheet to attempt to keep her decent. The accused then removed the blanket and continued to leave her breasts exposed.

I then secured my patrol vehicle and rode with LES to Newton Medical Center while Sgt. Perry followed behind the ambulance. During transport, the accused continued to leave her breasts exposed. A female EMT was present due to this circumstance. The accused then stated "my nipple rings do record just so you know". Once at Newton Medical Center, the accused pulled her shirt back down. The accused was then brought into the facility at which time my BWC was deactivated. The accused was then secured by hospital staff in the hospital room. Patrols advised the accused that summonses would be mailed to her regarding her second arrest. Patrols cleared the hospital and returned to Post One. No further action taken at this time. End of report.

On August 2, 2024, I had a chance to review all BWC and MVR footage regarding this incident. While reviewing the footage, I observed on the processing room camera that the accused had pulled her pants down, squatted and proceeded to urinate on the floor intentionally as if it was a bathroom. During the arrest, patrols observed this wet mark but originally thought it was from the bottom of her shoes being wet. I also observed on camera the way the accused was attempting to resist during the first arrest. I then spoke to the on-duty AP, AP Neidhardt, who advised the incident did not rise to the level of assault, but was instead harassment under the offensive touching, shoving or kicking subsection. I then completed the following summonses and had them mailed to the accused. The following summonses had a mandatory Andover Township Joint Municipal Court date of August 14, 2024 at 0900 hours:

The remaining summonses are from the second arrest of the accused:

1902-SCJ-002413 Disorderly Conduct 2c:33-2a(1)

1902-SCJ-002414 Obstructing the Administration of Law 2c:29-1a

The court administrator was advised of the Harassment summons being involved with the first arrest so that the two different court dates did not become an issue. Patrol cleared. No further action taken at this time. End of report.

08/07/2024 21:02:53 Sgt. Kevin Perry

On the above date and time, Patrols responded at the above location for a female yelling and screaming for help and knocking on doors. Patrol arrived in the area spoke to a neighbor standing outside. The Neighbor stated the female left and walked down the street. Patrol drove down the street and observed a female waving her hands at me matching the description. Patrol observed several individuals around her. I advised Patrolman Kuncken over the radio.

Patrol stopped the vehicle and the female, later identified as Katelyn Lewandosky, hereinafter will be referred to as the accused. The accused came right up to the patrol's vehicle, and I had to state "back up" multiple times to the accused. Patrol was able to step out of the vehicle and the accused stated, "I am drunk and waiting for my father". Patrolman Kuncken was now talking to the accused.

Patrol then went over to the individuals that were standing at end of the driveway and patrol asked what happened. Patrol spoke to Madison Napp, she stated that accused was very nice and earlier in the day she was not so intoxicated. Madison stated the accused was going to the liquor store and gave her \$40 dollars to by her liquor. Madison stated she did not see her for 3 to 4 hours. Madison said she saw her later in the day and asked for her liquor or \$40 dollars back, the accused said to her I don't have your \$40 and then walked away. Madison stated she didn't care about her money, I am a pacifists. Madison's friend, Ed Nufrio stated he went over to the accused and said that I was told you took \$40 dollars from our friend and that you can give it back and stay or you can leave. He stated that the accused then took her phone out and said do you know who my dad is. Patrol advised the individuals will try and get her a ride home.

Patrol went back to Patrolman Kuncken and the accused. The accused was getting very irate while patrolman Kuncken was on the phone with dispatch. During this time, I was trying to direct traffic, waiting for dispatch to get a hold of the accused father. Patrolman Kuncken advised patrol that they are sending a car to the residence. I advised Patrolman Kuncken of what happened at the party with the accused.

Patrol was approached by a person who stated that she has a car here. Patrol followed the individual to a possible car that the accused may have been driving. Patrol gave the NJ registration of [REDACTED]. Dispatch advised Patrol that it is the accused father's vehicle and same address.

Patrol went back over to Patrolman Kuncken and the accused. Patrol then started directing traffic. While directing traffic patrol heard Patrolman Kuncken telling the accused to stop and stop walking way. Patrol rushed back over, and Patrolman Kuncken then restrained the accused from walking away to her car, due to her being intoxicated. Patrolman Kuncken let go of the accused and patrol advised we are giving you a chance. The accused was yelling and screaming at Patrolman Kuncken. The accused then began acting violently and screaming while walking towards Patrolman Kuncken. Patrols then attempted to arrest the accused at which she began tensing her arms and trying to walk away and not complying. Patrols used the arm bar technique to gain compliance as she continued to tense her arms and resist arrest.

Once the accused was handcuffed, Patrolman Kuncken escorted the accused to the back of his patrol vehicle. The accused was still acting irate and screaming. Patrol Unlocked Patrolman Kuncken's vehicle. While Patrolman Kuncken was placing the accused in the back of the vehicle, the door came flying out at me due to the accused kicking it. Patrolman Kuncken was then able to close and secure the door. The accused was then brought back to Police Headquarters for processing. See Patrolman Kuncken's report for further.

Patrolman Kuncken processed the accused and released the accused to her father Mr. David Lewandowsky. Patrols cleared.

Patrols then began responding to another high priority assignment. I then observed Patrolman Kuncken stop for a vehicle in the parking lot of town hall. Patrol then followed Patrolman Kucken to where he found the accused walking down Mansfield Dr.

Patrol Kuncken was now out with the accused on the street. The accused was screaming and yelling. Patrolman Kuncken was advising the accused that she will be going to the hospital. While

Patrolman Kuncken was talking to the accused, the accused was screaming and yelling. Lakeland EMS arrived on scene.

The accused then began walking quickly down the street between myself and Patrolman Kuncken. Patrolman Kuncken grabbed her arm to prevent her from walking away. Patrol was able to gain control of her one arm using an arm bar technique. The accused then was acting in a violent manner and was resisting police officer control. The accused then lunged toward Patrolman Kuncken. Patrols continued to struggle with the accused in an attempt to gain compliance and handcuff the accused. Patrolman Popelka from Stanhope Police Department arrived on scene and helped patrols. The accused was placed in the ambulance.

Patrol advised Patrolman Kuncken that he will be riding in the ambulance with the EMT's Patrol will follow the ambulance. Lakeland EMS transported the accused to Newton Hospital. Patrols cleared the hospital after the hospital staff secured the accused. Patrol cleared. EOR
