

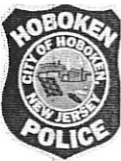

Today is Sunday, March 30th, 2014. I am working the 1601-0001 tour of duty while assigned to the Uniform Patrol Bureau. I am working with PO Figueroa in marked radio car #106. We are assigned to the southeast district under the supervision of Sgt. Brereton and Sgt. Cruz while under the command of Lt. Ferrante.

At approximately 1600 hrs, Lt Ferrante briefed the 1601-0001 tour officers of a missing person (see initial investigation report completed by PO Burke). Sgt. Brereton, PO Lucignano, PO Cirillo and I were assigned to assist with the ongoing missing person investigation. Sgt. Brereton and I physically checked the Hoboken University Medical Center (1635 hours), Jersey City Medical Center (1710 hours) and Christ Hospital (1730 hours). The registration database of each hospital was checked for the name Andrew Jarzyk as well as individuals entered into the system as unknown persons/John Doe's. These checks of the hospitals were met with negative results.

While Sgt. Brereton and I were checking the area hospitals, PO Lucignano and PO Cirillo responded to _____ Street, Jarzyk's address, and checked both the rear yard and basement area for evidence with negative results. The officers on scene then checked Jarzyk's apartment (number _____), along with roommates Chris Katsimagles and Michael Dill. I was advised that the officers found Jarzyk's plaid shirt and jeans that Jarzyk was wearing earlier in the evening on his bed. Car keys were left in the apartment, however, a wallet was not found indicating that Jarzyk took it with him when he left. PO Lucignano and PO Cirillo then responded to _____ Street where they spoke with Joseph Cassela, _____ and Leo Seickendick,

I was advised that Seickendick stated that at approximately 0200 hrs he observed a male on the shed in his rear yard. The male was confronted by John Ippolito in the yard and escorted to the front of the building through the basement after falling from the shed. The male was then observed walking south on Monroe Street towards 5th street. No further direction was provided from that point by Seickendick. Seickendick told PO Lucignano and PO Cirillo that the male was wearing a black under armour cap, neon type T-shirt over a black long sleeve spandex shirt, black spandex pants, black snow gloves and earbuds around his neck. It should be noted as indicated in the initial investigation report that this male was positively identified as Jarzyk by Ippolito utilizing a photograph which was shown to him by PO Burke. Ippolito was unable to be interviewed at that time as he was not home. After the interview, PO Lucignano and PO Cirillo checked neighboring buildings including basements and rooftops with negative results. Also checked was the entire waterfront including parks, the W hotel and the Sheraton hotel in Weehawken with

negative results.

Shortly thereafter, Sgt. Brereton and I arrived at _____ Street in an attempt to speak with Ippolito. Ippolito was home and invited us inside the residence to speak with him. Ippolito was cooperative with providing his account of the encounter and brought us in his yard to describe the incident. The account provided matched that provided by Seickendick earlier. A check of the yard was conducted with negative results. Joseph Cassela, who was also on scene during our interview, stated he was not home during the incident and arrived home at approximately 0300 hours only to hear about the incident from Ippolito. Seickendick also provided a clothing description which matched that which he provided to PO Lucignano and PO Cirillo earlier.

At Police Headquarters, I spoke with Jarzyk's Mother Beverly and Father Stephen.

It should be noted that no odd behavior has been exhibited recently by Jarzyk. Both parents stated that Jarzyk had recently been promoted at his place of employment (PNC in Bergen County, NJ) and was "very happy" with his life.

I contacted the AT&T exigent circumstances line (1800-635-6840) and after faxing an affidavit received a detailed report of Jarzyk's cellular phone activity from approximately 0001-0206 hrs. At approximately 0206 hrs, the phone was shut off. No activity other than incoming calls directly to voice mail was observed. The last known coordinate of the cellular device was logged as Longitude -74.037393, Latitude 40.742478. This coordinate was entered into Google Maps revealing a location of 507 4th Street. It should be noted that this coordinate is accurate to within one hundred meters in circumference. Sgt. Brereton along with Sgt. Cruz, PO Lucignano, PO Figueroa and several other officers assisted in a detailed search/canvass of the surrounding area of 507 4th Street. See supplemental investigation report completed by PO Lucignano. Printed copies of the cellular activity was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for investigation.

Notifications were made by Lt. Ferrante to Chief Anthony Falco, Captain Garcia and Captain Fitzsimmons. In addition, Jarzyk's physical and clothing description was announced via SPEN and LERN. Port Authority Police NJ Transit Police and NYPD harbor patrol were also notified. CO Shine contacted the Hudson County Jail who advised that no person with the name Andrew Jarzyk was incarcerated within the State of New Jersey. CO shine also contacted McCabe ambulance services and the Jersey City Medical Center EMS dispatch who both stated that no person with the name Andrew Jarzyk was transported to any of their receiving hospitals. Lt. Ferrante checked the Aoctele system for any possible summons/warrant complaints that were generated with negative results. A Hudson County Sheriffs Officer identified as Sheriff Stucy (201-915-1300) contacted police dispatch to advise that she observed a male fitting the provided

Today is Sunday, March 30th, 2014. I, Patrolman Joseph Lucignano #131, am currently assigned to uniform patrol working the 1601-0001hrs tour of duty. Today, I am under the command of Lieutenant Kenneth Ferrante and supervision of Sergeant Brian Brereton S-2, assigned to patrol district "southwest" with Patrolman John Cirillo #149.

At approximately 2100hrs, Sergeant Edgardo Cruz, Sergeant Brian Brereton, Patrolman Dennis Figueroa Jr #119 and I responded to the area of 507 4th Street as a result of a ping signal on the cellular phone belonging to Andrew Jarzyk. At this time, Patrolman Figueroa and I conducted a check on the East and West side of Madison and Monroe Street from 3rd to 5th Street with negative results. At approximately 2130hrs, Patrolman Figueroa Jr and I responded back to 507 4th Street and conducted a check of the entire building with Sergeant Brereton and Sergeant Cruz. A door to door notification was made by showing a recent photo of Andrew Jarzyk, as well as checking the garage and rooftop areas. Upon exiting the building, we met with friends and family members on the corner of 400 Jefferson Street. At this time, a set of white Iphone ear plugs were located by a family member on the ledge of 401 Jefferson Street, similar to the style Andrew was wearing when he was last seen. The property was given to Patrolman Matthew Isler. This property will be entered into property and evidence book page #19972 and stored inside locker #7. In addition, a search was conducted of Clock Towers by Sergeant Brereton along with members of the Hoboken Police Housing Bureau. A search was also conducted on Jefferson Street from 3rd to 5th of all vestibules, around and under parked cars and garbage cans. A check was also conducted inside the establishment of The Stewed Cow located on 400 Adams Street. Except for the ear buds found, we were unable to locate any further evidence regarding Andrew Jarzyk's disappearance.

At this time, Patrolman Figueroa Jr and I were advised by Sergeant Brereton to respond back to the area and obtain any additional information from residents regarding the disappearance of Andrew Jarzyk. Keri Weintraub, of unit 1, stated at approximately 0200hrs, she heard noises on the fire escape stairs but did not investigate because she was all alone and her fiancée Ryan Nitto was out of town. Bill Olsen, of unit 1, stated he heard noises outside approximately 0150hrs and spoke with Andrew's roommates a short time later regarding noises they were making in the hallway. Travis & Morgan Boyer, of unit 1, stated they observed a male walking up and down the fire escape approximately 0930hrs this morning, which turned out to be Andrew's roommate, Michael Dill, who was outside looking for him. Katie & Beth Montgomery, of unit 1, stated they last saw Andrew approximately 1800hrs last evening carrying groceries into the building from A&P supermarket. Patrolman Figueroa Jr and I conducted a check of the rooftop before exiting the building.

At this time, Patrolman Figueroa Jr and I responded to the parking lot at 700 Jackson Street with Michael Dill) to check on Andrew's Audi A4 bearing New Jersey Registration J. Patrolman Figueroa Jr and I did not locate Andrew nor any type of letter or note left inside the vehicle. Andrew's roommate was transported back to

upon completion of our search. While generating this report at police headquarters, police dispatch received a call from Nicole Montegary , basement apartment, Hoboken, NJ. Montegary stated she saw a photo posted on Instagram regarding the disappearance of Andrew Jarzyk, who was wearing a grey colored Ohio State baseball cap with a red "O". Montegary said approximately 1000-1100hrs this morning, she saw a cap fitting that description next to the gazebo at Pier A Park. A check was conducted with negative results by Sergeant Brereton and Patrolman Cirillo.

Today is Monday, April 28, 2014 and I am currently assigned to the Detective Bureau working the 1001-1801 hours tour of duty under the direct supervision of Detective sergeant Anthony Falco S-27 and the command of Detective Lieutenant Tony Bartley.

This report is based upon an ongoing investigation pertaining to missing person Andrew Jarzyk. Refer to the preliminary report and supplementary reports for complete details.

At approximately 1735 hours, Communications Officer Michael Losurdo informed Detective Lieutenant Tony Bartley and I that a body was discovered floating near the old boat dock of the New York Waterway Ferry Terminal located south east of the Lackawana Train Station. Refer to case # 14-23693.

At this time, Detective Lieutenant Tony Bartley, Detective Sergeant Brian Brereton S-2, Detective's Anthony Russo, David Dimartino and myself responded to the southeast area of the pier. Upon arrival, we were met by Sergeant Emollo of the New Jersey Transit Police Department who informed us that New York Waterway Captain, Vincent Lombardi (201) 446-2932 who was also on scene, discovered the body floating to the left of the ferry near a floating pier as he was docking. Mr. Lombardi immediately contacted the Hoboken Police upon his discovery. Soon thereafter, Hoboken Volunteer Ambulance #134 and Chief Anthony Falco arrived on scene.

Upon arrival, we observed what appeared to be an intact white male, who was floating with his front torso area exposed, but still clothed in a Susquehanna University black long sleeve shirt and black gloves. This being the same description said to have been worn by Mr. Andrew Jarzyk on the early morning of his disappearance on March 30, 2014. At this time, Detective Lieutenant Bartley contacted the NYPD Harbor Unit, who then responded to assist with the recovery. Members of the Harbor Unit on scene were as follows: Lt. Smerina, Lt. Williams, and Police Officer's Davitt #25512, Bravy #14889, and Cook #30729. Detective Lieutenant Brian Duval, Detective Sergeant Michael Crowe, and Detective Matt Kickey of the Hudson County Prosecutor's Office Homicide Unit were also contacted and responded. At approximately 1754, Communications Officer Michael Losurdo contacted the North Regional Medical Examiner's Office and spoke to Rose Wilson, who informed him that Mr. Steven Cicala will be responding.

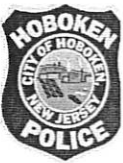

Once the Harbor Unit arrived, they positioned themselves between the concrete pier and the body, then successfully hoisted the body onto the pier. At this time, I was able to complete my observation of the body. The male's lower extremities were clothed in black shorts over long Under Armour brand pants, and what appeared to be black dress socks rolled down to his ankles, along with black and yellow sneakers. This also was described as being worn by Mr. Jarzyk on the early morning of his disappearance. By this time, Detective Kickey of the Homicide Unit photographed the corpse, along with the scene.

At 1838 hours, Hoboken Fire Department Battalion Chief Jason Casessa and several other fire personnel arrived on scene and provided a blue tarp to cover the body. At 1901 hours, Medical Examiner Steven Cicala arrived on scene and also photographed the corpse along with the scene. As means of identification, we were looking for a tattoo of a catholic cross, positioned on the right ribcage area, along with the name "JARZYK" inscribed within the center. Medical Examiner Cicala then rolled the corpse on it's left side and raised up the tee-shirt allowing us to clearly observe the tattoo. Mr. Jarzyk was described as having. Both Medical Examiner Cicala and Detective Kickey photographed the tattoo. Once complete, the body was placed in a cadaver pouch and transported to the North Regional Medical Examiner's Office located at 325 Norfolk Street Newark, NJ 07103 to be autopsied.

Today is Wednesday, May 07, 2014 and I, Detective William Vera D-44, am working the 0801-1601 hours tour of duty. I am currently assigned to the Detective Bureau, under the supervision of Detective Sergeant Anthony P. Falco, Jr. S-27 and under the direct command of Lieutenant Tony Bartley.

This report is based upon an investigation concerning the disappearance of Mr. Andrew Jarzyk, who was reported missing by his roommates on Sunday, March 30, 2014. Refer to the preliminary investigation and supplementary investigation reports for full details pertaining to the incident.

On Tuesday, April 29, 2014 at 0945 hours, I arrived at the North Regional Medical Examiner's Office, located at 325 Norfolk Street, Newark, New Jersey, for Mr. Jarzyk's autopsy. The Medical Examiner's Office case number is 09-14-0431.

Dr. Di Wong and his Medical Technician, Ms. Danielle Sadowski, performed the autopsy. A positive identification was made through the utilization of Forensic Odontology and several personal identifiers.

Once the autopsy was completed, Dr. Wong explained that there were no signs of injuries or trauma caused to the body which would be indicative of foul play. A cause and manner of death was not officially determining pending further medical studies. Ms. Sadowski took post mortem fingerprints and she also provided a compact disc depicting all the photographs taken of Mr. Jarzyk during the procedure.

Prior to me leaving the facility, Dr. Wong explained it would take approximately 3 to 4 months for the death certificate to be issued. If the family had any questions, they could contact him for assistance.

The fingerprints and compact disc were marked W.V. D-44, Blotter #16986-14 and 05/07/2014. The items were entered into Property/Evidence and the information was listed in the logbook on page #20098.
