AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF AN ARREST WARRANT
LAKEWOOD PD CASE # 25-026008
STATE VS. MOSHE EHRLICH
2ND DEGREE ENDANGERING THE WELFARE OF A CHILD

The following will detail the factual basis for criminal charges regarding the joint investigative actions of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, the Lakewood Police Department, the Ocean County Sheriff's Department, and the Ocean County Medical Examiner into the death of [REDACTED]. Any mention of investigative findings and statements taken should be considered abridged summaries, shortened for the necessity of brevity.

On March 18th, 2025, at approximately 1346 hours I, Officer Ganley was approached by Sergeant Kearns within the detective bureau. Sergeant Kearns informed me that I would be responding to Monmouth Medical Center Southern Campus in reference to a child who was left in a vehicle. At the time of our conversation, there was no other information available about the condition of the child. As I arrived at Monmouth Medical Center Southern Campus, I observed a Hatzolah ambulance arrive. I also observed several members of Hatzolah performing Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) while entering the hospital.

At 12 5th Street, patrol units located a vehicle that was identified as being involved in this incident, specifically the car that the child was recovered from. The car was parked on the street in front of 14 5th Street, Lakewood, NJ. The vehicle, a Toyota Sienna bearing NJ registration [REDACTED] was secured by Lakewood Police Officers pending application of a search warrant. The registered owner of the vehicle was identified as Yeruchem Ehrlich of [REDACTED]. It should be noted that Detective Joseph Mitchell (OCPO MCU) responded to Monmouth Medical Center Southern Campus to assist me with the investigation. Detective Mitchell and I met with the parents of the child, Yeruchem Ehrlich and Faiga Ehrlich as well as their attorney, Yosef Jacobowitz. While Detective Mitchell and I were at the hospital, the child was pronounced deceased at 1440 hrs by Dr. Zipagan. Det. Mitchell informed me that Jacobowitz asked him if it would be possible for the parents to admit that the child was left in the car and that caused the death in order to facilitate a "virtual" autopsy in a more expedited fashion.

Detective Bromley of the Ocean County Prosecutors office notified SAP Mara Brater and relayed the pertinent facts of the investigation that had been learned thus far. Utilizing the CourtSmart recording application through the Ocean County Radio Room, a telephonic search warrant was requested for the involved vehicle as well as Moshe Ehrlich's cellular phone (By OCPO). The Honorable Kenneth Palmer approved the search warrant at 1520 hours. Detective Cirz of the Ocean County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene in order to process the vehicle. At the time of reading (1545 hrs.), the outside temperature was determined to be 67.8 degrees and the ambient temperature inside the vehicle was determined to be 96.2 degrees. The vehicle was towed to the Ocean County Sheriff's Office for a search warrant execution.

While at Monmouth Medical Southern Campus, we asked the parents if they would voluntarily come to the Lakewood Police Department to participate in a statement. I responded to the Lakewood Police Department in order to take statements from Mr. And Mrs. Ehrlich. Mr. Jacobowitz (Attorney) was present for both interviews. Detective Bromley and I first conducted

a statement of Faiga Ehrlich. During the statement, Mrs. Ehrlich said that on this day, her husband was responsible for dropping off 4 of their 6 children. She said that he is normally only responsible for 3 children, including the decedent. On this day, their 6-year-old child missed the bus, so Moshe was tasked with taking their 6-year-old to school as well. She said that she left for work at 9:30 am, and she received a call from Moshe saying that he had forgotten the decedent's milk at home and had to go back to retrieve it. She said that she last spoke to Moshe via phone before he returned home to get the decedent's milk and other supplies. She said that she assumed that Moshe would drop the decedent at his babysitters at [REDACTED] at approximately 1100 am. Mrs. Ehrlich said that she received a text message from the babysitter, Esther Kitay, at approximately 12:18 pm complaining that the decedent was late to be dropped off. She said that she did not see the message until approximately 1:30 pm. She said that when she got the message, she called Moshe but he did not answer his phone. She said that she then called the emergency line at Moshe's school where he was praying to make contact with him. She said that she again spoke to Moshe after the decedent was being transported to the hospital and said that they both just agreed to "pray." She indicated that the decedent was in good health and last went to the doctor on Sunday, where he was given a clean bill of health. Mrs. Ehrlich and Mr. Yacobowitz consented to us viewing and photographing Mrs. Ehrlich's cellular phone to document the phone calls and texts in reference to this incident. Mrs. Ehrlich signed an Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Digital Evidence Consent to Search Form. We confirmed the text received from the babysitter and the subsequent phone calls within Mrs. Ehrlich's cell phone. The photos taken of her phone were added to evidence.com under the Lakewood PD case number by Detective Bromley.

After speaking to Mrs. Ehrlich, we conducted a recorded statement with Moshe Ehrlich. Mr. Jacobowitz was present for the statement, acting as Ehrlich's attorney. Before asking Ehrlich any case related questions, Detective Bromley read him his Miranda Rights from a Lakewood PD Miranda Rights Form. Mr. Ehrlich indicated that he understood his rights and agreed to provide a statement with his attorney present. Mr. Ehrlich said that on this day, he left his house initially at 8:30 am to pray, returning at 9:20 am. He said that when he returned home, he got his 4 and 2-year-old dressed and got the children (6, 4, 2 and decedent) into the van. He said that because he had to drop his 6-year-old off at school, he took the Toyota Sienna on this day, where he normally drives the families Toyota Camry. He said that normally he drops the decedent off at the babysitter first (located at [REDACTED]), but when he arrived at the babysitter's house, he realized that he left the decedent's milk at home. He said that he decided to drop the other children (6, 4, 2) off at their respective destinations before returning home to retrieve the items he forgot. He said that he successfully dropped the 6-year-old at school and the 4 and 2 year old off at their daycare. He said that he returned home, ran inside and retrieved the items that he needed before returning to his car. Mr. Ehrlich said that he then proceeded to his school (Beth Medresh Goroha), which is located on Princeton Ave between 6th and 7th Street, forgetting to drop the decedent off at the babysitter's house. He said that he parked on 5th Street, which is where he normally parks his car for school. Mr. Ehrlich estimated that he arrived to school at approximately 11 am. He said that at 1:30 pm, someone from the school notified him that he had a call on the emergency phone of the school, reserved for family members who need to reach students at the school in emergency situations. He said that before he got to the phone, a man who he believed was the decedent's babysitter's son approached him in the school and asked him, "where is your baby?" He said that he gathered his belongings and ran to his vehicle. He said that

he got to the car, removed the decedent and called Hatzolah. He said that Hatzolah responded to the scene and transported the decedent to the hospital. Mr. Ehrlich detailed several methods he took to remember to drop the decedent off at the babysitter, including asking his wife to remind him to drop the child, and using his hat as a reminder, placing it in the passenger seat while he was driving. He said that this method failed to remind him that the decedent was in the back seat and needed to be dropped off.

A virtual autopsy was performed at Monmouth Medical Center, Southern Campus at 1830 hours on March 18th, 2025. It was then determined that a full post-mortem autopsy would take place on March 19th, 2025 at approximately 1000 hours at Community Medical Center. I then responded and sat in on that autopsy on that date and time.

After the full autopsy, Doctor Mazari stated that there did not appear to be any trauma to the descendant's body. He also added that he would not be able to determine the cause of death until the cultures that he took can be tested. I am currently waiting on those results. At that time, we concluded the autopsy.

Detective Bromley and I then responded to [REDACTED] to speak with Esther Kitay about the incident. Ms. Kitay stated that she been caring for the descendant for approximately two months. She went on to say that the descendant usually arrives around 1020 and 1030 hours each day. She stated that on March 18th, 2025, she sent a text message to the descendant's mother stating that he never arrived. Ms. Kitay stated that she then provided the emergency phone number at BMG to the descendant's mother. When she ended the call, she instructed her 19-year-old son Zevi to run to the school and look for Mr. Ehrlich. Her son then immediately ran to the school and located Mr. Ehrlich, who then frantically ran to the car. We asked Ms. Kitay if there was anything that she had to add about the situation. Ms. Kitay stated that the child always appeared to be well kept and not ill. She added that the family is usually very attentive to their children.

On March 19th, 2025, the abovementioned facts were presented to Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Mara Brater. SAP Brater approved the charge associated with complaint for Moshe Ehrlich: 2nd DEGREE ENDANGERING THE WELFARE OF A CHILD in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:24-4A(2).
