Purpose: This Affidavit/Certification is to more fully describe the facts of the alleged offense so that a judge or authorized judicial officer may determine probable cause.

1. Description of relevant facts and circumstances which support probable cause that (1) the offense(s) was committed and (2) the defendant is the one who committed it:

On October 11th, 2019, members of the Barnegat Township Crime Reduction Unit (herein referred to as CRU) were in the area of Big Lots Parking Lot (580 North Main Street Barnegat, New Jersey) conducting surveillance and observed the following: A white female later identified as Jaymee Tice exit her vehicle, a 2002 Toyota SUV bearing KY REG: [REDACTED] and enter a white Nissan Maxima bearing NJ REG: [REDACTED] and depart the area. Jaymee Tice's vehicle remained stationary occupied by two black male occupants in the rear seat later identified as Gerald Spence and Julian Johnson. While the vehicle remained stationary, a white male later identified as Kevin Tice exited Big Lots and entered the driver seat of Jaymee Tice's vehicle. Kevin Tice drove the Toyota SUV bearing KY REG: [REDACTED] from 580 North Main Street Barnegat, New Jersey and travel directly to the Wawa parking lot (550 North Main Street Barnegat, New Jersey). At this time, Kevin Tice and the aforementioned black male occupants remained stationary for approximately fifteen minutes. At this time, the aforementioned white Nissan Maxima bearing NJ REG: [REDACTED] pulled into the Wawa parking lot (550 North Main Street) and dropped off Jaymee Tice. Jaymee Tice immediately walked up to, and entered the passenger side front seat of the Toyota SUV bearing KY REG: [REDACTED] and it began to depart the area. The aforementioned Toyota, exited the Wawa parking lot (550 North Main Street Barnegat, New Jersey) at which time the driver, Kevin Tice made an improper turn. A motor vehicle stop was conducted by CRU for same. The vehicle failed to immediately stop and drove to 425 North Main Street Barnegat, New Jersey where it came to a complete to a stop. Jaymee Tice was advised of her Miranda Rights which she acknowledged she understood same. This Affiant conducted an interview from Miranda on with Jaymee Tice, who related the following: She met with Josh LNU, who was in a white Maxima and performed a sexual act in exchange for \$60.00. The two black males in the back seat had heroin and gave her one (1) bundle of heroin for her and her husband driving them up to Barnegat. She was given a bag containing heroin by her husband, who received it from Spence, once they realized the police were stopping them. She was told to hide the drugs by Spence. Jaymee Tice was placed under arrest. Kevin Tice was advised of his Miranda Rights which he verbally acknowledged he understood same.

Gerald Spence and Julian Johnson were advised of their Miranda Rights which they verbally acknowledged they understood same. This Affiant conducted an interview with Spence from Miranda on who related the following: He took a ride up and knows nothing about any drugs. Nothing is his. Spence was placed under arrest. This Affiant conducted an interview from Miranda on with Johnson, who related the following: He does not have any drugs and nothing is his. He smoked weed earlier on the ride up with Spence. Johnson was placed under arrest.

3. If victim was injured, provide the extent of the injury:

A female matron (Patrolman Keilitz) arrived on scene and searched Jaymee Tice at which time approximately 60 white wax paper folds marked "\$ 3.14" in black containing powder (suspect heroin) was recovered. A subsequent search of the Toyota SUV bearing KY REG: [REDACTED] was conducted at which time one white wax paper fold containing residue (suspect heroin) was recovered. All subjects were transported by marked patrol units to Barnegat Police Headquarters.
