APPD Gents:

Thanks for participating in this program. As you will soon hear and learn, this works. I'm glad Asbury is diving in. As we have seen in Howell, Belmar and Hazlet, a robust use of a recovery specialist program can put a big dent in the high fatal overdose rates you see in your area, while also saving you valuable police response resources. They have also seen Narcan spray rates fall as well, which is a good side-effect from employing this program.

It's truly a simple program – when an officer in your department either: (1) revives an overdose with Narcan or (2) arrests an individual for a small, low-level crime (think narcotics possession, shoplifting, minor burglary, DP), you need only *call the recovery specialist at the point of revival from Narcan or arrest*. Lifeline works in mobile fashion, will come out to your department, and are successful in convincing these at-risk people to accept treatment. From there, they (not your departments) obtain a clinical assessment and find that person a treatment facility to best treat their level of addiction.

As for any criminal charges being diverted, this is a separate assessment from the introduction of the recovery specialist. If it's an indictable, then we'll work with you in that regard. If it's a municipal court matter, you can make that determination with your municipal prosecutors. Remember though, regardless of charges being diverted, *it makes good sense to utilize the recovery specialists at the point of arrest or revival*.

As first responders in Asbury, you are the most important part of this whole thing. Key to success is ensuring your officers know to call Lifeline after a Narcan spray or an arrest of someone who has a substance abuse problem. Thanks and please let us know if you have questions, we are here to help facilitate your participation in the Cuffs to Beds Program.

Chiefs,

I totally agree. Unfortunately, we're on pace to exceed last year's overdose deaths and as you can see a significant number of **OD deaths and naloxone deployments** occur within your respective AOR (see the attached). Regardless of which recovery specialist group your department chooses to use, it's critical to call them as soon as possible at the incident of arrest and even those that receive naloxone. Some are receiving multiple naloxone deployments which ties your officers up and prevents them from doing crime prevention and other enforcement related work. Most, if not all, recovery specialists will respond to your department or scene between 20 and 35 mins after being contacted. As you all know, these folks are recovering addicts themselves and are very successful in convincing at-risk people to accept treatment. I also believe for this to work effectively, it needs to be mandated in some form within your respective department. In addition to the still maps, I've also attached a google earth map (once the google map opens, move the cursor to the US and NJ) which will show you the exact address for each event. Many received naloxone and several days later same died from an OD.

Gents,

Did a good story with nj.com on the "Cuffs to Beds" opioids diversion program earlier this week. We named your towns, among several others, that will be participating in the program. Per the attached "heat" maps, the Asbury/Neptune and Long Branch areas have suffered from higher statistics of fatal overdose rates over the past two years. As we have seen in Howell, Belmar and Hazlet, a robust use of a recovery specialist program can put a big dent in these statistics, while also saving you valuable police response resources.

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Chiefs Hunt and Kelso have had preliminary conversations with John Brogan at Lifeline for this program; Chief Roebuck is leaning towards Howell's group with CFC Loud and Clear. Whatever you decide, but I want to get your towns up and running ASAP. I need your help in getting this to the point of muscle memory for your officers. There's nothing magical or difficult about it. TO make it work, I just need you to make it a strategic priority in your towns. As Prosecutor, I'm calling it a strategic priority for this entire county, and I need your towns to come online considering the high fatal overdose rates in your jurisdictions. By way of example, Belmar has done this for the past 2 years and successfully steered nearly 100 people towards treatment through this process. They have yet to have a single re-arrest. As a collateral benefit, their Narcan sprays have fallen during this period too.

When can we start? Chief McCabe – feel free to supplement where necessary. Thank you for the prompt attention to this request.

Manalapan: began Cuffs to Beds Oct. 1 – to date, utilized recovery specialists 4x with a 75% success rate in convincing at-risk individual (ARI) to accept some level of treatment. Use Lifeline as primary contact; Seabrook as secondary contact. Since rollout, they have had single incident of re-overdose of a person who refused treatment, and he refused again. I forgot to give these stats to Alex.
