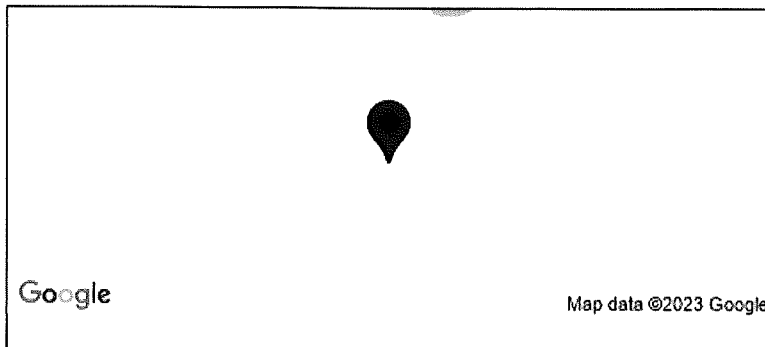

The dogs are gone. Horses are at Iron Ranch and the horse farm was paid some money to board the horses until they can be moved. That arrangement is between the farm and the horse owner. Closing if necessary will reopen.

I spoke with John. He stated that hes been in contact with Tina and she stated that today they are setting up the pens for housing the dogs where she is staying (I believe Williamstown, have not gotten a definite answer on that but I know its not in the township) tomorrow she is picking up the dogs. If she has a transportation issue it will be Saturday. John advised that it seems that Tina has a much more organized plan than earlier in the week. He will keep me up to date. I told John that I would call him before the end of my shift tomorrow for an update OR if the dogs leave before my call to please call me and advise me that they have left.

Tina did not come into headquarters yesterday. I did return her call but unable to leave a message due to full v/m. I am not sure why she wanted to come to headquarters but will update if I speak to her

I received a v/m from Tina saying she was confused and thought I was taking the dogs. John had advised me that he would keep Tina up-to-speed on everything. She stated she is going to the municipal building at 1pm today with the dogs. I returned her call but got v/m and it states the v/m is full so unable to leave a message.

I spoke with John this morning. The Herons are giving Tina 1 week to either take the dogs or find another spot. I confirmed with John Sept 30. I advised John that I would call him towards the end of the week to check on their progress. According to Kathy McGuire who contacted me last night. Tina is going to get the dogs rabies vaccinations today, hopefully. I did not call Tina as yesterday when I called her she was very argumentative. I am not looking for a confrontation and will check in with John to make sure everyone is staying proactive. I did not get to finish our conversation as the call dropped. I tried calling back but got v/m. I did leave him a message stating to call me if he needs anything and that I would contact him later in the week

I called John Heron as well as Tina. I spoke with John and advised him that if the dogs are not off the property tomorrow 9/24 6 am that we will be taking the dogs to the shelter and potentially being charged with Harboring Unlicensed dogs with the Township. John is beyond willing to comply and understands our position. He is trying to get ahold of Tina as well. When I tried to notify her, I received v/m and left a detailed message stating she has until 9/24 6am to remove the dogs from the property otherwise we will transport to the shelter. John also advised that Tina picked up 1 dog, Buster so there are 4 remaining. I also called John back to let him know I did not speak with Tina and he stated he is currently trying to get ahold of her. Mr Gallagher is also aware of the potential charges as well as possibly transporting the dogs to the shelter. I will reach out to the shelter and advise them I may be bringing in 4 dogs as well.

I called and spoke with John Heron. I explained that there had been complaints about new dogs on the property and that this was a temporary thing so I wouldnt have to take the dogs to the shelter. His response was; "absolutely". I asked John if either him or Kim could call Tina and advise her or try to establish if she has a plan in place. John advised that he couldn't do it "right now" but will def speak with her today when Tina comes over to see the dogs. John stated that Tina is coming over this afternoon and that he would keep me advised as to what the plan is and call me later. I thanked John for his time, understanding and cooperation and to please call me back at a better time and after he's spoken to Tina. He said he would.

I feel I would be remiss if I did not mention that prior to the horse trailer even arriving at the property, Tina was already laying under the tree up the road. I was told this by the trailer driver when he arrived at the property. Sheriff's Office Morine also drove up the road to see where Tina had ridden to after she left the property via horseback. I believe he also saw her up the road by the tree. When the horse trailer left, we then went to see Tina up the road and it was then she had stated she was thrown. It is my belief that the trailer going past and her already being on the ground is a complete fabrication of how the events went down. I will reach out to John Heron and see if he can talk to Tina to get the dogs removed from the property and update in the internal notes portion of the request

I called Tina this morning to see if she had a plan in place to move the dogs from the Heron property. Tina was very defensive and argumentative. I advised her one of the reasons I called her was because my boss, wanted to make sure the dogs were not staying at the Herons and that he had received calls about new dogs coming onto the property. Tina insists that I am "busting" her when she was thrown out of her house with no notice and that the reason she was thrown from the horse was because the horse trailer went past her with the horse whinnying and thats what caused her to get thrown. She demanded to know who told me or made the decision to trailer Chief off the property since she had until 3pm to move the animals. I advised her that was not the case that the new property owner told the Sheriff that the dogs could stay there until 3pm NOT the horses. She demanded questions to be answered! She advised that she was recording the entire conversation and demanded to know my boss' name. I kept trying to reel Tina back in to the initial question I had which was: Is there a plan in place to move the dogs? I reiterated that I was not "bustin" her and that I've always been respectful to her and was just staying up to date on the whole issue. She stated she has a broken back and tailbone and how dare me make her make accommodations when things are fine with the dogs at the Herons. I explained that I did not want to take the dogs to the shelter and was giving her an opportunity on that day to temporarily house her animals. She stated she has an attorney and that the eviction was illegal and she received no notice that she would have to go that day (Wed 9/18). I again tried reeling her back to the initial topic of getting the dogs off the

property a the Herons. I terminated the conversation but advised her that I would be terminating the conversation prior to doing so but she just kept on ranting about how her world was turned upside down and she had no knowledge that the eviction was going to happen that day. She demanded to know who told me to remove the animals? I advised her that the Sheriff and new property owner advised Animal Control that the animals had to go NOW.

At the end of shift yesterday I called Andrew to see if Shelly picked up the horses. Andrew advised that Shelly called him and advised him that she would come tomorrow (9/19) and pay him for 1 mos. board to keep the horses at Iron Horse. I advised Andrew to have them sign a 1 mos contract with them and that the Township is not involved in these negotiations or contractual obligations. This is an agreement between Shelly and Iron Horse. He stated he understood and that Shelly told him she was coming today with the money. I will update after speaking with anyone regarding this case in this portion of the report.

Before we left with the dogs the new owner Subash Rashatwar originally was going to work with Tina and give her until 3 pm to get the dogs off the property and then meet Animal Control back at the property was called, by myself and advised that all animals are off the property with the exception of a few cats and that I would trap the cats for him if he needs at a future time.

Myself and ACO Kavafes then proceeded to unload the dogs at the Heron's back pens which are not being used because they rehomed numerous dog. This is only a temporary situation and I advised the Herons that I would work with them in setting up the dogs. We successfully transferred the dogs placing them all in their own enclosures with the exception of Buster & Molly who are housed together. John brought buckets water and an additional dog house. The Herons will get in contact with Tina for arrangements to pick up the dogs. I then transported two kittens to the shelter and marked them as stray.

We then went back to 501 to load some of the dogs. ACO Kavafes and i loaded the 2 dogs that could "be together" into her vehicle. I took the 2 younger dogs from their pens and put one dog in my vehicle and one in a crate in the back of the Herons vehicle. The 5th dog which was more isolated from the pack and did not have a collar and according to Tina was a fear biter. Using my control stick I was able to gain control of the dog and get it into a carrier and John Heron and myself carried the carrier to his car and loaded it. With all the animals off the property and the locks already changed while all this going on we then proceeded to the Herons on Church to help set up their temporary situation.

When we stopped at where Tina was laying on the ground holding the horses reins, we learned that she was thrown from the horse. (Boots, large Draft). Tina had called a friend who was also on location, Shelly Good, 854 Raritan Rd., Waterford Twp ph [REDACTED]. Shelly had called for an ambulance for Tina. I then called Andrew to turn around and we would attempt to load Boots in with Chief. Shelly stated that the horses could go to he home and we were under the assumption that she had a property that could facilitate the horses and she would work something out with her friend. Andrew arrived along with Ptlm Wells who was dispatched for the ambulance call. We were successful in loading Boots onto the trailer with Chief. It was at this time we learned that Shelly had no horse experience and was going to tie the horses to trees in her yard until her husband came home and they would figure it out. We then determined that the horses would be better off going with Andrew to Iron Horse and held there until Shelly's husband could come home and they would go and pick the horses up with their trailer.

She had made no arrangements for removing/placing or taking any of her animals. 5 Pit Bulls, 2 horses, and numerous cats. When asked what her plans were she stated she was trying to contact her friend, the Herons to temporarily keep her dogs. Rather than waste time I drove to the Herons and met with Kim and John and advised them of the situation. The Heron's said that yes they could and would help Tina as she was on old friend. I advised them to bring at least 3 crates to the property and we would help them load and unload the dogs. I went back to 501 Erial and Tina was riding off on her horse. she rode down Erial Rd and we did not know where she was going. I called Andrew to come to the property and we loaded the 1 horse (Chief, Appolosa) into his trailer. We then went down to Tina who was at a property further down the road.

On 9/18 myself and ACO Kavafes went to assist the CCSD enforce an eviction. When we arrived the new owner was on scene. He advised Tina was there and she stated she had a gun and for him not to come onto the property. We call PD for assistance; Capt Leahy, Lt Pizicco, Ptlm Cobian, Ptlm Boyle Ptlm Urban responded and all approached the residence. Once it was determined that there was no gun they called us in. I had called Andrew Hamilton earlier to ask if he could standby if needed. In the beginning there was an issue as to whether the eviction would happen as the resident stated that she had filed an extension. Office Morine (CCSD) called and advised Tina that although she did fill out the paperwork she did not pay the \$25 filing fee and that the eviction was taking place.

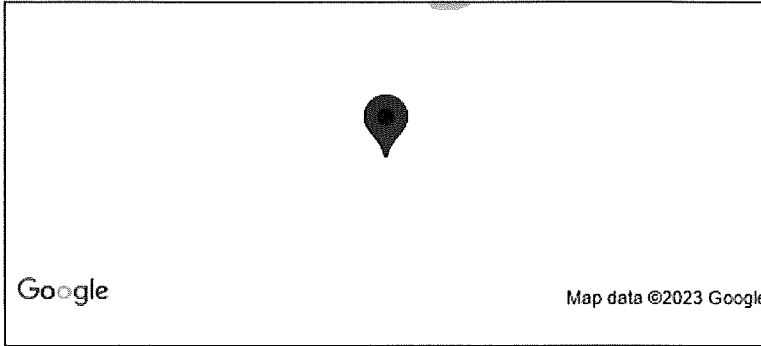

I met with Tina to advise her of the complaint. An anonymous caller said the horses had not been fed for five days. I asked Tina if she was having a dispute with a former friend and she said a girlfriend of hers had come over this morning and they had gotten into an argument. She felt that was where the complaint had come from. Within the hour PD had been called with the complaint.

Tina walked me to the barn and showed me the horses. They were in the shade and had water. She showed me several empty bags of horse grain and said she was expecting a delivery of more that morning. The large bay horse "Boots" was in good body condition, and the appaloosa, "Chief" was on the thin side. She noted that to me and said they had both just been wormed. She said Chief paces when he is inside the barn causing him to have a hard time keeping weight on. The complaint is unfounded at this time. Dispute with a former friend.

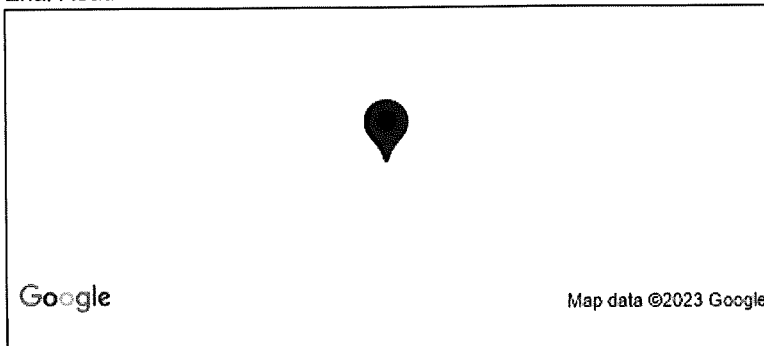

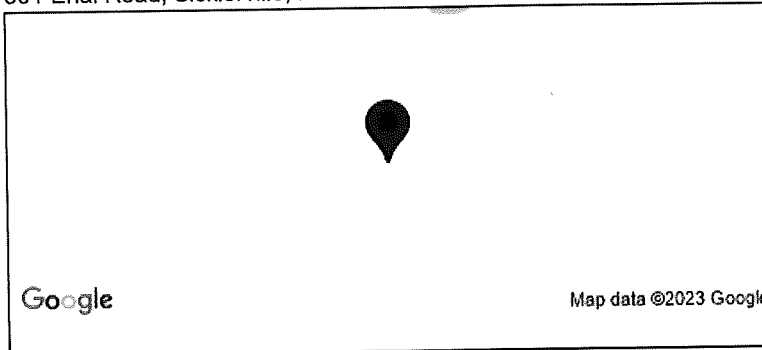

The owner of the property Robin Curran was killed in a motor vehicle crash the previous Thursday. There are 3 pigs, 4 horses, approximately 8 cats, a small flock of chickens and 2 ducks. Two of the horses belong to Tina Dace. Tina advised that she was getting some food for the animals today and I advised that I would return to follow up. I also obtained Robin's daughters phone (Judy Curran [REDACTED] number and will try to make contact with her.

Reason Closed

All of the animals that could be removed have been. There is a horse and some cats remaining. The residents stopped cooperating and were hindering our final attempts to remove the animals. The remaining animals will have to stay on location and will be the responsibility of those residing here.

Description

I was dispatched for a dead horse, dispatch advised that there was a Veterinarian on location. When I arrived I met with Sharron Curran AKA Robin Curran she is the owner of the property and owner of the horse. The vet, Dr, Sandy Strilec was present and 2 other women, one I knew as Tina Dace the other is not known to me. The horse was identified as a gelding known as "Walker". My conversation with Dr. Strilec, Curran and Dace left questions as to the cause of the injuries (Dr. Strilec had already euthanized the horse). The horse was laying on its right side. There was an open wound on the left side of the neck. Dr. Strilec told me that it was a small puncture wound but she had opened it with a scalpel in order to explore the wound. Dr. Strilec could not determine what the cause of the injury was but there was hard foreign matter in the wound and it wasn't clear if it was bone. There was also blood present on the horses throat. Both front hooves were broken completely free of the adjacent bones in the lower legs. The left front hoof was almost completely torn off only remaining attached by the skin on the front of the hoof. The right hoof was also broken completely free from the lower leg bones but was not torn off like the other hoof. The under side of the right hoof had a hole in it that went up into the foot and light was visible coming from the upper rear part of the hoof. The question that remained was if the injuries were gun shot wounds ? I explored the opening on the neck and probed the entire interior of the wound but could not find a pathway for a projectile to have penetrated. I could feel the hard material in the wound but whatever it was it was not in proximity to any bones and felt like the surrounding tissues had grown around it, It could not be moved. I concluded that whatever the foreign material was it had been in the horses body for a period of time long enough to allow for healing and encapsulation. Therefore it did not appear to be a contributing factor to the current circumstances. I explored the bloody area on the throat and found no opening. We concluded that the blood was drainage from the injection site when the horse was euthanized. I used a metal detector and scanned the left side of the horses body with greater focus on the known wound sites. There was no metal detected during this scan. We rolled the horse over and scanned the right side for metal, again with no metal detected. We examined the horses hoofs with a focus on the soft tissues that had previously connected the hoof to the lower leg. The tissues had large irregular edges on both sides of the opening. This is indicative of a traumatic tearing and is not consistent with the tissues having being cut with a sharp edged tool, having been sawn, or having been cut by constriction such as with a wire. Closer observation of the right hoof and the hole in that hoof showed that some of the bone structure between the hoof and lower leg was missing. The ends of the bones were generally jagged with longitudinal fractures present, but the ends of the broken bones were rounded and compressed. Part of the remaining bone structure lined up with the hole when the hoof was compressed manually back up in line with the bones. During the investigation Curran stated that this was one of her rescue horses. I asked Curran if the horse had come in severely malnourished and she acknowledged that it had. The conclusion based on the evidence is that the horse most likely had weakened bone structure as a result of its long term previous malnourishment and general neglect, resulting in bone decalcification. Something spooked the horse causing him to rear up and come down hard on his front feet. The weakened bone structures failed. The horse continued to try to walk on the broken legs causing the extensive soft tissue damage and almost complete trauma amputation of the left front hoof and the penetrating injury to the right front hoof with the corresponding bone loss and compression of the long bones.

Reason Closed

Cause of injuries does not appear to be gun shots. Although it cant be ruled out, there is no evidence that there was any foul play involved. It appears to be a tragic accident.

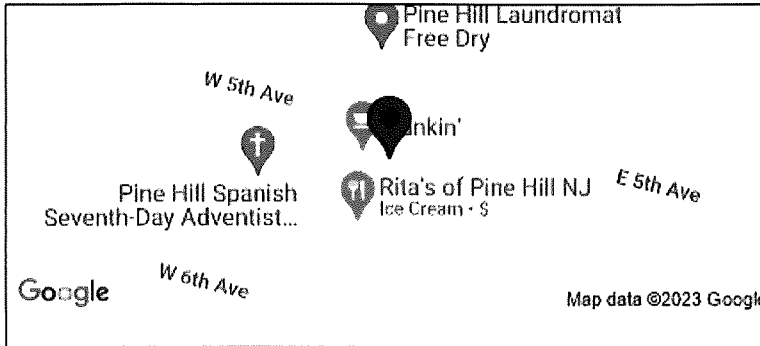

I received a call from Theresa Cooper of the NJSPCA. Cooper told me that the SPCA had a complaint about the condition of 2 horses at this location. The 2 horses are "Boots" and large draft cross and "Chief" and Appaloosa. We are familiar with these horses and the owner due to previous issues. We found that Boots is slightly thin but not dangerously so. His hooves are overgrown and the edges are starting to crack and chip. The condition of the hooves does not appear to be impacting his gate. Chief's body mass appears to be adequate and his hooves do not appear to be overgrown. We met with the land owner Robin who said that Tina feeds sometimes and that she feeds sometimes. Robin also said that Tina had just wormed the horse last week. Internal parasites may be a contributing factor in Boot's lower body score. Theresa and I agree that we will give these horses some time and monitor them to be sure they are receiving adequate feed and that the hooves are cared for.

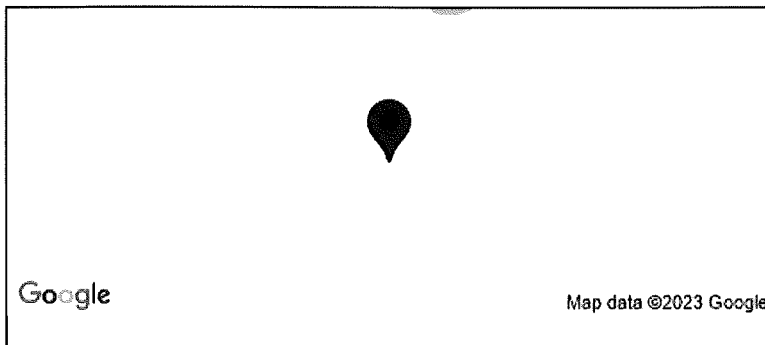
