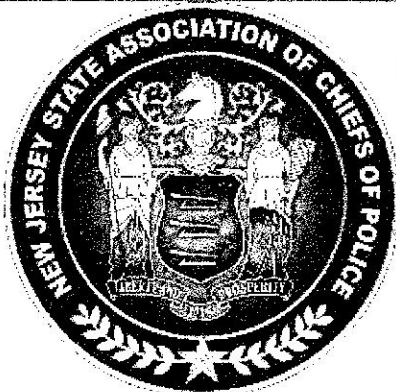

Chiefs -

On June 28, 2018, the Asbury Park Press published a cartoon in its editorial section that was clearly a poor attempt at political satire. Rather than encourage thoughtful discussion the cartoon was offensive to its directed audience; law enforcement and communities of color. Publishing a cartoon, such as this, was intended to be no more than incendiary in nature, and simply for the purposes of selling more newspapers.

The cartoon, see below, depicts a young person of color speaking, presumably to his mother, in what appears to be their home. He is wearing a costume, complete with white hood, that is commonly associated with the "Ku Klux Klan." This young man tells his mother that he is wearing these clothes so that he is not "hassled" by the police. The next scene of the cartoon has the young man passing by what looks like a headline related to a police shooting involving "another unarmed black man."

A reference of any kind to the Ku Klux Klan is insulting and reprehensible and relating it to current police/community relations is appallingly insensitive. We in New Jersey law enforcement are outraged by this unjustified attack on our profession and strongly feel that this, in no way, is an accurate reflection of the ongoing collaborative efforts undertaken with the communities we serve. We have, for example, collectively engaged in substantial and meaningful interaction and communication with communities of color to increase diversity within our ranks. In short, we are very much engaged in processes seeking solutions, increasing trust and reducing tensions.

The Asbury Park Press should be entrusted to publish newsworthy articles that accurately depict what takes place around our State and inform our citizens. With this extreme example of a biased invective it is now beyond our comprehension how it can be relied upon as an objective source for information. In short, we feel that this cartoon is nothing short of yellow journalism and it should be removed from their website immediately and an apology issued to both law enforcement and our communities of color.

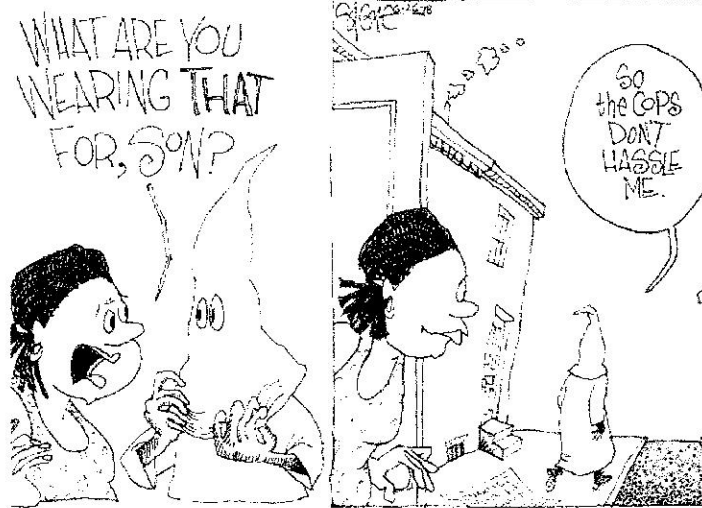

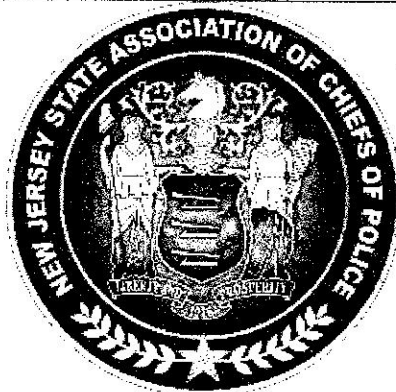

Chief,

Per your request, we have reviewed this application seeking to have police departments extract information from its computer database. Generally speaking, this request would seem to be a natural extension of the Paff v. Galloway Twp. (i.e. if public entities are required to provide information that can easily be extracted from electronic records).

While some of the requests appear to be overly broad (such as request the number of "hits"), the requestor asserts that all of the information can be extracted by the Department running either an "Agency Data Sharing Report" or a "Dashboard Hit Ratio Report". Therefore, if the Departments computer database clearly identifies the information being requested, then the records should be provided. Of course, if the information found in the records would be confidential for other reasons, the records should be reviewed and redacted accordingly.

The requests can be broken down as follows:

1. The names of agencies and organizations with which the Agency shares ALPR data;
 - We assume that ALPR stands for "Automated License Plate Reader" (police cameras that can read license plates and records the time, date, and location of a particular car). The request is only seeking the names of organizations that this information is being shared with. It is not seeking information about the license plates. Therefore, if this information can be easily extracted within a department's computer database (as alleged in the OPRA request by generating an Agency Data Sharing Report) then it should be provided, unless there is some security risk for doing so.
2. The names of agencies and organizations from which the Agency receives ALPR data;
 - The analysis is the same as No. 1.
3. The names of agencies and organizations with which the Agency shares "hot list" information;
 - Responding to this request will be whether a Department understands what "hot list information" is referring to. The request indicates that the information is located in a Department's LEARN system and can be obtained by generating an Agency Data Sharing Report. If this information is clearly identified in the LEARN system, then it should be provided. However, if it is not clear, then the request can be denied as overly broad.
4. The names of agencies and organizations from which the Agency receives "hot list" information;
 - The analysis is the same as No. 3.
5. The aggregate number of "detections" (i.e. license plate scans and associated data) collected during 2016.
 - While this request appears overly broad, the OPRA request indicates that it can be obtained by creating a "Dashboard Hit Ratio Report" in the Department's LEARN system. If this is accurate (i.e. that the program clearly identifies a "detention"), then it should be provided, with any confidential information being redacted, if necessary.
6. The aggregate number of detections collected during 2017.
 - Same analysis as No. 5
7. The aggregate number of "hits" (i.e. times that a plate on a hotlist was detected) during 2016.
 - Same analysis as No. 5
8. The aggregate number of "hits" during 2017.
 - Same analysis as No. 5

This information is easily available within the Agency's LEARN system. The simplest way to extract this data is to generate an "Agency Data Sharing Report" PDF file from within LEARN. To do this, a user may simply go to the "Sharing" section of LEARN and select "Output Report." A CSV/XLS file containing these records would also satisfy this request.

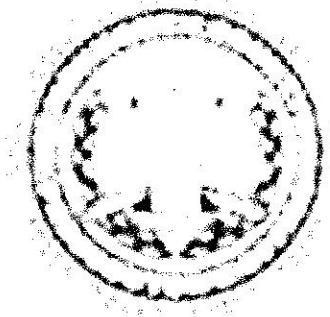

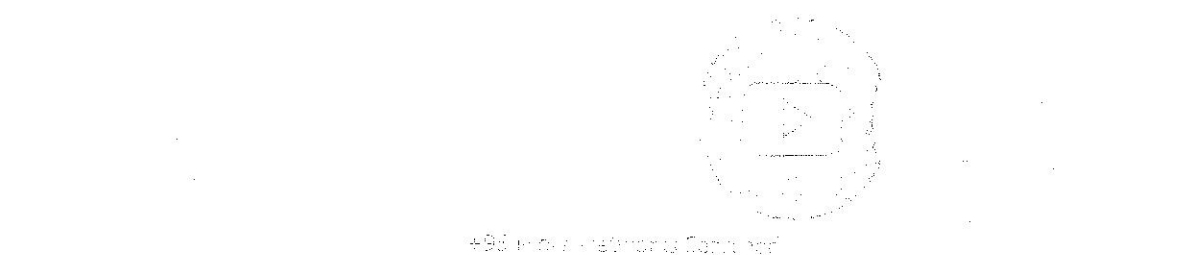

Numerous municipalities have received an OPRA request from Andrew Ford requesting employee related information, employment application, and complaints signed by the officer.

Please see my email with him below.

Chiefs have expressed concern regarding the "application" specifically the type of information contained in the document. Without knowing what is contained in each agencies application, it is not possible to have a one-size fits all approach. The agency needs to review the document for protected or private information and make the appropriate redaction using the established exemptions. Custodians should consult with their attorney if needed.

Andrew,

As per our conversation this afternoon, it is understood that your OPRA requests are seeking:

Item 1: The current title, position, and annual salary. Regarding Payroll Records you are seeking the officer's Date of Hire and if no longer employed, their End Date of Employment.

Item 2: The initial employment application form filed by this officer, which may be subject to redaction.

Item 3: Regarding "Complaints" you are seeking criminal complaint warrants and summonses, in addition to motor vehicle summonses.

As the Sergeant-of-Arms for the NJSACOP I will inform our membership of your clarification in an effort to assist them in being responsive to your request. Our conversation is in no way is meant to speak on behalf of any Municipality, Municipal Clerk or any individual Chief of Police, or to interfere with any communications you are having with or will have with any Records Custodian.
