Carteret, New Jersey, October 26, 2016 – Mayor Daniel J. Reiman and Councilman Vinnie Bellino have announced the Carteret's Fall Festival and Parade on Saturday October 29th from 11AM to 4pm.

Mayor announces ground breaking ceremony for Noe Street Project

Carteret, New Jersey, October 19, 2016 – The Mayor and Borough Governing body will be holding a groundbreaking ceremony on Friday, October 28th at 12:00 noon for the Noe Street project at the future site of the Noe Street Park. “I am very proud of the work we’ve done so far with the Noe Street Park plan,” said Mayor Reiman. “The project will go a long way to eliminate nuisance flooding in the area but it will also add to the Borough’s vibrant parks department.”

The Noe Street Park is being created to mitigate flooding to residential areas and to provide additional opportunities for recreation to Borough residents. The borough acquired a block of residential properties in the low lying areas of Noe Street that have experienced severe flooding in the past. The properties were combined with borough lots to be used to create a passive recreation park. At the center of the park will be a drainage pond used to collect storm water from new and additional catch basins on the street. Once the water exceeds a certain level a new pump station will begin diverting excess water to an upgraded outflow off of Peter J. Sica highway to Noe’s Creek which drains into the Arthur Kill. Obsolete storm water drainage pipes will be replaced on Pershing and Leick Avenue as well as Noe, Harris and Sharot Streets. Once the project is complete all of the roads will be milled and repaved. The basin will appear as a pond at the center of the new park and may be used as an ice rink during for skating and other such winter activities, as weather permits.

“We married together several sources of funding to make the project the feasible. The upgrade will prevent the ponding that occurs from the system being overwhelmed by sudden heavy rainfall. This would not prevent the flooding from one hundred year events, like Superstorm Sandy, but will it will prevent storm flooding the more frequent 25-50 year events from being catastrophic.

The project will take approximately eighteen months to complete and will be completed in four phases. The first phase will involve the creation of the drainage basin at the new Noe street park, a pump station will be installed in the park adjacent to the pond and the outflow to Noe’s Creek will be upgraded to manage larger quantities of water. The project is being completed by Lucas Construction Group, of Morganville, who was awarded the project in May. The nearly \$8 million dollar projects is being financed by the NJ Environmental Infrastructure Trust with 19% of the funding being a grant and the balance being low interest loan. In addition to the NJEIT funding the NJDEP granted money to the Borough from the Green Acres Open Space fund for acquisition of properties for the creation of the park. “This project is long overdue and finally four years after Super Storm Sandy the state has issued approval for work to begin,” said Reiman.

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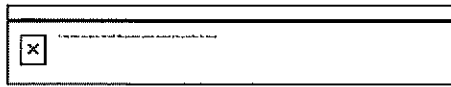

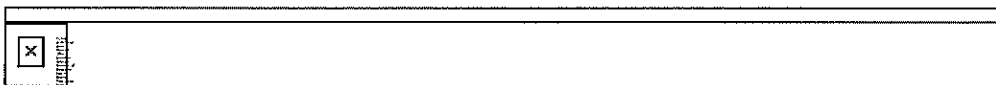

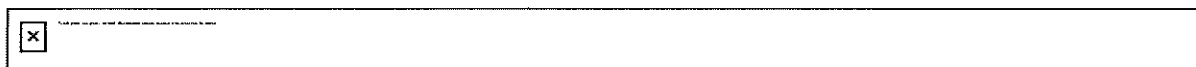

Pianos in the Park celebration and park tour

Carteret, New Jersey, September 29, 2016 – Mayor Daniel J Reiman, the Borough Council and the Central Jersey Arts Council (CJAC) will be hosting a program celebrating the success of the Borough's pianos in the park program and honoring the local artists who participated. The program will include remarks from the Mayor Reiman commending the artists for participating in the program, a presentation on the background of the program, refreshments, and a bus tour to the locations of all the pianos and performances by local musicians.

"I have been pleased with the enthusiasm our residents have shown for our "Pianos in the Park" program. Every time I stop in a park, I see residents playing the pianos and admiring the artwork," said Mayor Reiman. "The success of program is an affirmation of the importance of art and music to our community."

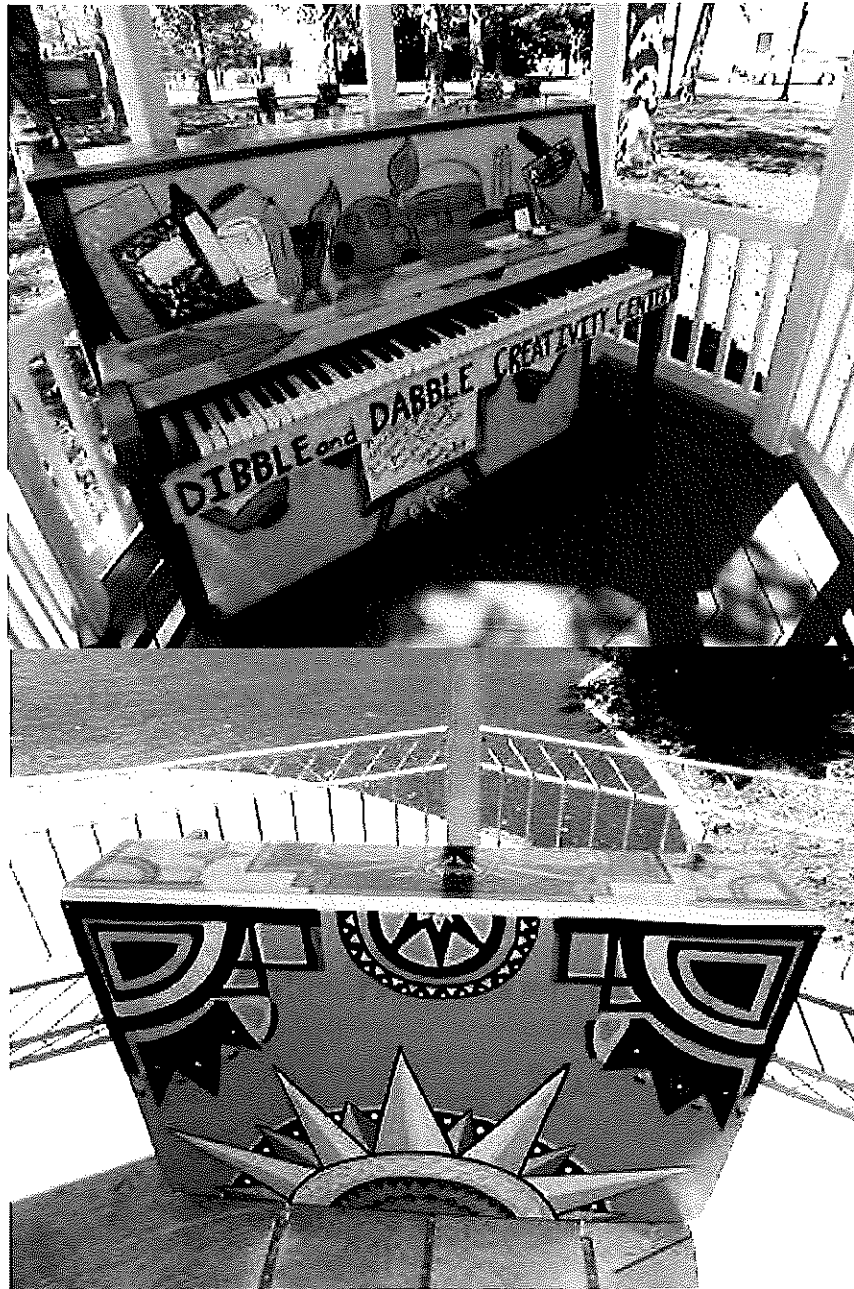
The program was announced in late May and local artist were invited to submit designs for the opportunity to paint a piano to be showcased in one of our many community open spaces. The Arts Council approved eleven submissions, with varying themes including "around the world", flowers, "scifi", patriotism and steam punk. The inspiration for the Carteret program came from similar programs in Bryant Park in New York City, Baton Rouge, and Seattle. The purpose of the program is to showcase Carteret residents' many talents while highlighting the borough's commitment to the arts.

The borough acquired eleven refurbished upright pianos that were tuned, sanded, and primed for volunteer artists to paint. The artists were provided with supplies and a work space. Each completed piano was then lacquered and secured under a gazebo or bandstand to protect them from the elements. The pianos began trickling into the parks in the beginning of August with the final piano being installed this Friday.

Mayor Reiman commended the Central Jersey Arts Council for their collaboration with the Borough on this program, "The Central Jersey Arts Council has done a fantastic job of engaging Carteret's youth and providing a powerful outlet for our residents creativity and enthusiasm, which would otherwise go untapped. It brings me a lot of pride knowing our community has so much talent."

The pianos will remain in the parks for the rest of autumn and will be stored indoors over the winter months. They will be returned to the parks in spring having been rotated to a different location giving residents an opportunity to appreciate a different artwork. We encourage residents to check out all of the different piano designs and musicians to share their talents with the community.
