

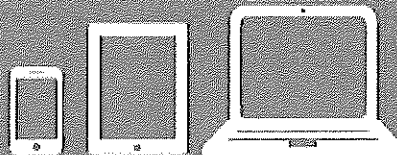

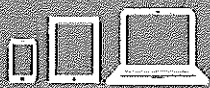

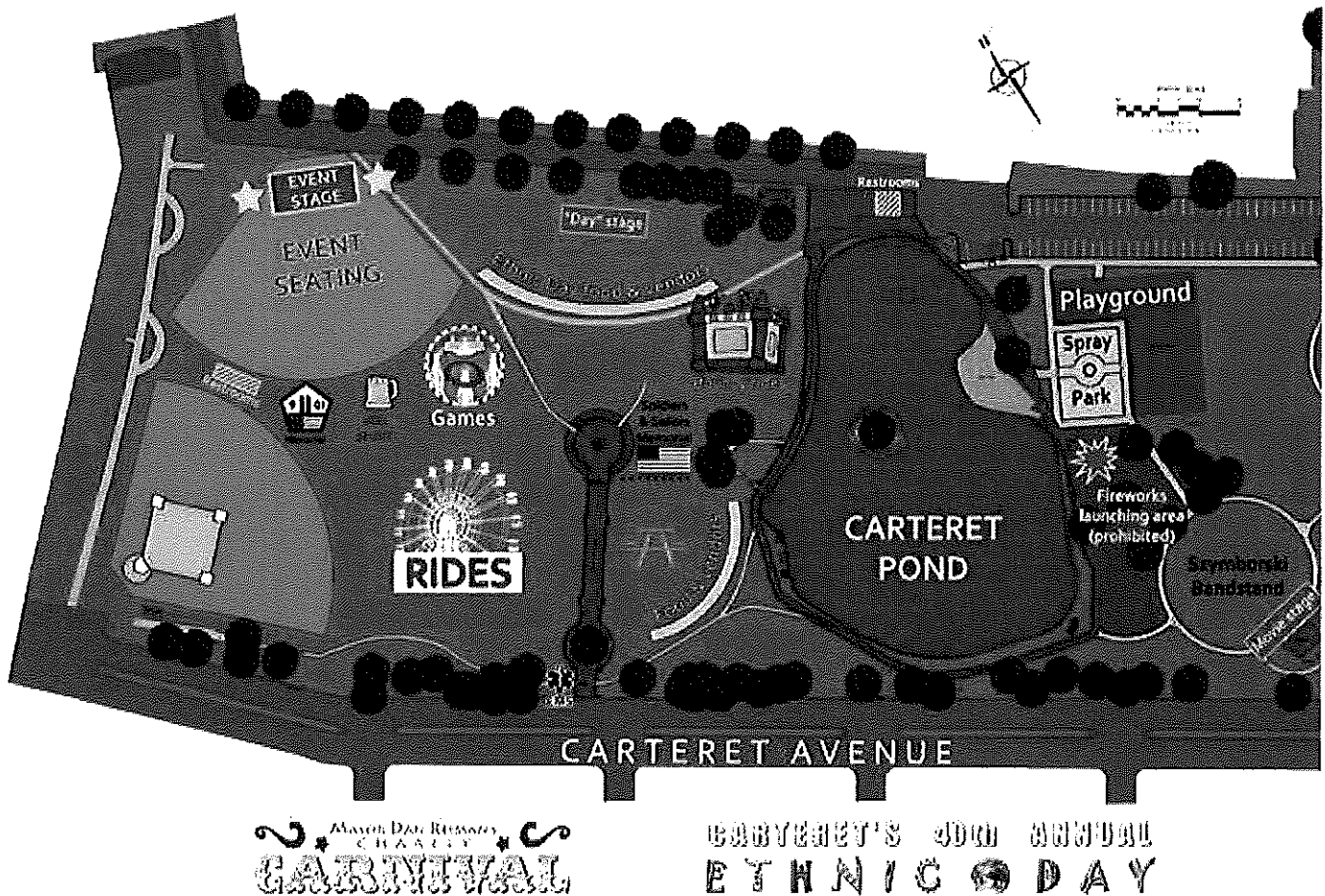
The Charity Carnival will be held on Thursday September 15th from 6PM-10PM, Friday from 6-10PM and Saturday from Noon to 11 PM. Bracelet will be available for purchase on Thursday and Friday evenings and will allow anyone who has purchased a bracelet unlimited rides on the attractions. Friday night will also feature a "Batman vs Superman" movie night at the Szyborski bandstand. A live band will play jazz and blues music from 7PM to 11 PM.

Ethnic Day will be held Saturday September 17th from 11AM to 11PM. Ethnic Day was started in 1975 as a celebration of the diversity and inclusion our community values. Again this year we will have food vendors, dancers and musicians, of differing ethnicities, to participate in Ethnic Day festivities so everyone is afforded the opportunity to share their heritage, while experiencing other cultures. This year's bands will be New York Bee Gees, a Bee Gees tribute band, Almost Journey, a Journey tribute band and B Street Band, a Bruce Springsteen tribute band. Mayor announces 4th annual tree planting program for homeowners.

Carteret, New Jersey, September 8th, 2016 – Mayor Daniel J. Reiman is pleased to announce the fourth year of our tree planting program for Carteret Homeowners.

The program allows Carteret homeowners to request to have a tree planted on their property at no cost. Residents have to agree that the tree has to remain in the same spot and it must be taken care of. If the tree dies, the resident will be responsible for the removal and disposal costs. Residents can choose one of three curb side trees: Columnar hornbeam, ivory silk or redspire flowering pear. The tree selections for yards will be: Columnar hornbeam, Ginko, Dawn Redwood, Pin Oak and Aristocat Flowering Pear. All trees will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis and each resident is allowed one per home per season.

By planting trees we offset can reduce our carbon footprint, reduce energy consumption by providing shade and appreciate the beauty they bring to our surrounding area,” said Mayor Daniel J. Reiman. “Humans contribute significantly to the amount of carbon in the air through deforestation, farming and by the methane gas given off by our livestock. Planting trees is the simplest most direct way we can help reduce the amount of greenhouse gases in the air.”

This program is just another example of the Borough of Government engaging in environmental responsible behavior. The borough has been leading on green initiatives investing in an electric charging station on Cooke Ave, solar powered trash receptacles around Civic Center Park and the Carteret Police Department has added several hybrid vehicles to their municipal fleet. The Borough has a similar program for Earth day in April, giving out tree seedlings. To participate, contact the Mayor’s office at 732-541-3836.

Borough of Carteret to Host Annual Memorial Service for the 15th Anniversary of 9/11 attacks

Carteret, New Jersey, September 1st, 2016 – Mayor Daniel J. Reiman and the Borough Council will be hosting a memorial vigil commemorating the 15th anniversary of the September 11th attacks.

The memorial will begin at 6:30 PM at the 9/11 Memorial at Carteret Park with remarks from the Mayor, Freeholder Director Ronald G. Rios and Commander George Lisicki, the former National Commander in Chief of the VFW. The services will conclude a candlelight vigil at dusk honoring Carteret residents Colleen Meehan Barkow, Jayceryll Chavez and Joseph Mangano, who were killed in the attacks.

“This year marks the fifteenth anniversary of the worst terrorist attack on American soil in the history of our great Republic. We hold these services not to just honor those killed in the attack but to honor the brave service men and women who have died bringing the fight to Islamic Fundamentalists,” said Mayor Dan Reiman.

COLLEEN ANN MEEHAN BARKOW, 26

Was a native of Carteret, Colleen Ann Meehan Barkow was a graduate of Bishop Ahr High School in Edison and attended St. John's University in Staten Island. She worked as a project manager for Cantor Fitzgerald, on the 103rd floor of the North Tower. She was married September 17, 2000.

JAYCERYLL M. DE CHAVEZ, 24

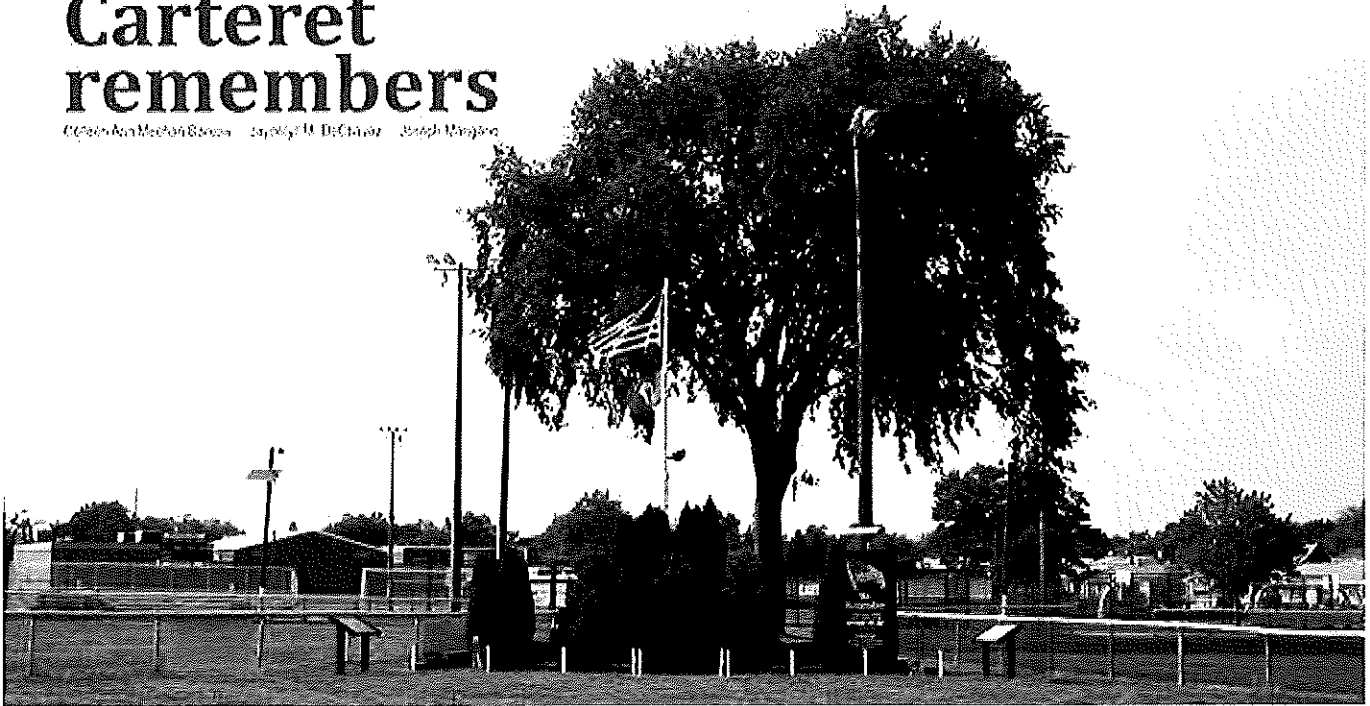

Carteret showcasing the Borough's commitment to the Arts

Carteret, New Jersey, August 29, 2016 – Mayor Dan Reiman, in conjunction with the Central Jersey Arts Council announced the rollout of artistically painted pianos being placed in Borough Parks and community spaces for the Mayor's "Pianos in the Parks" program.

Carteret is the first town in the area to have the Pianos in the Park program in place. The program will give residents access to a tunable musical instrument and painted work of art. In late May Mayor Reiman and the Central Jersey Arts Council (CJAC) invited local artists to submit designs for the opportunity to paint a piano which will be put on display. By the June 11th deadline the contest had eighteen submissions, of which eleven of the designs were selected by the Arts Council to be painted on pianos.

"I decided to bring the Pianos in the Park program to Carteret because I think it is a great opportunity to reaffirm our commitment to the arts, music and recreation," said Mayor Dan Reiman. "It is a great way for us to showcase the many talents our community members have to offer, and it gives our families, neighbors and residents a chance to interact with each other, through passive recreation, in one of Carteret's many fantastic parks."

Each of the artists was provided a primed refurbished piano and painting supplies to make their submission a reality. Some of the design submission themes included "supporting our troops", art and creativity, history, superhero comics, around the world, garden flowers and art deco.

Once completed the pianos will be sealed with a lacquer, to protect the pianos from the elements, and will be secured in gazebos or covered spaces throughout the town for public use. Musicians are encouraged to play, spectators to listen and passersby to appreciate the beauty of each painted work of art. The pianos will be available seasonally during spring, summer and fall months, stored indoors over winter and rotated to different parks each season.

Spray Park opens at Bishop Andrews Park in Carteret

Carteret, New Jersey, August 25, 2016 – Mayor Dan Reiman and Councilman Vince Bellino announced the opening of a second Municipal Spray Park this one located in Bishop Andrews Park (Chrome Park) near the intersection of Salem Avenue and Mercer Street.

The park was designed in a curvilinear pattern and has an area of approximately 1,200 square feet. The Spray Park will feature a textured concrete spray pad with an above ground structure that has multiple jets forming a variety of patterns. The jets are operated by flush mounted push buttons on the spray pad. Additional benches, landscaping and fencing is being added to the park around the perimeter. The spray pad will collect used water into a water revetment, reservoir, where it will be used in watering the park's landscaping. Any overflow will be sent to a rain garden revetment and then into the Borough storm water collection system. The Spray Park will be open from 10 AM till dusk daily until mid-September.

"We are very excited to provide the amenity to our area residents," said Mayor Dan Reiman. "It is the 2nd Spray Park in Carteret and they have both been well received by the community." This is another example of the Mayor and Council working together to improve Carteret and our continuing efforts to upgrade our parks system.

Bridge Construction to Build 206,000 sq ft Warehouse on 10 Acre Tract in West Carteret

Carteret, New Jersey, August 15th, 2016 – Mayor Daniel Reiman and Councilman Jorge Diaz announced the approval of construction on a new industrial complex at 900 Federal Boulevard in West Carteret. The project is being undertaken by Bridge Development Partners LLC of Parsippany. The lot is owned by Federal Business Centers of Edison, New Jersey.

The facility to be constructed at 900 Federal Boulevard will occupy lot 12 in Block 2802. The current condition of the property is a vacant unutilized brownfield site. The new warehouse will sit on the 9.9 acre property located at the corner of Federal Boulevard and Raskulinecz Road. The facility will be 1-story warehouse and will provide 206,500 square feet of flex space. The site will include ancillary offices, off-street parking spaces and loading docks.

“The redevelopment and revitalization of this area will add increased value to the community and will create union construction jobs in Carteret. No one in the community is served by allowing a brownfield site in an industrial zone to remain vacant or underutilized. By adding industrial space to these lots we are increasing the economic benefit to the town and improving the value of the site,” said Mayor Daniel Reiman. “Redevelopment is all about retooling and acknowledging that Carteret’s infrastructure needs to evolve as much as our workforce. By replacing a vacant lot with a

warehouse off a busy transit corridor we are competing not just locally but globally, being located in the vicinity of three international airports and busy ports,” Councilman Jorge Diaz.

Carteret Bridge I LLC, the company constructing the warehouse, will pay \$18.8 million in new tax revenue to the Borough over the next 30 years. The cost of the project is estimated \$30 million in development and construction. The Federal Boulevard Redevelopment Plan was created in September of 2006 by Beacon Planning and Consulting services at the request of the Carteret Planning Board to address redevelopment needs of the borough in West Carteret. The plan identified and addressed several properties that had been underutilized or maintained inefficient layouts that made them prohibitive to potential businesses and revitalization as whole.
