RESOLUTION 2021:88

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5) authorizes contracting units to establish a Cooperative Pricing System and to enter into Cooperative Pricing Agreements for its administration, and

WHEREAS, the County of Camden hereinafter referred to as the Lead Agency originally offered voluntary participation in a Cooperative Pricing System for copy, computer paper and envelopes as awarded to the vendors, W.B. Mason and Paper Mart, for a term commencing on October 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021 with the option of an additional six months extension, and

WHEREAS, the County of Camden adopted the additional extension for a term commencing on April 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021 under Bid A-48/2020 with W. B. Mason, Office Basics, and Paper Mart, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Lindenwold as follows:

1. This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the Cooperative Pricing Resolution of the Borough of Lindenwold.
2. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5) the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Cooperative Pricing Agreement with the Lead Agency
3. The Lead Agency shall be responsible for complying with the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq) and all other provisions of the revised statutes of the State of New Jersey.
4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.
