On Monday November 4, 2024 at approximately 0621 hours, Sgt. S. McGrath, Ptl. W. Arway, and I (Ptl. S. Zuczek) were dispatched to Camerato Contracting Inc. (10 Cross Avenue) for the report of a burglary. Upon arriving to the business, we met with employee Antonio Quintas, who informed us he arrived at the building at approximately 0605 hours (he later informed us no one had been inside the building since approximately 1700 hours on Saturday November 2). Upon unlocking the front door and stepping into the front office, Mr. Quintas immediately observed the building had no power. After checking the breakers, Mr. Quintas stated he came back into the office and observed all the drawers in the office were open and appeared to have been rummaged through. Mr. Quintas then

informed us he observed a side window was open with the screen and panels completely removed. He then took us around the side of the building where we observed the screen and panels laying on the ground, along with a large screwdriver that Mr. Quintas stated should not have been there. A few minutes later, while checking the front of the building, Sgt. McGrath and I discovered the electrical meters to the building had been broken open and disconnected.

A short time later, the business owner (Gregory Camerato) arrived on scene, followed shortly after by Det. G. Wagner, who took photographs of the scene. After Det. Wagner finished taking the photographs, Mr. Camerato checked the open drawers, soon determining nothing appeared to be missing at that time. When I asked him if there was anyone he believed would have wanted to break into the business, Mr. Camerato stated his ex-fiance (Renee Dent, MNI #166777) had recently made a comment to his lawyer about harming the business. Prior to clearing from the scene, Det. Wagner took custody of the screwdriver (I later entered it into property as evidence), and I provided Mr. Camerato with a business card with the incident number.

No further police action taken at this time.

On 10/12/2024 at approximately 0056 Hours, Ptl. Zuczek and I (Ptl. Mendes) were dispatched to 578 Washington Rd for a Verbal/Family dispute involving a dating couple. Ptl. Hernandez responded to the scene incident as well.

Upon arrival, we made contact with the reporting party, Lisa Camerato, outside of the residence. Lisa stated that her brother, the victim in this matter identified as Gregory Camerato, was involved in a verbal altercation with his girlfriend, later identified as Renee Dent. Lisa then explained that the argument became physical and that Gregory suffered a bite mark as a result. Gregory then made contact with us outside and displayed what appeared to be a fresh bite mark with swelling and redness surrounding it. He then stated that Renee was "acting crazy" inside the house and that she did bite him. At this time Gregory refused medical attention.

Ptl. Zuczek, Ptl. Hernandez, and I then entered the residence and made contact with Renee in an upstairs bedroom. Renee appeared to be packing personal belongings. She explained that she and Gregory were spending time in Spotswood at a Bar/Club establishment earlier in the evening when they entered into a verbal altercation. She stated that she then walked off scene to "cool off" and refused to get a car ride back with Gregory. Renee then caught a ride home from an unknown party. She stated that when she got back home to 578 Washington Rd, she entered into another verbal altercation with Gregory in the living room. As per Renee, the argument became heated while she was sitting on the couch. She then described that Gregory pushed her down and proceeded to grab her hair behind her head with both hands while pulling downwards towards the couch. He then pinned her shoulder blades down towards the couch with his forearms, and her legs down with his knees. Renee explained that he was arguing with her and telling her to leave the house as she screamed for him to let her go so she can return back home to Florida. As per Renee, Gregory then stated that he had the keys to her residence in Florida, specifically by saying "I went to get the keys out of your Louis Vuitton bag and your not getting them back" as he maintained her pinned down. Renee stated that after approximately 10 minutes of struggling while still pinned down, she was able to loosen her left arm from him. At this time she proceeded to bite his forearm to get him off of her. She explained that he then pressed his right forearm into her face causing pain to her left cheek bone area. She further explained that Lisa was in the room and stating that she was going to call the police, at which Renee yelled to her that she should call.

While gathering Renee's account of the events, she proceeded to pull on her hair and stated that her hair was now tangled in multiple knots as a result of Gregory grabbing on to it during the physical altercation. As she pulled on her hair, strands of hair fell off her head, and she claimed that it was a result of Gregory's actions. Renee then confirmed that she and Gregory were in a dating relationship and were engaged to get married. While speaking with Renee, I observed redness throughout her entire face, with a slightly darker red mark below her left eye socket. She refused medical attention and stated that the redness was due to Gregory's arm being pressed down on her face.

Ptl. Zuczek made his way downstairs and took statements from Gregory and Lisa. As per Gregory, he was involved in an argument with Renee in Spotswood, and that when Renee got back home to 578 Washington Rd, she went upstairs and began banging and slamming the doors. Gregory stated that he then told her to pack up her personal belongings and leave the house to go back to Florida, while calling off the engagement and requesting the engagement ring back. He stated that Renee then came downstairs into the living room and the argument continued. At this time Renee began spitting at Gregory, towards his face multiple times, prompting him to then get control of her by pinning her down to the couch to stop her from spitting. As per Gregory, Renee proceeded to bite him. During this physical struggle, he stated that Lisa was present in the room as well as during the ensuing verbal argument. When asked regarding the keys for Renee's Florida house, he stated he did



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not have the keys and claimed that she must have them somewhere in her luggage case.

Lisa stated that she heard the argument taking place and proceeded to enter the living room. She explained that she observed Renee spitting towards Gregory multiple times before Gregory got physical control of Renee on the couch. Lisa stated that she also observed Renee bite Gregory.

At this time, Sgt. Przybylowski and Sgt. Maslowski were on scene, and photographs of Gregory and his bite injury were taken with the department issued camera.

Due to the statements provided by all parties, including the witness, and the physical injuries observed while on scene, I determined Renee to be the aggressor in this matter and placed her under arrest. I handcuffed her with both her hands behind her back and checked the handcuffs for proper fit, and double locked them. She was then escorted out of the residence where Ptl. Hernandez conducted a search of her person incident to arrest. Gregory informed us that Renee had in her possession a set of keys containing his car keys and the engagement ring that he wanted returned. Sgt. Przybylowski inquired with Renee who then relayed the keys were in her purse, and refused to return the ring at this time as it was gifted to her. The keys were then removed by Sgt. Przybylowski and handed them back to Gregory. As we were not able to confirm if the ring was a gift at this time, Renee was permitted to keep the ring and advised that the matter shall be addressed in court at a later time. Renee was then placed inside of marked police unit #3 in the secure compartment (which was checked to be clear of contraband prior to her entering it) and was advised that the police unit was recording in audio and video. Ptl. Hernandez then transported Renee to HQ in marked unit #3 along with her property for processing while I followed in marked police unit #26.

Upon arrival at HQ Sally Port, Ptl. Hernandez and I secured our firearms in the lockers provided within the sally port. We then escorted Renee into the booking room where she was searched again by Ptl Hernandez with negative results for contraband. She was then handcuffed to the booking room seat. Renee then inquired if we can check her purse to verify that her camera and money were present. Upon verifying, we proceeded to inventory her items including the money in her presence, and then secured all items in a prisoner locker while she was processed for booking. While in the booking room, Renee proceeded to show us that she was able to pull more hair out of her head as a result of this incident. She was advised that she may sign complaints with the court against Gregory for his action during this incident. Photographs were then taken utilizing the same department issued camera.

Ptl. Zuczek transported Gregory to HQ along with a suitcase filled with Renee's personal belongings

that were packed up by Lisa. Ptl. Zuczek placed the luggage in the evidence room where the remainder of Renee's property was stored. Ptl. Zuczek then completed a TRO application with Gregory, which was approved by Honorable Judge James Weber. A VINE and an ODARA form was completed with Gregory and a Domestic Violence Counselor was offered, at which Gregory refused at this time.

Gregory requested to speak to me regarding some belongings of his that he wanted documented. I made contact with him in the lobby area of HQ. He stated that he owns a Harley Davidson motorcycle that is registered to him (Model Night Train, black in color with saddle bags in mint condition) that's stored at Renee's residence in Florida. He was not able to provide a registration number for the motorcycle. He also stated that he owns an enclosed 16 foot trailer (unknown make or model) that's at a storage yard in Florida, and can be accessed by Renee. Gregory expressed concerns regarding the retrieval of his motorcycle and trailer due to this recent incident. I advised him that if he's unable to coordinate the retrieval of the above mentioned items, he may address this matter during his court proceeding.

Renee was charged with Simple Assault (2C:12-1A(1) with Complaint Summons # 1219S2024000511. She was then served with the Complaint Summons and advised of her court date. Ptl. Zuczek served Renee a copy of the TRO and advised of her court date. Renee was then released into the lobby area of HQ with her belongings. I escorted her into the prosecutor's room as she requested to look over her belongings to identify what may still be present at 578 Washington Rd. I advised her that she was also afforded a 15 minute opportunity to return to the residence to collect any personal belongings that may have been left behind with police escort, at which she accepted.

At this time, Ptl. Zuczek transported Gregory back to the residence and stood by awaiting my arrival as I transported Renee for the escort. Ptl. Klein also responded to the residence to assist. While on scene, Renee entered the residence and collected her remaining belongings while constantly in my presence as Ptl. Zuczek remained with Gregory.

Renee's biggest concern was her Florida home keys and her dog. Gregory persisted on stating that he didn't know where the keys were, but was willing to look for them if Renee agreed to give back the engagement ring. Gregory informed Ptl. Zuczek that Renee's dog was now with his brother, Glenn Racey, next door at 2 Dupont St. As per Renee, she was in good standing with Glenn. I advised her that she may contact him via cell phone to arrange for retrieval of the dog. Renee then exited the house and attempted to contact Glen via cell phone. Renee then entered the garage door of 2 Dupont St via a door code which she was previously authorized to use and attempted to make

contact with Glenn at his apartment above the garage. She then exited the garage and stated that Glenn was now refusing to give the dog back.

Glenn made contact with me through a window. He stated that he was instructed by Gregory to keep the dog until Gregory gave him permission to release it to Renee. I advised Glenn that the dog belonged to Renee. He exited his apartment and returned the dog to Renee. Glenn stated that he was displeased with the fact that Renee entered the residence as he did not want her inside. I inquired with him if she had authorization to enter as she had the code for the garage, at which time he confirmed that she did have prior authorization. He relayed to me that after this recent incident between Gregory and Renee, he no longer was permitting entry to the residence by Renee. I informed her that moving forward she would be considered a trespasser if she came back to this residence. She confirmed that she understood.

I then provided her a courtesy transport back to HQ along with her dog, where she awaited the arrival of a friend to pick her up. The SD card with the photos from the injuries was then removed from the camera and placed into evidence. Nothing further to report at this time

Upon our arrival we were met by Gregory Camerato who stated his tenant/neighbor Kim Petagno was outside his residence screaming. Gregory explained when he looked outside he saw Kim throwing things and screaming. Gregory further explained when he opened the door Kim saw his female friend inside and proceeded to yell at him. Gregory stated as Kim was yelling at him she ripped his shirt. Gregory explained Kim wrote "Scum bag" with a marker on the back window of his vehicle (NJ Registration- PF1548).

Gregory further explained Kim also wrote "Dumb Cunt" with a marker on the windshield of his friends vehicle (NJ Registration- U49FTJ). While we were on scene Gregory was able to clean the writing off and the marker left no damage to either vehicle. Gregory stated it was just a verbal argument at this time. Gregory did not complain of any pain and did not have any visible signs of injury while on scene. Gregory also wanted to document that Kim backed her vehicle (NJ Registration- J32NTA) into his boat and broke her tail light earlier in the day. On Friday March 19, 2021 at approximately 1908 hours, I, Ptl. S. Zuczek, was dispatched to the Sayreville Police Department headquarters (1000 Main Street) for a walk-in report regarding harassment that had occurred at 578 Washington Road. Upon arriving at the front lobby, I spoke to Greg Camerato, who informed me his ex-girlfriend, Laurie Cologna, had been harassing him via text messages, along with showing up uninvited to his home and leaving things on his property. Mr. Camerato informed me he only wanted to document the incidents, further informing me he did not wish to press charges against Ms. Cologna.

First, Mr. Camerato showed me a series of print outs of a text message conversation with Ms. Cologna, which started on March 17 with her sending him a picture of the two from a prior Saint Patrick's Day celebration. Ms. Cologna then begins to harass Mr. Camerato because he did not ask her to watch his cat "Bootie" while he was on vacation. In many of the texts, Ms. Cologna told Mr. Camerato she was coming to take the cat, followed by angry texts when he would tell her the cat was fed and cared for. Throughout the texts, Ms. Cologna told Mr. Camerato "I will destroy" whoever he dated in the future, accused him of having "9 million girlfriends!!", called him a "mother fucker" and "pussy", and made comments about him dating girls with crabs.

Mr. Camerato then showed me another series of print outs, this time entries from his security system. From the time stamps and images on the print outs, I observed Ms. Cologna's vehicle (no vehicle information was provided) on Mr. Camerato's property multiple times over the previous two days, several of which were during the early hours of the morning or when he was not at the home.

Lastly, Mr. Camerato showed me several print outs of photographs he took the morning of this report. From the images, I observed Ms. Cologna left a pair of slippers outside Mr. Camerato's front door, left flowers on his vehicle's windshield, left a stick of butter (melted) on one of the door handle's of the vehicle, and opened the gas cap on the vehicle. Mr. Camerato did not report any damage to the vehicle at this time.

I completed a Victim Notification (VINE) with Mr. Camerato, who signed off as not wanting to apply for a Temporary Restraining Order at this time. I provided Mr. Camerato a copy of the VINE form, along with a Sayreville Domestic Violence Response Team business card. The VINE form was later scanned and emailed to the Middlesex County Family Court. A Supplementary Domestic Violence Offense Report was completed and submitted along with copies of the VINE. The print outs of the pictures, Ring history, and the text messages were uploaded to the attachment section of this report.

No further police action taken at this time.

Greg proceeded to show me the scene. Walking into the back of the building, I observed the chain links around the main fence to be cut, but only halfway through, showing the gate could not have been opened. However, the small access gate to the right, had a padlock, which was cut in half, showing this is how the access was gained to the rear of the premises. Sergeant McGrath arrived on scene.

After walking in, there were multiple wheelbarrows, lined up by the fence. Greg explained they were moved there. It appeared the wheelbarrows were used to move the stolen items. Greg then showed me a Ford F150 (NJ 48EC). The rear side panel was open on the side of the truck, and Greg explained there are multiple tools missing from there, however he could not pinpoint what they were.

Detective Lieutenant Castlegant, and Detectives Berry and Pyrigi arrived on scene.

I was then directed further back to three different trailers (NJ T40J4P, T50E5X, TLJ88C). All three trailers were opened up. The locking mechanism on the back, was bent up, and on T40J4P, there was a padlock on the ground which was cut to gain access. There was also a red and black work glove of which Detective Berry later took into evidence. There were multiple tools taken from the trailer which include, but are not limited to: 5x Stihl cut off saws, 2x Stihl chainsaws, 1x Stihl power pruner, multiple backpack blowers, and multiple weedwackers. The current number taken is still undetermined for some items. At this time it is also undetermined which trailer the items were in.

Greg then directed me to the side of the shop where he pointed out, there .

were two new ToraKing dump truck tires missing.

Greg believes the time frame of which this was possible was from 11/04/2019 at 1800hrs to 11/05/2019 at 0700hrs, based on Employee time cards.

I supplied Greg with a property loss form, which he said he would fill out to the best of his knowledge and return to police headquarters, when finished.

The scene was turned over to the Detective Bureau, where Detective Pyrigi attempted to access any possible footage, while Detective Berry gathered evidence and took multiple photographs.

After speaking with Mr. Swider he was allowed to leave the scene and was told if I need anymore information I would see him at his shop on Washington Road.

Moments after Mr. Swider leaving the property Father Ryan arrived. Father Ryan stated that he received a third party call informing him that Mr. Swider was using the machines as late as 2000 and 2100 hrs last night in the rear right corner of the property where all of the piles of soil, wood chips, and black top millings are. I asked Father Ryan if he saw anything on the property that was not supposed to be there and he stated that all of the piles of soil, chips, and millings that are there have been there. Father Ryan stated that he gave Mr. Camerato permission to store what was there along with his machines however never gave permission to Mr. Swider to operate on the cemetery. I asked Father Ryan if his third party caller provided any additional information regarding the dumping aspect of the call and he replied yes, there may be things buried underground. This officer would like to note that prior to asking that question, I did find that an area approximately 50x50 directly adjacent to the two piles of blacktop millings appeared to be spread out and graded. There were numerous vehicle and machine tire tracks over the millings as if vehicles drove over it quite a bit.

Father Ryan expressed to this officer that he does not want to move forward with this investigation until he speaks with a few people. I advised Father Ryan that I would be completing the initial report with my findings as well as the conversations with all parties involved which would be on file if he wished to pursue the matter. Father Ryan stated that upon speaking with whoever he had to discuss the matter with he will be opening up the ground to investigate further this way the Sayreville Police Department can also proceed. No further police action.
