The recognized leader in school security in the Lakewood region

Since its founding, IronRock has quickly developed into the gold standard of school security in Lakewood and beyond.

IronRock combines the highest level of professionalism and law enforcement credentials with a genuine grassroots understanding of the students, faculty, and parents of the institutions it protects. School security has been the primary focus of IronRock's operations, making our firm the undisputed expert in this field.

IronRock was co-founded and is led by former Lakewood Police Chief Robert C. Lawson, who has three-and-a-half decades of law enforcement experience on the ground in Lakewood. Chief Lawson began his career as a street patrol officer and continually rose through the ranks. In our fast growing, diverse and culturally sensitive region, Chief Lawson gained invaluable experience in all aspects of law enforcement and homeland security including street crime, school security, gang violence, bias crime, and terrorism. He has forged extensive relationships with all relevant local, County, State and Federal agencies.

IronRock has raised awareness about the need for professional school security and has earned the trust of local institutions. At the time of this writing, more than 50 private educational institutions in Lakewood and the surrounding areas have contracted with IronRock to provide security services, including several that do so through private (non-BOE) funding. This is in addition to numerous Lakewood summer day camps and private schools outside Lakewood that are protected by IronRock. We also protect over 50 business establishments both in Lakewood and outside its borders.

IronRock thoroughly screens all its guards, most of whom have substantial law enforcement experience of their own. They receive extensive training both in school security and cultural sensitivity. IronRock guards wear professional uniforms and have other insignia while on duty. The result is that IronRock is seen by schools, students, faculty, and parents as both a potent protective force and a friendly, reassuring presence on a daily basis.

In addition to on-site security services, IronRock provides tailored security training for school administrators, faculty, and staff. Our sessions cover emergency response, lockdown procedures, threat recognition, and coordination with security personnel. Delivered by our leadership team with input from experts such as retired Police Chief Kevin Craig, these trainings equip school staff with practical skills to enhance preparedness and foster a culture of safety across the school community.



Technical Criteria:

As the predominant school security provider in the region, IronRock Security offers unmatched expertise in servicing educational environments. With deep operational experience and a full-service infrastructure already in place, we are prepared to scale and adapt to any new requirements while maintaining high standards of service. On average, IronRock fulfills new guard requests within 7-14 days – well below the contractually mandated 30-day window.

Should we be awarded the contract, no transition is needed at all. As the incumbent vendor with an active presence at over 30 Lakewood nonpublic schools serviced through this BOE contract. IronRock can seamlessly continue services without interruption. Our security staff are already vetted, deployed, and fully trained on each school's specific protocols, traffic flow, and cultural environment. This eliminates the risk of delays, miscommunication, or onboarding errors that often accompany a vendor change. More importantly, it preserves consistency and trust between guards and school communities—an essential factor in effective school safety. Our firm grasp of BOE policies, our certified training programs, and the commitment of our returning staff ensure a smooth continuation of services with zero risk to the district or its students.

Scope of Work:

IronRock Security meets or exceeds each technical requirement outlined in the RFP, Section C. Below is a detailed breakdown of how our operations and training protocols align with the required duties of a School Security Officer:

- **Visitor Control** — Our officers are trained to enforce sign-in/sign-out protocols and conduct package inspections in accordance with each school's policies, ensuring that only authorized individuals gain access.
- **Delivery of Goods** — Security staff are instructed to monitor and verify all vendor deliveries, cross-checking with school administration for authorized entry.
- **Vendors and Contractors** - Our post orders emphasize strict monitoring of all contractors and vendors without leaving the assigned security post, maintaining coverage integrity at all times.
- **Parent Pick-Up Procedures** — Officers are briefed on school-specific early dismissal protocols and coordinate directly with principals to validate identification and authorization.



- **Missing Child, Illness, or Behavioral Incidents** — Security officers respond immediately to emergency situations in partnership with school staff. Most are CPR/AED certified and receive ongoing training in de-escalation and child welfare response.
- **Equipment and Alarms** — All guards are familiarized with each school's security infrastructure, including intrusion detection, panic buttons, fire alarm locations, and emergency shutoffs. This is reinforced through on-site walkthroughs and documentation.
- **Other Duties** — Our officers work cooperatively with principals and are ready to support safety-related tasks in alignment with school guidelines and directives.

In every respect, IronRock understands the full scope of services, duties and responsibilities required under this engagement. IronRock is prepared to provide a seamless continuation of security services with trained officers, reliable supervision, and policies built to meet all technical obligations as outlined by the Lakewood Board of Education.

Seamless Transition – As the incumbent provider, IronRock requires no transition period. Our existing infrastructure, trained personnel, and post-specific standard operating procedures are already in place at each school. This means there is no onboarding delay, no gap in coverage, and no learning curve for guards. Continuity of service ensures that school staff, students, and parents continue interacting with familiar, trusted officers—officers who already understand school schedules, parent pick-up traffic flows, emergency exit routes, and the unique cultural norms of each school community. This eliminates operational disruptions and preserves institutional knowledge that would be lost with a new vendor.

Guard Hiring and Training:

IronRock officers undergo a rigorous vetting process to ensure the utmost competency and safety. Comprehensive background checks and fingerprint checks are performed for all applicants before they are hired. Officers are given site specific security training by our Director of Security, as well as SOP training for the specific site(s) they work at. We provide our guards with a comprehensive security training session on an annual basis. Topics include: Terrorism awareness, theft prevention, suspicious letters and packages, first aid, incident command system, ethics, limits on the use of force, detention of suspects and writing reports. All aspects of training are regularly reviewed and updated in accordance with the realities on the ground.



Individualized Protocols:

Before beginning service, our director of security confers with each school's administration to review best practices for the assigned security guard and to create a unique SOP for their particular institution. Following a comprehensive assessment of a school's particular needs and dynamics, we begin our search for the ideal officer to be assigned for that site.

On-Demand Flexibility:

Additional security coverage requests for nights, weekends and special events are covered by our part time staff. Every security request is met. IronRock maintains a 15%- Part Time reserve force that is available to service scheduled and unscheduled time off and call outs.

Compliance:

IronRock maintains all required licenses, permits and insurance, which can be provided upon request. Our administrative staff reviews and updates the files for accuracy on a daily basis; and for completeness on a monthly basis. All files are maintained and accessible in an organized manner in personnel binders and stored in our corporate office. IronRock uses TrackTik, a sophisticated reporting and tracking program, to track and manage our security officers. You can find more details about this software in Appendix C.

Non-Public School Expertise:

IronRock has been servicing Lakewood's nonpublic schools over the past Eight years. Servicing these institutions entails accommodating schedules and requests unlike those associated with security of any other school system. At this point, we have cemented a great working relationship with each of these institutions and have trained our guards to best service them. It would be enormously difficult for anyone to replicate this.

Cost Criteria

IronRock Security agrees to provide security services at a charge of \$42.97 an hour for armed security, and \$31.25 an hour for unarmed security. No additional fees or surcharges will be incurred by BOE or schools.

While these rates represent a modest increase from our previous bid, this adjustment reflects significant market factors impacting the security industry. The growing nationwide demand for qualified security personnel — particularly retired law enforcement officers eligible for Class 3 armed positions — combined with ongoing increases in New Jersey's minimum wage, have driven up the cost of recruiting and retaining high-quality staff. IronRock remains dedicated to providing the most qualified, thoroughly vetted, and professionally trained personnel to ensure the highest standard of service for the schools we protect.

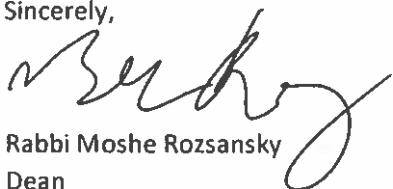

Appendix B:

IronRock School Officer Procedures and Guidelines

I. Security Officers must report to their shift on time.

- You must report to the shift in a timely manner. Late arrival will not be tolerated.
- Any misrepresentation related to time records is considered “falsifying” time records, which is a major infraction that results in the immediate termination of the officer and supervisor.
- Any falsification related to “sign in” or “sign out” in our program will likewise lead to immediate termination of both the officer and supervisor, as it is considered to be theft of hours from our company. Please ensure that all sign in/sign outs are accurate and true.

II. Security Officers need to begin their shift with all elements of their uniform and required equipment.

- Security Officers must be wearing all elements of their uniforms as they begin their shift. The officers must also wear key uniform elements of equipment, such as their weapon, throughout the shift. Bulletproof vests can be worn on an optional basis; they are not provided by the company.

III. Security Officers may not use personal electronics during the shift.

- While on shift, your private cellular device may be used for emergencies only.
- You may not make any personal calls, browse/update social media or engage in personal text messaging on company time.
- During working hours, you must be completely focused on and engaged in your work.
- Distraction caused by personal electronics will be considered an act of negligence and will result in immediate termination.



- You may not use any personal electronic devices during working hours, including but not limited to smartphones, smartwatches, tablets, earbuds, personal laptops, or any devices used for streaming, video, gaming, or social media.

IV. Security Officers must comply with the IronRock Security Action Employee Handbook and Memos at all times. Serious violations are listed below.

- Sleeping on company property and during your shift is considered misconduct for any officer. For an armed officer, this is considered to be a violation and an act of negligence.
- The use of narcotics and/or effects of narcotics on your person while on duty will be considered willful misconduct and will result in voluntary termination at a minimum. An officer – whether on or off duty - is prohibited from use, possession, distribution or trafficking of controlled substances or illegal drugs.
- The possession of and/or the consumption of alcohol while on duty will be considered willful misconduct and will result in voluntary termination at a minimum. No employee shall use alcohol within four hours prior to performance of safety-sensitive functions.
- No employee will divulge, discuss or relate any information of a classified, personal or proprietary nature concerning IronRock Security, its clients or employees as notated in the signed employee IronRock Security Action Employee Manual.

V. You must be in compliance with Armed Security Officer regulations.

- You must have proper identification at all times: NJ SORA II License, Company ID and NJ Carry Permit.
- You must follow procedures as an Armed Officer in NJ and be in compliance with the NJ State SORA Rules.
- You may only use a weapon registered in your own name.
- You must maintain a calm and respectful composure and remain professional, courteous and attentive at all times while on duty.



General School Guidelines

(These are the general guidelines. Each school may have particular requests in addition to or in contradiction to the below.)

- Security Officers should have a neat and clean appearance.
- Uniform must be clean and presentable at all times.
- All incident reports must be entered to TrackTik before the end of your tour.
- You may not engage or converse with the students. If any student asks you questions or touches you or your property, in any way, immediately inform the school staff.
- You must pay close attention to detail and immediately be able to **detect a change in circumstances that could pose a threat to the school and the students.**
- You must be able to respond to these threats and situations rapidly and effectively given your law enforcement expertise.
- Conduct a perimeter tour at least once every hour.
- During the tour, make sure that all doors are locked.
- Always remain visible so as to serve as an effective deterrent.
- Any person entering the school building that is not part of the student or staff body must be escorted to the office.
- Vendors and contractors need to be approved by the school staff before being allowed onto the premises.
- During arrival and dismissal, it is of utmost importance to look out for the safety of the students. Students should not run between busses. No private vehicles should not be allowed to access the area where students are being loaded onto or unloaded from the busses.
- Officers must monitor the school entrance to ensure that students don't wander off premises.
- Officers must remain in contact with the school's staff and make sure that students only enter the vehicles operated by their parent or someone else authorized to transport them from school.
- In case of an emergency, officers should call the local police department.
- Officers must comply with local and state police commands.
- Officers are to participate in any drills that the schools perform. Drills may include but are not limited to: Active shooter drill, bomb threat drill, evacuation drill, fire drill, lockdown drill and other security drills.
