Jenny,

At the 4:00 a.m call Saturday morning at Councilman Santo's house which became a CPR job, only one Tuckerton Police officer was there. One of our EMT's told me that this officer was on duty here alone. You told me on at least two occasions that the new police contract called for at least two officers to be on duty at all times. (I didn't see it when I read the contract). Some Wednesdays there seemed to be 7 officers on the day shift- 4 overlap, 1 school officer, and the 2 ranking officers if there were no absences. There were 3 officers on the scene of the fire call last Tuesday at midnight. There were 4 separate officers on the scene of two EMS calls today.

- ① OPRA Request: Records for the months of March, April, May, and June showing who actually worked what time periods, for all police department officers, Chief on down.

You have told me on several occasions that one reason for the Wednesday shift overlaps was that Wednesday's have more calls / need for coverage.

- ② OPRA Request: Records of numbers of actual police calls for assistance for all days of the week that you and/or Chief Olsen used to make this determination. I'm not interested in motor vehicle summonses, warrant arrests, etc. that would automatically run up the numbers solely because more personnel was on duty....only actual realistic calls for police help.

On a previous request, you wanted to know exactly what I was looking for regarding the police accreditation.

- ③ OPRA Request: All of the documentation submitted to justify the police accreditation.

- ④ Also, still have not received the rest of the invoices from the hearing officer and prosecutor from the Cherry hearings per a prior request.

See the attached taken from the borough's website. Looks like the leadership is not in sync with the mission statement.....protection of life (automatic response without communication delays called for in the "memorandum"), and property (keeping fire scenes clear). Anything getting fixed yet ???

Mayor and Council;

Unfortunately, I wasted part of my day a couple of weeks ago at a meeting in Borough Hall with Jenny, John, and Sam- called there because I was not happy with the borough giving away the store and getting pretty much nothing in return on the police contract.

Two of the things I also mentioned were the high water truck and the police interfering at fire calls. These apparently fell on deaf ears. Jenny and Brian will tell you to call when you have a problem, but it's a waste of time as nothing gets done.

As you can see on the attached high water memorandum, it fails to include fire calls, and advises officers to arrange to meet with the FTD ??? members. As I have explained to Brian and Jenny on multiple occasions, we have no direct communications with the police, and there is absolutely no good reason why we can't have a policy in place for an automatic response to prevent unnecessary delays in critical emergency situations. This is a case of Jenny and Brian giving residents in flood prone areas a potential DEATH SENTENCE. This problem could be solved today if common sense prevailed.

The Parking Fire / EMS instructions appear to have been written in the aftermath of my conversation with Brian in April after the Willow Landing call where police cars blocked fire truck placement. At said meeting, I mentioned to Jenny the problem persists as it happened again at a Second Avenue call.

So now on Tuesday night, we get called to a structure fire on Angler, and there are 3 police cars- parked on both sides of the street in violation of the chief's instructions and one of these was parked right where the pumper should have been (see photo). Instead of pushing the police car out of the way, I blew the air horn and told the police to move their cars. Remember- the same problems occurred on Floyd Lane. By the way to show the stupidity here, all three police vehicles were "trapped" there on Angler (the dead end street) for about an hour and a half. I have recommended before to Brian that maybe one car respond to the scene, the second could control traffic at the corner. In this instance the third could have patrolled the borough.

The instructions are uneducated and flawed. This also could easily be fixed very quickly by Brian consulting with us about procedures and the reasons why, and better yet have the fire company talk to officers on "Waste Money Wednesdays" when police are overstaffed.

The only reason for Jenny not wanting to fix things are her comments that I go about things the wrong way. This seems to be spreading to council.....so we'll hold the townspeople hostage because we don't care for Lee's actions.

Too bad the borough is being driven into a ditch. Because I had put something on "Facebook" about waste in the P.D. and said I wanted to maintain the town and P.D. but we need to run a tight ship, one day I waved to a police officer going to a fire call. His response was to verbally attack the fire chief at the call because I had waved to him. He was promoted to sergeant the next week. Is someone like this fit to be a police officer, let alone a sergeant ?

Obviously the police accreditation is a fraud.

There is still a total lack of communication. The fire company was not notified Second Avenue would be closed this week.

I sent the attached e-mail to Jenny and Brian- no response yet so they must be OK with me going public with these issues.

Now I see you are going to one meeting a month. I fought this idea as mayor because it causes delays in paying vendors. At my business, we'll charge more when we know it will take longer to be paid. By the way, are the governing body, administrator, and attorney taking proportional pay cuts for less meetings?

The governing body is the last chance to save the borough from self destruction.

For now on during high water events the following will be followed in reference to the military vehicle use for first aid calls.

- **Officers will communicate with the Tuckerton Fire Department (FTD) as to the status of the military vehicle (in service/out of service)**
- **Officers will arrange to meet with members of FTD at public works to transport them to scene in the military vehicle.**
- **If officers are unavailable to meet with FTD members, FTD will be immediately notified to this so they can notify West Tuckerton Fire Department for use of their military vehicle.**

Upon high water recede, the military vehicle will parked at public works, all equipment will be removed from the vehicle, and it will rinsed off with fresh water.

Here's what happened at the Floyd lane fire (It was in the middle of the night)- I drove the first engine, pulled into Floyd Lane, and had the Quality ambulance in the opposite lane (to my left) facing in the same direction I was travelling, then just past that was a Tuckerton Police vehicle parked in my lane facing the wrong way. I was able to weave through without hitting either one due to the short length of the pumper, but the next truck in couldn't get in as it is longer. (The ladder truck we're getting would have been completely blocked). So when I got out of the pumper, activated the pump, and went to the rear of the truck to pull hose up to the hydrant, I pulled out my camera to get photos. After the fire was out, I said something to the two police officers there about the situation because their vehicle was the problem. I also said something to the Quality ambulance crews that were standing right there in close proximity about where they parked and where they should park for fire calls. They told me when they arrived the street was clear and that the police car had been moved from another spot to where it was blocking the road prior to our arrival. The police did not disagree with this account. I mentioned the incident to Chief Olsen at a subsequent meeting and later mentioned it to you. At a later date you told me the police officer had given a different account....so if someone is trying to paint a different picture of what happened, I have a big problem with that.

We had an alarm call on Parker Road a few months ago where two Tuckerton police vehicles were actually double-parked in front of the house when I pulled up with the pumper. A few weeks ago on a Wednesday there were four Tuckerton police vehicles at an EMS call on the end of Edgewater at the dead end. This means I had to park the ambulance further up the street to leave room for Quality and the medics- and room for everyone to get out of there in a hurry if need be....so I want to see if Chief Olsen put policies in place to fix things, or just ignore me as he was doing on the high water truck over the end of last year.

That brings me up to the excessive waste of taxpayers money so all of the senior police officers can work days. You as an administrator have been aware of this for years (I've mentioned it several times). I've also mentioned it to past Chief Caputo and Chief Olsen. On Wednesdays, such as the day of that first aid call, you have four police cars out on the road, one officer at the school, and if nobody is out sick, etc. you have two ranking officers on duty. Absolutely ridiculous. To be efficient you need to do 8 or 12 hour shifts or there will be lots of wasted time. The only reasons i see to do ten hour shifts with an overlap day on Wednesday is to give more people off on weekends and to keep all of the senior officers on day shifts. While the borough wastes money catering to well paid people and gives out nice contracts and raises, the volunteer fire company is expected to stand in the street to raise money in addition to taking care of duties and other things. Why don't you, the police, public works, other employees, council, etc. have to go out and raise money to help fund yourselves?? You have been telling us for years that you wanted to get out allocation up to \$90,000.00 but there is always an excuse.

Then you have what I see as double standards on the part of the borough. The Cherry thing has been going on for over six years. The guy was doing his job, and even if there were some infractions on his part, it is more than obvious by what I have seen extreme measures have been pursued to go after him and destroy his life. And I ask why borough council would vote to terminate when an appeal has been filed about the hearing verdict from Sleeping Beauty. I was there for parts of it, and may be wrong, but I'll bet some and maybe even most of that will be overturned. When Officer Evans lost his driving license and couldn't do his job which involved driving a police car, he apparently remained on the payroll and was brought to work by the chief. Officer Cherry told me the other day that when Rice noticed, they requested executive session- but he was terminated anyway without that being granted. When I asked Chief Olsen if he initiated the charges against Cherry, he said he did. When I asked him if he had read the judges decision about the K-9 incident, he told me he had not. How in the world do you do a proper investigation without reading all of the appropriate information. You, as the appropriate authority over the police should have an obligation to make sure things were done properly.

I have resigned from fire company officer positions. Anything I do as a disgruntled citizen is on me and me alone- nothing to do with the fire company.

Note- On the matter of the house fire call on Floyd Lane, I was driving the pumper and was able to wiggle past the other vehicles, but the next truck could not. I said something to the police officers and ambulance crews there that night, then later mentioned it to Chief Olsen and then Jenny due to my concerns. Jenny later got back to me and basically said the police officer blamed the ambulance. Just to be clear, the police car was on the wrong side of the road blocking the lane the fire apparatus should have come in on. (see attached photo- photo is looking toward Center Street). I have a big problem with people who try to avoid blame by blaming others. (lack of honesty- especially with police).

I think this is the incident where I said isn't the police first on scene so the ambulance should have parked on the same side, but you then informed me that the officer moved the car before the fire company got there.. and my response was ok I will advise the Chief.. it was talked about at a Council Meeting. Correct me if this is a different time.

I attended some of the hearing sessions re: the Cpl. Cherry matter. Based on what I saw, heard, and later read, I'm having a difficult time comprehending how he was allegedly found guilty on all counts.

Would each council member please answer one question.....did you base your vote to terminate Cpl. Cherry on the recommendation of the hearing officer, or did you take the time to read the transcripts or the final arguments of the prosecution and of the defense???

The hearing officer missed at least part of the hearing- she was dozing during testimony and I think I sent you the attached photo prior.

Also, I logged on to the meeting this evening but I guess I missed something. I wanted to speak during the public portion to ask why, in light of the budgetary issues / tax increases here in Tuckerton, there is still so much money wasted on the police department. I've inquired on several occasions over the years about the 10 hour shifts which waste thousands of dollars each year, and have been told it's because there are not enough officers to do a 12 hour schedule. We have in fact had plenty of officers to implement a 12 hour Pitman schedule, so I know I've been getting a snow job, and maybe you have also. If I were running the department, the ranking officers below the chief would be on staggered shifts instead of all of them being on day shifts. Pitman gives everyone some weekends off. When I asked Jenny why the corporal who came back to work was doing the school resource officer job instead of the class II, she told me he wanted to work weekdays. Since when do employees dictate when they will work??? Shouldn't the department (especially as a smaller one like ours) be run efficiently in the taxpayers interest???

In my e-mail last Thursday, I mentioned something about records being doctored during sworn testimony at Cherry's hearing. I have now obtained a copy of that portion where a date had been changed for the accreditation process. This means that it appears we have corruption in the police department. When you take that, and things like where Jenny told me she was told by police that the blame for blocking fire truck access to a fire call is on the Quality Medical crew, we now have a problem where the police are no longer credible. If they would doctor dates for an accreditation, then there is the question of whether they would tell the truth on their reports or in court. Like I said, it's all about trust. Pretty sad. Since I have not heard from anyone in a week now from the governing body, administration, or the police chief about addressing anything I have mentioned, tomorrow I will be starting to disseminate information publicly to force change.

Looking at the budgets, I notice that the police combination of salaries and wages and other expenses totalled have gone from \$741,543 in 2018 to \$942,500 in the proposed 2020 budget. An increase of \$200,957.

Then we get into the things regarding borough dollars. The biggest week after week waste of money I have seen is the police, especially the shift schedule. I have mentioned this to you several times over the years and nothing gets done to fix it. Just excuses for not fixing it. Maybe it's in their contract to have these shifts, maybe not. But either way you bear responsibility for cutting blatant waste- if it's not in the contract it should be fixed now, if it is in the contract then it's on you for having it in there. It makes no sense having all of the ranking and senior police officers on day shifts instead of spread out in supervisory capacities across the other shifts. If you and Chief Olsen can't do a better job of managing the department, then maybe we shouldn't have one. You seem to ignore my comments in these e-mails regarding double standards and manipulating records for accreditation. I spoke to you a couple of years ago about looking into other JIF's, and you always made excuses why you couldn't. I recently spoke to the insurance girl (Tamara) at Berkeley Twp. who are members of Garden State JIF. She told me they just priced it out and they can't afford to go back to Ocean County JIF and said Garden State has a tendency to fight back more. I just did a job for Flemington (a borough in Hunterdon County) who only has one component of the utility, and they have a CFO one day a week that works for another town also. OK, we have both water and sewer, maybe we could have a CFO for 2 days a week and save some money. If there is no money set aside for a possible half-million dollar exposure to Tuckerton taxpayers, I would think you and the CFO bear responsibility.

What bothers me the most as I write these e-mails is that not one of you- administrator, police chief, or member of the governing body has called or commented to say hey, maybe we better look into some things and correct some problems. Doesn't say much for the future of our town or the people running it. It's all about trust.....

Sorry Jenny, had to cut off this morning and do some things at the shop..

As far as double standards, you had the Sanzari matter where he was paid while out, where Cherry was cut off. The borough must have worked out some kind of agreement, and he's back. I'll see in the requested paperwork what he was actually charged with. My understanding was you had executive sessions to go back and forth about Cherry, so if he would agree to certain things, I'm assuming he would have been back.....then suddenly he gets terminated in what sounded like a quick, pre-orchestrated vote.....and none of our elected council members had the common decency to answer my question. I had to read it in the Sandpaper. You have stated to me several times over the years that Cherry is guilty. A few weeks before she left, Mrs. Gaboardi stated to me Cherry is guilty. The hearings weren't completed.

There is a settlement agreement that went through the Joint Insurance Fund and you will have a copy of that with all the stuff I owe you. As for having something to hide that is not the case and what paperwork you are requesting that does exist you will get it.

If you don't have a contract, please supply copies of whatever instruments state your work rules, job descriptions, salary, etc. for the last few years. For the Clerk's position my duties and responsibilities are defined in NJSA 40A:9-133 and also found in the Borough Code which is located online. For the administrator my duties and responsibilities are define in NJSA 40A:9-136 and also found in the Borough code at tuckertonborough.com and the salary resolution will be part of the packet that will sent to you via email.

You should get yourself and the governing body copies of the transcripts also and read them thoroughly. There was testimony that sounded to me like records may have been doctored for the accreditation process. If I heard that correctly, heads should roll. Besides, how can a police department who can't figure out a way to enforce laws and deal with a parking issue for over 10 years get accredited??? According to records, Cherry never got his required eluding training the year before the incident- but Caputo testified he may have given it at the range!!!.... and Chief Olsen failed to successfully pass his in 2012.

Several years ago, Councilman Schwartz told me that Tuckerton had set aside some money toward Cherry.

23. Please provide detailed accounting of all monies set aside for Cherry. We do not have monies set aside specifically for Cherry; therefore I have no record of that... If there was a record it would be listed in the annual audit which is also located on the Borough website

24. Please provide any documentation, letters, memos and information leading up to the appointment Of the hearing officer in the Cherry Matter. If there exists a document outside the appointment resolution, contract and invoices I will put that with the packet. If there is things I do not have I will explain that as well

25. Please provide any documentation, letters, memos, and information leading up to the apointment of the prosecutor in the Cherry matter. Same as above

26. Please provide all documentation pertaining to the police department accreditation since the accreditation was first mentioned. I need you to be more specific on this... as there is a lot of information on this and most of it is policies and procedures for the police department which is a huge amount. Do you want to see how the certification was obtained and what needed to happen to get that? This is done by an outside company called the Rodgers group and then we are certified by the State Association of Police Chiefs which has its own OPRA rules.. I am not trying to avoid this it is just voluminous amount of documents and involving people coming to the police department and right now that is not allowed to happen. So if it is something that I can get myself I will and it will be with your pile of stuff.

Unfortunately, when people are unwilling to answer simple questions as elected officials and public employees there is usually a reason.....something to hide. I am sorry that you feel that way but I have nothing to hide.. anything that is public record you can come and view at any time once COVID-19 is over with.

Here's what happened at the Floyd lane fire (It was in the middle of the night)- I drove the first engine, pulled into Floyd Lane, and had the Quality ambulance in the opposite lane (to my left) facing in the same direction I was travelling, then just past that was a Tuckerton Police vehicle parked in my lane facing the wrong way. I was able to weave through without hitting either one due to the short length of the pumper, but the next truck in couldn't get in as it is longer. (The ladder truck we're getting would have been completely blocked). So when I got out of the pumper, activated the pump, and went to the rear of the truck to pull hose up to the hydrant, I pulled out my camera to get photos. After the fire was out, I said something to the two police officers there about the situation because their vehicle was the problem. I also said something to the Quality ambulance crews that were standing right there in close proximity about where they parked and where they should park for fire calls. They told me when they arrived the street was clear and that the police car had been moved from another spot to where it was blocking the road prior to our arrival. The police did not disagree with this account. I mentioned the incident to Chief Olsen at a subsequent meeting and later mentioned it to you. At a later date you told me the police officer had given a different account....so if someone is trying to paint a different picture of what happened, I have a big problem with that.

We had an alarm call on Parker Road a few months ago where two Tuckerton police vehicles were actually double-parked in front of the house when I pulled up with the pumper. A few weeks ago on a Wednesday there were four Tuckerton police vehicles at an EMS call on the end of Edgewater at the dead end. This means I had to park the ambulance further up the street to leave room for Quality and the medics- and room for everyone to get out of there in a hurry if need be....so I want to see if Chief Olsen put policies in place to fix things, or just ignore me as he was doing on the high water truck over the end of last year.

That brings me up to the excessive waste of taxpayers money so all of the senior police officers can work days. You as an administrator have been aware of this for years (I've mentioned it several times). I've also mentioned it to past Chief Caputo and Chief Olsen. On Wednesdays, such as the day of that first aid call, you have four police cars out on the road, one officer at the school, and if nobody is out sick, etc. you have two ranking officers on duty. Absolutely ridiculous. To be efficient you need to do 8 or 12 hour shifts or there will be lots of wasted time. The only reasons i see to do ten hour shifts with an overlap day on Wednesday is to give more people off on weekends and to keep all of the senior officers on day shifts. While the borough wastes money catering to well paid people and gives out nice contracts and raises, the volunteer fire company is expected to stand in the street to raise money in addition to taking care of duties and other things. Why don't you, the police, public works, other employees, council, etc. have to go out and raise money to help fund yourselves?? You have been telling us for years that you wanted to get out allocation up to \$90,000.00 but there is always an excuse.

Then you have what I see as double standards on the part of the borough. The Cherry thing has been going on for over six years. The guy was doing his job, and even if there were some infractions on his part, it is more than obvious by what I have seen extreme measures have been pursued to go after him and destroy his life. And I ask why borough council would vote to terminate when an appeal has been filed about the hearing verdict from Sleeping Beauty. I was there for parts of it, and may be wrong, but I'll bet some and maybe even most of that will be overturned. When Officer Evans lost his driving license and couldn't do his job which involved driving a police car, he apparently remained on the payroll and was brought to work by the chief. Officer Cherry told me the other day that when Rice noticed, they requested executive session- but he was terminated anyway without that being granted. When I asked Chief Olsen if he initiated the charges against Cherry, he said he did. When I asked him if he had read the judges decision about the K-9 incident, he told me he had not. How in the world do you do a proper investigation without reading all of the appropriate information. You, as the appropriate authority over the police should have an obligation to make sure things were done properly.

The hearing officer missed at least part of the hearing- she was dozing during testimony and I think I sent you the attached photo prior.

Also, I logged on to the meeting this evening but I guess I missed something. I wanted to speak during the public portion to ask why, in light of the budgetary issues / tax increases here in Tuckerton, there is still so much money wasted on the police department. I've inquired on several occasions over the years about the 10 hour shifts which waste thousands of dollars each year, and have been told it's because there are not enough officers to do a 12 hour schedule. We have in fact had plenty of officers to implement a 12 hour Pitman schedule, so I know I've been getting a snow job, and maybe you have also.

If I were running the department, the ranking officers below the chief would be on staggered shifts instead of all of them being on day shifts. Pitman gives everyone some weekends off. When I asked Jenny why the corporal who came back to work was doing the school resource officer job instead of the class II, she told me he wanted to work weekdays. Since when do employees dictate when they will work??? Shouldn't the department (especially as a smaller one like ours) be run efficiently in the taxpayers interest???

I kind of thought it would be nice to solve problems behind the scenes, but it doesn't seem to work here.

Just so you are not blindsided, I'll start tonight at the council meeting about the public safety issue regarding high tides. (See e-mail at the bottom from November 16th)
As of now, the only thing I'm aware of having been done is Chief Olsen calling Dale and advising to call Little Egg Harbor PD if the flood truck is needed. This can cause delays.

I think those potentially affected by the high tide responses should be warned that there may be longer response times than necessary for emergencies due to a lack of a plan to expedite arrival of the needed personnel and supplies, especially in situations like the Great Bay Blvd. call where SECONDS mean life or death, so I'll publicly warn them and question why we can't get together and come up with a realistic response plan here.

Why can't we have a pre-plan to have the high water truck and driver automatically going to a certain point to meet responders for calls during high tide events?

What is the plan if the fire company is out on a call and not calling LEHPD for an incident?

Has Quality been included as they could get a BLS call that turns into a ALS call?

We had a man die on Heron Road in his bath tub when I was mayor and that day there was a delayed response due to the Great Bay EMS situation. One July 4th weekend we had accident victims laying on backboards under a tree for about 25 minutes waiting for ambulances. Volunteers did something to help fix these problems by buying used ambulances with the Tuckerton First Aid dissolution money. I think the well paid employees of the borough should be willing to put some effort into doing better.
