Dear Mr. Schneck:

You filed an OPRA request with the Casino Reinvestment Development Authority, seeking:

1. Any and all documents, including but not limited to correspondence, emails, memoranda, applications, contracts, invoices, memoranda, records of deposits, payments, rebates or refunds relating to the rental or attempt to rent space within Boardwalk Hall for an event on January 19, 2019.
2. A copy of any complaint, letter, flyer or other document, whether anonymous or not, received by any employee or officer of CRDA, or by any member of its Board of Directors, since July 1, 2018 claiming or alleging that Martin Small sought to rent or use Boardwalk Hall for a "Small Ball" or other event in 2019, whether at a discounted price or otherwise.
3. A log listing any and all emails to or from any person with an @njcrda.com email account from July 1, 2018 to the present date using the term "Small Ball"; "Martin Small Ball"; "Marty Small"; "Martin Small"; "Councilman Small" or "Council President Small"; and with respect to each such email identifying the date of the email, the sender and all recipients thereto, the subject line of the email, and whether there are attachments to same.

4. A log listing each and every email to or from, or cc'd or bcc'd to mdoherty@njcrda.com, and with respect to each such email identifying the date of the email, the sender and all recipients thereto, the subject line of the email, and whether there are attachments to same.
5. A log listing each and every email to or from, or cc'd or bcc'd to any person with an @njcrda.com email account from July 1, 2018, and as to which matt@dohertynj.com is the sender or a recipient, and identifying with respect to each such email the date of the email, the sender and all recipients thereto, the subject line of the email, and whether there are attachments to same.

The Authority has determined that your OPRA request is overly broad and substantially disruptive.

OPRA does not allow a blanket request for every document a public agency has on file or a wholesale request for general information. Gannett N.J. Partners, LP v. Cty. of Middlesex, 379 N.J. Super. 205, 212 (App. Div. 2005); MAG Entm't, LLC v. Div. of Alcoholic Beverage Control, 375 N.J. Super. 534, 549 (App. Div. 2005); Bent v. Twp. of Stafford Police Dep't, 381 N.J. Super. 30, 36-37 (App. Div. 2005); Spectraserv, Inc. v. Middlesex Cty. Utilities Auth., 416 N.J. Super. 565, 578 (App. Div. 2010); N.J. Builders Ass'n v. N.J. Council on Affordable Hous., 390 N.J. Super. 166, 178-79 (App. Div. 2007).

Requests for correspondence must identify the individuals or accounts to be searched and be confined to a discrete and limited subject matter. Burke v. Brandes, 429 N.J. Super. 169, 176-78 (App. Div. 2012); see also Elcavage v. West Milford Twp. (Passaic), GRC Complaint No. 2009-08 (Apr. 8, 2010) (stating that a proper request for email correspondence must contain "(1) the content and/or subject of the e-mail, (2) the specific date or range of dates during which the e-mail was transmitted or the emails were transmitted, and (3) a valid e-mail request must identify the sender and/or the recipient thereof").

With respect to Item 1 of your request, there are no documents responsive to the portion of your request seeking "applications, contracts, invoices, memoranda, records of deposits, payments, rebates or refunds . . ."

With respect to the remainder of Item 1 and all of Item 2 of your request, the Authority cannot respond to an inquiry about the receipt or possession of documents or the existence or non-existence of an investigation. N. Jersey Media Grp. Inc. v. Bergen Cty. Prosecutor's Office, 447 N.J. Super. 182, 204 (App. Div. 2016); see also Falcetti v. Waterfront Comm'n of New York Harbor, A-1082-15T4, (App. Div. Sept. 23, 2016).

With respect to Items 3 and 4 of your request, the Authority's search located more than 10,000 emails. Due to the scope of your request, reviewing these records for applicable exemptions and privileges would substantially disrupt to agency operations.

With respect to Item 5, there are no documents responsive to this item of your request.

Your request is hereby denied and closed.
