STATEMENT: Adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, pursuant to Public Laws of 1975. Said notice was advertised in the Asbury Park Press and the Beacon and was posted on the bulletin board showing the time and place of the meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00PM by Mayor Juliano with a salute. Committee members present were Messrs. Quinn, Curatolo and McDonald. Mr. Kennis was absent.

Lacey Elks Presentation: The Lacey Elks was present to present to the Lacey Food Bank a check in the amount of \$1,500 to help the needy families throughout the community. They are also placing food barrels in their building for members to place non-perishable items in and to then turn over to the Food Bank for their pantry.

Special Use Permits: FR Presbyterian Church is requesting to hold their Annual Fall Flea Market on September 15th. The Zoning Officer has reviewed the request and approved the site plan for the event. A motion was made by Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Curatolo to authorize the event and the posting of signs one week in advance of the event. Motion carried.

Trademark Dance Academy: Trademark Dance Academy is requesting to hold a car wash in their place on Manchester Avenue on August 19th. The Zoning Officer has reviewed the request and approved the site plan for the event. A motion was made by Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Curatolo to authorize the event. Motion carried.

Trademark Dance Academy: Trademark Dance Academy is requesting to hold a flea market in their place on Manchester Avenue on September 16th. The Zoning Officer has reviewed the request and approved the site plan for the event. A motion was made by Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Curatolo to authorize the event. Motion carried.

Lacey Memorial Home: Lacey Memorial Home is requesting along with the Business Professional Women of Southern Ocean County to hold a fundraiser at the Funeral Home on October 13th. It would be a Halloween themed walk through event inside the funeral home, as well as offer psychic reading and refreshments. The event will feature items that already exist within the funeral home as well as live costumed actors moving throughout the guests. The original layout of the funeral home will not be modified in any way with additional structures, animatronics or pyrotechnics. The public areas will be clearly marked and sufficiently lite to ensure the safety of the guests. Both exits will be clearly marked. A food truck may also be on premises located in the back parking lot. The governing body would like to carry this to the next meeting until the following items are addressed: Overflow parking where will that be; concerns with on street parking because it narrows the width of the road for emergency vehicles; no police coverage requested and the requester will have to pay for such coverage; also a letter from State Fire that this is a permitted and authorized use and finally a letter from the mortuary licensing board that this type of event can be done at such a facility.

Community Options: Community Options is looking to hold an awareness fundraiser to promote their upcoming 5K run. They are requesting to hold such at the Lacey United Methodist Church on October 6th. There will be food trucks and bands on site during the day from 12-5. The Zoning Officer has reviewed the request and approved the site plan for the event. A motion was made by Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Quinn to authorize the event. Motion carried

Clean Water Action: Clean Water Action is requesting permission for door-to-door solicitation education and fund-raising drive through out the community from July 25th to September 15th from 4pm to 9pm. Each canvasser will be required to wear their ID badge and a list of personnel will be on file with the local police. The governing body approved the request but asks that the Clean Water Action be considerate and not canvass after dusk. Also they are to register with the Police. This was passed on a motion by Mr. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Quinn. Motion carried.

The meeting was recessed at 7:12 PM on a motion by Mr. Quinn, seconded by Mr. McDonald. Motion carried.
