Narrative

Investigation Narrative

Vehicle when stopped or arrival on scene:

On 11/10/2022 at approximately 1909 hours, Ptl. Steffen and I, were dispatched to 99 Lacey Road (Bowker Field) for the report of a black sedan with the operator asleep in the front seat with a child in the back seat. Upon arrival, to Bowker Field, I observed a black sedan facing the wrong way on a one way street to the entrance of Bowker Field. I positioned my patrol vehicle behind the rear of the black sedan, and observed the vehicle to be a black 2018 Mazda 6 bearing Delaware registration (404043). Due to the vehicle matching the description given by dispatch, I activated my emergency lights to conduct a suspicious motor vehicle traffic stop. The activation of the emergency lights automatically turned on the Mobile Video Recorder inside the patrol vehicle and my issued Body Worn Camera.

I approached the vehicle from the passenger side and I observed two small children in the rear passenger seats crying and visible upset. I observed a white male in the driver seat who was slumped over and appeared to be sleeping. The juvenile female, later identified as [2] (dob [1]) stated, "daddy fell asleep". Also in the rear of the vehicle was a juvenile male, later identified as [4] [3]. I advised Ptl. Steffen to position his patrol vehicle in front of the Mazda because I was unsure if the vehicle was in park. I then walked around to the driver side of the vehicle in attempt to wake up the driver, later identified as Steven P. Westphal. I called to Mr. Westphal while standing outside the driver side window and received no response. I opened the driver side front door and continued to call to the Mr. Westphal, with no response. I then touched the left shoulder of Mr. Westphal several times in attempt to wake up Mr. Westphal, and received no response. At this time, I asked [5] if she had seen daddy take anything, and [6] responded, "daddy's sleeping". At this time we asked for a Manchester Township Emergency Services Ambulance. I examined Mr. Westphal's eyes to be dilated and there to be a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from inside the vehicle. I then continued to rub Mr. Westphal's chest (Sternum Rub) in order to awaken him. Mr. Westphal finally woke up after that attempt. I advised Mr. Westphal to unbuckle his seatbelt and step out of the vehicle. As Mr. Westphal stepped out of the vehicle I detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Mr. Westphal.

I escorted Mr. Westphal to the rear of his vehicle, during the short walk Mr. Westphal was stumbling. I asked Mr. Westphal what was going on, and he stated "nothing". I then asked Mr. Westphal if he had taken anything, and he stated again "nothing". I then asked Mr. Westphal if he was impaired, and he stated "no". I then asked Mr. Westphal if he was under the influence of alcohol, and he stated "yes". While speaking with Mr. Westphal his speech was slow and slurred. Mr. Westphal was wearing glasses, but I was able to determine that his eyes were watery and bloodshot. I asked Mr. Westphal how much he had to drink tonight, and he stated "a little bit". Due to the odor of an alcoholic beverage and Mr. Westphal sleeping behind the wheel of vehicle, with the engine running, I advised him that I would be running him through a series of tests to determine his level of impairment. At this time, Mr. Westphal stated "just arrest me". I asked Mr. Westphal if he would be willing to take my tests and Mr. Westphal stated "I don't know but I have been drinking". While waiting for additional patrol officers to arrive on scene, I began to have a conversation with Mr. Westphal. During the conversation Mr. Westphal was confused and unsure of where he was. Ptl. Steffen remained with the juveniles who were still visibly upset and crying.

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SFSTs:

HGN: I asked Mr. Westphal if he had any medical conditions with his eyes and he stated "no". I asked Mr. Westphal the reason for his eye glasses and he stated "distance". I then began explain the test to Mr. Westphal and if he understood my instructions, and he stated "yup". During the instructions Mr. Westphal was swaying from front to back while still leaning on his vehicle. During the test Mr. Westphal failed to follow my instructions and at no point in time using his eyes followed the stimulus.

Arrest and Enroute to Police Headquarters:

At this time, I determined that Mr. Westphal was highly intoxicated and if I was to continue the SFSTs Mr. Westphal would be a risk to causing bodily injury to himself or officers on scene. I advised Mr. Westphal that he was being placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated. Mr. Westphal was handcuffed to the rear utilizing the double-lock mechanism and was searched incident to arrest. Mr. Westphal was placed in the rear prisoner compartment of my patrol vehicle 76. Sgt. Gatnarek arrived on scene.

Manchester Emergency Service EMT's arrived on scene and began to check on the two juveniles in the rear of the vehicle and remained with the children. It was determined that the juveniles would be transported to police headquarters and New Jersey Department of Child Protection and Permanency would be contacted.

2 A intoxicant search was conducted and an 200ml bottle of Svedka Vodka was found on the passenger side seat in a take out food box. This bottle was taken into custody, photographed and logged into evidence, see attached photograph.

I advised Mr. Westphal that his children would be transported back to police headquarters in their car seats by one of the officers on scene. Ptl. Steffen transported the children back to police headquarters without incident. Mr. Westphal's vehicle was impounded and towed from the scene by Priced Rite Towing in accordance with John's Law and Mr. Westphal was transported to police headquarters without incident. During transport, an odor of an alcoholic beverage filled the passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle that was not present prior to placing Mr. Westphal inside.

While at Headquarters:

Once at police headquarters Mr. Westphal was removed from the rear prisoner compartment of my patrol vehicle and it was checked and found to be clear of any contraband. Mr. Westphal was escorted into police headquarters through the front entrance due to his high level of intoxication and inability to walk properly. Once inside the processing room, all radios, cellphones, and any other electronic devices were placed outside and separate from the processing room where the Alcotest is administered as per department protocols. My weapon and taser were secured outside of the prisoner processing area. I observed the time on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C at 1954 and the observation period was started. I read Mr. Westphal the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Standard Statement for Operators of a Motor Vehicle Form and after the conclusion of the form he replied "Yeah" to providing samples of his breath. I read Mr. Westphal his Miranda Rights and he signed that he understood. Mr. Westphal did not wish to sign his Miranda Rights waiver. Based on this, he was

not asked any additional questions in reference to the incident. After the twenty minute minimum observation time had passed I observed the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C to be 2014 hours and I entered the information into the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. Mr. Westphal was continuously monitored and at no time did he place anything in his mouth, burp, belch or vomit. After two adequate sample breaths were provided the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C received a 0.29 % BAC. The sample readings were entered into the State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator and were found to be within acceptable tolerance.

While at police headquarters the two juveniles were placed in the police interview and were monitored by Ptl. Steffen. The New Jersey Department of Child Protection and Permanency was contacted and stated that would be responding to police headquarters. I contacted the juveniles mother, identified as [1], [2], and advised her of the incident. [3] stated that she would be responding to police headquarters from their residence located in Delaware. [4] stated that she would be contacting the juveniles uncle, identified as [5] to respond to police headquarters to sit with the children while she traveled up to police headquarters.

Due to the totality of the circumstances it was determined that, Endangering the Welfare of a Child (2C:24-4A(2)) charges would be applied for through the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office. I contacted Assistant Prosecutor Brandon DeJesus, and advised him of the incident. AP DeJesus stated that there was probable cause and he would approve the charges against Mr. Westphal. Mr. Westphal was processed for arrest according to department protocol. I transported Mr. Westphal to Ocean County Jail without incident.

At police headquarters DCPD case workers Lacey Longo and Alice Mann arrived and spoke with the children. The case workers spoke to [6] and it was determined that the children would be transported by their uncle [7] to a local hotel. The case workers advised me that they would be also following to the local hotel to follow up with [8].

Mr. Westphal was charged with the following offenses, two counts of Endangering the Welfare of a Child (2C:24-4A(2)), and two counts of Driving While Intoxicated with a Minor in the Vehicle (39:4-50.15B) (Warrant no. 1518 W 2022 000395). Mr. Westphal was also issued the following traffic summonses:

Narrative

Manchester Township Police Department

Investigation Narrative

On November 11, 2022 at approximately 2321 hours, I was on stationary patrol in marked vehicle 81, utilizing my patrol vehicle's radar on State Highway 70 (SH-70) near the intersection of County Route 571. I positioned my vehicle toward SH-70 eastbound in the parking lot of the Santander Bank (2000 SH-70). While stationary, I observed a silver Jeep bearing New Jersey Registration (X47JMT) traveling east on SH-70 toward the intersection of County Route 571. As the vehicle passed my location, I observed the aforementioned vehicle had front window tint; in violations of New Jersey 39:3-74. As a result, I drove onto SH-70 to position my vehicle in order to conduct a motor vehicle stop. While I was driving behind the silver Jeep I observed the vehicle fail to maintain its lane of travel and cross over the center double yellow lane marking multiple times. I then notified dispatch of my location, activated my patrol vehicle's emergency lights, and conducted a motor vehicle stop in the area of 2341 SH-70. During this time, the Mobile Video Recorder (MVR) on my patrol vehicle and Body Worn Camera (BWC) were activated.

I exited my patrol vehicle and approached the passenger side of the above mentioned vehicle. During this time, I requested the driver's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance. The driver and sole occupant of the vehicle was identified as Virginia Schneider. While speaking to Virginia, I detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the interior compartment of the suspect vehicle. Virginia's movements were slow and her speech was slurred. Virginia fumbled her documents and dropped her wallet. Virginia struggled to pick up her wallet off the passenger side floor board. I then asked Virginia to unlock her front passenger door so that I could pick up her wallet for her, to which she agreed. Virginia struggled to unlock the car door utilizing the buttons located on the driver door. It should be noted Virginia stated that she had the vehicle for approximately 5 years. Once I gave Virginia her wallet she only handed me her work identification and registration. I asked Virginia once more for her license and insurance to which she complied. Shortly after Ptl. Gardner #422 arrived on scene.

At that time, I asked Virginia to exit her vehicle; to which she completed without incident. I then advised Virginia that I initiated a motor vehicle stop due to the fact that her vehicle had window tint. I then advised Virginia when I positioned my vehicle behind her vehicle I observed her cross over the double yellow lane marking twice, to which she replied "okay". Additionally, I explained to Virginia that I observed her fumble with her documents and struggle to unlock the vehicle's doors. It should be noted, while speaking with Virginia I detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath. I then asked Virginia how many drinks she had consumed on the above mentioned date. Virginia advised me that she had three (3) drinks. During conversation it was learned that the three (3) drinks were Vodka iced tea which were consumed within approximately 2 hours of the motor vehicle stop.

I requested Virginia perform a series of Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST's); to which she agreed to perform.

It should be noted that the roadway was flat, wet, and clear of any notable debris when SFST's were conducted. The area was well lit by patrol vehicle head lamps. All forward facing emergency flashing lights were deactivated so as to not affect Virginia's performance on any test.

Test 1: Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN)

Patrolman Gardner #422 was on scene and performed HGN on Virginia. Please see Patrolman Gardner's supplemental report for the details on the outcome of this test.

Test 2: Walk and Turn Test:

I explained and demonstrated the Walk and Turn Test to Virginia; to which she stated she understood the instructions. I then asked Virginia if she had any issues that may affect her performance during the test; to which she stated she had knee problems but nothing that would affect her walking.

While providing Virginia the instructions, I observed her not be able to stand in the instructional stance and step off balance. During the test, I observed Virginia to stop walking to steady herself, fail to touch heel to toe, lose balance while walking and not count her steps aloud until I reminded her to do so. Additionally, Virginia took more than nine heel-to-toe steps and stopped. At that point I asked Virginia if she was done with the test. Virginia replied by asking if she was supposed to take nine, and took additional steps. It should be noted that I had to remind Virginia to turn around and take nine heel-to-toe steps back.

Test 3: One Leg Stand Test:

Next, I demonstrated and provided instructions for the One Leg Stand Test; to which Virginia stated she understood the instructions.

During the test, I observed Virginia to put her foot down several times, and sway while attempting to balance.

Based on the aforementioned observations of Virginia, I formed the opinion that she was under the influence of intoxicating liquors and/or drugs and too impaired to operate her vehicle. Virginia was handcuffed to the rear, utilizing the double locking mechanism. Prior to Virginia being escorted to my patrol vehicle, Ptl. Gardner observed a metal cup containing a pink liquid in the front cup holder near the driver seat. Ptl. Gardner asked Virginia what was in the cup, to which she replied "It's not mine". Virginia then stated it was tequila and quickly changed her answer to the liquid being ginger ale. Virginia was placed in the rear of my patrol vehicle #81, which was checked and found to be clear of any contraband, before and after being transported to the Manchester Township Police Department for processing.

Ptl. Gardner remained on scene with the vehicle until it was towed by Priced Rite Towing. Once impounded, the vehicle would have a mandatory 12-hour hold as per Johns Law. A vehicle impound report was completed. Ptl. Gardner conducted a search of Virginia's vehicle for proof of intoxicants which yielded the aforementioned metal cup. See attached photo.

Transport to Headquarters:

During the transport, Virginia remained calm and cooperative. The odor of an alcoholic beverage filled the rear compartment of my patrol vehicle, which was not there prior to Virginia being placed in the vehicle. Upon arrival at Manchester Police Headquarters, I parked my patrol vehicle in the cul-de-sac near the entrance to the police department. I then escorted Virginia into the processing room and secured her to the cuffing bench.

At Headquarters:

At police headquarters, Virginia was processed for her arrest; to include photographs. Virginia was read her Miranda Rights; which she stated she understood them and wished to speak to me regarding the investigation. Virginia was read the implied consent statement in regards to providing breath samples. After being read the statement in its entirety, Virginia was asked if she would provide samples of her breath; to which she stated "Yes". Prior to the twenty-minute observation I asked Virginia if she had anything in her mouth to which she stated no.

Sergeant Barker #393 assisted with the investigation by operating the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. Virginia provided breath samples which yielded a result of a .21% Blood Alcohol Content (BAC). It should be noted, all cellular phones, portable radios, and radio frequency devices were removed from the processing area prior to and during breath testing. See Sergeant Barker's supplemental report for more information.

Virginia was issued the following summonses as a result of the investigation:

Upon completion of processing, Virginia was released to her father, identified as [REDACTED] who signed the Potential Liability Warning Form for Virginia, which he indicated that he understood (see attached). This case is closed pending court action.

Vehicle Operation:

On November 12, 2022 at approximately 2254 hours, I Ptl. R. Campolei #421 was on uniformed stationary patrol in the Crossroads Realty parking lot (2002 State Highway 70) (SH70) near the exit facing northbound towards SH 70 when I observed a red Kia Rio (NJ REG L71PCZ) traveling eastbound on SH 70. As the vehicle passed my location, I observed the passenger front headlamp to be inoperative. As I was closing the distance to conduct a motor vehicle stop, I observed the vehicle fail to maintain its lane of travel, specifically by both passenger side tires crossing over the white solid fog line for approximately one (1) to two (2) seconds. I then observed both of the the vehicle's passenger side tires contact the white solid fog line two (2) more times prior to conducting a motor vehicle stop. I then gave dispatch the vehicle's information, my location, activated my emergency lights, and conducted a motor vehicle stop on SH 70 near mile marker 47.5. It was at this time, my Mobile Video Recorder (MVR) and Body Worn Camera (BWC) were activated.

Vehicle When Stopped:

I exited my patrol vehicle, and approached the passenger side of the vehicle. I observed a female driver, and no other occupants. I then identified myself and spoke to the driver, requesting to see her driver's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance. Ptl. Gardner arrived on scene at this time to assist with the call. It should be noted, the driver of the vehicle was advised my BWC was recording. The driver, identified as Ms. Sharon Thomas provided her credentials without incident. I asked Ms. Thomas where she was heading to, to which she stated she was going home. I advised Ms. Thomas as to the reasons for the motor vehicle stop, to which she stated it was because of her contacts. I asked Ms. Thomas where she was coming from, to which she stated "I came from meeting a friend at Donovan's." It should be noted, Donovan's is a bar/restaurant located in Manchester Township. Ms. Thomas then stated without being asked "I didn't drink." I then reiterated what Ms. Thomas stated, to which she then stated "I had one glass of wine, nothing crazy." While speaking with Ms. Thomas, I detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the interior passenger compartment of the vehicle and observed her eyes to be watery and her speech to be slurred. Based on observations, I requested Ms.

Thomas exit the vehicle. She did so without incident. At this time, I explained to Ms. Thomas that officers would be conducting Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST's).

The area where the test was performed was a flat and level blacktop surface, relatively free of debris with no pedestrian traffic and medium vehicle traffic. The area did not have any lighting from overhead street lamps, however was partially lit from patrol vehicle's spotlight and headlamps. It should be noted, all front facing emergency lights were deactivated as to not affect the performance of SFST's. During the course of SFST's, Ms. Thomas was wearing a blue jean jacket, pink top, black leggings, and white athletic sneakers. It should be noted, while speaking to Ms. Thomas I was able to detect the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath.

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN):

Please refer to Ptl. Gardner's supplemental investigation report. At the conclusion of the HGN test, Ptl. Gardner asked Ms. Thomas how much alcohol she had consumed to which she stated "two glasses of wine." Ms. Thomas stated she was drinking white wine and that the glasses were standard pours. I then asked Ms. Thomas if she was on any medications to which she stated no.

Walk and Turn:

Prior to the instructional phase of the Walk and Turn Test, Ms. Thomas was asked if she had any physical ailments or injuries that would impede her from performing the test, to which she stated she was not exercising and that she does not do yoga or anything. Ms. Thomas then stated she has a rare blood disease that "discriminates" her bones. Ms. Thomas stated it was not an excuse, however further stated that her bones are not that strong. I advised Ms. Thomas I would take her statement into account while conducting the tests. I then advised Ms. Thomas I was going to place her in the starting position while I explained the test. Ms. Thomas was then asked to stand in the starting position by placing her right front in front of her left foot, with her right heel touching her left toe, with her hands placed at her side. Ms. Thomas was then advised to remain in the starting position during the instructional phase of the test and further advised not to begin the test until instructed to do so. During the instructional phase of the test, Ms. Thomas stepped out of the starting position. It should be noted, while explaining the instructions, Ms. Thomas stated that she wished she was wearing better sneakers. I then gave her the option to remove her sneakers to which she agreed to do so. Ms. Thomas performed this test in its entirety in her socks. I then advised Ms. Thomas to get back into the starting position. When told to do so, Ms. Thomas was instructed to take nine (9) heel to toe steps while looking at her feet and counting aloud, then take a series of small steps to turn around, and continue the test with nine (9) heel to toe steps while looking at her feet and counting aloud. It should be noted, while explaining the instructional phase, Ms. Thomas was repeating the instructions aloud. During this time, I observed her speech to be slurred. I then demonstrated the test for Ms. Thomas using a three (3) step demonstration. Prior to beginning the test, Ms. Thomas again stepped out of the starting position and extended her arms up and away from her body for balance. Ms. Thomas was then again placed back into the starting position. I asked Ms. Thomas if she understood the instructions, to which she stated she did not have any questions. Ms. Thomas was then instructed to begin the test.

During the performance of this test, Ms. Thomas did not make heel to toe contact on several steps. Ms. Thomas stepped out for balance on her eighth

step, continued walking and counted aloud to ten (10) steps, took an additional step, then stopped. Ms. Thomas stated that she went past nine (9) steps. I then instructed Ms. Thomas to continue the test. Ms. Thomas then took an additional twelve (12) steps, failing to make heel to toe contact on several steps without counting aloud, prior to turning around after the first nine (9) steps as instructed. Ms. Thomas then turned around and asked if she was suppose to continue back. I instructed Ms. Thomas to complete the test. Ms. Thomas then began walking back and stated "I'm not counting cause I figured..." Ms. Thomas extended her arms away from her body for balance and stepped off for balance on her ninth step. Ms. Thomas then continued for an additional fourteen (14) steps, failing to make heel to toe contact on several steps without counting aloud. Ms. Thomas stated that she had lost count while walking.

One Leg Stand:

The next test was the One Leg Stand Test. Prior to the instruction phase, Ms. Thomas stated her feet were cold and opted to put her sneakers back on. Prior to demonstrating the test, I asked Ms. Thomas to stand in the starting position with her feet together and her hands placed at her sides. Ms. Thomas was instructed to remain in the starting position until the test was explained to her and she was instructed to begin. I then advised Ms. Thomas that when she was instructed to begin, using the foot of her choice, she would raise her foot approximately six (6) inches off the ground, parallel to the ground. While in this position, Ms. Thomas was instructed to look at her foot while counting aloud; one thousand one, one thousand two, one thousand three, and so on until I tell you to stop. I then demonstrated the test for Ms. Thomas while reiterating the instructions. It should be noted while demonstrating the test, Ms. Thomas stated that she was old and did not have that much energy, but she would try anyway. Ms. Thomas then stated "that's a lot for anybody" then did not finish her sentence. Ms. Thomas then attempted to begin the test prior to be instructed to do so. I then instructed Ms. Thomas to get back in the starting position and asked her if she would like the test demonstrated again, to which she stated no. I then explained the test again to Ms. Thomas and instructed her to begin the test.

During the performance of this test, Ms. Thomas failed to look at her foot and count aloud. Ms. Thomas extended her arms away from her body several times for balance. Ms. Thomas also put her foot down, stepping off several times for balance. While attempting the test, Ms. Thomas stated "I'm sorry, I'm not an exercise person," while continuing to use her arms for balance. I then advised Ms. Thomas she could use her other foot if she chose to do so. Ms. Thomas then attempted to continue the test using the same foot. Based on observations, the test was terminated for safety reasons. I then asked Ms. Thomas if she had consumed more than two (2) glasses of wine, to which she stated "somebody gave me a shot," further stating that she was there for approximately three (3) hours.

Arrest and En Route to Headquarters:

Based on the results of the SFST's, I advised Ms. Thomas that she was under arrest and positioned her hands behind her back. Handcuffs were then placed on Ms. Thomas utilizing the double locking mechanism. It should be noted, while being cuffed, Ms. Thomas stated "I wasn't even, I'm not even drunk." Ms. Thomas was then searched incident to arrest yielding negative results and placed into the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle (#86). The rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle was checked prior to placing Ms. Thomas inside and was found to be free of any contraband. Ms.

Thomas was then transported to police headquarters. Ptl. Gardner remained on scene, awaiting a tow truck to impound the vehicle under New Jersey DWI John's Law. Prior to the vehicle being impounded, a search for additional intoxicants was conducted yielding negative results. It should be noted, the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle filled with the odor of an alcoholic beverage during transport.

While at Headquarters:

Upon my arrival to MPD headquarters, I parked my patrol vehicle in the prisoner sally port. I then requested Ms. Thomas exit the rear passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle. She did so without incident. I then checked the rear passenger compartment again for any contraband yielding negative results and escorted her to the processing room. Prior to processing Ms. Thomas, Sgt. Barker, Ptl. Gardner, and I secured all of our personal electronic equipment in a separate room, away from the ALCOTEST machine. Ms. Thomas was then read her Miranda Rights from the Miranda Rights Acknowledgement Form. Ms. Thomas was willing to waive her rights to answer any questions and signed the form (see attached). At this time, a twenty (20) minute observation of Ms. Thomas began at 2340 hours. During this time, Ms. Thomas did not burp, belch, or vomit. Additionally, a visual inspection of Ms. Thomas's mouth was conducted yielding negative results for any foreign objects. After reading the New Jersey Attorney General's Standard Statement, Ms. Thomas agreed to provide samples of her breath. Upon completion of the twenty (20) minute observation period, Sgt. Barker ran the ALCOTEST 7110 MKIII-C machine. Ms. Thomas reported breath test results was 0.20% blood alcohol content (BAC). The results were run through the ALCOTEST calculator (CHUN) which revealed that the samples were within tolerance (see Sgt. Barker's supplemental report for additional information). Ms. Thomas was then processed for arrest for Driving While Intoxicated (DWI).
