Manchester Township Police Department
Investigation Narrative

On 11/04/2018 at approximately 2343 hours, I was patrolling the area of SH 70 Westbound between Buckingham Drive and Colonial Drive. While traveling Westbound I observed a vehicle, two vehicles in front of mine, failing to maintain its lane. I observed this blue colored sedan drift over the double yellow center line with both driver side tires and then abruptly swerve to towards the right side of the lane and cross over the white fog line with both passenger side tires. As we passed Colonial Drive I observed the blue sedan drift from the double yellow center line into the turn lane for the shopping plaza without signaling and then abruptly swerve back to the west bound lane to continue on SH 70. At this time the vehicle in front of me turned into the shopping plaza and I closed the distance between myself and the Blue Sedan to conduct a motor vehicle stop. I activated my emergency overhead lights and the Blue sedan came to an abrupt stop on the shoulder of SH 70 in front of the shopping plaza (1001 SH 70). I advised dispatch of my stop and observed the blue sedan to be bearing NJ Registration WNZ67Y.

Vehicle When Stopped:

I approached the passenger side window and began speaking to the female driver who was the sole occupant of the vehicle. I immediately smelled the odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from inside the vehicle. I introduced myself and asked the driver for her credentials. While the driver searched for her documents, I observed her eyes to be watery and bloodshot and her eyelids to be droopy. The driver's face was also flushed. The driver fumbled with her documents and dropped her registration and insurance card on the ground before picking it up and handing it to me. The driver then held out her wallet with her ID in it and did not pull it out of the slot it was in. At this point I pulled out the ID to assist her. I was able to identify the driver as Malgorzat Sosynska through her NJ Photo Driver's license. Immediately I noticed a speech impairment which Malgorzat immediately identified to me as a hearing impairment. Malgorzat stated that she was deaf and had a hearing aid in.

I advised Malgorzat that I stopped her due to her careless driving, specifically failure to maintain lane. I then asked Malgorzat about how much she had to drink prior to driving her vehicle. Malgorzat originally stated that she had not consumed any alcohol this evening. After confronting Malgorzat about the odor of alcoholic beverages and her careless driving, she admitted that she had one drink. It should be noted that during the entirety of the stop that there was a strong language barrier, however if we spoke clearly, loudly and slowly, Malgorzat was able to converse with us. Ptl. Anderson arrived on scene shortly after to assist with the incident. I escorted Malgorzat out of her vehicle and off to the side of the road to ensure her safety during this incident.

SFST: HGN

I attempted to conduct the standardized HGN test on Malgorzat, however she was unable to follow instructions at this time. It should be noted that while standing face to face with Malgorzat, I could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath.

Walk and Turn:

I attempted to demonstrate and explain the walk and turn test. Malgorzat swayed while I gave instructions and continually tried to start the test before instructions were finished. After multiple attempts of trying to walk a straight line without being told to do so and almost falling over, the walk and turn test was stopped for her safety. Due to the fact that Malgorzat was likely to cause injury to herself and was not able to follow directions for each of these two tests, the One Leg Stand test was not administered.

One Leg Stand:

Not administered.

HGN: After attempting the Walk and turn test Ptl. Anderson returned to and administered the HGN test. Ptl. Anderson advised me that her total score was a four, which included lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, and maximum deviation in both eyes.

Due to the observation of Malgorzat's driving, results of her SFSTs, and observations during the investigation of the stop, she was placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated 39:4-50. Malgorzat was handcuffed to the rear, double-locked. The rear compartment was checked and clear at which time Malgorzat was placed inside, patrol vehicle #81. Ptl. Anderson stayed with the vehicle and completed the Impound Sheet (see attached) until Grones's Towing arrived to take the vehicle as per John's Law.

En Route to Headquarters:

There is nothing of notable significance to be documented during the transport to police headquarters.

At headquarters:

I arrived at headquarters and parked in the top cul-de-sac area of the police lot. I was concerned for Malgorzat's safety and knew the front entrance would be less likely for her to cause injury to herself while walking. I opened the rear passenger side door and immediately smelled the odor of alcoholic beverages, which had filled the rear passenger compartment area. This odor was not present prior to placing Malgorzat inside of the rear passenger compartment. I escorted Malgorzat inside to the rear processing area. Sgt. Morgan entered

shortly and observed the time on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C at 0013 hours. During the observation period, I printed out the Polish text for the N.J Attorney General's standard statement form, as Malgorzat stated that Polish was her native language. I gave Malgorzat a copy of this form to read while I played the Polish audio version of the form out loud. After the completion of the first portion of the form, Malgorzat stated, "no". At this time I played out loud the last paragraph of the standard statement form while Malgorzat read along. Again when asked if she would cooperate with testing, Malgorzat stated, "No". At this time I contacted the AT&T language line and spoke with Operator [1] [REDACTED] regarding the standard statement form. I did not want there to be any confusion with the language barrier and wanted to make sure that Malgorzat understood the consequences of not cooperating with testing. I advised [2] [REDACTED] to tell Malgorzat that she was required by law to cooperate with our testing. I also made sure that Malgorzat understood that there were penalties as she just read and listened to that would be imposed if she were not to cooperate. [3] [REDACTED] advised me that Malgorzat understood and stated that she would not be cooperating with our testing, ultimately refusing to blow. Sgt. Cooke operated the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C completing the test for a refusal at 0057 hours. At this time I attempted to complete the New Jersey State Police Drinking/ Driving/Operator Questionnaire. Upon reaching the second section of questions regarding the consumption of alcohol, where Miranda warnings are required, again I contacted the AT&T Language Line. At this time I spoke with operator [4] [REDACTED]. I read [5] [REDACTED] verbatim Miranda warnings that she then translated to Malgorzat in Polish. After the completion of the Miranda warnings, Malgorzat stated that she did not wish to speak with me or answer any questions.

After the completion of processing for Malgorzat, I was able to contact a friend of hers to come pick her up. [6] [REDACTED] arrived at headquarters and signed the Potential Liability (see attached). Malgorzat was released to [7] [REDACTED] with her summonses that included: Driving While Intoxicated (39:4-50), Refusal to submit to breath testing (39:4-50.2), Reckless driving (39:4-96), Careless driving (39:4-97), Failure to maintain lane (39:4-88), Failure to signal (39:4-126). No further information at this time.

Driving While Intoxicated

Operation of the Motor Vehicle:

On November 4th, 2018 at approximately 0111 hours I was traveling North on County Route 547 near the Lakehurst Naval Base in marked patrol unit #60. I observed a vehicle, later identified as a 2002 Red Chevrolet Camaro NJ Reg-Z76ECL, traveling South on County Route 547. I observed that the vehicle was using their high beams as it passed my patrol vehicle. Once I was behind the vehicle, I then observed the vehicle's passenger side tires cross over the white fog line by approximately three inches. I then activated my emergency lights indicating to the driver to pull off to the right side of the road. At this point in time my Mobile Video Recorder (MVR) was activated. The vehicle stopped on State Hwy 37 near the intersection of Colonial Drive.

When Stopped:

I contacted dispatch, exited my patrol vehicle, and approached the Red Chevy Camaro on the passenger side. I knocked on the passenger side window indicating to the driver of my presence. I introduced myself and requested the operator's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance. The driver was identified as Modesto Ortiz Jr. by his New Jersey Driver's License. I also discovered that Ortiz was the registered owner of the vehicle. As I was speaking with the driver, I detected an odor of alcoholic beverage emanating from inside the vehicle. I asked the driver if he consumed alcoholic beverages on today's date, which he replied, "Yes, I had two beers." The driver stated that he was coming from the Cornerstone Kitchen & Tap located in Jackson. I observed that his speech was slowed and slurred. I also observed that his eyes were red and watery and his hands were moving slow as he reached for his credentials.

At this time, Ptl. Gavin Reilly arrived on scene to assist in the investigation. I walked over to the driver side of the vehicle, opened it, and requested Ortiz to exit, so I could conduct the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. Ortiz then exited the vehicle and was instructed to walk towards the trunk compartment. Before I started speaking to Ortiz, I observed that he was leaning against the trunk of the vehicle for support. While speaking to Ortiz outside of the vehicle, I detected an odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from his breath. I again asked Ortiz how many drinks he consumed this evening, and he replied "I had two IPA beers that were pretty strong." I advised Ortiz that these tests would assist in determining the extent of his impairment. I asked Ortiz if he had any injuries that would affect him from successfully completing the tests in their entirety, which he replied "No."

Standardized Field Sobriety Tests:

H.G.N.: I explained the instructions for The Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (H.G.N) test and conducted the test. I observed equal tracking and the same pupil size in both eyes. I observed that Ortiz displayed six out of six indicators. I observed lack of smooth pursuit in both the right and left eye. I observed distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both the right and left eye. I observed angle of onset prior to 45 degrees in both the right and left eye. The angle of onset occurred at approximately 25 degrees. I also observed Vertical Gaze Nystagmus in both the right and left eye.

Walk and Turn: I demonstrated and explained the instructions of the Walk and Turn test which he stated he understood. Ortiz could not keep his balance while listening to instructions and stepped off the line with his right foot and did not return to the starting position until I asked him to do so. Ortiz also lost his balance when trying to complete the turn by staggering forward.

One Leg Stand: I demonstrated and explained the instructions of the One Leg Stand test which he stated he understood. Ortiz raised his left foot and dropped it on count #7. I also observed an approximate four inch sway back and forth while Ortiz was performing the test.

All tests were done on a paved surface, clean of debris, flat, and level. Based on Ortiz's poor performance of the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and operation of the motor vehicle, I believed he was obviously intoxicated. I then placed Ortiz under arrest for driving while intoxicated with handcuffs that were double locked. I then advised Ortiz of Miranda Rights, which he stated that he understood. I searched Ortiz incident to arrest with negative findings prior to placing him in the rear of patrol car #60. Ptl.

Reilly remained on scene for Accurate Towing to arrive and impound the vehicle in accordance with John's Law. Ptl. Reilly and I then searched the vehicle for a source of intoxication with negative findings.

En Route to Headquarters:

The passenger compartment of patrol unit #60 was recorded on my MVR during the transport to headquarters. The interior passenger compartment of my patrol vehicle filled up with an odor of an alcoholic beverage. Ortiz was calm and cooperative during the transport.

At Headquarters:

Upon arrival to headquarters, the rear compartment of patrol unit #60 was searched once the arrestee was removed from the vehicle, again with negative findings. I then used the Manchester Police Department's Alcotest 7110's time function which displayed the time to be 0146S hours. I then read Ortiz the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Standard Statement for Operations of a Motor Vehicle-N.J.S.A 39:4-5.2(e)(revised and effective July 1st, 2012), to which he stated, "Yes", indicating he intended to submit breath samples. At the conclusion of the observation period, I verified the time on the Alcotest 7110's time function to display 0209S hours. I then entered the necessary information into the Alcotest 7110, continued face to face observation with Ortiz, and administered the test, which calculated Ortiz's blood alcohol concentration to be 0.16% BAC (see attached sequential file number 01601). From the two samples, I then checked the results using the State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator which verified that the readings were true and within acceptable tolerances. At this time, I notified Sgt. Bachovchin of the readings and informed him that the results were consistent with my observations.

I completed the arrest processing and released Ortiz into the custody of [REDACTED]. I informed [REDACTED] of the potential liability and she signed the Potential Liability Warning form stating she understood (see attached). The matter is scheduled for a first appearance on November 14th, 2018. I served Ortiz with the following summonses:

Investigation Narrative

On Saturday November 3, 2018 at approximately 2057hrs. I was dispatched to a motor vehicle crash involving two vehicles in the intersection of County Road 530 and the CVS parking lot (421 Lacey Road). I arrived on scene and observed that a 2007 beige Kia bearing New Jersey registration SSM84M had rear ended a silver 2004 Toyota Camry. The Kia was operated by Ann McDonald-Bilak, and the Toyota was operated by [REDACTED]. I approached both vehicles (who were still blocking the roadway) and inquired if there were any injuries, and [REDACTED] stated that she had neck pain but did not want medical assistance. Both vehicles appeared operable so I advised the operators to move their vehicles into the CVS parking lot (421 Lacey Road) where it would be safer to continue the investigation. While Ms. McDonald-Bilak was pulling into a parking space in front of CVS she failed to stop and crashed her vehicle into the wooden guard rail in the parking lot.

I asked Ms. McDonald-Bilak if she was ok and she stated that she was not injured. I requested both operators driver license, vehicle registration, and insurance. While Ms. McDonald-Bilak was retrieving her documents I observed that she was extremely lethargic, had very slow and slurred speech, and was unable to remember the simplest of instructions. I asked her if she had consumed any alcohol or narcotics prior to operating her vehicle and she stated that she has been sick and took an Ambien approximately 30 minutes prior to the crash. During this time I requested first aid to evaluate Ms. McDonald-Bilak for her safety and after they arrived, she refused medical treatment. See NJTR-1 for crash details.

Due to the admission made by Ms. McDonald-Bilak that she consumed Ambien (a sleep aid) prior to operating her motor vehicle, her extremely dangerous driving which caused two motor vehicle crashes, and the visible signs of impairment, I instructed Ms. McDonald-Bilak out of the vehicle in order to administer standardized field sobriety tests. Ms. McDonald-Bilak was positioned in an area that was straight, level, free of debris, and illuminated for testing.

The first test I administered was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test. I asked Ms. McDonald-Bilak if she had any problems with her eyes and she stated that she can't see far distances but is fine up close. I administered the test but was unable to observe any decision points because Ms. McDonald-Bilak could not follow my instructions. During this time I observed that Ms. McDonald-Bilak was swaying from front to back and had watery eyes.

The next test I administered was the Walk and Turn test, I first asked Ms. McDonald-Bilak if she had any problems with her legs and she stated she has bad legs but will attempt the test. I first explained the "starting position" to her, which includes her remaining with her right foot touching her left foot heel to toe with her arms down at her side while I explained the test. Ms. McDonald-Bilak was unable to remain in that position and came out of it numerous times. After I finished explaining the test, she advised me that she understood and began as instructed. I observed that she did not touch heel to toe multiple times and she stepped off the line more than three times, as a result the third test was terminated for her safety. While Ms. McDonald-Bilak was taking the test I also observed that she was swaying from side to side, sagging her knees, and staggering while walking.

The final test I administered was the One Leg Stand test. I explained

and demonstrated the test to Ms. McDonald-Bilak and she advised me that she understood. I instructed her to begin and she immediately put her foot down more than three times and almost fell over. I terminated the test for her safety at the time.

Due to the poor performance on the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, the dangerous driving, admission of consuming a sleep aid, and the visible signs of impairment, Ms. McDonald-Bilak was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence. Ms. McDonald-Bilak was secured in the front with handcuffs utilizing the double locking mechanism and placed into the prisoner compartment of patrol vehicle #75. The prisoner compartment was searched for contraband and weapons prior to and after Ms. McDonald-Bilak being inside, with negative findings. Her vehicle was impounded by Accurate Towing pursuant to Johns Law and she was transported to Manchester Police Headquarters for processing without incident.

Upon arrival at Police Headquarters, Ms. McDonald-Bilak was entered into the Manchester Police Arrest Computer and photographed. I read Ms. McDonald-Bilak the Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators and when asked to submit samples of her breath for testing she replied "Yes". Ms. McDonald-Bilak was then observed by Ptl. Volk and I for twenty continuous minutes to ensure no residual mouth alcohol was present. The twenty minute observation period began at 2121hrs. as indicated by the internal clock mechanism on the Alcotest 7110 MK111-C. After the observation period had concluded, Ptl. Volk administered the test to Ms. McDonald-Bilak and received a reading of her breath at .00% BAC. The New Jersey State Police Alco Test Calculator was utilized and the readings were found to be within acceptable tolerances. After receiving a reading of .00% Ptl. Collins responded to Manchester Police Headquarters to administer a Drug Recognition Exam to Ms. McDonald-Bilak, see Ptl. Collins DRE Evaluation for details. After Ptl. Collins had concluded his exam, Ms. McDonald-Bilak was released to her friend [REDACTED] who signed the potential liability form. Ms. McDonald-Bilak received summonses for driving under the influence (E18-4190), reckless driving (E18-4191), and Following too Closely (E18-4192). No further action was taken.
