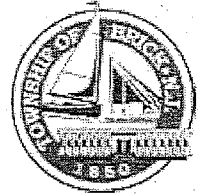

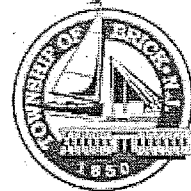

On 09/02/2018 at 0046 hours I, Ptl. Docherty #275 was on patrol in the area of Lanes Mill Rd. / Burnt Tavern Rd. operating marked police vehicle #10. During this time, I observed a blue colored Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck bearing NY registration 10531MA traveling north in the right lane on Burnt Tavern Road. I further observed the driver of the vehicle swerve off of the roadway onto the shoulder and nearly collide into a road barrier. The driver avoided the collision by coming to a quick complete stop.

As a result, I parked directly behind the vehicle and made a driver side approach. There I made contact with an adult male driver (Nicholas Lyons) and adult female front passenger (Katherine Guido). Lyons immediately related that he was not from the area and needed directions. I further observed that his eyes were bloodshot and watery. His speech was also very slow as he stuttered and slobbered when he spoke. I also detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. I asked Lyons if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages tonight and he stated "Yea I had one beer at my friends house in Brick". Sgt. Shepherd #167 arrived on location to assist.

Lyons was then advised to exit his vehicle to which he complied. There I advised him I was going to test him on a series of field sobriety tests. The below listed tests were explained and demonstrated by me and were performed on a flat level surface, in a well lit area free of debris. Prior to Lyons performing the tests, I asked him if he had any type of injuries or disabilities that would affect him from performing any type of mental or physical tests to which he stated "No".

Alphabet Test: I asked Lyons what his highest level of education was and if he understood the English language and its alphabet to which he stated "yes, I have a masters degree". Lyons was instructed to recite the letters in the alphabet from letters "B to O", without singing. Lyons recited the alphabet by starting with the letter "A" and finishing with the letter "P". Lyons was unable to recite the alphabet as instructed.

Walk and Turn: Lyons was instructed to stand with his hands at his sides and place his right foot in front of his left foot and stand in a heel to toe fashion, prior to him being given any further directions. Lyons was instructed to take nine steps heel to toe counting aloud for each step, while keeping his hands at his sides. After his ninth step, he was instructed to plant his front foot and take a small series of steps to turn around in the other direction and take another nine steps heel to toe counting them aloud.

Lyons was unable to stand with his hands at his sides in a heel to toe fashion for any amount of time as he continuously lifted his arms and fell out of position. None of Lyons first set of steps and second set of steps were in a straight heel to toe line. His feet crossed each other and faced outwards as he took each of his steps. He raised his arms out past his sides to support his balance during the entirety of the test. Lyons did not count aloud for the majority of the test. Lyons also lost his balance multiple times as he stumbled side to side. He also did not complete the total number of instructed. Lyons stopped at seven steps on the first set of steps and stopped at eight steps during the second set of steps. Upon completion, I asked Lyons if he had completed the test and he stated, "Yes". I asked Lyons if he injured himself during the test and he stated, "No". Lyons was unable to complete the test as instructed.

One legged stand: Lyons was instructed to place his feet together and keep his arms by his sides. He was to raise his right leg six inches off of the ground in front of him without raising his arms for balance. Once in position, he was to count to thirty out loud by one thousands.

Lyons started the test by lifting his right foot off of the ground. Lyons swayed back and fourth and raised his arms out past his sides. As Lyons reached five one thousand he dropped his foot on the ground. Lyons then picked his foot back up and attempted the test again. This time his foot fell to the ground when he reached two one thousand. I asked Lyons if he was finished with the test and he stated, "Yes". I also asked him if he had injured himself during the test and he stated, "No". Lyons was unable to complete the test as instructed.

After totaling my observations, it was in my opinion that Lyons was operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and was subsequently placed under arrest for DWI. He was handcuffed utilizing a double locking mechanism. Lyons was seat belted in the rear of patrol car #10 and transported to police headquarters. Sgt. Shepherd remained on scene for Glen's Towing to respond and impound the suspect vehicle as per Johns Law.

At headquarters, Lyons was booked and processed, as per departmental policy. His personal property was logged and placed into evidence filing cabinet 1. Sgt. Kelly #241 mirandized Lyons and he stated that he understood by signing the same. He was read implied consent and when asked if he would provide samples of his breath to determine his content of alcohol in his blood he agreed. Prior to taking breath samples all portable electronics (radios, cell-phones, lap-tops) were removed from the booking room prior to the operation of the Alcotest instrument. After the 20 minute observation had ended, Sgt.

Kelly collected breath samples from Lyons revealing his blood alcohol content to be 0.14%. Refer to Sgt. Kelly's supplementary case report for further information (same case number).

Lyons friend, Matthew Sloan, arrived at headquarters in order to take responsibility of Lyons. He was explained the Potential Liability Form. He then signed the form stating he understood the Potential Liability Form and accepted custody of Lyons. He was then released from police custody and advised of his future court date.

On 09/02/18 at approximately 0115 hours while at Brick Police Headquarters I assisted Ptl. Docherty #275 by operating the Alcotest.

I observed the suspect for a period of at least twenty minutes. During that time he did not belch or vomit and no items were placed inside his mouth. A new mouthpiece was used for each test and the instructions were read prior to each sample. All portable electronic devices were removed prior to tests. The Standard Statement was read to the suspect and he agreed to provide samples.

At the conclusion of testing the initial results of were not found to be in acceptable tolerances from the NJ State Police Calculator. New samples were taken and those results were found to be acceptable with a result of .14% BAC. Reference Ptl. Docherty's report for further details.

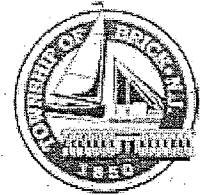

On 09/03/18 at approximately 1530 hours Ptl. Newlund #285 and I responded to Lake Riviera in reference to a hit and run accident. Dispatch advised the vehicle, a white older model Jetta operated by a female with blonde hair, had struck a fire hydrant near 333 Birch Bark Drive. A partial plate of UN9FV was obtained by the caller. Dispatch advised the caller had last observed the vehicle turning on Delaware Drive but was no longer following it. Dispatch further advised as per the caller the vehicle had run children on bicycles off of the road and was currently operating on a flat tire.

Upon arrival Ptl. Newlund and I began checking the area for the suspect vehicle. I checked the 711, 108 Lake Shore Way, and located the suspect vehicle. The vehicle, bearing NJ registration U90 FNV, was parking in a parking spot on the north side of the parking lot, facing north. I observed the vehicle to have a flat rear passenger side tire as well as rear vehicle damage. As I got closer to the vehicle I observed a white female with blonde hair sitting in the driver's seat.

I positioned my vehicle behind the suspect vehicle and activated my vehicle's overhead lights to initiate a traffic stop. I approached the driver side of the vehicle as the female subject, later identified as Melissa Sinnott, opened the door and exited. Sinnott exited the vehicle and immediately began swaying as if she was having trouble maintaining her balance. I asked Sinnott to sit back in the vehicle and she stated "Why? What's happening?" I again advised Sinnott to sit back in the vehicle and she complied. I observed Sinnott to be covered in sweat, specifically her face. Sinnott had watery, bloodshot eyes and I detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath. I asked Sinnott to retrieve her driving and vehicle credentials. Sinnott began to go through her vehicle documents, fumbling with the paperwork and mumbling. I asked Sinnott if she knew why I had to stop to speak with her and she stated "Yeah, because I've been drinking". While speaking to Sinnott her driver side door was still open. At this time I observed a small "shooter" bottle of Fireball in the driver side door. I observed the bottle to still contain a small amount of alcohol in it.

I asked Sinnott what she had struck with her vehicle and stated "I didn't hit anything". As Sinnott attempted to locate her credentials I checked the front of the vehicle and located damage to the front end. The driver side had green paint transfer and the passenger side had yellow paint transfer. The entire front bumper was damaged as well.

I again asked Sinnott what she had struck and she stated "I didn't hit anything". I asked Sinnott where she was coming from and she stated "Elizabeth". I asked Sinnott where she was headed to and she stated "Toms River". I asked Sinnott why she was in Lake Riviera as it did not lead to Toms River and she stared at me for several seconds before stating "I don't know".

I asked Sinnott if she had been drinking any alcohol and she stated "Yes". I asked Sinnott how many drinks she had consumed and she stated "A lot".

Sgt. Kelly #233 and Ptl. Bailey #293 arrived on scene as backup along with Ptl. Newlund. I had Sinnott exit the vehicle and we moved to an area of the parking lot that was level and free of debris. I asked Sinnott if she had any medical conditions that would prevent her from performing field sobriety tests and she stated "No".

Using a straight yellow parking space line as a guide, I demonstrated the Walk and Turn test to Sinnott. I requested that Sinnott stand with the foot of her choice in front of her other foot, heel to toe, hands at her side while I demonstrated the test. Sinnott was unable to follow these instructions, as she continually moved her feet apart for balance and almost fell over several times. I then demonstrated that she was to walk nine steps, heel to toe, in a straight line using the yellow parking space line as a guide. I demonstrated three heel to toe steps for Sinnott and was about to advise her how to turn around after nine steps when she suddenly began attempting the test. I advised her to stop and observe the rest of the demonstration but she continued to attempt the test. Sinnott attempted to walk heel to toe in a straight line but continually stepped off of the line and did not walk heel to toe. Sinnott began to fall over and had to be supported by Ptl. Bailey. Sinnott then looked at me and said "I can't do this test". I asked her why and she stated "Because I drank too much".

The next test I demonstrated for Sinnott was the One Leg Stand test. I advised Sinnott to stand with her feet together and hands at her side while I demonstrated the test. Sinnott was unable to do this, as she continually moved her feet apart for balance and raised her arms to prevent herself from stumbling. I demonstrated to Sinnott that she was to keep her arms at her sides and raise the foot of her choice six inches off the ground, toes pointed out, and count out loud "one one thousand, two one thousand, three one thousand" and so on for thirty seconds. Sinnott stated she understood the test.

Sinnott began the test by lifting one leg off of the ground and pointing her toe out. Sinnott immediately raised her arms for balance and stood there silently, with her arms fully extended and one leg raised in the air. I advised Sinnott she needed to count out loud and she shrugged and stated "Four thousand, three thousand" before placing her foot on the ground.

At this time, due to Sinnott's inability to perform the tests, I placed her under arrest for DUI. D&L Towing was contacted and responded to impound her vehicle as per John's Law. I also retrieved the bottle of Fireball from Sinnott's driver side door.

I transported Sinnott to headquarters without incident. I escorted Sinnott to the booking room, where I removed all portable electronic devices, including my portable radio, all cell phones and the laptop booking computer. I asked Sinnott to open her mouth to show she did not have any foreign objects inside and she complied. I was able to confirm Sinnott did not have any foreign objects in her mouth. I then began and completed a 20 minute observation of Sinnott, during which time she did not place anything in her mouth or regurgitate or vomit. Sinnott was advised of her Miranda Rights and signed the Waiver portion. I also read Sinnott the NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators. Sinnott advised she would provide samples of her breath for testing.

After the 20 minute observation period, I activated the Alcotest 7110 and entered all of the required information. Prior to collecting the breath samples, I read Sinnott the posted instructions for providing the samples, which she stated she understood. Sinnott provided the necessary breath samples and I provided a new mouthpiece prior to each sample being collected. Sinnott's BAC was determined to be 0.33%. The results were checked by dispatch on the Alcotest Calculator and were found to be within acceptable tolerance.

After being processed, Sinnott's father, Michael Sinnott, was contacted and responded to headquarters to pick up Melissa. Michael was advised of and signed the Potential Liability Form. Melissa was turned over to Michael.

I issued Sinnott the following summonses:

- DUI (summons #E18-3492)
- Open Container (#E18-3493)
- Failure to Exhibit Registration (#E18-3494)
- Reckless Driving (#E18-3495)

Ptl. Newlund completed an accident report and issued Sinnott the following summonses:

- Careless Driving (T-159888)
- Failure to Report (T-159889)
- Leaving the Scene of an Accident (T-159890)

I photographed the bottle of Fireball and placed the pictures on a DVD. The DVD was placed into property (see Aegis Property report). The remaining Fireball was disposed of along with the bottle.

Due to Sinnott's statement that she had driven from Elizabeth and the damage to rear of her vehicle, NJ State Police were contacted but stated they were not looking for any hit and run drivers. It should also be noted that Sinnott's father Michael advised the green paint transfer and driver side front damage was old but the yellow paint transfer, passenger side front bumper and rear damage were all new. The rear damage to the vehicle had the outline of a license plate on the bumper, as Sinnott had possibly backed into another vehicle. The surrounding area of Lake Riviera was checked for other possible objects and vehicles Sinnott could have struck with negative results.

It should be noted that as I was transporting Sinnott to headquarters she requested her purse be retrieved from her vehicle. I radioed Ptl. Newlund and advised him to retrieve the purse. Ptl. Newlund retrieved the purse and brought it to headquarters. Ptl. Newlund advised me while he was retrieving the purse he found three plastic bags in Sinnott's vehicle right next to her purse and each bag contained approximately ten "shooter" bottles of Fireball. Ptl. Newlund advised the approximately thirty bottles all appeared to be empty.

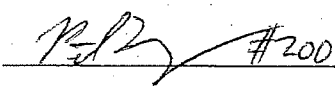

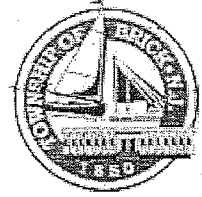

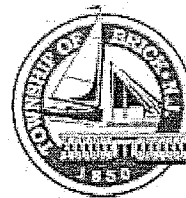

On 09-08-2018 at approximately 0050 hours I (Patrolman Alexander #216) was on patrol traveling east on Princeton Avenue. I observed a vehicle (New Jersey Registration G48KKX) directly in front of me. This vehicle swerved out of its lane of travel into the westbound lane and returned back into the eastbound lane. It did this two more times, but the third time it stayed in the westbound lane and never returned to the eastbound lane. I then conducted a motor vehicle stop on said vehicle at the intersection of Princeton Avenue and Margherita Place.

Upon approaching the driver side front window I spoke with the driver, later identified as Karl Egner. I asked Egner for his drivers license, insurance card and registration card. Egner pulled his wallet out of his front pants pocket and started to go through it. I observed Karl's hands to be shaking nonstop, so I asked him why they were doing that. Egner stated he did not know why. I watched Egner look for his drivers license in his wallet, which was cluttered with numerous cards and paperwork. Egner was fumbling through his wallet and could not produce his license at this time. Egner was able to produce the other paperwork I asked for. When looking at Egner I observed his eyelids to be droopy and his eyes were bloodshot, glassy and watery. Egner was also slurring his words and was talking very slow. I asked Egner where he was coming from and he stated Lakewood Township, coming from a friend's house. I asked him where he was heading to and he stated home, but he was lost. I asked him how he did not know how to get home and he stated that he does not get out much. I then asked Egner if he had drank any alcoholic beverages tonight and he stated he did not. I asked him if he had any medical conditions and he stated he had bi-polar depression. I asked Egner if he was on any medication for this and he stated he was. Egner stated he was on Paroxetine and Abilify. When asked when he took them last Egner stated he was unsure, but took one medication yesterday. I questioned Egner if he should be driving while taking these medications and he stated he has not read up on that yet. After my observations of Egner and my conversation with him I contacted Lieutenant Forrester #202, who was working a Driving While Impaired detail. Lieutenant Forrester responded to assist.

Upon Lieutenant Forrester's arrival I advised him of my investigation. Lieutenant Forrester subsequently arrested Egner after administering The Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (See his report under same Case #54899-18 for more details). I responded to Brick Police Headquarters to operate The Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C for Lieutenant Forrester.

At headquarters I read Egner his Miranda Warnings and The Attorney General's Standard Statement Form for Motor Vehicle Operators. Egner stated he understood his rights and would submit samples of his breath. I checked Egner's mouth for any residual alcohol or foreign objects, with negative results. All cellular phones, portable radios and other electronics that could interfere with the test were removed from the booking room. After observing Egner in excess of twenty minutes, to which time he never belched or regurgitated, I administered the test. At the completion of the test Egner had a reported breath test result of 0.00% BAC. The results were entered into the The State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator, which were in acceptable tolerance.

On 9/8/18 at approx., 0110hrs., Ptl. Alexander #216 requested that respond to a motor vehicle stop on Princeton Ave in the area of Margherita Pl. in reference to a possible intoxicated driver. I was requested because I was working a DUI detail.

Upon arrival I met with Ptl. Alexander who advised me of his observations surrounding the stop and his interactions with the driver, Karl Egner. I approached Egner who was seated in the driver's seat. I asked if he had anything to drink tonight or if he had ingested any narcotics or medications to which he stated he took only his medication last night. I did not detect the odor of any alcoholic beverages emanating from the vehicle but I did detect a faint odor of raw marijuana. Egner's hands were shaking and he slurred his words when he spoke. His eyes were watery/ glassy and his eyelids were droopy.

I requested that Egner exit the vehicle. I explained and demonstrated the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests to Egner which he stated he understood. He also stated that he didn't have any injuries or disabilities that would prevent him from completing them. Egner failed all of the tests and was placed under arrest as a result. (See Standardized Field Sobriety Checklist for further details)

Search incident to arrest I removed Egner's belongings from his pockets. He had a pack to rolling papers commonly used to inhale marijuana. I said "I thought you don't smoke marijuana" and he stated they were for tobacco. It should be noted that he had one full pack and one empty pack of cigarettes in his pocket as well. Utilizing my flashlight from outside the vehicle I observed a small piece of cigar paper containing green vegetation (suspect marijuana) on the floor behind the driver's seat which I recovered.

Egner was transported to Brick H.Q. for processing. Ptl. Alexander #216 read Egner Miranda, the NJ Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators, conducted the 20 minute observational period and administered the Alcotest, which resulted in a BAC of .00%. (see Alexander's report for further details) Ptl. Caulfield #235 was requested to respond as a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE). Egner refused to cooperate with the DRE testing.

The marijuana and rolling papers were placed into evidence as per departmental procedures.

I signed complaints against Egner on a summons for Possession of Marijuana (50 grams or less) and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. He was also issued the following motor vehicle summonses: DWI, CDS on a Motor Vehicle, Reckless Driving, Careless Driving, and Failure to Maintain Lane.

Karl Egner was released to _____ who signed a Potential Liability Form acknowledging receipt.

Joe and Sons Towing took custody of the vehicle from the scene as per John's Law.

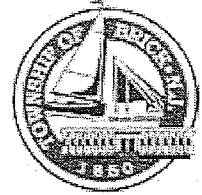

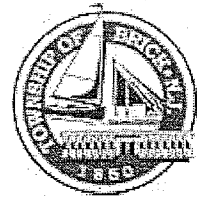

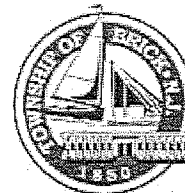

On 9/12/2018 at 2357 hrs. I responded to 191 Van Zile Rd. (McDonald's) with Ptl. Fogarty #211 for a report of an unconscious female in a vehicle in the drive thru lane. Upon arrival Sgt. Thomas #164 was on scene banging on the windows of a vehicle bearing N. registration D97KHA to gain the attention of the driver. The driver, Karen Dimicco eventually responded and rolled down the driver's side window. Sgt. Thomas asked her if she was ok, Dimicco responded "yes". Sgt. Thomas asked her if she knew she was sleeping, Dimicco stated that she wasn't sleeping, but she was tired. Sgt. Thomas asked Dimicco to move the vehicle out of the drive thru lane and pointed to a location that he wanted her to park the vehicle. Dimicco appeared to not understand the instruction, Sgt. Thomas repeated the instruction and Dimicco seemed to still not understand on what she was being asked to do. Dimicco was instructed to get out of the vehicle, while Sgt. Thomas moved the vehicle out of the drive thru lane.

Dimicco spoke with Ptl. Fogarty and I about what she had been doing prior to our arrival. She stated that she had come from Cube Smart Self Storage (1242 Rt. 70) where she rents a storage locker to McDonald's to get something to eat. I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath and inquired about the smell. Dimicco stated that she had consumed three "Coors Light's" approximately four hours ago. I asked Dimicco if she knew the alphabet and was able to count from one to twenty-five, she responded that she did know the alphabet and could count to twenty-five. I asked Dimicco to recite the alphabet starting with the letter C and ending with the letter R. Dimicco recited C through R properly, however she did not stop at R and continued, after the letter T she recited the letters A and L, then asked how far she was supposed to go. When asked about why she continued past the letter R, she stated that she was confused about when to stop. Dimicco was asked to count from 3 to 17, when she started counting she silently mouthed the words one and two and continued to count out loud until she reached twenty-one and then asked when she should stop. Ptl. Fogarty performed a Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test on Dimicco in which she scored 4 out of 6 clues (see Ptl. Fogarty's report, case # 55785-18).

Dimicco was asked if she had medical issues that would prevent her from lifting her legs and walking in a straight line, she responded that she did not have any issues. I asked Dimicco to stand with her feet together and her hands at her side while I explained the test I wanted her to perform, I demonstrated the position. The one-legged stand test was explained and demonstrated Dimicco acknowledged that she understood the test. Dimicco lifted her left leg, her arms moved approximately 12" from each side of her body to maintain balance and counted to 8 one thousand and put her leg down she was instructed to lift her leg up again and continue until told to stop. Dimicco stated "I think you guys are trying to trick me" I assured her that Ptl. Fogarty and I were not tricking her and for her to continue the test and reminded her to keep her hands at her side. Dimicco lifted her left foot, raised her arms approximately 12" from each side of her body to maintain balance, swayed from side to side as she counted to 12 one thousand and put her foot down and stated "I can't do this test, it would be easier for you to just take me to jail". Dimicco was instructed to stand with her right foot in front of her left with her arms at her side while I explained and demonstrated the walk and turn test. The time during the explanation and demonstration, she moved her right foot to the position next to her left foot three times, each time she was instructed to place her right foot in front of her left. Two of the three times she placed her left foot in front of her right and corrected when instructed. Dimicco acknowledged that she understood the test. Dimicco was informed that she could remove her flip-flops if she desired, she stated that she would complete the test with them on. Dimicco was told that she could start the test when ever she was ready, she stated "I think you guys are tricking me" as she moved her right foot to a position next to her left. I told Dimicco it was not a trick and place her right foot in front of her left and start the test when ready. Dimicco put her left foot in front of her right and started to walk heel to toe. I stopped the test and explained that she was to start with her right foot in front of her left, Dimicco stated "you guys are tricking me". I did not respond, she put her right foot in front of her left and started to walk heel to toe on a line painted in the parking lot, she raised her arms approximately 6" from each side of her body to maintain balance, each step after the third the heel was approximately 4" from the toe, when she arrived on the ninth step she asked "how did you want me to turn?" and performed a pivot similar to a military, to the rear march movement, instead of short steps as instructed to face the other way. On the return nine steps Dimicco raised her arms approximately 6" from each side of her body to maintain balance only the first step was heel to toe the rest varied from 4" to 6" at one point she stopped and her arms came to the level of her shoulders, she regained her balance, put her arms down and continued. when she completed the test she stated "that's a hard test, I couldn't do it if I was sober"

Dimicco was taken into custody at 0015 hrs. 9/13/2018, while searching Dimicco, a glass tube used for smoking CDS was found in the right front pocket of her pants. Ptl. Fogarty and his K-9 partner searched Dimicco's vehicle for CDS, trace amounts were found. (see Ptl. Fogarty's Report, case # 55785-18) After Dimicco was placed in the patrol vehicle for transport she asked where her money was. Dimicco was informed that I only found a nickel during her search. Ptl. Fogarty found \$159 in the area of the center console of her vehicle, that money was counted in front of Dimicco and placed in her front right pants pocket. Dimicco was transported in patrol vehicle #24 to HQ without incident. Dimicco was processed according to departmental procedures. There was an issue with the fingerprint computer not reading Dimicco's rolled prints. Sgt. Thomas was notified and attempted to rectify the issue with negative results, most of the taken images were overridden from the error message. Dimicco's vehicle was impounded according to John's law. The glass tube was placed into property. Dimicco was issued the following motor vehicle summons: 1506-T-158752, 39:4-50, Driving While Intoxicated. Dimicco was released with the following summons: 1506-S-2018-000822, 2C:36-2, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. She was given a court date of 9/19/18.

On 09/13/2018 I responded to Police Headquarters to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C in reference to Karen L. Dimicco (Dimicco) who was in custody for DUI. (See Case Report by Ptl. Byers #226)

On arrival, Dimicco was escorted to the booking room. Dimicco was under Ptl. Byers direct uninterrupted observation beginning at 0042 hours. During the observation period, Dimicco did not have anything in her mouth, she did not belch or vomit and he did not consume any food or drinks. All portable electronic devices were removed from the booking room. I advised Dimicco of her Miranda Warning Rights at 0046 hours. Dimicco agreed to the acknowledgement of her Miranda Rights and also signed off on the Miranda Warning Form.

The NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators was read to Dimicco. After completing the nine bullets, Dimicco stated, "Yes" when asked if she would submit samples of her breath. I operated the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. Dimicco was read the breath sample instructions verbatim, from the posted sign, which she stated she understood. The instructions were read for all three breath samples collections. The breath hose mouth pieces were changed after each breath sample was given.

Dimicco's first breath sample returned the error message of blowing time too short. Dimicco's second and third breath samples were accepted. The reported breath samples recorded was 0.10% BAC. The breath sample results were entered into the New Jersey State Police Alcotest Calculator, and were within acceptable tolerances.

A copy of the Alcohol Influence Report was provided to Dimicco upon her release.

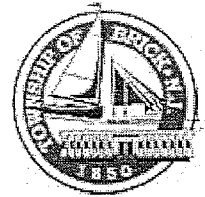

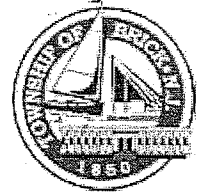

On 09/14/18 at approximately 2156 hours I, Ptl. Carter #280 was on DUI Patrol in the area of Rt 88 and Burnt Bridge Rd when I observed a white Subaru Crosstrek fail to maintain its lane twice, breaking the lane markings with the vehicle tires each time. I also paced the vehicle utilizing patrol vehicle 03 which has a calibrated speedometer. The vehicle was traveling 46 mph in a 35 mph zone. The vehicle also had a license plate holder which partially obstructed the license plate.

I conducted a motor vehicle stop of the above listed vehicle in the 7-11 parking lot, 3201 Rt 88 in Point Pleasant Boro. The vehicle operator later identified as Pamela Barrett parked the vehicle in a crooked fashion. I advised Barrett the reason for the motor vehicle stop and asked her to provide her drivers license, vehicle registration, and insurance card. When Barrett spoke her words were slurred and I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath. Barrett was also very evasive with answers to my questions such as where she was coming from and if she had been drinking alcoholic beverages this evening. I observed Barrett's eyes to be watery and bloodshot when I requested her to remove her glasses. I requested an additional unit and Ptl. Alexander #216 responded.

I asked Barrett to exit the vehicle and escorted her to an area of the parking lot which was level and clear of debris or any obstructions. The parking lot was well light. Barrett staggered and swayed her way to the test area nearly falling in the process. I asked Barrett to stand with her feet together and hands at her side to which she stated he understood. I demonstrated the position as well. While standing with her hands at her side and feet together Barrett began to sway in a circular motion which continued throughout the entire instruction phase. Barrett was unable to follow directions and kept moving from the starting position. Barrett would widen her feet to aid in her balance and removed her hands from her side as well.

Once Barrett was in the starting position I began to administer the "one leg stand test." I instructed Barrett to stand with her feet together and hands at her side during the instructional phase. The test was explained as such: Once in the starting position you lift the leg of your choice six inches off the ground, keeping your foot level to the ground. Additionally look at the tip of your toe and count in one-thousandths until I instruct you to stop. I advised Barrett to keep her hands at her sides during the remainder of the test. I demonstrated the starting position as well as the test. Barrett acknowledge she understood the instructions. I asked Barrett if she had any physical ailments which would prevent her from completing the tests to which she responded "no."

Once the test began Barrett lifted her right foot approximately 6 inches from the ground for approximately .5 seconds before placing it down to maintain her balance. Barrett attempted to lift her right foot again with similar results this time she stumbled from the starting position. Barrett began to refuse the test, however she agreed to try again. Barrett attempted the test again, however she was unable to hold her foot in the air, placing it down immediately to maintain her balance. Barrett tried the test a final time with her left foot. Barrett raised her foot and immediately placed it back down. Barrett was unable to hold her foot off the ground for any significant amount of time and failed to complete the test. Barrett failed to count out loud as instructed and was not looking at her toe as instructed despite numerous warnings to do so.

I informed Barrett the next test to be administered is called the "walk and turn test" and was explained as such: Barrett was instructed to place one foot in front of the other foot, heel to toe, keeping her hands at their sides. I demonstrated the starting position. She was also instructed to remain in this starting position for the remainder of the instructional phase. Barrett was advised that to complete the test she has to take 9 heel to toe steps in a straight line while counting each step out loud and looking at her feet. Upon completion of the 9 steps she must turn 180 degrees utilizing a series of small steps. Once turned around and back into the starting position she has to take an additional 9 heel to toe steps back in a straight line. I demonstrated the test for Barrett and she acknowledged she understood the test. Barrett was asked if she had any physical ailments which would prevent her from completing the tests to which she responded "no."

Barrett failed to maintain the starting position for the instructional phase, stepping from it and standing there in a normal stance. Barrett failed to follow instructions and began the test before instruction was finished. Barrett had difficulty maintaining her balance and did not take any heel to toe steps as instructed. During the steps fell off the line numerous times and began to refuse to finished the test. Barrett eventually agreed to continue with the test. When Barrett turned around she did not do so as instructed nor did she complete the correct amount of steps. Once turned around Barrett stumbled from the line on one of her steps. Barrett failed this test as well.

Ptl. Alexander #216 administered a Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test. The test revealed Barrett scored 4 out of 6. While Ptl. Alexander administered the test I observed Barrett swaying in a circular motion.

Barrett failed all of the field sobriety tests and she was placed under arrest for operating a motor vehicle under the influence. Barrett was placed in double locked handcuffs and transported to Headquarters for further processing. Ptl. Dierking #204 responded to headquarters to operate the Alcotest machine. A 20 minute observation phase of Barrett was completed and processing for the Alcotest procedure began. Barrett was advised of her Miranda Warning at 2226 hours which was documented on a Miranda Warning

Form. Barrett completed the testing as required and the Alcotest machine revealed a blood alcohol level of 0.15

All required DUI documents were completed. The results were submitted and found to be in acceptable tolerances. The vehicle was impounded and entered into AEGIS. A potential liability form was completed with _____ responding and signing the form. Barrett was released to John and received the following summons:

On 9/14/18 Ptl. Carter #280, responded to headquarters with an arrestee, Pamela Barrett, that needed breath testing. Ptl. Carter began his 20 minute observation time at 2231 hours. During this time she did not vomit, burp or have anything in her mouth.

I read Barrett the NJ Standard Statement Form and Barrett replied "Yes" to submit samples of her breath. I opened a new mouth piece for each test (2 tests total). Barrett's reading, 0.15, was checked on the NJ State Police Alcotest calculator. Her readings were within specifications. Barrett was given a copy of the Alcotest Report.

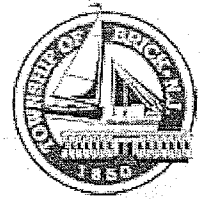

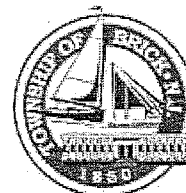

On 09/15/2018 at 0230 hours I was dispatched to a report of an erratic driver exiting the Garden State Parkway at exit 91. Dispatch advised that the driver was operating a white Dodge Charger (NJ-W13EWM), which was registered to Corey Lane (1414 Isabella Court, Brick).

At the intersection of Burnt Tavern Road and Herborn Road I observed the white, Dodge, Charger (NJ-W13EWM), turning right onto Burnt Tavern Road from Herborn Road. The driver made the turn at an excessively slow rate of speed, over steered the turn and crossed over the lane onto the shoulder. I activated my overhead lights and initiated a motor vehicle stop in front of 44 Burnt Tavern Road.

I approached the vehicle, identified myself and requested the driver's license, vehicle registration and proof of insurance. While interacting with the driver I observed the driver's hand movements were very slow, eyes were watery, eye lids droopy, clothing was dirty and jeans were unzipped. The driver failed to locate his documents and identified himself as Corey Lane. As Lane was speaking I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath.

Once Ptl. Alexander #216 and Ptl. DeMaio #194 arrived on scene to assist, Lane was instructed to exit the vehicle at which point Lane's driver's license was observed on the driver's seat. Lane was directed to a closed off section of the roadway that was flat, well lit and free of debris to perform field sobriety tests. While Lane was standing and walking his body was swaying and he was sagging at the knees.

Prior to starting the testing procedures Lane was asked if he is on any medication, or has any disabilities that would effect the results of the test. Lane advised that he does not have any conditions that would alter the results of the field sobriety tests. It should be noted that lane was slurring his words while I was speaking with him.

Lane was instructed to stand with his feet together and hands by his side while I explained and demonstrated the one leg stand test. Lane used his arms twice for balance while I was explaining the test. The test was demonstrated and explained to Lane. Lane advised that he understands the test and was instructed to begin. Lane raised his right foot off the ground approximately six inches and counted to one thousand two before needing to place his foot on the ground. Lane picked his foot up off the ground and counted to one thousand four before needing to place his foot on the ground again.

Lane was instructed to stand with one foot directly in front of the other, touching his feet heel to toe, while I explained the walk and turn test. Lane had difficulty getting into position touching his feet heel to toe. While I was explaining the test Lane used his arms three times for balance and stepped out of alignment. Lane advised that he understood my instructions and was instructed to start the test. On step two, five and six Lane failed to touch his feet, heel to toe and used his arms continuously throughout the test for balance. Lane proceeded to take ten steps in one direction but only counted nine steps. Lane proceeded to turn, take nine steps back and failed to connect steps, three, six and seven.

Lane was placed under arrest, handcuffed, searched, placed in the rear of patrol car 12 and transported to Brick Police Headquarters for processing without incident. Ptl. DeMaio remained on scene with Lane's vehicle while Ptl. Alexander followed me to headquarters to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C (see his supplemental report- same case number). Joe's Service Center responded to the scene to impound the vehicle in accordance with John's Law.

At headquarters Lane provided two quality breath samples which were found to be within acceptable tolerance limits. The result of Lane's samples were 0.21% BAC. Lane was charged with DUI (T-160026), Reckless Driving (T-160027) and Careless Driving (T-160028).

Heather Sisco was summoned on behalf of Lane to sign the Potential Liability Warning and assume responsibility for Lane. Once Lane arrived at headquarters the Potential Liability Warning was read verbatim to Sisco. Sisco acknowledged that she understands the warning, is willing to accept the responsibility and signed the Potential Liability Warning. After processing was complete Lane was released to Sisco and departed police headquarters.

It should be noted that Lane exited Sisco's vehicle in the area of Chambersbridge Road and Rt 88. Sisco called Brick Police Headquarters and advised dispatch of the situation. Ptl. Alexander, Ptl. Byers #226 and I responded to the area. Ptl. Byers located Lane in the area of Lanes Mills Road and Joe Parker Road. Lane was instructed to get back into Sisco's vehicle. Lane complied and departed with Sisco.

OfficerID: malexander, Narrative

On 09-15-2018 I (Patrolman Alexander #216) responded to Brick Police Headquarters to assist Patrolman Gannaio #234 with a DUI arrest. I was to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C.

Upon arrival I met with the arrestee, Corey Lane, in the booking room. I first checked the inside of Lane's mouth for any foreign objects or residual alcohol, which was negative. I read Lane his Miranda Rights and The Attorney General's Standard Statement Form for Motor Vehicle Operators. Lane stated and signed that he understood his rights and agreed to give samples of his breath. I then observed Lane in excess of twenty minutes, in which time he did not belch or regurgitate. All electronics, cellular phones and portable radios that could interfere with the test were removed from the booking room. After this process I administered the test to Lane. Lane gave two good breath samples, with a reported breath test result of 0.21% BAC.

The results were checked by dispatch using The State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator, which were within acceptable tolerance.

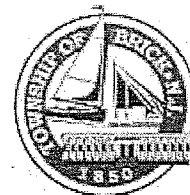

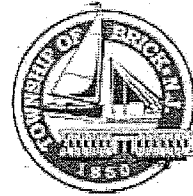

On 09/16/18 at 0020 hours, while I was working a supplemental Driving While Intoxicated detail, Ptl. DeLuca #276, Ptl. Haugh #217 and I responded to the area of Baywood Boulevard and Bonair Drive for a single car motor vehicle crash where the driver exited his vehicle and fled the area on foot (see N.J.T.R.-1 form, same case number). The crash occurred when the driver failed to negotiate the curve of the road, ran off the roadway to the left and struck a utility pole. The utility pole was snapped in half and it was suspended by the wires it was attached to. The vehicle then continued on the grass median and struck a large tree.

Prior to our arrival, the caller advised us the driver left the vehicle. Upon Ptl. DeLuca's arrival, he located the driver sitting in a pickup truck on scene, which turned out to be a family member of the driver. Upon my arrival I identified the driver as Kyle T. Tussel through his New Jersey digital driver's license. Tussel was leaning against the family member's pickup truck. Tussel's eyes were blood shot and watery and his face was flushed. Tussel's speech was slow and slurred and I detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. Tussel sustained a cut to his nose and first aid was requested and responded but Tussel refused first aid. After Tussel refused first aid, I spoke with him and he was swaying from side to side as we spoke. I asked Tussel if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages tonight and he admitted he "had three beers."

I asked Tussel what his highest level of education was and he told me he went to a trade school after graduating high school. I asked Tussel if he was familiar with the English language and the English alphabet. Tussel replied yes to both. I asked Tussel to recite the alphabet from the letter 'A' to the letter 'Z' while saying the letters slowly and individually without singing or grouping the letters together. I asked Tussel if he understood and he said "yes." Tussel was instructed to begin. Tussel immediately started to sing the letters and group them together. After Tussel said "M,N,O,P" he stopped. Tussel again said "M,N,O,P", stopped and put his hands over his face. After waiting for about 30 seconds with his hands over his face, I asked Tussel if he wanted to try again and he said no.

I asked Tussel if I can check his eyes and he said I could. I then conducted the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test. I put Tussel into the starting position by having his feet together and his hands at his sides. I told him I was going to check his eyes. I instructed Tussel to keep his head still and to follow my pen with his eyes only and not to move his head. I asked Tussel if he understood and he stated he did. Prior to conducting the test I checked Tussel's eyes for resting nystagmus which he did not have and I ensured Tussel's eyes tracked equally, which they did. After testing Tussel's eyes, I observed both eyes to have a lack of smooth pursuit, both eyes have nystagmus at maximum deviation for a period of no less than four seconds along with the both eyes having the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees for a period of no less than four seconds. Due to Tussel's performance on the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test, I asked him to perform the Walk and Turn Test.

Tussel stated he did not want to perform any additional test. Due to the damage from the motor vehicle crash, Tussel's slow and slurred speech, his bloodshot watery eyes, his own admission to consuming alcoholic beverages prior to operating his vehicle and coupled with his inability to recite the alphabet and his performance on the horizontal gaze nystagmus, I determined Tussel was under the influence of an intoxicating liquor and took him into custody while using the double lock method.

Tussel was turned over to Ptl. Haugh #217 who transported Tussel to Headquarters for processing since I have a department issued police canine. Once at Headquarters Tussel was provided with his Miranda Warnings, which he invoked and was read the implied consent form which he replied "sure" to. Ptl. Dierking #204 operated the Alcotest machine (see supplemental report by Ptl. Dierking) and informed me Tussel refused the breath testing.

Tussel was processed and charged with: DUI (159729), Careless Driving (159730), Reckless Driving (160071), Refusal (160072), Refusal as per Ocean County Prosecutors Officer (39:4-50.4(a)). All of Tussel's charges are returnable for court on 09/19/18 at 0900 hours. Tussel's mother, Tamara responded to Headquarters to take custody of her son. Tussel was turned over to Tamara and she signed the Potential Liability Form acknowledging receipt.

OfficerID: sdierking, Narrative

On 9/16/18 Sgt. Catalina #229 arrested Kyle Tussel for driving under the influence. The arrest involved a motor vehicle crash on Baywood Boulevard, see crash report under the same case number. Sgt. Catalina requested that I operate the Alcotest for him, as he is not a certified operator.

Sgt. Catalina maintained a 20 minute observation of Tussel, at which time Tussel did not vomit, belch or have anything in his mouth. Tussel was read the standard statement form and he replied "sure." I entered Tussel's information into the Alcotest, but when it came time for him to submit samples he began to ask questions about the DUI penalties. I informed I could not give him legal advice and then he kept saying "I don't know what to do" each time I requested him to submit a sample. I warned him several times that he needed to submit a sample or be charged with refusal. Tussel was given more than 5 minutes to provide a sample. He refused to do so and would only say "I don't know what to do" when I asked him for a sample. At that point I listed Tussel as a refusal.

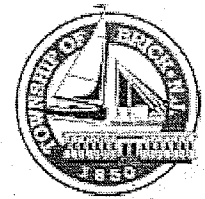

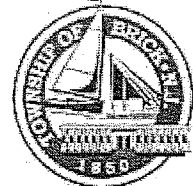

OfficerID: mfeeney, Narrative

On 09/21/18 at 2031 hours I responded to the area of Hooper Avenue and Old Silverton Road in reference to a motor vehicle accident. Ptl. Miller #218 was already on scene and advised three vehicles were involved.

Upon arrival I spoke with Ptl. Miller, who advised a subject, identified as Doreen Emerson, had crashed her vehicle into a parked vehicle on Hooper Avenue northbound near Old Silverton Road. Ptl. Miller advised this parked vehicle then struck another parked vehicle (See Ptl. Miller's accident report for more information).

Ptl. Miller and I spoke with Emerson, who was operating a red Chevy Corvette, NJ registration PZM 66R. I asked Emerson what had happened and she stated "I drank too much". While speaking with Emerson I observed her eyes to be bloodshot and watery. I also detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath.

Emerson stated she had been drinking alcohol at the Elks Lodge, 2491 Hooper Avenue. Emerson advised she exited the Elks parking lot in her vehicle and began traveling north on Hooper Avenue. Emerson made it approximately 100 feet before she struck a parked vehicle on the shoulder.

Due to the airbags in Emerson's vehicle being deployed, Brick PD EMS responded to check on her. After being checked by EMS Emerson refused medical attention.

I moved Emerson to the sidewalk, which was level and free of debris. The area was also well - lit due to the headlights from the patrol vehicles on scene. I had Emerson stand with her back to my patrol vehicle, so the overhead lights would not affect her. I asked Emerson if she had any medical issues or physical ailments that would prevent her from performing field sobriety tests and she stated "No I don't". Emerson was wearing sandals and I advised her if she wished to take them off for the test she could but she stated she preferred to leave them on.

The first test I demonstrated for Emerson was the Walk and Turn test. I advised Emerson to stand with her hands at her sides and to place the foot of her choice in front of the foot, heel to toe. I advised Emerson to stand like this while I demonstrated the test. Emerson immediately began walking, as if the test had started. I again advised Emerson to stand still with her hands at her sides and one foot in front of the other. Emerson again tried to do this but lost her balance and almost fell over. Emerson again started to walk as if the test had begun. I had to advise Emerson multiple times to stand with her hands at her sides and with one foot in front of the other, as she continually lost her balance and began walking.

I demonstrated to Emerson that she was to walk heel to toe, in a straight line, for nine steps, counting out loud as she walked. I demonstrated to Emerson that after nine steps she was to turn around by taking a series of small steps and then take nine steps back in the same fashion. Emerson stated she understood my instructions.

Emerson began the test by taking three steps, not in a heel to toe fashion. On the third step Emerson lost her balance and started to fall over. Emerson continued walking, not in a heel to toe manner, with her hands behind her back, for twelve steps. After twelve steps Emerson slowly turned around and took two more steps before losing her balance and almost falling over. Emerson stopped walking and advised she could not perform the test.

The next test I demonstrated for Emerson was the One Leg Stand test. I advised Emerson to stand with her feet together, hands at her side while I demonstrated the test. Emerson was able to stand in this fashion as I demonstrated the test.

I demonstrated to Emerson that she was to raise the foot of her choice six inches off of the ground, toe pointed out, and count "one thousand one, one thousand two, one thousand three" and so on for thirty seconds. I asked Emerson if she understood these instructions and she stated "I have to lift my foot?" I advised Emerson again that she would need to lift the foot of her choice six inches off of the ground with her toe pointed out. I also demonstrated the test for her again. Emerson stated she understood the instructions.

Emerson began the test by lifting her foot off of the ground, putting her arms straight out and counting "one, two, three, four". Emerson was swaying and using her arms to try and keep her balance. I advised Emerson of the proper way to count and she put her foot down. Emerson attempted the test again by lifting her foot and not counting. Emerson kept her arms raised and lost her balance after approximately three seconds. Emerson put her foot down and stated "I can't do it".

I asked Emerson what her highest level of education was and she stated "High school". I asked Emerson if she had graduated and she said "I don't know". I asked Emerson if she knew the English language and she stated she did. I asked Emerson if she knew the alphabet and she stated she did. I advised Emerson to recite the alphabet, starting with "D" as in "dog" and ending with the letter "T" as in "Thomas". Emerson stated she understood.

Emerson began the test by reciting the alphabet from "D" to "P". After stating "P" Emerson stood there silently, looking at me. I advised Emerson she was supposed to end on the letter "T" as in "Thomas". Emerson stared at me blankly. I advised her she stopped at the letter "P". Emerson then began reciting the alphabet under her breath, moving her head back and forth as she did it, as if she was thinking. Emerson then stated out loud "U, V, W, X, Y, Z".

Based on Emerson's obvious signs of intoxication and her poor performance on the tests, I placed her under arrest for DUI. I transported Emerson to headquarters without incident. Ptl. Miller stood by with Emerson's vehicle, which was impounded by Sandy's.

Once at headquarters, I placed Emerson into the booking room. I removed all portable electronics from the room, including my portable radio, all cell phones, and the laptop computer. I then had Emerson open her mouth so I could confirm she had no foreign objects or debris in her mouth. After confirming Emerson did not have any foreign objects in her mouth I began a 20 minute observation of her. During this 20 minutes Emerson did not place any foreign objects in her mouth or regurgitate, belch or vomit.

Emerson was advised of her Miranda Rights, which she stated she understood. Emerson signed the Miranda Waiver form. I then read Emerson the NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators. Emerson stated she understood and agreed to provide samples of her breath for testing.

I then activated the Alcotest 7110. After I put all of Emerson's information into the machine, I read her the statement of instructions posted on the wall near the Alcotest. Emerson stated she understood. Emerson provided two acceptable breath samples. A new mouthpiece from a sealed bag was used for each breath sample Emerson provided.

The breath results were checked on the Alcotest Calculator and found to be within acceptable tolerance. Emerson's BAC was found to be .20%.

Emerson contacted her friend, John Horan to come pick her up. Horan responded to headquarters and I advised him of the Potential Liability form. Horan stated he understood the form. Horan signed and was given a copy of the form. Emerson was released to Horan.

I issued Emerson the following summonses:

- DUI (summons # T-159903)
- Reckless Driving (#T-159904)
- Improper Display of Plates (#T-159906)

Ptl. Miller issued Emerson a summons for Careless Driving (summons # E18-3694).

It should be noted that when I initially arrived on scene I observed what appeared to be feces on the back of Emerson's jeans. It appeared she had defecated herself. After she was cleared by EMS, I utilized a sheet from the ambulance to use as a barrier in the rear of my patrol vehicle. Upon arriving at headquarters I observed the sheet to be red, as it appeared Emerson was bleeding from her upper leg / groin region. I asked Emerson if she was injured and she stated she was not. Emerson stated she did not wish for EMS to respond to check on her.

On 09-23-2018 at 1739hrs. I was dispatched to the area of Hollycrest Dr. and Mandalay Rd. for a motor vehicle crash.

While en-route dispatch advised us the vehicle had left the scene and headed toward Drumpoint Rd. The description of the vehicle was a green Mazda pick-up truck with a cap on the rear. Ptl. Storch # 206 observed a vehicle matching that description heading north on Drumpoint Rd. away from the direction of Mandalay Rd. At that time he changed directions and attempted to get behind the suspect vehicle. Storch was able to get behind the suspect vehicle just prior to the intersection of Drumpoint and Hooper. It was at that time I got behind Storch and we activated our overhead lights and conducted a motor vehicle stop on the above described vehicle (N.J RZM91F). As the vehicle entered the CVS parking lot it hit the curb then ran over the curb.

At that time we approached the vehicle we identified the driver as Ryan Calabro by his photo NJ driver's license. As I spoke to the driver I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. I asked Calabro what had happened on Mandalay Rd. He said he had hit the gas in the truck and lost control of his vehicle hitting a tree. Calabro then left the scene after arguing with a witness to the crash. I asked Calabro to exit the vehicle and move to a smooth well lit area of the parking lot that was free of debris.

When I advised Calabro that I suspected him of driving while intoxicated he became uncooperative. I asked him if he had anything to drink today and he replied "I will be honest with you I am a little buzzed." He then said do what you need to do if you got to arrest me arrest me. I asked him if he would take some roadside test and he agreed.

The first test I had him perform was the one leg stand. I demonstrated the test, explained the test and he stated he understood. Calabro stated he had no physical injuries that would prevent him from performing the test. He began the test prior to me asking him to start the test. His first attempt at lifting his leg was to the count of four. The second attempt he started and quickly put down his leg and began to cry saying he was really nervous. The third time he attempted the test he used his left hand to stabilize his leg.

The next test I asked Calabro to perform was the walk and turn. I demonstrated the test and explained the test. Calabro stated he understood and began the test. While walking he failed to walk heel to toe and stepped off the line several times. Calabro also failed to count out his steps as he performed the test. At that time I advised Calabro I was placing him into custody for suspicion of DUI. A open bottle of Vodka was found in the vehicle in plain view. I subsequently cuffed him placing him into my patrol vehicle and transported him to Police Headquarters.

While at Police Headquarters I observed Calabro in excess of twenty minutes prior to starting the Alco test. I also made sure Calabro had nothing in his mouth and all cell phone and radios were taken out of the room. Calabro agreed to provide samples of his breath for testing. After providing the samples his results came back at .25 % BAC. The samples were ran through the State Police Alcotest Calculator. It came back that the breath samples were within acceptable tolerance.

I issued Calabro the following summonses: DUI 39:4-50, 39:4-50(g) DUI in a School Zone, Careless 39:4-97, Reckless 39:4-96, Leaving the Scene of a Crash 39:4-129, Failure to Report a MVA 39:4-130 and Open Container in a MV 39:4-51(b). Jessica Fiedler responded to Police Headquarters to pick up Calabro. She signed the Potential Liability Form and also was given a copy of that form. Calabro was processed and released.

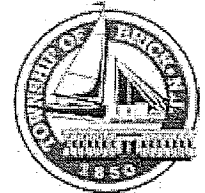

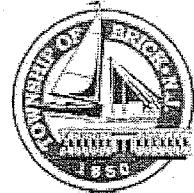

OfficerID: bulman, Narrative

On 09/23/2018 Ptl. Hentges #288 and I, Ptl. Ulman #215, responded to the area of Hooper Ave. and Cedar Bridge Ave. to investigate a report of Motor Vehicle Crash (See Ptl. Hentges crash report same).

While interviewing one of the drivers, Francis Casey, I detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath as he spoke. I asked Casey if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages tonight at which time he stated "I had a few at the Knights of Columbus".

As I continued to speak with Casey he kept leaning his body against his vehicle for support. Casey's speech was slow and slurred and his eyes were glassy. I then proceeded to test for Nystagmus in his eyes.

I asked Casey if he had any physical problems with his eyes that would hinder him from taking part in said test at which time he stated no. I then asked him to place his hands at his side with his feet together. Upon performing the test Casey's eyes demonstrated Nystagmus in both and I obtained a score of six of six. After testing for Nystagmus I moved Casey off to the side of the road where it was well lit, level and safe in order to administer several more standard field sobriety tests.

The second test I demonstrated/administered was the Sway Test. I asked Casey to place his hands at his side with his feet together. I then asked him to tilt his head back, with his eyes open, and count from one to thirty in one thousandths. During said test Casey continued to sway from side to side in a back and forth motion. Casey was also unable to keep his hands at his side. Casey also counted sixteen twice and skipped to nineteen.

The third test I demonstrated/administered was the Walk and Turn. I first asked Casey if he had any physical injuries/limitations which would hinder his participation at which time he stated no. I then asked Casey to place his hands at his side and place his right foot in front of his left heel to toe.

Upon doing so Casey began to place his hands out for balance and came out of said position several times. While I was demonstrating the exercise Casey kept starting the exercise and had to be told to go back to the heel toe position three times. As I was completing the demonstration Casey advised he couldn't do the test nor did he want to attempt it.

The final test I demonstrated/administered was the One Leg Stand. I advised Casey he would be picking up either his left or right foot six inches, while keeping his hands at his side, and look down at his foot then count from one to thirty in one thousandths. After demonstrating the exercise Casey lifted his left foot then almost fell over. Casey advised that he could not do the exercise nor did he want to continue.

I then proceeded to place Casey under arrest for DUI. Casey was then placed into the back of my patrol vehicle and transported to Police Headquarters to be processed. Enroute I could smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the back of my patrol vehicle.

Upon arrival at Police Headquarters Casey was placed into the processing room to be observed for twenty minutes by Alcotest operator Ptl. Haugh #217 (See Ptl. Haugh's supplemental report).

After administering the Alcotest, which takes samples of Casey's breath to determine blood alcohol content, Ptl. Haugh advised me that Casey's BAC was .13%. Casey was then charged with the following:

- (1) DUI 39:4-50 T#3726
- (2) Careless Driving 39:4-97 T#3727
- (3) Reckless Driving 39:4-96 T#3728
- (4) Failure to Exhibit DL 39:3-29 T#3729

At the conclusion of the investigation Maureen Donnelly responded to Police Headquarters to take custody of Casey. Donnelly signed accordingly on the Potential Liability Form at which time Casey was released on summonses.

**Casey's vehicle, Chevy Venture NJ#U97KEZ, was impounded under Johns Law and towed from the scene by Brick Performance.

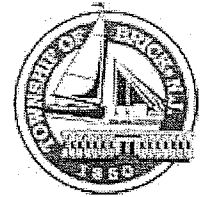
