On the above date and time, this officer responded to the area of 210 Niblick Street for a report of a vehicle that slowly rolled down the road and crashed into trash cans. Upon arrival, this officer observed a pickup truck parked halfway in the road, bearing New Jersey registration "[REDACTED]", which came back to a [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] Street. Officer Marchetti and this officer approached the driver side window and observed a male subject hunched over with the truck running. Once these officers knocked on the window and woke the male subject, this officer advised him to get out of the truck. This officer then observed the male place an item between the seats and attempt to exit the vehicle. While exiting, this officer observed the truck to still be in drive. This officer immediately placed the truck in park and had the male step out. This officer identified the male subject as [REDACTED].

While Officer Marchetti spoke with [REDACTED] it appeared he was intoxicated. This officer asked [REDACTED] if he had any alcohol or used and drugs to which he advised he used drugs earlier. This officer located the item he placed between the seat which was a glass smoking device utilized to inhale or ingest drugs. It should be noted it is the same style glass pipe this officer removed from this subject on a prior incident on 12/29/2019. Also located on the seat was an empty clear bag and a rock powdery substance on the seat. This officer placed the white substance (suspect crack cocaine) in the clear bag. This officer asked [REDACTED] where he was coming from to which he advised he hasn't slept in days and went to get food. [REDACTED] advised he had been smoking crack that is why he can't sleep.

It should be noted [REDACTED] was not wearing shoes and due to the cold weather, this officer had him place his shoes on to conduct field sobriety tests. This officer placed [REDACTED] in front of Sgt. Kowalewski's patrol vehicle #180 to capture the field sobriety tests. This officer advised [REDACTED] a series of tests were going to be explained and demonstrated to him and he was not to begin any test until advised to do so, to which he stated he understood.

The first test was the alphabet test. [REDACTED] stated he understood the English alphabet and could recite each letter. After being advised to begin, [REDACTED] stated A-P correctly then stated K, I and stopped.

The next test was the one leg stand test. After being advised on how to perform the test, [REDACTED] was advised to begin if he understood. [REDACTED] raised his left foot approximately one foot off the ground counted to one thousand and six but did so by using his arms for balance, swaying side to side, and placing his foot down to regain his balance. [REDACTED] was given another opportunity to which he raised his right foot approximately six inches off the ground began to sway side to side, and started hopping. This officer ended the test for his safety at this time. See in car video and psychophysical evaluation form for results of the test.

Next test was the walk and turn. This officer had [REDACTED] utilize the white painted parking spot line as a guide to a straight line. It should be noted the ground was flat, level and clear of any debris. This officer had [REDACTED] go into the heel to toe position with his right foot in front of his left foot and he was to stand like that until advised to begin the test. This officer explained and demonstrated the test to [REDACTED] and he was advised to begin. [REDACTED] began and took nine steps forward after the ninth step, he asked on how to turn around and in the incorrect manner, spun around quickly. He then began taking steps back to the starting point. While taking his steps back to the starting point he continued to ask questions, raised his arms for balance and began swinging his leg back and forth. After almost falling because he was trying to balance on one foot, [REDACTED] walked back to the starting point without counting. It should be noted [REDACTED] speech was slurred and his eyes were bloodshot red. It should be noted this officer did not detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath.

Officer Marchetti handcuffed [REDACTED] utilizing the double locking method and was transported back to this agency by Sgt. Kowalweski for processing. [REDACTED]'s truck was towed and held for twelve hours as per John's law. All tests were explained and demonstrated to [REDACTED] prior to him conducting them. He stated he understood all tests. While at headquarters Sgt. Kowalewski read [REDACTED] his Miranda warning to which he signed off on and the New Jersey implied consent form to which he stated "yes" to giving samples of his breath. This officer began the mandatory uninterrupted 20 minute observation period to which [REDACTED] did not belch, vomit, spit, chew gum, or place any items in his mouth. At the conclusion of the observation period, this officer administered the Alco-test resulting in a .00 BAC. The Ocean County Dispatch center was contacted in reference to getting a DRE to respond. Officer Caufield #235 from Brick Township Police responded as the DRE officer. At the conclusion of the testing, [REDACTED] provided a urine sample which was tagged, sealed, and placed into the evidence locker to be sent to the state for testing. See supplemental DRE report by Officer Caufield #235.

This officer charged [REDACTED] with 2C:35-10A(1), 2C:36-2, and motor vehicle summonses for DWI, Reckless Driving, Failure to Maintain Lanes, and Failure to report an Accident, all returnable for court on 1/18/2019 at 10:00 AM. Charges were placed on a warrant and [REDACTED] was subsequently transported to Ocean County Jail. All evidence was tagged, sealed and placed into evidence. MVR audio and video was also submitted into evidence.
