Narrative On 03/09/2019 at approximately 22:31 hours I, P.O. Kleinknecht #295, and P.O. Pante #292 were dispatched to CeeGee's Bar and Grill for an individual passed out inside their vehicle. Upon my arrival I observed a Hispanic male asleep behind the wheel of an idling silver Mercedes sedan bearing Pennsylvania registration [REDACTED]. I tapped on the window of the vehicle with my flash light and was able to wake up the driver. At this time I observed the drivers eyes to be blood shot and glassy. Upon opening the drivers side door to speak with the driver I detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the interior of the vehicle.

This officer reached into the vehicle and removed the key from the ignition to prevent the male from driving away. This is due to the fact that the driver was visually intoxicated and had trouble comprehending my commands. While speaking to the driver he kept reaching towards under the front drivers seat. This officer then asked the driver to step out of the vehicle. While exiting the vehicle the driver had difficulty standing and had to grab the vehicle to keep standing. This officer then asked the driver if he had any form identification to which he responded no. This officer was able to locate the drivers wallet in his front trouser pocket. After removing his wallet this officer again asked the subject if he could locate his identification. While searching through his wallet the driver fumbled through the cards in his wallet and handed me a credit card. I then advised the driver that he needed to supply me with identification not a credit card. The driver who was later identified as Cornelio Carrasco of Jackson, then removed a Mexican American ID from his wallet.

At this time I asked Cornelio if he had been drinking to which he stated yes. I then asked him how many beers he had consumed, Cornelio replied in Spanish which I was unable to comprehend. At this time I advised Cornelio I was going to check his eyes. I advised him that he was to stand with his feet together and hands at his sides. I then asked Cornelio if he had problems with his eyes to which he responded no. At this time I advised Cornelio that I would be checking his eyes for Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus. I advised Cornelio that he was to watch the tip of my pen with his eyes and his eyes only, and not to move his head at any point. When asked if he understood my instructions he replied yes. While checking for equal pupil size and equal tracking I observed that Cornelio could not focus on the tip of my pen and that he was unable to follow the stimulus. After several tries and again instructing Cornelio how to perform the test he was unable to complete the test.

At this time P.O. Pante #292 arrived on scene. I then advised Cornelio that we would be moving on to the walk and turn test. While explaining the test to Cornelio he was having a very difficult time standing still as he kept losing his balance. I advised Cornelio to stand on the yellow painted line in front of my patrol car. I advised Cornelio that he was to place his left foot on the yellow line and place his right foot in front of his left foot. Before I could advise Cornelio to not start the test until instructed to do so he began walking heel to toe down said line. I told Cornelio to stop and to resume the starting position. While explaining the remainder of the test to Cornelio he stepped off of the line several times and could not maintain his balance. I then advised Cornelio he was to take nine heel to toe steps, and look down at his feet while doing so and count aloud every step he had taken. Once I confirmed with him that he understood the test I told him to begin the test. Cornelio repeatedly failed to walk heel to toe, counted out of sequence several times, and did not complete the proper number of steps without being reminded several times.

I then advised Cornelio that we were going to perform one last test, the One Leg Stand Test. I then asked him if he had any leg or knee problems to which he responded no. I then advised Cornelio to stand with his hands and feet at his sides and to stay in that position until I told him to do otherwise. While starting to explain the test Cornelio began to lift his left foot off the ground. I then advised him not to do so. After explaining the test I advised Cornelio that he could begin. Cornelio had a very difficult standing which led me to end the test for his safety.

After his unsatisfactory completion of the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, Cornelio was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated (39:4-50). It should be noted that after his arrest an empty 22oz bottle of Bud Lite Lime was recovered from his vehicle. Said open container was photographed and attached to this report. His vehicle was towed from the scene and a twelve hour hold was placed on the vehicle as per John's Law. Once back at headquarters Cornelio was removed from the rear of my patrol vehicle, It should be noted when being removed this officer detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the rear partition of the patrol vehicle. This odor was not present during my pre shift vehicle inspection. Cornelio was then brought into headquarters and placed on the bench in the booking room. At this time I began the twenty minute observation period. During the twenty minute observation period this officer did not observe Cornelio burp, belch, vomit, or place any foreign objects in his mouth. The Alcotest was operated by P.O. Candido #218. Refer to #218's supplemental report for more information on said test.

After completing the Alcotest Cornelio was then placed in temporary holding cell 2. Cornelio was charged with 39:4-50 (E19001702), Driving Without a License 39:3-10B (E19001703), Failure to Present Registration Card 39:3-29B (E19001704), Failure to Present valid Insurance Card 39:3-29C (E19001705), Reckless Driving 39:4-96 (E19001706), Driving While Suspended 39:3-40 (E19001707), and Possessing an Open Container of Alcohol in a MV 39:4-51B (E19001708). Cornelio was released to Digna Flores who signed the potential liability form (attached to this report). Cornelio was released on motor vehicle summonses pending a March 21st Jackson Municipal Court Date.

All pertinent documents have been scanned in and attached to this case file.

I met with the driver of the vehicle later identified as Mr. Charles Nelson. Mr. Nelson was sitting down on the driveway curb and looked confused by what had occurred. I asked Mr. Nelson if he would like any type of medical treatment which he declined.

I then asked Mr. Nelson how the crash occurred and Mr. Nelson stated "I dont know." He continued by saying his steering wheel did not allow him to turn his vehicle when he was traveling down the hill. I asked Mr. Nelson where he was coming from and Mr. Nelson stated, he was dropped off at his house by his friend but forget his cellphone in his car. Mr. Nelson stated once he knew his phone was with his friend, he got in his vehicle and drove to his friends house to retrieve his phone. Mr. Nelson did not want to tell me where his friend lives. While speaking with Mr. Nelson he made very little eye contact with me. Mr. Nelson was talking slowly with slurred speech and I noticed his eyes were glassy. By these observations I had reason to believe Mr. Nelson was impaired and I conducted standardized field sobriety tests.

1.) Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test (HGN)

I asked Mr. Nelson to remove his glasses for the test which he did. I then asked if Mr. Nelson had any medical issues with his eyes which he replied "no." Mr. Nelson was advised to stand with his feet together and arms down at his side. Mr. Nelson was advised to focus his eyes on the tip of my pen and follow the tip with his eyes only; without moving his head. Mr. Nelson was advised if he understood these instructions which he replied "yes." I then placed the tip of my pen approximately 12 to 15 inches away from his nose and slightly above eye level. I began the test by checking for equal tracking in both eyes and pupil size. During the HGN test I observed lack of smooth pursuit in both left and right eye, nystagmus at maximum deviation in both left and right eye were sustained and distinct, and onset nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both left and right eye. This test was performed twice because the first time it was performed I noticed I did not have my mic pack on my person and there was too much flashing lights from our vehicles that may have been contaminating the test. During the second test there was the same observations of nystagmus.

2.) Walk and Turn Test

I asked if Mr. Nelson had any medical issues with his back, legs, or any problems with balance which he replied "no." I told Mr. Nelson to imagine a straight line in front of him and to put his left foot on that line which he did. I then told Mr. Nelson to put his right foot in front of his left heel touching toe which he did. I advised Mr. Nelson to put his arms down at his side and that this would be his starting position for the test. He was advised not to begin until I told him to and was asked if he understood which he replied "yes." I told Mr. Nelson, when I tell him to I want him to take nine heel to toe steps on the line. When he gets to nine steps keep his lead foot on the line and turn around taking a series of small steps and return nine heel to toe steps on the line. I asked Mr. Nelson if he understood which he replied "yes." I advised Mr. Nelson I would demonstrate the test. While I was performing the turn during the demonstration, Mr. Nelson asked if he keeps his front foot on the line while executing the turn which I confirmed yes. After I was done demonstrating the test I advised Mr. Nelson to count his steps out loud, keep his eyes on his feet, and do not stop until the test is complete.

During the test Mr. Nelson failed to touch heel to toe on step three and seven. Mr. Nelson also counted the starting position as step "one" and counted his first step as "two." Mr. Nelson took ten steps (10) instead of the instructed nine before the turn, and turned incorrectly. Mr. Nelson turned incorrectly by taking his front foot off of the line and turned in the complete opposite direction that was demonstrated. He returned by taking ten (10) steps back instead of the instructed nine.

3.) One-Leg-Stand Test

I asked Mr. Nelson again if he had any medical issues with his back, legs, or any problems with balance which he replied "no." I told Mr. Nelson to stand with his feet together, arms down at his side, and advised him this would be his starting position. I advised Mr. Nelson not to begin until I tell him to and asked if he understood which he replied "yes." I told Mr. Nelson, when I tell him to I want him to raise the leg of his choice six inches above the ground with his foot parallel to the ground. I told him to keep his eyes on that elevated foot and count out loud one thousand-one, one thousand-two, one thousand-three, and so on until I tell him to stop. I asked if Mr. Nelson understood which he replied "yes." I then demonstrated the test for Mr. Nelson. Once I was done demonstrating the test Mr. Nelson asked me if the foot has to be parallel to the ground which I confirmed yes. I advised Mr. Nelson he may begin and Mr. Nelson began the test without counting out loud. I advised Mr. Nelson he has to count out loud and he then stopped the test and seemed confused by the instructions. I advised Mr. Nelson we can start over and I will demonstrate the test for him again. Once I completed demonstrating the test I asked if he understood the directions which he replied "yes." During the test Mr. Nelson could not focus on counting; unable to count in sequential order by skipping and repeating numbers. Mr. Nelson also swayed and put his foot down once during the testing.

Video evidence was not captured due to complications with PO Thompson's vehicle learned after the testing was complete.

Based on my observations and the way Mr. Nelson performed on the test it was determined that he was unable to operate a motor vehicle safely. Mr. Nelson was advised he was under arrest for driving while intoxicated. Mr. Nelson was handcuffed (double lock), and searched. During the search a black zip baggy with the letters "HG" were found in his front left pocket. In this baggy was a green vegetation of what I know through my training and experience to be marijuana. All evidence was collected on the scene and secured. Mr. Nelson was placed in the rear of my vehicle and seat belted in. I then transported Mr. Nelson to headquarters while officers remained on scene with the vehicle. The vehicle was towed as per John's law by CH Auto for a twelve (12) hour hold. During the transport I detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage that was not previously present in my vehicle.

After being read the standard statement Mr. Nelson agreed to provide breath samples. At this time I began my twenty minute observation period. During the twenty minute observation period, Mr. Nelson did not have anything in his mouth and did not burp or regurgitate. Once the observation period was complete, PO Delatorre #264 conducted the Alcotest (see PO Delatorre supplemental report for further details).

PO Delatorre advised me Mr. Nelson scored a .14% BAC on the Alcotest.

Mr. Nelson was then processed and released to Ms. Kimberly Nelson. Ms. Nelson was the signer on the Potential Liability form.

tree line of Mrs. Barqueri's property. I asked Mr. Popovzen if he was ok, and Mr. Popovzen gave me a blank stare with his head slightly tilted forward (as if he was confused). I asked again but he did not answer. Mr. Popovzen had a small amount of dried blood on his lips but did not appear to be injured. I asked Mr. Popovzen if he was driving, to which he responded yes. Mr. Popovzen spoke with a Russian accent but he said understands English. I noticed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Mr. Popovzen. Mr. Popovzen was swaying while standing and his speech was slowed. I asked Mr. Popovzen if he had been drinking today, and he stated that he had one shot. I asked Mr. Popovzen to walk back to my patrol car with me, to which he began to walk towards my patrol car. As we were walking back to my patrol car, Mr. Popovzen stumbled several times and almost fell. I grabbed his arm to help stabilize him and keep him from falling. I held onto his arm until we got to the pavement near my patrol car due to the uneven terrain.

2. Field Sobriety Testing

Once on the even pavement, I began to administer the standardized field sobriety tests.

The walk and turn test:

The first test was the walk and turn test. Prior to the test, Mr. Popovzen was asked if he had any injuries that would hinder his performance in any testing, to which he responded with no. I instructed Mr. Popovzen to face me with his arms down along his side and his feet together during the instructional portion. Mr. Popovzen attempted to get into that position but began to sway and raised his arms for balance, never placing his feet together. After two failed attempts to get Mr. Popovzen to place his feet together, He finally placed them together. Mr. Popovzen requested that we call his mom, to which I informed him that we can call her later. As I backed up to provide more room so I can demonstrate how to conduct the walk and turn, Mr. Popovzen backed up as I did. Mr. Popovzen was instructed to stay put and remain in the starting position during the course of the instruction, and that he would be informed of the proper time for him to conduct the test. As I took my first step forward, Mr. Popovzen attempted to take a step forward. Sergeant Grochowski stopped Mr. Popovzen. Upon completion of the instructional portion, Mr. Popovzen started his test. Mr. Popovzen took three steps forward (without his feet ever touching each other), turned around, and took three steps backwards. As Mr. Popovzen turned around from his walk back to his starting position, he stumbled again. I instructed Mr. Popovzen to attempt the test again but this time to take the nine heel to toe steps forward, turn around using short choppy steps, and then take nine heel to toe steps back to his starting location that he was initially instructed to take. Mr. Popovzen attempted the test again. Mr. Popovzen started taking his steps as though he was casually walking down the street, without his feet touching heel to toe. Between steps seven and eight he began to raise his arms to help stabilize himself. Mr. Popovzen stopped on his tenth step forward and asked if then asked, "Good?" To which he was instructed to return to his starting point. Mr. Popovzen spun around and began to walk back, with his arms still extended as if he was an airplane. Mr. Popovzen took nine steps back and spun around.

The one leg stand:

The second test was the one leg stand. At the beginning of the test, Mr. Popovzen was instructed to stand with his hands and arms at his side with his feet together. Mr. Popovzen placed his arms at his sides but failed to place his feet together. As I was demonstrating how to perform this test, Mr. Popovzen began the test. Mr. Popovzen was instructed to wait until I told him he could begin the test. Mr. Popovzen went back to the starting position, but again failed to place his feet together. As I attempted to demonstrate how to conduct the test, Mr. Popovzen began to perform the test again. Mr. Popovzen was directed to go back to the starting position. On the forth attempt to demonstrate the test with Mr. Popovzen starting the test, I continued with the instructions. As I was concluding the demonstration and Mr. Popovzen was performing the test during my demonstration, he stumbled. Mr. Popovzen almost fell, losing his shoe and Sergeant Grochowski and I attempted to catch Mr. Popovzen to keep him from falling to the ground. Once Mr. Popovzen regained his shoe, he was asked if he understood the which he stated he was ready. I instructed Mr. Popovzen to begin. Mr. Popovzen began the test by raising his arms then his foot approximately an inch off the ground. Mr. Popovzen promptly lowered his foot to the ground. Mr. Popovzen raised his foot and lowered it again. Sergeant Grochowski demonstrated the one leg stand as Mr. Popovzen was attempting the test again. Mr. Popovzen stumbled multiple times.

Due to Mr. Popovzen's instability and almost falling, testing was terminated. Mr. Popovzen was arrested. Mr. Popovzen was handcuffed to the rear, searched with negative results, and placed in the rear of marked patrol car 312. Sergeant Grochowski remained with Mr. Popovzen's vehicle until Carlsons came to take the vehicle to be held under John's Law.

3. Enroute to the station.

During the transport to the police station, Mr. Popovzen remained quiet in the back seat. Upon arrival to the police station, I noticed an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the rear of the vehicle as Mr. Popovzen was removed (which had not been there prior to Mr. Popovzen's presence). Mr. Popovzen was searched again with negative results.

4. At the station

Mr. Popovzen was read the implied consent as it pertains to the Alco-test instrument by Officer Riso #275. When asked to submit a breath sample for the test, Mr. Popovzen stated yes. Upon expiration of the twenty minute observation period conducted by Officer Riso and myself, Officer Riso performed the Alco-test. Taking a sample of Mr. Popovzen's breath, which the sample came back with a reading of .21 BAC%. For further information, refer to Officer Riso's supplemental report. Upon completion of the test, Mr. Popovzen was processed then placed into cell #2. Mr. Popovzen was released to Kseniya Bykov per John's Law. No further actions.

I then observed as we were traveling on the bend of the roadway near Dunhill Road, the vehicle fail to maintain their lane of travel by traveling in the on coming lane of travel. I thought the vehicle was going to miss judge this bend and travel off the roadway.

I proceeded to close the distance between our vehicles to conduct the motor vehicle stop. I continued to activate my emergency overheads. It took sometime for the driver to acknowledge my presence. Eventually he engaged his right blink and the motor vehicle stop was conducted on E. Veterans Highway near South Wind Circle.

On the Stop:

I approached the vehicle and immediately was able to recognize the driver, later identified as William Simmons, was displaying the common signs and symptoms of being under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. There was a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his facial area as he spoke. His words were hard to understand due to his slow and slurred speech. Simmons concentration and responses were slow and delayed. I had to repeat my questions several times and when he did decided to answer he would pause, lick his lips and then answer. Simmons also had a blank stare and seemed confused about the motor vehicle stop. I later learned that Simmons coordination was very poor by him displaying a distinct sway while standing. He also staggered and dragged his feet while walking. He needed to use his vehicle to maintain his balance.

I continued to ask Simmons for his drivers license, proof of registration and proof of insurance. Simmons had a hard time searching for his drivers license in his wallet. Simmons pulled out his credit card and drivers license. I noticed that he began to speak to himself by repeating drivers license, drivers license and removing and placing back his credit card. Simmons was also able to produce proof of registration and insurance.

I then heard via radio that PO J. DeLatorre was enroute to my location.

Based on my observation I decided that I would have Simmons exit the vehicle for further testing. I had him stand in a safe location at the rear of his vehicle.

I advised Simmons about by observations and that I would be conducting the standardized field sobriety tests which he replied "ok."

The first test I conducted was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) test. I instructed Simmons to stand with his feet together, hands at his side and to remain motionless throughout this test. I then instructed Simmons to follow a stimulus with his eyes only. I proceeded to place this stimulus approximately 12 to 15 inches away from his nose and slightly above eye level.

I first checked for equal pupil size and equal traction which was present for both. I then began the test.

Simmons displayed lack of smooth pursuit, maximum deviation which was sustained and distinct and onset prior to 45 degrees. Vertical nystagmus was not present.

The next test I conducted was the walk and turn test. Simmons was instructed to stand with his right foot in front of his left, on the white painted fog lane, with his arm at his side and not begin the test until I instructed him to do so. Simmons was instructed to take nine (9) heel to toe steps forward on the line, while looking at his feet, keeping his arms at his side and count each step out loud. Once he reached his ninth step, on the lead foot, to turn with a series of steps and proceed to walk another nine heel to toe steps on the white line, keeping his arms to his side, looking at his feet and count each step out loud. I also told him to not to stop during the test until it is complete. I then demonstrated an example of the test which Simmons acknowledge he understood how to perform the test properly. I then had him began the test.

When performing the test Simmons missed heel to toe on three (3) times. Simmons raised his arms on all steps to maintain his balance. The turn was done improper by him stopping and then turning. On the returning steps Simmons missed heel to toe four (4) times and again raised his arms to maintain his balance on all steps.

The last test as the one leg stand. Simmons was instructed to stand with his feet together and his arms at his side for the instructions. I noticed immediately that Simmons was displaying a distinct circular sway. I then asked Simmons if he had any injuries that would prevent him from lifting his leg. Simmons replied "no". I then instructed Simmons while keeping his arms at his side to lift any leg of his choice approximately six (6) inches off the ground with his toe parallel to the ground (pointing out). Simmons was instructed to look at his foot and count out loud one thousand one, one thousand two, one thousand three and so on until I instruct him to stop. I then demonstrated an explain of the test which Simmons acknowledge he understood how to perform the test properly. I then instructed him to begin.

When performing the test Simmons was unable to maintain his balance by displaying a distinct circular sway. There was one point when I had to reach out and catch him to prevent him from falling. Due to Simmons level of impairment I terminated the test for his safety.

Based on my observations and the way Simmons performed on the sobriety it was determined that he was unable to operate a motor vehicle safely. I then placed him under arrest for driving while intoxicated.

Simmons was handcuffed, searched and secured in the rear of marked patrol vehicle 307

As per John's law Carlson Auto Body impounded the vehicle with a twelve (12) hours hold.

As search of the vehicle was negative for any evidence.

At headquarters:

Simmons was searched, photographed and secured on the rear bench in the processing area.

I conducted the twenty (20) minute face to face observation to ensure Simmons does not place anything in his mouth, burp or regurgitate. I also checked her mouth for any foreign substances which was clear.

I read to Simmons the standardized statement which he agreed to provided breath samples.

I then verbally advised Simmons of his miranda rights which he knowingly and voluntarily waived agreeing to answer my questions. Simmons said he is a musician and had a gig today at the Maggie's bar in Lakewood. Simmons said he began drinking alcohol beverages, specifically beer, while performing. He left Maggie's bar around 2330 hours and drove to a friends house. He continued to drink beers at his friends house and left to drive home around 0430 hours. Simmons did say that he should not had been driving and should have found a ride home.

Then prior to Simmons providing the breath samples I removed all electronic devices from the cell block area.

When conducting the test, I replaced the mouth piece prior to each sample. At the conclusion of the breath samples Simmons had a BAC of .21

I neared the intersection of Jackson Mills Road and N. County Line and was advised by Police Dispatch that the vehicle was stopped at a red light on N. County Line preparing to turn left. After reaching the intersection I conducted a U-turn and was able to get in a line of vehicles behind the White Mazda and maintained a visual on it. Once the light turned green I then proceeded to make the left turn as well and get behind the vehicle along with P.O. T. Conti. While behind the vehicle it was observed to be traveling very slowly at approximately 25 mph after completing the turn. The vehicle then merged onto E. Commodore Blvd and I then activated my emergency lights to conduct a motor vehicle stop. After turning into the Jackson Veterans Memorial Parking lot the vehicle would not come to a complete stop. I then had to activate my emergency siren to alert the driver to stop the vehicle. The vehicle began to stop but then began to drive again. I then exited my vehicle and had to shout at the driver to stop the car which they finally did. Officer's then approached the vehicle occupied by one (1) adult male.

I announced myself to the driver and requested his driver's license, vehicle registration and proof of insurance. The driver appeared to be very confused and flustered. While trying to look for his documents he began fumbling around documents in his glove box unable to identify his paper work. His hand movements were very slow and sluggish, as if his hands moved in slow motion. The driver continuously mumbled incoherently to this officer with very slow and slurred speech. After finally obtaining the driver's documents he was then identified as Jerome Benedetti of Jackson. Due to the reports and officer observations of Mr. Benedetti driving behavior and his current signs of impairment he was then asked to step out of the vehicle where he was brought in front of this officer's patrol car to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Test. After exiting the vehicle, I could now detect the odor of alcoholic beverage emanating off Mr. Benedetti's person as well as his breath while he spoke. He notified officers immediately that he was disabled and suffers from spinal stenosis and sciatica.

The first test conducted was the Horizontal Gauze Nystagmus Test (HGN) by P.O. T. Conti. (See P.O. T. Conti's report for details. During this test, this officer observed Mr. Benedetti standing hunched over and swaying from side to side.

The second test conducted was the Walk and Turn test. This officer demonstrated and explained to Mr. Benedetti to place his right foot in front of his left foot heel to toe with his hands at his side. He was then told to take nine heel to toe steps forward, turn around, resume the heel to toe stance with his right foot in front of his left and walk another nine steps heel to toe. After explaining and demonstrating the test to Mr. Benedetti he acknowledged and stated that he understood the instructions. He was then instructed to begin. While performing the test, Mr. Benedetti could not maintain his balance with his feet in heel to toe fashion and walked nine steps casually with his feet spread apart turned as if he was walking normally. He turned around and proceeded to do the same. This concluded the Walk and Turn Test.

The second test I demonstrated and explained was the One-Leg-Stand. Mr. Benedetti was instructed to raise one leg of his choice approximately six inches off the ground with his hands at his side and toes pointed forward. He was told look at his foot while counting aloud "One-Mississippi, Two-Mississippi etc.." until instructed to stop. Mr. Benedetti again acknowledged and understood the test however expressed his medical issues with his back would make the test more difficult. His injuries were taken into consideration during the tests and he was instructed to start. While performing the test, Mr. Benedetti was unable to raise his leg six inches off the ground and attempted to count at a quick pace. He dropped his leg numerous times and stopped the test on his own. This concluded the one leg stand.

As a result of the field sobriety tests and Mr. Benedetti's driving behavior it was determined by officers that he was unable to operate a motor vehicle in a safe manor. He was then placed under arrest for driving under the influence. Mr. Benedetti was placed in the back of my patrol vehicle and transported to Jackson Police Department without incident. Once in the rear of my patrol vehicle the odor of alcoholic beverage was now emanating from where Mr. Benedetti was seated which was not present prior to his custody. P.O. T. Conti remained on scene and awaited Jerry's Towing and Recovery to impound the vehicle as per Johns Law.

At Police Headquarters, Mr. Benedetti was processed and placed under 20 minute observation by this officer. He then was placed under the supervision of Sgt. M. Kelly #243 where he consented to providing samples of his breath for testing (See Sgt. M. Kelly report for details.). After providing breath samples Mr. Benedetti's blood alcohol content (BAC) yielded .02 %. Due to his level of impairment Sgt. M. Kelly being a certified Drug Recognition Expert then conducted a D.R.E evaluation of Mr. Benedetti and a voluntary sample of urine was provided to be sent to the lab for testing (See Sgt. 2. Arrival at the scene

Upon arrival at the scene this officer was flagged down by an older white male. He advised the truck later identified to bear Pennsylvania registration [REDACTED] had crashed into various fixed objects on the right side of the roadway before veering off out of control to the left side of the roadway. After going off the left side of the roadway the vehicle traveled uncontrolled approximately thirty to forty feet into a dense area of woods, with swamp like conditions.

This officer observed the roadway in this area to be covered by various grass, dirt and other earth matter that was thrown onto the road from the motor vehicle crash. From this officer's training and experience in dealing with multiple crashes it was evident that the vehicle identified above had traveled at an excessive rate of speed to cause the damage he did to the wood line as well as uproot so much earth matter. Officer Greenberger #228 arrived at this time to assist and handled the motor vehicle crash investigation.

This officer then exited my patrol vehicle and began to walk into the woods toward the crashed yellow Ford Excursion bearing Pennsylvania registration [REDACTED]. While navigating through this muddy area the driver later identified to be Jose Estrada emerged from the rear passenger window. As he crawled out of the severely damaged vehicle he was hysterically crying. This officer asked if he was injured as he was viewed to be bleeding from both arms at this time. Mr. Estrada advised that he was "OK" however he continued to act hysterical. He was then asked if anyone else was in the vehicle to which he advised he was the sole occupant.

This officer then assisted Mr. Estrada in walking back out to the roadway as he was unsteady on his feet. After making it back to stable ground this officer had Mr. Estrada rest against the push bumper on my marked patrol vehicle #174. At this time a Jackson First Aid ambulance was passing and was flagged down to assist.

During my initial observation of Mr. Estrada he was viewed to have bloodshot and watery eyes with droopy eye lids. He had a strong odor of consumed alcoholic beverage emanating from his person and breath as he cried and as he spoke. He again was unsteady on his feet and swayed as we spoke. At this time his clothing was dirty from the mud and blood from the motor vehicle crash.

Mr. Estrada was escorted to the ambulance to be treated for his injuries. As he was treated in the ambulance he continued to act hysterically and cried as he called multiple family members. Again this officer detected a strong odor of consumed alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath and person. While in the ambulance this officer asked Mr. Estrada if he had consumed any alcohol to which he replied he had consumed two Heineken beers.

Prior to conducting SFST with Mr. Estrada this officer cleared the area of the large size debris. In addition this officer deactivated my front facing emergency lights and positioned my spot light and camera to help illuminate the area as well as capture the following events.

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus Test (HGN):

Mr. Estrada was advised to stand with his feet together and his hands at his side. This officer then demonstrated this position to him ensuring he understood before I continued with further instructions. Mr. Estrada was able to get into the required starting positions however he immediately began to sway in a circular manner while we continued to speak.

Mr. Estrada was further instructed to follow a stimulus specifically the tip of my pen with his eyes only and further reminded not to move his head. Again he was asked if he understood to which he replied that he did. This officer then conducted the HGN test with the following results: lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, distinct and sustained nystagmus in both eyes and onset of nystagmus prior to 45°, no sign of vertical gaze nystagmus. Mr. Estrada exhibited 6/6 hits on the HGN test. During the duration of the test Mr. Estrada continued to sway in a circular manner and this officer again viewed his bloodshot and watery eyes. The odor of consumed alcoholic beverage continued to emanate from his person.

Walk and Turn Test (WAT):

This officer then instructed Mr. Estrada to place his left foot down and his right foot directly in front heel to toe with his hands at his side. As I explained this to Mr. Estrada I also demonstrated it to him ensuring he understood both visually and verbally. Mr Estrada was able to get into the starting position, I then told him not to begin until being instructed to do so which he replied he understood.

This officer then began to explain and demonstrate the test to Mr. Estrada, during this time he stepped out of the starting position more than three times being reminded each time to get back into the required starting position. He was instructed to take nine heel to toe steps down an imaginary line maintaining heel to toe contact on each step. He was then told on his last step to leave his front foot planted and take a series of short steps to turn around, he then was to complete nine additional heel to toe steps in the same manner. I further advised him once he began to not stop walking, maintain his hands at his side and to count each step aloud as he walked.

I instructed him again not to begin until being instructed to. This officer then asked Mr. Estrada if he understood and if he had any questions. He advised he understood and had no questions. Mr. Estrada during his first set of nine steps was unable to maintain heel to toe contact on multiple steps. He staggered and stepped off the line multiple times and stopped while walking to balance himself multiple times. He took an improper amount of steps causing him to turn in the wrong direction (right) before continuing in the same manner as described above for his next nine heel to toe steps. He did complete the proper amount of steps on the second set of nine steps.

One Leg Stand Test (OLS):

This officer then advised Mr. Estrada to stand with both feet together and his hands at his side. I then instructed him not to begin until being told to do so. After getting into the required starting position he began to sway in a circular manner.

This officer instructed and demonstrated to Mr. Estrada that when he was told to begin he would raise the leg of his choosing approximately six inches from the ground with his foot parallel to the ground. He was to maintain his hands at his side and stare at his raised toe. He was then to count aloud one-one thousand, two-one thousand and so on until being instructed to stop. This officer then asked if he understood to which he replied that he did.

Mr. Estrada attempted to lift his foot but immediately had to put it back to the ground as he swayed side to side. He attempted two more times with the same result before refusing to continue. He stated "I can't do it" I then asked if he did not wish to continue or if he physically was unable. He continued to respond that he couldn't do it.

At that time Mr. Estrada was placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated 39: 4-50. He was handcuffed (double locked) and searched with negative results. This officer then read to Mr. Estrada his Miranda warning and waiver verbally to which he replied that he understood. I then asked how many beers he had consumed to which he replied three (3) Heinekens and that there were more inside of his crashed vehicle. Officer Greenberger later relayed that there were multiple beers thrown throughout the vehicle and appeared as if Mr. Estrada had been consuming one as he was driving. Due to the damage of the vehicle we were unable to determine this detail.

He was then secured in the rear of my patrol vehicle #174 to be transported back to Jackson Police Headquarters. The on-duty tow company, Jerry's Towing and Recovery later arrived to remove his vehicle from the woods and a mandatory twelve hour hold was placed on the vehicle.

3. Enroute to the station

Mr. Estrada was calm and polite while enroute to the station. This officer detected a strong odor of consumed alcoholic beverage emanating from the rear cabin of my vehicle which was not there prior to Mr. Estrada.

4. At the station

After arriving at the station this officer brought Mr. Estrada in through the sally port to the cell block area. After being searched again per policy and procedure he was permitted to use the bathroom before being secured for a mandatory twenty minute observation period. Prior to the observation period this officer checked his mouth cavity to ensure it was clear of any obstructions. This officer then read verbatim the N.J. Attorney General's Standard Statement for Motor Vehicle Operators (N.J.S.A. 39: 4-50.2(e))(revised and effective July 1, 2012). Mr. Estrada replied "yes" to providing breath samples and then further stated "but I will probably fail."

This officer then conducted a twenty minute face to face observation with Mr. Estrada. During this time he did not place anything in his mouth and he did not vomit, burp or have any fluids leave his mouth. During the observation period this officer continued to detect a strong odor of consumed alcoholic beverage from Mr. Estrada's person.

Once the observation period was completed this officer removed all electronic devices from the area of the Alcotest machine placing them in an adjacent room blocked by a cinder block wall, Mr. Estrada was escorted with this officer to maintain visual contact as this process was completed. The items removed included the arrestee's cell phone, this officer's cell phone and smart watch as well as police radio.

After all electronics were removed from the area this officer administered breath testing with Mr. Estrada. Prior to Mr. Estrada providing breath samples I read to him verbatim the posted instructions on the wall on how to properly provide breath samples. Each time he acknowledged that he understood. A new mouthpiece was used for each sample with the old one being discarded after use.

Mr. Estrada provided two successful/acceptable breath samples out of the three tests given. His blood alcohol content reading was 0.16% (Alcohol Influence Report Sequential File #: 01444). A State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator was completed and advised the readings were within acceptable tolerance limits.

Mr. Estrada's father later arrived and signed the potential liability form and custody was transferred to him. He was provided a copy of the potential liability form before leaving.

I closed the gap on the vehicle and identified it a a Silver BMW bearing New Jersey Registration:

██████████ I then observed the vehicle make a left hand turn onto Pointe circle. The vehicle then made a second left hand turn, failing to stop and signal at the Stop Sign. I then activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in front of 5 Pointe circle. The vehicle suddenly jerked the wheels towards the curb and almost striking the curb. The vehicle then came to a complete stop. I approached the vehicle on the driver's side and identified myself to the male driver and female passenger. While speaking with the driver I requested his license, vehicle registration and proof of insurance. The driver was sipping a water bottle. He then fumbled through his glove box in an attempt to retrieve his insurance card. The driver identified as Mr. Jahkim Parrish, appeared very confused and flustered. I later identified the front passenger as Stephanie Harmon.

While speaking to Mr. Parrish, I could now detect the odor of alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath as he spoke. He then began to mumble and was incoherent. Mr. Parrish began reaping himself stating he knew why he was pulled over, becuae he said he was coughing on water. It was now clear to this officer that Mr. Parrish was displaying signs of impairment and was possibly under the influence of alcohol. At this Time P.O D. Thomason #297 had arrived as back up. I then returned to my patrol vehicle with his documents. Due to the totality of the circumstances, I returned to him and had him step out of the vehicle and to the front of my patrol vehicle. I previously asked him where he was returning from and he stated he had left his friends house. I then asked him if he had any drinks at his friends house. He stated "no, you can test me". I then explained to him that I was going to conduct some standardized field sobriety tests based on his driving behavior and signs of impairment. Mr. Parrish remained cooperative at the scene.

The first test I conducted with Mr. Parrish was the One-Leg-Stand test. Before I demonstrated the test I asked Mr. Parrish if he had any type of injuries or balance issues that would enable her from conducting any balance tests. He replied "no". I then demonstrated the One-Leg-Stand test to Mr. Parrish instructing him to use his left leg for support. I told him to keep his hands at his side while raising his left left approximately 6 inches up off the ground with his toes pointed forward while looking at them counting aloud "One-thousand-one, one-thousand two... etc" until she was told to stop. I then asked him if he understood the instructions which he stated yes and began. Mr. Parrish was unable to maintain his balance and dropped his leg and stumbled backwards, he attempted a second time and barley lifted his leg. He attempted a third time and again stumbled again. This concluded the One-Leg-Stand test.

The second test was the Walk and Turn test. I explained and demonstrated to Mr. Parrish to place his right foot in front of his left foot heel to toe. He was then instructed to take nine heel to toe steps forward, take short choppy steps to turn around 180 degrees and take another nine steps heel to toe all while keeping his hands at his side. When asked if he understood he stated "yes" and then began the test. Mr. Parrish raised her arms out at his sides to support his balance. Mr. Parrish could not maintain heel to toe steps and crossed his feet multiple times as well as step not stepping heel to toe. He also took an additional steps. I then reminded him to perform the test as instructed. He then turned around and again maintained his arms up in the air to support his balance and failed in maintaining heel to toe steps.

The third and final test I had Mr. Parrish conduct was the Alphabet test. I began by asking him what her highest level of education was. Mr. Parrish began to ramble an elaborate response to this officer while speaking slow and slurred. It was learned that he understood and spoke the English language and used the English alphabet. I then asked him to stand straight up with her hands at her side while saying the letters of the alphabet starting from the letter "A" and ending on the letter "Z" without singing or humming the letters. He stated that he understood the test and proceeded. Mr. Parrish was able to complete this test without struggle. This concluded the field sobriety tests.

Based on my observations of Mr. Parrish driving and the performance of the SFSTs it was determined that he was unable to operate a motor vehicle safely. I then placed Mr. Parrish under arrest and in handcuffs for Driving Under the Influence. He was placed in the back of my patrol vehicle and seat belted in. P.O. D. Thomason and I conducted a intoxicant search of the passenger compartment which yielded negative results. We then retrieved Mr. Parrish's personal property as the vehicle was to be impounded as per Johns Law. He was then transported to Jackson Police Headquarters by this officer without incident. While Mr. Parrish was present in the back of this officer's patrol vehicle, the odor of alcoholic beverage was now emanating from the rear of the vehicle which was not there prior to Mr. Parrish arrest. P.O. D. Thomason remained on scene for the tow company to retrieve the vehicle.

Ms. Harmon was given a ride to her residence by P.O Thompson #301.

At the station this officer placed her under the supervision of Sgt. R. Bosley #221 who is a certified Alcotest operator and began the twenty minute observation period (See Sgt. Bosley's report for details.) After concluding the twenty minute observation period, Mr. Parrish was read the Standardized statement for providing breath samples which he consented to providing samples of her breath. He then provided breath samples which yielded a BAC of .14 % which is over the legal limit.
