Supplemental Narrative 03/20/2019 03:10:33 Stratton, Garrett

On the above date and time I, Ptl. Stratton, was on uniformed patrol in marked unit #2903. I was traveling North bound on Route 9 behind a black Mini Cooper bearing NJ registration L68LBC. While traveling behind the vehicle, it utilized it's left blinker to go into the turning lane of Route 9 to make a left turn onto Dover Road, but then turned it's blinker off. The vehicle approached the intersection and made a left turn onto Dover Road without utilizing it's left blinker. I also noticed that the vehicle had a bracket around the rear license plate that was blocking the words "Garden State" thus not being able to distinguish if it was a New Jersey license plate.

The vehicle pulled into the driveway of Wawa and at this time I activated my overhead emergency lights to initiate a motor vehicle stop. The vehicle pulled over onto the side of the driveway that leads to the Wawa parking lot. I advised Ocean County Radio Room (OCRR) that I was on a motor vehicle stop and advised them of my location. I approached the driver's side of the vehicle, identified myself as a police officer for the borough of South Toms River, and advised the driver, later identified as Queionta Ridley [REDACTED] of the reason for the stop. Before I could ask for the driver's credentials, both the driver and front seat passenger, later identified as Marques Alexander [REDACTED], became very argumentative over the reason for being stopped. As I attempted to defuse the situation, Ptl. Carver #298 arrived at my location and approached the passenger side. Myself and Ptl. Carver defused the situation and were able to get the driver to retrieve his license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance.

While speaking with the driver and passenger I detected the odor of both burnt and raw marijuana. After the driver retrieved his documents, Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. #295 arrived at my location. I advised Ptl. Carver and Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. of the odor of marijuana. Ptl. Carver indicated that he also detected the odor of marijuana. I returned to my patrol vehicle to utilize my MDT to input the occupants' information while Ptl. Carver and Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. returned to the vehicle to continue to speak with the occupants. During this time, Spillman was down so I hand wrote the information on my note pad, then returned to the vehicle.

Upon returning to the vehicle, Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. also indicated that he detected the odor of marijuana. Ptl. W. Kosh

Jr. and Ptl. Carver had both occupants step out of the vehicle and walked them to the rear of the vehicle. While standing behind the vehicle, Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander continued to protest the reason for being stopped. All officers explained the violations to them multiple times. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. read both Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander their Miranda Rights which they both verbally indicated they understood.

Ptl. Kosh Jr. advised both Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander that there is an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle and that officers have probable cause to believe that there are illegal items in the vehicle and officers will be searching the vehicle. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. asked Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander if there is marijuana or anything else illegal in the vehicle which they both indicated there is not. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. did a pat down search on Mr. Ridley which yielded \$44.00 United States currency and one pocket knife that Mr. Ridley indicated "is used for fishing." Ptl. Carver did a pat down search of Mr. Alexander which yielded \$576.00 in United States currency and a pink lighter. I stayed behind the vehicle with both Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander while Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. began to search the driver side of the vehicle, and Ptl. Carver began to search the passenger side. Right as the search of the vehicle began, Mr. Ridley advised officers that this was not his vehicle and he does not consent to the vehicle being searched. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. advised Mr. Ridley due to exigent circumstances being the odor of raw marijuana, consent is not needed for officers to search the vehicle. Search of the vehicle yielded positive results for illegal items. Ptl. Carver located \$400.00 United States currency in the glove box. Ptl. Carver located a small scale suspected to be used to weigh narcotics under the front passenger seat. Ptl. Carver located raw marijuana in a gray Europort backpack on the rear passenger side seat. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. located a blue marijuana grinder in a black purse on the rear driver's side seat.

Upon locating these items, at 18:55 Hours, both Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander were placed under arrest. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. placed Mr. Ridley in handcuffs while Ptl. Carver placed Mr. Alexander in handcuffs, both double locked for safety. Officers advised Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander of the findings, and advised them they would both be charged with the offenses unless one of them decides to admit ownership of the illegal property. After a brief moment with neither Mr. Ridley or Mr. Alexander admitting ownership of the illegal property, they were advised they would both be charged. Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. lead Mr. Ridley to the rear of marked unit 2906 and Ptl. Carver lead Mr. Alexander to the rear of marked unit 2903. Due to the belief that the vehicle was used in commission to commit a crime, Priced Rite was notified to come to our location to impound the vehicle for possible asset forfeiture. A search of the vehicle continued which yielded no more contraband.

Ptl. W. Kosh Jr. stayed on scene to await the tow while myself and Ptl. Carver transported the prisoners to our police headquarters. I advised OCRR of my starting and ending mileage. It was also noted that the rear of my patrol vehicle was checked and was cleared before my shift and after transport. Mr. Ridley and Mr. Alexander were booked and processed without incident.

After processing, Mr. Alexander was released pending an Ocean County Superior Court date and I gave him an escort to the intersection of 1st Street and 1st Avenue. I advised OCRR of my starting and ending mileage. It was also noted that my rear seats were checked before and after transport. Mr. Ridley was released shortly afterwards pending an Ocean County Superior Court date and advised officers he did not want an escort.

While processing the evidence, it was determined that approximately 119 grams of marijuana and \$1,020 in United States currency were seized in the arrest. All evidence was placed in property locker #3.

On the above date and time this writer was conducting a property check of 1 Drake Lane located in the Borough of South Toms River. This writer was conducting a building check and as this writer got the rear of the building this writer observed a Blue Ford Focus bearing NJ registration B71FBJ parked in the corner of the building blocking a garage door. Upon initial observations this writer observed all of the windows to be fogged. This writer then activated the scene lighting on marked patrol unit 2906 and approached the driver side of the vehicle. As this writer approached the vehicle this writer observed four (4) occupants inside. This writer knocked on the driver's window so the driver, later identified as Charlotte Brennan would roll down the window. As C. Brennan rolled down the window this writer observed a dense smoke roll out the window that had an odor of burnt marijuana. This writer identified himself and asked what the occupants were doing and this writer was advised they were waiting for a friend. This writer asked about the burnt marijuana smell and C. Brennan advised this writer that she just received the vehicle from her brother last week, and that is how the vehicle always smells. This writer then gathered the occupants information, went back to marked patrol unit 2906 and had the OCRR (Ocean County Radio Room) check to make sure no one was missing and no one had any warrants. Ptl. Santos #299 of the South Toms River Police Department arrived on scene.

This writer then approached the driver side of the vehicle and had C. Brennan step out of her vehicle and to the rear. This writer asked C. Brennan if there was anything in the vehicle that this writer needed to be aware of including any drugs. C. Brennan advised this writer there was not and that they finished smoking everything. This writer then had the front seat passenger (D. S-G) step out of the vehicle, followed the driver's side rear seat occupant () and then the passenger side rear seat occupant (). As the parties were removed from the vehicle, all parties advised this writer that nothing illegal was in the vehicle. This writer then had all parties stand between marked patrol unit 2903 and 2906 with Ptl. Santos while this writer began to search the above listed vehicle. As each occupant was removed from the vehicle this writer conducted a pat down to make sure there were no weapons or cds on any persons.

This writer began searching the vehicle due to the odor of marijuana emanating throughout the vehicle. This writer located, two plastic bottles with holes and residue inside that is consistent with the use of marijuana typically a water bottle bong located in the center console of the vehicle. A continued search of the vehicle provided this writer with a glass Bong with residue inside that was located under the front passenger seat, accessed from the rear seat. This writer then located a blue colored grinder in a box between both rear seat passengers.

This writer then spoke with Ptl. Santos and advised him of the findings so far. Ptl. Santos placed C. Brennan and the other female into the rear of marked unit 2903. This writer placed both males in the rear of 2906. Ptl. Santos then assisted this writer in searching the rest of the vehicle for additional intoxicants. This writer then packaged up the paraphernalia and secured it in marked patrol unit 2906. The OCRR was advised of four (4) arrests made. This writer made sure both all parties were seat belted in the vehicles. This writer then transported the two males to headquarters without incident. This writer and Ptl. Santos called out the starting and ending mileage for the transport of the two males. *Please note that at the start of the shift this writer performed a rear seat vehicle inspection that was clear, and no one was in the vehicle until the two (2) males. All parties were transported without incident.

Once at headquarters all parties were escorted into the report desk area. Upon checking the driver's driver license this writer discovered C. Brennan was 18 yrs old and not 17yrs old so she was then escorted into the booking room by this writer where she was processed and later released after being issued a complaint summons (S 2019 000024) without incident.

Ptl. Santos notified Dana Gaquer so she could pick up (). Ptl. Santos also contacted Gloryfer Ayala to respond to headquarters to pick up (). Both parents were advised that complaints would be signed and they would receive it in the mail at a later date. All parties were released without incident. This writer secured the evidence in Evidence locker #6 for safekeeping.

Prior to start of shift on 03/24/19 the rear compartment of patrol vehicle 2903 was searched yielding negative contraband.

On the above date and time while this officer was on routine patrol, this officer was doing a property check at 1 Drake Lane. While at Drake lane this officer observed a vehicle bearing registration J23GUC parked along side the community center. While approaching the vehicle this officer observed that there was no one in the vehicle. This officer also detected a odor of burnt marijuana emanating from the interior of the vehicle because the driver side window was open. This officer began to search the immediate area to try and find anyone that could have been operating that motor vehicle. At this time Ptl. Kosh arrived on scene. This officer and Ptl. Kosh searched the area for the operator, but got negative results.

At this time, two males who were later identified as Brandon Terry and Kyle Tisch walked out from the woods behind the baseball fields. This officer and Ptl. Kosh introduced ourselves, and asked what they were doing back in the woods. They stated that they wanted to go see the silos that are back in the woods because they used to go there as children. We asked if either of them were the operator of the vehicle which at that time Brandon stated he was the driver. At this time Ptl. Kosh went to go search the woods for any weapons or contraband. Speaking with both Brandon and Kyle they advised this officer that they were taking pictures with Brandon's iphone. When this officer asked if I could see the pictures Brandon stated that he already deleted them. When Ptl. Kosh came back from the woods this officer advised him that they were just taking pictures, but they were already deleted. At that

moment Brandon stated to Ptl. Kosh that he did not have the pictures because he sent them to a girl that he has been talking to on snap chat. This officer found that a little suspicious because Brandon advised this officer that he deleted the pictures. This officer then identified both Brandon and Kyle through DMV while Ptl. Kosh requested Brandon and Kyle to return to the vehicle.

At this time this officer approached the driver side of the vehicle and asked Brandon to step out of the vehicle. Before speaking with Brandon this officer searched Brandon for any weapons on his person with negative results. Speaking with Brandon this officer asked if there was anything illegal in the car that this officer and Ptl. Kosh needed to know about. Brandon stated that he was going to be honest with me, and that there was a little bit of marijuana in the center console in a White Owl Cigar bag. Ptl. Kosh then asked Brandon for consent to search the vehicle in which Brandon agreed, and signed the consent to search from. This officer then asked Kyle to step out of the vehicle so this officer could begin to search the vehicle. Before searching Kyle this officer asked if Kyle had anything in his pockets. Kyle stated that he had a pocket knife, and this officer requested if he can remove it and put in on the vehicle's trunk. That knife was confiscated by this officer. While searching the vehicle this officer found green and brown vegetation, suspect marijuana in the White Owl bag. Continuing my search of the vehicle this officer found a purple makeup bag that was behind the passenger seat on the floor. In the makeup bag this officer found drug paraphernalia. Brandon stated that it was his ex-girlfriends bag but she never got it out of his vehicle. From this officer's observations it looked to be a mushroom glass pipe with suspected burnt marijuana inside of the bowl. This officer continued to search the vehicle and was met with negative results. This officer and Ptl. Kosh asked who owned the drugs and paraphernalia. Brandon stated that it was all his.

At this time Ptl. Kosh placed Brandon under arrest utilizing the double locking device. Before placing Brandon into my patrol vehicle the back seat was searched for any weapons or contraband with negative results. Brandon was placed into my patrol vehicle with his seatbelt on for his safety. Arriving at police headquarters this officer checked the back seat after removing Brandon from the vehicle for any weapons or contraband. This officer and Ptl. Kosh started to book and process Brandon per departmental policy. Brandon was fingerprinted, and charged. Brandon was charged with possession of Drug Paraphernalia (2c:36-2) , and possession of marijuana under 50 grams (2c:35-10a(4)). Brandon was released pending his court date and with his copy of his summonses. This officer then escorted Brandon back to 1 Drake lane. After dropping Brandon off, this officer again searched the rear seat of my patrol vehicle with negative results.

Body cam was activated.

After confirming the children had been in the accident and were not in need of medical attention, I made my way to the vehicle in the woods (PA KVJ5248). #289 escorted the driver, Maida Wilson, from the vehicle as I attempted to locate the vehicles pedigree documents and the driver's shoes. Upon failure to find documents or the drivers shoes, I returned to the roadway to inform #289 and check on the juveniles who were now split into two groups, 3 seated in the rear of patrol vehicle #2903, and 4 seated in the rear of patrol vehicle #2905.

Upon the arrested of the driver (See supplement #2 for further details), the group of 7 juveniles was transported to transported to South Toms River Police Department to await the arrival of their guardians. 3 of the juveniles were kept in the rear of #2903, and the other 4 moved to the rear of a South Toms River First Aide squad ambulance. Starting and ending mileage were provided to Ocean County Dispatch. The rear compartment of #2903 was searched prior to the start of shift and after transport yielding negative contraband.

Arriving at police headquarters, I gather needed information from the children;

██████████ seated between the middle and right passenger seat

██████████ seated front passenger seat

██████████ seated rear right passenger seat

██████████ seated rear left passenger seat

██████████ seated between the middle and left passenger seat

██████████ seated on the lap of Jahaun Whitley

██████████ seated in the middle rear passenger seat

The children stated with the exception of ██████████ no seat belts were worn prior to the accident.

The driver had originally told officers her name was Jessica Lee. When the children were asked if this information was correct they confirmed it was. When photo of the drivers license provided did not match the Driver, the children were again questioned and affirmed the Driver was Jessica Lee. It was not till the name found on an airline ticket was run through spillman that the true identity of the driver was eventually confirmed.

██████████ explained that the Driver had consumed multiple drinks prior to leaving a Chinese restaurant "...somewhere up north" prior to making their way to south Toms River. He stated he was fearful during the drive as M. Wilson was swerving between lanes and traveling at a high rate of speed. He went on to say that she was using ██████████ cell phone for directions. As she made her way onto Railroad she dropped the phone and while attempting to retrieve it, left the roadway driving directly into the wooded area. He went on to explain after the impact, the Driver attempted to leave the scene but due to the distance it had traveled into the woods she could not move it.

On 04/05/2019 this writer and Ptl. Santos #299 of the South Toms River Police Department responded to a single car motor-vehicle accident in the woods, in the area of Railroad and Elm. St.

Upon arrival this officer observed a large group of kids standing in the roadway and observed a vehicle in the woods off of the roadway. This writer was advised by the children that they were all in the vehicle and that no one was injured. This writer then responded to the crash scene in the woods. *Please note the vehicle was approximately One-hundred and five feet (105') from the roadway into the woods where the final resting position of the vehicle was. The distance was measured utilizing a measuring wheel for motor-vehicle accidents. Once at the vehicle bearing PA registration KJV5248 the Chief of the South Toms River First Aid Squad was with the driver, and advised this writer that she may be impaired. The driver, later identified as Maida Wilson, exited the vehicle and walked to this writer without any shoes, and staggering. Ms. Wilson had an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her persons as well as the odor of burnt marijuana. Once Ms. Wilson began talking, the odor of an alcoholic beverage became more pronounced. She had a slow, slurred speech and her eyes were watery. Ms. Wilson advised this writer that she had shoes in her vehicle. Ptl. Santos attempted to locate shoes in the vehicle but did not recover any. As this writer attempted to help Ms. Wilson out to the roadway, she advised this writer that she was not drinking. This writer inquired if she was under the influence of anything else at which time this writer was advised she was not and she was just tired. Upon escorting Ms. Wilson to check on the children, she advised this writer that her name was Jessica Lee. At this time this writer had all of the children involved get into both marked police vehicles to stay out of the in climate weather. She further advised this writer again that she was just tired and was not drinking.

This writer was advised by Ms. Wilson that she had a tummy tuck and a body lift. This writer confirmed that there was nothing that would impair her balance having those procedures done and she advised this writer that it would not impair her balance. This writer also asked about any medications, at which time Ms. Wilson advised she was on Percocet 5mg and the last time she took them was two (2) days ago. While speaking with Ms. Wilson she was fumbling with money that was in her pockets and dropping money, not realizing. Ms. Wilson advised she speaks English and her highest level of education was high-school. This writer then read Ms. Wilson her Miranda rights. Ms. Wilson began to be difficult and initially would not allow this writer to read her, her Miranda Rights. Ms. Wilson stated she "has not been drinkin and has not been druggin". This writer then read Ms. Wilson her Miranda Rights at which she advised this writer she understood, and she was willing to speak with me.

This writer again confirmed Ms. Wilson had no trouble with her balance. This writer then began explaining the instructions for the One Leg Stand. This writer demonstrated the test as it was being explained. This writer advised to stand with your feet together and your arms down at your sides, not to start the test until I tell you to do so. This writer asked if Ms. Wilson understood and she replied "uh huh". When I tell you to begin, raise one leg (either one) approximately 6" off of the ground with your toe pointed out, keeping both legs straight and your arms at your sides. This writer Demonstrated what was to be done to perform the test properly. Ms. Wilson then spread her legs apart for balance. This writer had her move her feet back together with her arms down at her sides. This writer further explained while holding this position count out loud in the following manner 1001,1002,1003, and so on, until I tell you to stop. Ms. Wilson then started counting "1002.1001, 1000". This writer stopped Ms. Wilson and explained the counting and demonstrated again. Ms. Wilson then advised she understood. Keeping your arms at your sides at all times and watching your raised foot. This writer then advised that if you put your foot down, raise it back up and continue counting where you left off. This writer also demonstrated. Ms. Wilson stated she was not drunk. This writer again confirmed that she understood the test. This writer then advised Ms. Wilson she may begin the test and that it would last approximately 30 seconds. Ms. Wilson began the test leaving both feet on the ground and stating "9000". This writer stopped Ms. Wilson and advised she was going to begin at 1001. This writer then demonstrated the test again to Ms. Wilson. This writer counted from 1001 to 1003 then Ms. Wilson started counting at "1004" still leaving her foot on the ground. Ms. Wilson then tried to pick up her foot and kept taking a step forward toward this writer. This writer advised her she has to stay in one spot. This writer had her back up to

the even surface again and demonstrated how to do the test again. Ms. Wilson attempted to pick her foot up off the ground and started counting putting her hands in her pockets and looking away from her foot. counting 1001,1002. This writer then had her look at her foot as she was counting. Once she began looking at her foot, with her foot off of the ground she began swaying counting 1001,1002,1003,1004,1005,136,137,138,139,1010. during this time Ms. Wilson foot hit the ground several times while counting. This writer then stopped the test to give her an attempt at a different test.

Ms. Wilson was then advised the next test is called the Walk and turn. This writer then started explaining the instructions. This writer advised to put her left foot straight, then take her right foot, putting it ahead of her left foot, then Ms. Wilson interrupted the test instructions stating "just walk toward the cars". This writer then requested Ms. Wilson allows this writer to give the instructions because I want Ms. Wilson to do it the right way. This writer then advised how to start off standing again putting her right foot in front of her left with the heel of your right foot touching the toe of your left foot. This writer demonstrated how to stand properly. Ms. Wilson then attempted to start walking. This writer had to stop her so the instructions could be given. This writer explained that I wanted Ms. Wilson to fully understand the directions before taking the test. She then stated "Do you understand I have children in the car, I wouldn't drive" This writer advised Ms. Wilson that the kids are keeping warm in our vehicles and that they were in good care. This writer then had Ms. Wilson stand with her right foot in front of her left foot heel to toe. This writer then advised her to place her arms at her sides and to not start to walk until I ask you to do so. At this time she raised her hands straight out parallel to the ground. When I ask you to start, take nine heel to toe steps down the line, turn around, and take nine heel to toe steps back. When you turn, keep your left foot in the same spot and turn left by taking a series of small choppy steps with your other foot which was demonstrated by this writer. While you are walking, keep your arms at your sides, watch your feet at all times, and count your steps out loud. Once you start walking, do not stop until you have completed the test. Count the first step from the heel to toe position as one. This writer then asked do you understand, and Ms. Wilson advised she did. This writer then advised she may begin the test. Once the test began, Ms. Wilson had to put her feet to the side to keep her balance multiple times. None of her steps were heel to toe. Ms. Wilson took 15 steps forward until she could not walk any further due to a marked patrol unit being in the way. Ms. Wilson then turned around and walked another 15 steps back which were not heel to toe to the front of the other marked patrol unit where she could not walk any further.

This writer then asked Ms. Wilson if she knows her A,B,C's. and she advised she knew how and she began reciting the alphabet. This writer stopped Ms. Wilson so this writer could explain the instructions. This writer then advised Ms. Wilson how to say the alphabet without singing and demonstrated it. Ms. Wilson inquired as to where her babies were at and this writer advised her they are in our cars keeping dry. Ms. Wilson was advised to start at the letter "A" and end at the letter "Z" without singing. She was advised to begin when she was ready. Ms. Wilson began citing the alphabet slowly up to the letter "G" this writer advised her to go a little bit quicker. At this time she went back to the letter "E" and then stated the rest of the alphabet as follows: E,F,G,H,I,J,H,I,J,K,L,M,N,N,M,O,P,Q,R,S,T,E,V,E,X,Z,X,W. At this time the test was stopped, and this writer had inquired if she had anything to drink tonight, and Ms. Wilson advised she is just tired. This writer then inquired if she smoked anything and Ms. Wilson advised she "smoked a little bit of weed".

This writer then requested a rig for assistance in transporting all of the juveniles to headquarters so they can be safe, until transportation home could be provided. This writer then advised Ms. Wilson she was going to be placed under arrest, at which time she asked why and advised this writer she has her ID and that she has not been drinking. She further asked why, and this writer explained she was going to be placed under arrest for driving under the influence. Ms. Wilson advised this writer she was not under the influence. This writer also advised her that through my training and experience she is believed to be impaired. She further advised that she passed all of this writers tests. This writer advised her that she failed every test that was given. Ms. Wilson advised she was tired and she just got off of a plain from Miami. This writer then explained the process that was going occur from this point. Ms. Wilson advised if this writer gave her one more test that she would pass. This writer also advised that her vehicle was being impounded and subject to John's Law. Ms. Wilson then kept advising this writer that she got breast implants and a tummy tuck and that she does not have the money. This writer then advised Ms. Wilson that she was currently not being placed in hand cuffs at this moment due to her kids being able to see. This writer inquired as to where she was going and Ms. Wilson advised she was going to I Play America and that she got lost in Brick Town. This writer advised her she is about forty five minutes from IPlay America and that she was not in Brick Twp. Ms. Wilson further advised she "has not popped any Percocet" and that she "only took Tylenol" and that's it. This writer was advised that she was not intoxicated.

At this time this writer escorted Ms. Wilson to the rear of marked unit 2906. This writer then attempted to check Ms. Wilson's pockets in her jacket and Ms. Wilson advised this writer she did not have anything in her pockets. This writer recovered, a mobile phone, money and several other items. This writer secured everything from her pockets and placed them into an evidence bag to keep her property together. Upon arrival of the South Toms River Ambulance this writer requested an EMT from the first Aid Squad to check Ms. Wilson waist band for any weapons for this writer due to no female police Officers being on in the immediate area. Ms. Wilson waist band yielded negative results. At this time this writer, placed Ms. Wilson under arrest utilizing the double locking method for her safety. This writer had closed the handcuffs as much as possible before double locking them. At the start of the shift the rear seat of marked patrol unit 2906 was checked for weapons and contraband which yielded negative results. The rear seat was checked for weapons and contraband before placing her in the rear passenger seat of

marked unit 2906. She was placed in the rear passenger seat and seat belted. This writer then shut the door and walked away. A few minutes later this writer checked the rear seat and observed, Ms. Wilson on the phone and out of handcuffs. This writer went to the passenger side of the vehicle opened the door, observing Ms Wilson was trying to call a "Jess" at this time. This writer took Ms. Wilson phone from her, retrieved this writers handcuffs that were still double locked, and placed Ms. Wilson under arrest with a smaller pair of handcuffs and double locked them for her safety. This writer then re seat belted Ms. Wilson at this time. Ptl. Allen from the Beachwood Police Department arrived on scene to stand by for the tow truck for the off road recovery. This writer, then transported Ms. Wilson to headquarters via marked patrol unit 2906. This writer called out the starting and ending mileage for the transport to headquarters.

Once at headquarters this writer opened up the rear passenger door and observed Ms. Wilson trying to get out of the handcuffs again. This writer asked her to stop and then escorted her from the rear of marked unit 2906 into the booking room at headquarters. Once inside headquarters, Ms. Wilson jacket was removed, and this writer searched her again utilizing, a hand-held metal detector and removed more money from her pockets. As this officer was checking Ms. Wilson this writer asked if she had anything else on her and she said no then started to lift up her shirt, and this writer advised her to keep her clothes on. She then began to pull the top of her shirt down and this writer again advised her to keep her clothes on. This writer then started to escort her into Cell 1 at which time she put her arms out to her sides to keep her balance. Once in the cell this writer had her sit down and remove her jewelry which was placed in an evidence bag with her other property. While removing her anklet, she ripped it off causing it to break. This Officer then filled out an Detainee Screening form which Ms. Wilson continued using her alias of Jessica Lee. This writer then acquired how many dependents Ms. Wilson has at which she advised this writer that she has 3 dependents.

This writer then began the twenty minute observation period at approximately 21:30 hrs. This writer went through the standard statement form, the impaired driving questionnaire and last drink location report while conducting the observation. During the time, this writer was looking at Ms. Wilson alias identification (Digital New Jersey Drivers License) and asked what her date of birth was. Ms. Wilson gave this writer two (2) different date of births (4-5-19 / 8-4-84) which both date of births did not match up. This writer continued to speak with Ms. Wilson who ended up advising this writer her real name was Maida Wilson. At this time this writer retrieved her correct information and began to run the Alco test at 22:17. After the test results were printed showing a .17%BAC this writer then checked the results which yielded that the results were not within acceptable tolerance. At this time this writer began a second twenty (20) minute observation which began at approximately 22:49. This writer began the tests at approximately 23:15hrs which yielded a .17%BAC which was in acceptable tolerances. Ms. Wilson was then served 14 Motor-Vehicle summons (see below). Ms. Wilson also had several warrants out for her arrest out of the following jurisdictions; Brick Twp, Neptune, Wall Twp, and Eatontown. Brick twp. provided an ROR for Ms. Wilson. At this time this writer responded out to the sally port and performed a rear seat inspection which yielded negative results. This writer then removed the marked patrol unit from the sally port so Wall Twp. can pull their vehicle into the sally port for a safe transfer of Ms. Wilson. Wall Twp. responded to headquarters to pick up Ms. Wilson on strength of their warrant. Once Wall twp arrived at the department, Ms. Wilson began to get sick and throw up the alcohol she had consumed. Wall twp. then took custody of Ms. Wilson without incident.

On 04/05/19 at 2029, PTL. Giacinti #289 and I, PTL Santos #299, responded to Railroad Ave and Elm St for a report of a motor vehicle accident. We arrived on scene , observing a large group of children standing on the shoulder of the roadway and a vehicle approximately 100ft off the road in the woods.
