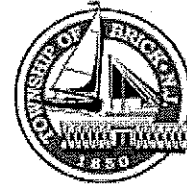

On 12/27/18 at approximately 1232 hours, Sgt. Pacitti #238, Ptl. Rotondo #252, Ptl. Giambona #290, and I were dispatched to the Home Depot at 1722 Rt 88 in reference to an accident.

Upon our arrival I spoke to the caller [redacted] informed me that the driver of the other vehicle (later identified as Merrill Last), hit her vehicle at the light at Rt 70 and Rt 88. [redacted] stated that she tried to get the vehicle to stop but the driver kept going. Finally she got the driver to pull into the Home Depot. When [redacted] approached the driver of the vehicle she stated the driver was slurring her words which caused [redacted] believe that she was under the influence of something.

Ptl. Rotondo was talking with Last about the accident and had asked to see her license, registration and insurance card. Last was traveling with [redacted] as the passenger in her vehicle. Ptl. Rotondo asked Last if she had anything to drink. Last stated that she had not been drinking. Last was asked to step out of the vehicle at which point she was asked if she was on any medication. Last stated that she had taken prescribed Xanax in the morning but did not give a time at which she took the medication. As Last walked to the back of the vehicle she was moving slowly and was slow in her response any questions that were asked.

Upon exiting the vehicle Last was asked to keep her hands out of her pockets. Ptl. Rotondo# 252 conducted the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test on scene. Last was asked to follow the tip of his pen with her eyes and eyes only. Last made the test difficult as she would move her head and at times would stop staring at the tip of the pen and stare at Ptl. Rotondo's hand. Last was not comprehending the instructions that were given to her even after Ptl. Rotondo #252 explained the directions several times. Ptl. Rotondo completed the test on Last and informed me that she did not pass.

I started to conduct a series field sobriety tests. The first test I demonstrated was the Walk and Turn test on a flat surface with a yellow paved line in the parking lot of the Home Depot. I explained to Last to stand heel to toe on the line and take nine heel to toe steps while counting out loud. I explained to her on the ninth step that she needed to take small steps and turn around and take nine steps back while counting out loud. Last began the test and after the first two steps did not stay heel to toe. I explained to her that they must be heel to toe several times, Last was not listening to the directions and was having a difficult time focusing on the instructions given. Last continued to count and walk without touching heel to toe until she completed the nine steps back.

The second test I demonstrated was One Leg Stand test. I demonstrated to Last to keep her hands at her side and lift one leg six inches off the ground. I demonstrated to her to stare down at the toe and I counted "One one thousand, two one thousand" and so forth. I asked Last to keep her hands at her side and that she could choose any leg that she wanted and can start when she was ready. Last made several attempts to lift her leg but informed me that she would be unable to perform the task because of her sciatic nerve. Last never lifted her leg high enough nor did she ever start counting and eventually stopped trying to lift her leg.

The final test I had Last complete was the alphabet test. I asked Last if she knew the alphabet, to which she stated she did. I asked Last to recite the alphabet starting with the letter D. Last started to recite the alphabet and after the letter R, Last then said the letter X instead of S. Last completed the rest of the alphabet without trouble.

Based on the observation of the poor performance on the field sobriety tests and Last admitting that she had taken Xanax , I placed Last under arrest. Last was placed into the rear of marked unit #08 and transported to Brick Police Headquarters to be processed. Ptl. Rotondo #252 remained on scene for Joe & Sons towing service to impound the vehicle as per John's Law.

Once at police headquarters, I escorted Last to the booking room. Ptl. Caulfield #235 arrived at Brick Police Headquarters as an Alcotest operator to test Last (see Ptl. Caulfield's #235 report). Last's BAC level was 0.00%. Based on her poor performance on the field sobriety test and her admission to taking medication, Ptl. Caulfield a certified D.R.E, conducted additional tests.

Last was processed and released on summons' to the care of [redacted] is per strict liability.

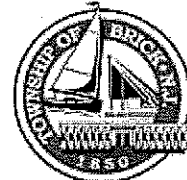

On 12/25/2018 at 0216 hours I (Ptl. Riccio #289) was on patrol in the area of Brick Boulevard and Beaverson Boulevard. During that time I was in the right hand left turn lane on Brick Blvd. stopped at a red light awaiting to enter the ramp connecting to Beaverson Boulevard. A red Hyundai Sonata (N.J. Reg. D48HJS) was stopped at the red light next to me in the left hand turn lane. When the light turned green the Hyundai accelerated, entered my lane of travel, and failed to signal his turn. I followed the vehicle on Beaverson Boulevard heading towards Lions Head Boulevard. I observed the vehicle begin to enter into the left travel lane and then jerk back into to the right travel lane. I observed the vehicle start to enter the shoulder and then jerk back into the right travel lane.

I stopped the vehicle on Beaverson Boulevard near the intersection of Old Toms River Road. As I approached the vehicle I was met by the suspect, Daniel Hernandez-Lopez. I asked Daniel for his credentials (i.e. license, registration, and insurance) and he provided them willingly. While retrieving his documents I observed Daniel's eyes to be watery and bloodshot. Daniel's hand movements were slow, and his speech was slightly slurred. I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the passenger compartment of the vehicle. I asked Daniel if he had anything to drink to which he stated he had two and a half beers. Ptl. Bailey #293 arrived on scene to assist.

I asked Daniel to step out of the vehicle to which he did without incident. I advised Daniel I would like to run him through field sobriety tests to which he agreed to do. While speaking with Daniel I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. When asked if he had any medical conditions which would prohibit and/or affect his ability to the taking of the field sobriety tests, Daniel stated he needs glasses to see. The field sobriety test/examinations were conducted in a well-lit, flat area free from any type of large cracks or debris. I asked Daniel what was his highest level of education. He stated, "High school diploma." I asked Daniel if he was well versed in the English language. He stated, "yes."

The first examination conducted was to recite the alphabet. While explaining, and demonstrating the test I observed Daniel's body slightly swaying in the starting position. Once I fully demonstrated and explained the examination, Daniel had no questions and was instructed to begin. While performing the test Daniel made it to the letter "W" and then said the letters "I", and "N" before ending with "Z".

The second examination conducted was the One-Leg-Stand test. While explaining and demonstrating the test I observed Daniel start the test without being instructed to do so. After I fully demonstrated and explained the examination, Daniel had no questions and was instructed to begin. While performing the test Daniel lifted his left foot approximately (2) inches off of the ground and began to count. Daniel made it to ten one-thousand before dropping his foot. I asked Daniel if he would like to attempt the test again and he stated he would. Daniel lifted his left foot and began. While counting Daniel counted seven one-thousand, eight one-thousand, and then went back to seven one-thousand. When Daniel made it to ten one-thousand the test was terminated.

The final examination conducted was the Walk and Turn. While explaining and demonstrating the test, I observed Daniel's body slightly swaying in the starting position. After I fully demonstrated and explained the examination, Daniel had no questions and was instructed to begin. Daniel completed the first nine steps without incident. When he turned to do the second set of nine steps he nearly lost his balance. When Daniel attempted his last nine steps he failed to do his ninth step but still counted it out loud.

Due to the traffic violations I observed, the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Daniel's breath, and his failure to pass the psychophysical tests I placed him under arrest (Handcuffs double locked). Daniel was transported to H.Q. by me without incident. Ptl. Bailey remained at the scene and awaited Glen's Towing Co. to respond and impound the vehicle under John's Law.

Ptl. Caulfield #235 responded to H.Q., and operated the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C machine (See Ptl. Caulfield's supplemental report for further information). Prior to the Alcotest being administered the room was cleared of any unauthorized electronic devices (i.e., portable radios, cellular phones, etc.). At the conclusion of the Alcotest, Ptl. Caulfield advised me, Daniel provided sufficient breath samples and his BAC was 0.12%.

Daniel was released a short time later to a family member who signed and was given a copy of the strict liability form.

On 12/25/2018 at approximately 0250 hours, I, Ptl. Caulfield #235, responded to police headquarters to assist Ptl. Riccio #289 with a D.U.I. arrest (Suspect/Arrestee: Daniel Hernandez-Lopez) related to a motor vehicle stop on Beaverson Blvd.. More specifically, I was tasked with operating the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C machine.

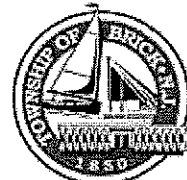
Once at police headquarters, Hernandez-Lopez was read his Miranda Rights and signed off on the waiver portion of the form (Waived his rights). In addition, I also inspected Hernandez-Lopez's oral cavity inside police headquarters which yielded negative results/findings. Sgt. Donnelly #212 also inspected Hernandez's oral cavity inside police headquarters which also yielded negative results/findings. I then read Hernandez-Lopez the NJ D.U.I. Standard Statement form (Implied Consent) in which he agreed to submit samples of his breath. Ptl. Riccio observed Hernandez-Lopez for twenty minutes prior to administering the Alcotest machine. During said observation time, Hernandez-Lopez remained under constant and uninterrupted observation by Ptl. Riccio until the administering of the Alcotest machine.

Just prior to administering the Alcotest machine, Ptl. Riccio and I both deactivated our body-worn cameras and secured them in a separate area. In addition, the Alcotest machine area was free from other type of electronic devices (i.e., portable radios, cellular telephones, etc.). Hernandez-Lopez provided sufficient breath samples and his BAC was 0.12%. I then entered the Alcotest breath sample results into the NJSP Alcotest Calculator in which the breath sample results were within acceptable tolerance. Furthermore, a new mouthpiece was used each time Hernandez-Lopez provided a breath sample into the Alcotest machine. A copy of the Alcohol-Influence Report from the Alcotest machine was left in Hernandez-Lopez's property.

On 12/18/2018 at approximately 0008 hours, Ptl. Borden #274 and I responded to the intersection of Burnt Tavern Road and Van Zile Road in reference to motor vehicle accident involving one vehicle. The caller stated a vehicle crashed into a utility pole on Burnt Tavern Road, directly in front of him and believed the driver was under the influence.

Upon my arrival, Ptl. Borden was already on scene and was speaking with the driver, identified as Rachel Benjamin, who advised that she did not need any medical attention. I observed the vehicle, (NJ registration F41GSN) which had succumbed significant front passenger side damage was facing East on Burnt Tavern Road in the center median, partially in the roadway. I asked Benjamin where she was coming from which she replied, "The Jersey Shore Outlets. I work at Coach." I asked her why she traveling on Van Zile Road coming from the outlets in Neptune Township, and then stuck a traffic light post. Benjamin replied "I don't remember, I'm very tired, and I'm trying to get home." I asked Benjamin where she lived and she stated she lives in Whiting.

Due to airbag deployment, Brick Police EMS #M534 responded and evaluated the driver, which she ultimately refused further medical treatment. See Ptl. Borden's NJ-TR1 crash report for further crash details.

While Benjamin was being evaluated inside the ambulance, EMS personnel advised me that Benjamin had an odor of "E.T.O.H." otherwise known as the chemical compound found in alcoholic beverages. When Benjamin was cleared by EMS, I asked her to step out from the ambulance and speak with me. While she was exiting the ambulance I observed her lose her balance while walking down the stairs and she was also slurring her speech. I escorted Benjamin to a safe location, out of the road way and spoke with her about the crash and where she was coming from.

Benjamin began speaking, and I immediately detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath. I informed her that I could smell alcohol on her breath and she began stating that she had three (3) drinks at the bar before she was driving. Benjamin stated "I had two (2) vodka Red bulls and one (1) Corona. While speaking with Benjamin I observed her slurring her speech, rambling, swaying and her eyes appeared to be watery. Based on my observations, I asked Benjamin to perform field sobriety tests. At this time, I conducted the standardized field sobriety tests with Benjamin in an area which was well lit, level and free from debris.

Test 1. Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus:

I first asked Benjamin if she had any eye defects which required medical attention which she replied "No".

During the test I observed Benjamin display lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes, and onset of nystagmus prior to forty five degrees in both eyes. She did not display any indication of vertical nystagmus. I also observed Benjamin swaying side to side, while I was conducting the test, and I advised her several times to keep her head still.

Test 2: Walk and Turn:

I asked Benjamin if she had any physical defects which would prevent her from walking and balancing to which she stated, "No." I advised Benjamin to remain in the starting position which I explained and demonstrated, and advised her to remain in there until I was finished explaining the instructions. Benjamin stated she understood, but could get set or remain in the starting position specifically by, keeping her feet spread a part, and raising her arms for balance. After I advised Benjamin of the directions, by demonstrating and explaining she stated she understood and I asked her to begin. During the test I observed Benjamin stop walking to steady herself, she did not touch heel-to-toe on every step, she lost balance by stepping out of line, she used her arms for balance, and lost balance while turning around.

Test 3: One Leg Stand

I asked Benjamin if she was uninjured and able to continue the test to which she replied, "Yes."

I then explained and demonstrated the starting position and advised her to remain there while I explained and demonstrated the last test. I observed Benjamin swaying side-to-side and using her arms for balance while in the starting position. After I explained and demonstrated the test, I asked if she understood my instructions which she stated, "Yes." and I asked her to begin.

Benjamin slightly raised her right foot off the ground briefly and put it back down several times throughout the test. She was not counting in the fashion which I advised her to and was unable to balance for more than approximately three seconds. During the test I observed Benjamin continually put her foot down, and used her arms for balance while swaying. I then concluded the test for her safety.

Based on my observations, I placed Benjamin under arrest for driving while intoxicated N.J.S.A. 39:4-50, and placed her in double locking hand cuffs behind her back. Benjamin was searched by Ptl. Borden, placed in the rear of my patrol vehicle and I transported her to Police Headquarters for processing without incident. Sandy's Service Center responded on scene at approximately 0045 hours and impounded the vehicle as per John's Law.

While at Police Headquarters Benjamin was processed in the booking room. I explained and read the Miranda Warning to which Benjamin Waived her right and signed indicating she understood. I also read the NJ Attorney General Standard Statement Form, which Benjamin refused to submit breath samples.

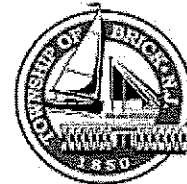
Benjamin was issued the following summonses:

Additionally, Benjamin was released to her friend as advised of the Potential Liability Warning and signed the form indicating his acknowledgement. Benjamin was advised of the vehicle impound release procedure and was released from Police custody without incident.

On 12/16/2018 at 2116hrs I was traveling east on Cedarbridge Ave when I observed a blue colored Jeep Cherokee collide with a telephone pole near the entrance to Quaker Stake and Lube. After colliding with the pole, the vehicle bounced back in to the westbound portion of the roadway. I called out the accident to police dispatch, conducted a U-Turn, and pulled behind the vehicle in the roadway. As I did so, the vehicle began to accelerate slightly as if the driver was attempting to leave. The front tires and suspension of the vehicle, however, were too damaged and would not allow the vehicle to move anywhere. I quickly exited my patrol vehicle and approached the driver door.

Upon opening the door, I instructed the driver (later identified as Tyler Whitesell) to shut the vehicle off. I then asked all occupants of the vehicle if they were okay, and they all stated they were fine. I asked Whitesell what happened. Whitesell looked at me with a blank stare, and stated that his vehicle slid in the roadway. His eyes were watery and bloodshot, and his speech was slightly slurred. I also detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from inside the vehicle. I instructed Whitesell to step out of the vehicle and speak with me.

Once out of the vehicle, I again asked Whitesell what happened. As I did so, a female (later identified as [REDACTED]) pulled up and began yelling at Whitesell that he almost killed her two year old daughter and he needed to go to jail. I instructed [REDACTED] to pull into the parking lot across the street and someone would speak with her shortly. I then instructed all occupants to exit the vehicle and move to the sidewalk so they were in a safe location.

Once on the sidewalk, Ptl. Albanese #257 and Ptl. Person #262 arrived to assist. I instructed Ptl. Albanese to speak with [REDACTED] to get her statement, and had Ptl. Person talk with the two occupants of the vehicle (later identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]). I asked Whitesell if he consumed any alcoholic beverages this evening. Whitesell advised that he drank one beer while at Quaker Stake and Lube. I noticed that he was swaying slightly while he stood on the sidewalk. I informed Whitesell that I was going to conduct a series of tests to make sure he was okay to drive. I then conducted the following Standardized Field Sobriety Tests:

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus

Prior to administering the test, I checked and confirmed that both of Whitesell's pupils were the same size and that there was no resting nystagmus. I asked Whitesell, and he stated that he did not wear glasses or contact lenses. I also asked if he was legally blind in either eye, to which he stated no. I held up my pen and instructed Whitesell to reach out and touch the tip of the pen with his right index finger. Whitesell raised his right hand and touched the middle of the pen. I again instructed him to touch the tip of the pen. He then moved his finger up and touched the tip. I instructed Whitesell to follow the tip of the pen with his eyes and his eyes only without moving his head. I then began the test. I observed a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, and Whitesell also moved his head initially and had to again be advised not to move his head. When I attempted to check for nystagmus at maximum deviation, Whitesell would not follow the pen all the way with his eyes. I advised him several times to keep following the pen but he would not move his eyes to maximum deviation. I attempted several times while repeatedly advising him to keep following the pen but he would only follow it to a certain point and then stop. As result, I terminated the test.

Walk and Turn

Prior to administering the test, I asked if Whitesell had any issues or injuries to his legs that would prevent him from walking or standing. Whitesell stated that he had arthritis in his hip, but advised he had no issues walking. I instructed Whitesell to get into the starting position, standing with his left foot in front of his right foot touching heel to toe with his arms down at his side. Whitesell placed his right foot in front of his left foot. I again instructed him to switch so that his left foot was in front of his right foot, and he then got into the correct position. I advised Whitesell to remain in that position while I demonstrated the test. While the test was being explained and demonstrated, Whitesell fell out of the starting position several times and separated his feet for balance. Each time, he was instructed to get back into position. When I finished demonstrating the test, I asked Whitesell if he understood and he stated that he did. I asked if he had any questions and he stated no. I then instructed him to begin the test. Whitesell immediately raised both arms for balance, and stepped off the line at steps two and six. While attempting step nine, he raised his right leg almost parallel to the ground, lost his balance and stopped the test before turning around and staring at me. I asked if he was finished the test. Whitesell asked if he should continue. I advised him to do whatever he thought he should do. He then turned around facing away from me and took ten heel to toe steps forward. He did not count any of the steps out loud, and again raised his arms for balance. After the tenth step, he turned around incorrectly and began walking forward again without counting. He proceeded to take twenty six steps forward until I finally advised him to stop. During the twenty six steps, none were counted out loud and Whitesell's arms were raised up high for balance. His body also swayed back and forth.

One Legged Stand

Prior to administering the test, I again asked Whitesell if he had any issues with his legs. He again stated that he had arthritis, and now advised that it was in both hips. He also stated that he is a mason and does heavy lifting all day. Whitesell again advised, however,

that he had no issues standing or walking. I instructed him to get into the starting position, standing with he heels and toes together and his arms down at his side. Whitesell remained in the this position during the instruction phase, but I noticed that his body was swaying back and forth slightly. After demonstrating the test, I asked if he understood and he stated yes. I then instructed him to begin the test. Whitesell raised his right foot off of the ground and began counting out loud without looking down at his foot. I instructed him to look down at his foot while he counted. He then looked down as he counted out the number three, and when he did so he raised his right arm high and almost lost his balance. When he reached the number ten, he raised his left arm out high and almost fell over to his right. He also began to hop on his left foot at this time to prevent himself from falling. He counted the number twelve and eighteen twice. When he reached the number twenty three, he began to loose his balance again and started hopping. He then went backwards and counted the number twenty two again before losing his balance and placing his foot down. At this time I terminated the test so Whitesell would not fall and get hurt.

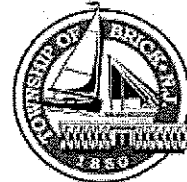
After terminating the One Legged Stand, I placed Whitesell in handcuffs and advised him that he was under arrest for driving while intoxicated. I then escorted him over to my patrol vehicle, searched him incident to arrest, and secured him in the rear passenger compartment. After doing so, I had Ptl. Albanese remain at the patrol vehicle with him while I went to search the vehicle for any evidence of alcohol consumption. In doing so, I located two empty airplane bottles of Fireball Cinnamon Whiskey. One was located on the front passenger floorboard, and the other was located on the floor just behind the center console. No other contraband was located. Brick Performance arrived on scene to tow the vehicle just as I left to transport Whitesell to police headquarters.

Upon arrival at headquarters, Whitesell was escorted inside where he was secured and placed in the DWI processing room. Prior to entering the room, I removed my portable police radio and cell phone and secured them in another location. I then entered the room and visually inspected Whitesell's mouth to ensure there were no foreign objects inside (ie. gum, breath mints, etc.) I then began the twenty minute observation period at 2149hrs. At 2209hrs, I began manually entering Whitesell's information into the Alcotest Unit. After doing so, I successfully obtained two acceptable breath samples from Whitesell. His blood alcohol content was determined to be .20%BAC.

Whitesell was issued and served with the following traffic summonses: T-161241 for 39:4-50(Driving While Intoxicated), T-161242 for 39:4-96(Reckless Driving), T-161243 for 39:4-88b(Failure to Maintain Lane), T-161244 for 39:4-51b(Open or Unsealed Container of Alcohol in MV), and T-161245 for 39:4-85.1(Wrong Way on a One Way Street). The last summons was issued because it was determined that Whitesell exited the plaza at the one way "Entrance Only" portion. Whitesell was later released to his cousin, who arrived at police headquarters and signed the Potential Liability Warning. See Ptl. Albanese's NJTR-1 report for further details and written witness statement.

On 12/16/18 at 0233 hours Ptl. Oliverio #286 and I (Ptl. Mesmer #292) responded to the intersection of Herbertsville Rd and Route 70 for a report of an unconscious female driver inside of a white vehicle stopped in traffic. A passerby had observed the unconscious female in her vehicle and placed a 911 call for emergency services. Ptl. Oliverio arrived on scene first and observed a white four door Nissan Rogue bearing NJ temporary registration R745991 stopped in the middle lane of traffic on Herbertsville Rd northbound at the traffic light to cross over Route 70. At that time he observed that the vehicle was still in drive and the female was unconscious. Ptl. Oliverio then positioned his marked patrol vehicle with its emergency lights activated in front of the vehicle to prevent it from being moved or rolling into the intersection ahead. Brick Police EMS unit #538 also arrived on scene at that time. Ptl. Oliverio then exited his patrol vehicle and attempted to wake up the female driver who was still unconscious, but was breathing, by knocking loudly on the glass window. All of the vehicles doors were locked, windows were up, the vehicle was still in drive, and it was running.

At that time I arrived on scene and observed Ptl. Oliverio and EMS personnel still attempting to wake up the driver. I then exited my patrol vehicle and approached the passenger side of the vehicle and knocked on the window loudly. After doing so, it appeared as if the female driver had opened her eyes but was still not verbal and was in a daze. I attempted to open the passenger side door to place the vehicle in park but it was locked. I then walked around to the driver side of the vehicle and attempted to open that door which was also locked along with all of the other doors. I continued to yell loud verbal commands for the driver to put the vehicle in park but she neglected to do so as she continued to look around and appeared lethargic. After several minutes of disobeying commands, the female finally pushed the passenger side window button and rolled down the window approximately 5 inches. I was then able to reach inside of the vehicle, unlock and open the door, place the vehicle in park, and turn off the ignition to the vehicle. It shall be noted that as the driver lowered the passenger side window and as I opened the door, an overwhelming odor of an alcoholic beverage was emanating from the passenger compartment of the vehicle and the female driver was the sole occupant.

I then walked back around to the driver side of the vehicle and began to converse with the driver. At that time I observed the driver's eyes to be bloodshot and watery, while her face appeared to be flushed. The first question that I asked the driver was if she knew where she was to which she replied "One of those places". I then asked the driver for her drivers license. After asking her for her license, she then began to ramble on words while slurring her speech and not making any sense. I then asked her two more times for her license and she finally produced an expired NJ drivers license from 2017. The driver of the vehicle was identified as Lauren A. Bowen. Bowen was then asked for her registration and her insurance card but once again began to ramble on without producing the documents. Bowen then produced a valid NJ drivers license. As I was conversing with Bowen the odor of an alcoholic beverage was overwhelming coming from her person. I asked Bowen where she was coming from and her answer was unable to be understood as she mumbled. I then asked Bowen if she had consumed any alcohol this evening to which she denied.

At that time I instructed Bowen to step out of her vehicle and explained to her that based on my observations thus far I was going to run her through a series of psychophysical standardized field sobriety tests to which she complied. I then brought Bowen to the rear of her vehicle to explain and conduct the tests. The field sobriety tests were conducted in a well-lit, flat area free from any type of large cracks or debris. I then began to explain the first examination to Bowen.

The first examination I conducted was to recite the alphabet. I first asked Bowen what her highest level of education was, which she attempted to answer but was mumbling, and if she understood the English alphabet to which she stated that she did. I then instructed Bowen to place both of her feet together and place her arms at her side while I explained the test, to which she complied. I instructed Bowen to recite the English alphabet starting with the letter "B" and ending with the letter "O" without singing it. I then asked Bowen if she understood the instructions and she said that she did. I then told Bowen she may begin. Bowen did not start the test when she was instructed to begin. I then told her several more times that she may begin the test and she did not. As she was standing in the starting position she continued to bend her knees and crouch stating "Its cold", rather then begin the test. I then re-explained the instructions to Bowen and asked her if she was going to start the test and she stated "yes". I then instructed Bowen to begin the test once again and she began by saying "Zero...this is just me". During this time period I observed her move her arms from her side several times and also sway from side to side. Bowen did not begin the test after multiple instructions were given to do so and she instead continued to talk and ignore commands. I then advised her that I was going to move on to the second test after she given multiple attempts to begin but neglected to do so.

The second examination I conducted was the Walk and Turn test. I once again instructed Bowen to place her feet together and her arms at her side in the starting position while I explained and demonstrated the examination to her. I instructed Bowen to take nine heel to toe steps as if she were walking on a line and to start by placing her right foot in front of her left. I explained that as she walked I wanted her to count out loud until she reached the number 9. Once she reached the number 9, I explained to her to take several small pivot steps and perform the sequence back. After demonstrating the test, I asked Bowen if she understood the test and she stated "I understand what you said". I then instructed Bowen to begin the test and she did. While performing the test, Bowen neglected to count out loud as instructed. Bowen eventually just turned around without utilizing her pivot steps, paused for several seconds and then began to do the test back. I instructed her once again that she needed to count out loud and she started to. Bowen continued past the 9 number, which is what I instructed her to stop at, and continued to number 13. I then advised her that she could stop the test.

The final examination conducted was the One-Leg-Stand test. I first asked Bowen if she had any medical conditions or problems with either leg to which she replied "Well one leg is longer then the other". I once again instructed Bowen to place her feet together and her arms at her side in the starting position while I explained and demonstrated the examination to her. I explained to Bowen that when I instructed her to do so, to raise whichever foot of her choice approximately 6 inches from the ground and look at her foot while counting out loud. I then demonstrated the test to her asked Bowen if she understood my instructions and she stated that she did. I then told Bowen to begin the test. While performing the test, Bowen raised both of her arms from her side in an attempt to maintain her balance and also put her foot down three times during the test to prevent herself from falling. Bowen also swayed from side to side while conducting the test. I once again asked Bowen if she had anything to drink tonight which she replied "Just a sip". Bowen then began to cry and tell us about a dog that she had several years ago which had passed away.

Due to my observations on scene, our inability to wake up Bowen in her vehicle, the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from Bowen's breath and the passenger compartment of the vehicle, and her failure to pass the psychophysical tests, I placed Bowen under arrest for driving under the influence. I then handcuffed Bowen to the rear utilizing the double locking mechanism. Bowen was then secured in the rear of marked patrol vehicle #29 and transported to Police Headquarters without incident. Ptl. Oliverio remained at the scene and awaited Brick Performance Towing Co. to respond to the scene and impound the vehicle as per John's Law.

Sgt. Turner #178 responded to Police Headquarters, and operated the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C machine (See Sgt. Turner's supplemental report for further information). Prior to the Alcotest being administered the room was cleared of any unauthorized electronic devices (i.e., portable radios, cellular phones, body worn cameras, etc.). At the conclusion of the Alcotest, Sgt. Turner advised me, Bowen provided sufficient breath samples and her BAC was 0.12%.

Bowen was issued the following summonses:

39:4-50 Driving Under the Influence (T- 161344)

39:4-96 Reckless Driving (T- 161345)

39:4-97 Careless Driving (T- 161346)

After processing, Bowen was released to a family member, _____, who signed and was given a copy of the John's Law/potential liability form.

During the course of this incident, my department issued body worn camera (serial # VHC2-015940) was activated through the entirety.

*It shall be noted that Bowen's vehicle at the time of this incident had expired temporary registration tags on it but Bowen was in possession of new license plates and a current registration inside of her vehicle.

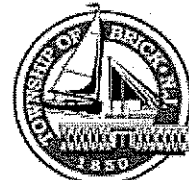
This supplemental report was submitted reference to my assignment as Alcotest operator for the DWI arrest of Lauren Bowen by Ptl. Mesmer #292.

Upon Bowen's arrival at headquarters, the booking process was initiated and Bowen was subsequently escorted into the booking room by Ptl. Mesmer #292 and Ptl. Riccio #289. At 0332 hrs, the required twenty (20) minute observation period was initiated. During the course of the observation period, Bowen requested to use the restroom and the twenty minute observation period was re-started upon her return to the booking room at 0342 hrs. Bowen had been advised of her Miranda Rights by Ptl. Riccio and I administered the reading of the NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement prior to starting breath testing. All portable electronic devices (radios, BWC units, cell phones) were removed from the processing area prior to the start of breath testing as well.

Bowen provided two acceptable breath samples analyzed via the Alcotest 7110-MK III C to reveal a BAC of 0.12%. See Ptl. Mesmer's case report for further information.

On 12/12/18 at approximately 1422 hours Ptl. Rosa #171, Ptl. Kenny #253, and I, Ptl. Carter #280 responded to the Awards of Brick, 799 Brick Blvd for a five vehicle motor accident with injuries. On scene were Officers from various departments that were in route to training who assisted.

Upon arrival I made contact with Ptl. Rosa who advised the driver who caused the accident is suspected to be under the influence of intoxicating substances. The vehicle in question was a 2016 GMC Terrain white in color bearing NJ Reg. WBU 43S. The vehicle was being operated by the registered owner, Donna Gunther. I made contact with Gunther who was standing with officers that were aiding in her balance. I engaged Gunther in small conversation and I could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath as she spoke. Also when I asked Gunther simple questions such as what brought her to Brick Township today. She was unable to remember and her speech was slurred when she spoke. Gunther then lost her balance and stumbled into me, requiring I catch her. I observed Gunther's eyes to be bloodshot and watery. In further questioning Gunther was observed swaying while speaking with her. Gunther continued to reach out to grab onto officers for balance.

I escorted Gunther to a flat area which was clear of debris and advised her I would be conducting some tests to judge her sobriety. Once escorted to this area Gunther continued to move and almost fell into me again. Prior to testing I asked if Gunther had anything wrong with her which would affect her walking and balance to which she stated she did not. Again Gunther fell backward this time requiring Officers to catch her.

The first test administered was the one leg stand which was explained and demonstrated to Gunther. Once explained I asked Gunther to get into the starting position as I had just explained and demonstrated. Gunther was unable to maintain this position and she fell from it multiple times. She was ultimately unable to maintain the starting position and began the test before being instructed to do so. Prior to beginning the test Gunther advised she understood the test. When Gunther began the test she reached out her arm in an effort to grab a nearby Officer for balance. Gunther failed to lift her leg and almost immediately stumbled when she did. Gunther advised this test was very hard even if she hadn't been drinking. I requested she attempt the test by utilizing the other leg. Gunther was unable to hold her leg up for any substantial amount of time. Gunther had failed the test and I declined further attempts for her safety.

The second test administered was the walk and turn test which was explained and demonstrated. Gunther was unable to get into or maintain the starting position despite several attempts. Gunther fell from the starting position. I declined further attempts and ended the test for her safety.

Once Gunther was in custody Ptl. Kenny responded to Gunther's vehicle to obtain her license, registration, and insurance for the vehicle. Located within the vehicle Ptl. Kenny located 2 Black Box Chardonnay wine coolers one of which was opened. These were found on the passenger seat.

Based on Gunther being unable to complete any of the tests and failing the tests she was placed in custody for driving while intoxicated. While placing Gunther into my patrol vehicle she made a statement that she did not want to be alive. Gunther was transported to Brick Police Headquarters for further processing where all needed DWI paperwork was completed. Ptl. Storch #206 responded as well to operate the Alcotest 7110. See his supplemental report for additional details. The Alcotest Calculator was deemed to be within acceptable tolerances and revealed a blood alcohol level of 0.19 Gunther was issued the following summons:

T147732 Driving While Under the Influence (39:4-50)

T147733 Reckless Driving (39:4-96)

T147734 Careless Driving (39:4-97)

T147735 Open/unsealed container of Alcohol in vehicle (39:4-51)

agreed to the Potential Liability Warning that was completed. Gunther's vehicle was towed in accordance to John's Law and logged into AEGIS.

OfficerID: mstorch, Narrative

On 12/12/18 at approximately 1500 hours, I assisted Ptl Carter #280 with a DUI investigation. Ptl, Carter made a DUI arrest and needed a Alcotest Operator to administer the breath tests for his arrestee.

The continuous observation period began in the Brick Township Police Department Booking Room at 1500 hours. Ptl Carter and Ptl. Gordon #297 were in constant observation with Donna Gunther prior to the administration of the breath tests.

At 1521 hours, I read Donna Gunther her Miranda Warning and the Standard Statement Form. Gunther signed off indicating she would voluntarily answer my questions. Gunther also agreed to provide breath samples for chemical testing on the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C.

When asked Gunther stated she did not have dentures. Gunther was not observed belching or vomiting prior to the administering of the breath test. All electronics consisting of body worn cameras, portable radios, cell phones, laptop computers, and the booking camera were removed from the room.

At 1534 hours I initiated the Alcotest. While the machine performed the self test I asked Gunther the questions on the Drinking Driver Questionnaire. While speaking with Gunther I observed her to be highly intoxicated. Gunther was emotional breaking out in sobbing fits. Gunther stated several times that her husband was going to kill her for this. Gunther repeatedly cried stating, "We just put my dog down." Gunther also attempted to stand up and move around the room on several occasions. I repeatedly had to remind her to sit down and not get up again.

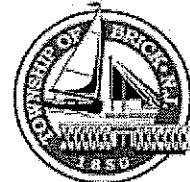
Gunther was able to provide two (2) satisfactory tests resulting in a BAC % of .19. The results were checked in the NCIC calculator and were found to be within normal sample tolerances. While administering the test I read the posted statement for providing breath samples to Gunther. The mouth piece was also changed between the tests.

After the test was administered Gunther stated

I informed Ptl. Carter of Gunther's statement.

On 12-10-2018 at approximately 0005 hours I (Patrolman Alexander #216) was on patrol traveling east on Route 70 just east of Brick Boulevard. Directly in front of me traveling east on Route 70 was Sergeant Thomas #164. I observed a vehicle, later identified as New Jersey Registration S39JLH, swerving in and out of its lane of travel, which was traveling directly in front of Sergeant Thomas. Sergeant Thomas conducted a motor vehicle stop on this vehicle shortly after I observed the violation (See his report for further details of the motor vehicle stop). Sergeant Thomas pulled the vehicle over directly in front of The Rainbow Diner (849 Route 70). I pulled behind Sergeant Thomas to back him up and assist.

While on the stop I observed Sergeant Thomas speaking with the driver, later identified as David Mayer. Sergeant Thomas questioned Mayer if he was drinking any alcoholic beverages and he stated he was not. Sergeant Thomas questioned Mayer a second time and he then stated he was drinking, but before. After speaking with Mayer Sergeant Thomas advised me that Mayer admitted drinking and he (Sergeant Thomas) would like me to administer Field Sobriety Tests on Mayer.

Sergeant Thomas asked Mayer to step out of the vehicle and take the tests, to which he complied. I then spoke with Mayer. While speaking with Mayer I observed his eyes to be bloodshot, watery and having drooping eyelids. I also observed an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath. I questioned Mayer if he was drinking alcoholic beverages and he stated he had two beers about four hours ago at a friend's house. I advised Mayer I would be conducting the tests, and once again he agreed.

A total of three tests were performed/attempted by Mayer on a well lit and level portion of a sidewalk, which was free from debris. During the tests Mayer had a difficult time understanding instructions and following commands. He also had a difficult time standing still and keeping his balance at times. Prior to giving him the tests I questioned Mayer if he was injured. Mayer stated he had football injuries, "maybe". I asked him if he could perform balance tests and he stated he could. See the Standardized Field Sobriety Checklist Form attached to this report for results of the tests. After the tests were completed I placed Mayer under arrest and transported him to Brick Police Headquarters to be processed, without incident. His vehicle was impounded for John's Law by Legacy Towing.

At headquarters I read Mayer his Miranda Rights and The NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement Form For Motor Vehicle Operators. Mayer stated he understood his rights and would provide samples of his breath. Before administering the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C to Mayer all electronics, cellular phones and portable radios were removed from the booking room, as to not interfere with the test. I also checked the inside of Mayer's mouth for any residual alcohol or foreign objects, which there was none. Mayer was observed in excess of twenty minutes prior to administering the test, at which no time did he belch or regurgitate. After performing the test Mayer had a reported breath test result of 0.08% BAC. The results were checked by dispatch utilizing the State of New Jersey Alcotest Calculator, but were not within acceptable tolerance. Mayer, again was observed in excess of twenty minutes, at which time he did not belch or regurgitate. A second test was administered to Mayer, having a reported breath test result of 0.07% BAC, which were found to be within acceptable tolerance.

After being processed Mayer received a summons for DWI (T-158396), Reckless Driving (T-158397) and Failure to Maintain Lane (T-158398). Mayer could not make contact with anyone to pick him up and sign The Potential Liability Warning, required by law. Mayer remained in a holding cell until he was sober enough to be released.

My body worn camera was worn during this incident (#VHC2-015176).

OfficerID: pthomas, Narrative

On 12/09/18 at 0005 hrs I was sitting in patrol vehicle 72 at the red light, located at the intersection of Rt 70 eastbound and Brick Blvd. At that same light was a Green Ford Taurus that was to my immediate left.

As the light turned green, I noticed the green Ford Taurus begin to accelerate in a high rate of speed eastbound on Rt 70, specifically in the far left lane. I begin to follow the green Ford Taurus when I observed that vehicle failed to maintain its lane of travel. As I continued to observe the green Ford Taurus, the said vehicle continued to drive on the actual lane markings of (2) far left lanes for approximately 200 yards. It should be noted the driver of the green Taurus never maintained his lane of travel.

After observing the above violations I initiated a motor vehicle stop on the green Ford Taurus (NJ-S39JLH). The said vehicle made an abrupt lane change across all 3 lanes and stopped on the right lane of travel of Rt 70 eastbound.

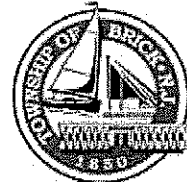
I approached the vehicle and immediately smelled the odor of alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. Due to the hazardous location of the stop, I requested the driver David Mayer to move his vehicle into the parking lot approximately 20 ft away. During the course of obtaining D. Mayer's driving credentials, Registration and Insurance it was determined that the driver David Mayer had been drinking alcoholic beverages prior to driving. As a result of my observations and the short conversation I had with David

it was determined that a sobriety test was necessary.

At this time Ptlm Alexander arrived on scene and administered the NJ Field Sobriety Test. See his report for further details.

On 12/08/2018, at approximately 2202 hours, I responded to the intersection of Rt.70/ Chambers Bridge Rd., in reference to an accident involving a Jeep Wrangler.

Upon my arrival, I observed the Jeep Wrangler bearing NJ # R45GMZ in question with it's hazard lights on at the corner of Rt. 70 and Chambers Bridge Rd. Behind the jeep was the second vehicle involved a 2008 black Ford Focus bearing NJ# Y29BRY which had heavy front end damage. (See Ptl. Person's #262 accident report in regards to the above mentioned vehicles involved in this case.)

As I exited my vehicle I spoke with the caller later identified as _____ advised he was sitting at the red light in his Jeep on Rt. 70 waiting to make a right turn onto Chambers Bridge when he was suddenly struck from behind by the black Ford Focus. After speaking with _____ I approached the black ford focus.

As I walked over the driver of the Focus, later identified as Linda Rudofsky was standing by the driver side door with her credentials in her hand. As I grabbed her information I immediately could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her breath. I asked Rudofsky what happened in regards to the accident. She replied back that she didn't see the Jeep stopped as she was approaching the intersection. As Rudofsky was speaking she slurred her speech, I also noticed her eyes were glassy and bloodshot. At that point, I asked Rudofsky where she was coming from and if she had anything to drink. Rudofsky replied back that she was coming from her friends house and had three glasses of wine when they were having dinner. At that point, I asked for additional units to assist me. Sgt. Turner #178 and Ptl. Person #262 arrived on scene to assist.

After Sgt. Turner and Ptl. Person Arrived on scene, I had Rudofsky walk over to a well lit area clear from debris in front of Sgt. Turner's patrol unit. As she walked, Rudofsky swayed side to side raising her arms from her sides. Once Rudofsky was at a flat surface clear from debris, I advised her that I would be conducting field sobriety tests. At that point, I asked her if she had any injuries. Rudofsky replied back that she did not, At which that point I advised her I would begin the testing.

The first test I advised Rudofsky that would be conducted, was the walk and turn test. I instructed Rudofsky to stand with her feet together and her hands at her side as I explained and demonstrated the test. I instructed her when to begin take nine heel-to-toe steps down a straight line and on the ninth step take a series of small steps turning around. Then walk nine steps back heel-to-toe counting each step out loud throughout the test. I instructed Rudofsky if she stopped at any point during the test, to just continue where she left off.

Rudofsky performed the test. As she performed the test, she raised her arms from her side multiple times for balance. On her ninth step as she was turning around she lost her balance and almost fell over. I asked her if was ok, and she replied back she was fine and continued to walk back. As she walked back nine steps, she walked off line not counting finally stopping on the 12th step.

The next test was the one legged stand test. I instructed Rudofsky once again to stand with her feet together and her hands to her side and to look and listen while I explained and demonstrated. I instructed her, when told to begin, she would raise a foot of her choice six inches off of the ground point the toe of the raised foot and count out loud, "one thousand one, one thousand two, keeping her hands to her side until told to stop.

Rudofsky performed the test. She was unable to keep her foot raised six inches off of the ground letting it touch the ground. She also kept raising her arms from her sides for balance. Finally at one point she put her foot down and stopped counting.

Based upon my observations and her admission of having alcoholic beverages, Rudofsky was placed under arrest for DWI 39:4-50. Joe's Service responded to the scene to impound the vehicle as per John's Law. Rudofsky was then transported to Headquarters (HQ).

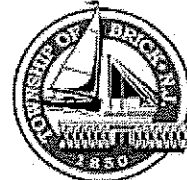
At HQ, Ptl. Mulcahey #130 responded to operate the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C. The 20 minute face to face observation period was initiated. Rudofsky was read her Miranda rights and exercised her rights not speaking without a lawyer present at this time. She was then read the NJ Attorney General's standard statement form agreeing to provide breath samples. The result of the breath samples showed Rudofsky to have a BAC of 0.16%.

Rudofsky was issued a motor vehicle summons for 39:4-50 DWI summons # T159717 , Reckless Driving 39:4-96 summons #T160205, and Careless Driving 39:4-97 summons #T160206.

A family member of Rudofsky, _____ was contacted and responded to (HQ) Wilson was advised of the potential liability warning and signed off on it. Rudofsky was then released into his care.

On 12/7/2018 at 1702 hours I Ptl. Finelli #273 responded to the intersection of Birch Bark Drive/ Sloping Hill Terrace in reference to a possible intoxicated driver. Deputy Chief Ling #137 had initiated a motor vehicle stop at said location and requested a patrol unit. (See Supplemental report)

As I arrived on scene, DC Ling advised me the driver appeared to be intoxicated. He advised the vehicle was all over the roadway prior to the stop. I approached the driver's side of the Silver Honda Accord bearing (NJ Reg U79FWN). The male subject, later identified as Daniel Meyer was sitting in the driver's seat on his cell phone. While speaking to Meyer, I immediately detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his vehicle. I observed his eyes to be bloodshot and watery.

Meyer was asked to exit his vehicle, and put down his cell phone prior to exiting his vehicle. He was unable to follow instructions and continued to exit with his cell phone in his hand. DC Ling then asked him again to put down the cell phone, in which he complied. I directed him onto the side of the road which was free of debris. I advised Meyer I was going to put him through Field Sobriety Testing, in which he stated, "I'm not going to do it, it's not even worth it." I asked him how much he had to drink tonight, he replied "a couple beers, like a quite a few beers, I'm not going to lie to you." He then advised he was supposed to get his license back in one and a half years. I asked if he had a license in which he replied, "no." He then asked, "you're not going to give me a break, you can't give me a ride?" While speaking with Meyer he then stated again he did not want to go through the tests, and he had "five or six beers at the Arrowhead." He then requested I make phone calls to other officers, and stated "if this goes through I'm fucked." I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath. His clothing was mussed, he was swaying and had his feet wide apart for balance. He was slurring his words and having trouble completing his sentences.

The first test I attempted to administer was the Walk and Turn test. Meyer was asked to stand in the starting position of this test, (right foot in front of left with the right heel touching the left toe, and his hands at his side), while I explained and demonstrated it. When he got into the starting position, he was swaying and raised his arms several times for balance. He was told not to begin this test until I specifically told him to do so. Prior to finishing the directions on how to perform said test, Meyer was unable to hold his balance in the starting position, and began the test prior to me advising him to do so. He advised he could no longer perform the test and told me he was done with it.

The next test administered was the One Leg Stand. Prior to explaining and demonstrating this test, I asked Meyer to stand in the starting position, (feet together and hands at his side.), and not to begin the test until I specifically told him to do so. Meyer was unable to maintain his balance, started prior to me advising, and refused to complete the remainder of the test. He then stated, "Are you going to fucking fuck me like that?"

Meyer was placed under arrest for DWI and placed into two (2) sets of handcuffs which were double locked. Meyer stated he just recently had shoulder surgery and was unable to put his hands behind his back with just one set of cuffs. Meyer was transported to Police Headquarters in the rear passenger seat of marked patrol vehicle #13. While walking to the patrol vehicle, he again kept requesting me to make phone calls. He advised he lost his licence for ten (10) years, and we (officers) "have some balls for arresting him." While in transport to headquarters, Meyer was very irate that we arrested him for DWI and kept repeating he was "fucked." Meyer asked me what he was arrested for, I stated DWI. He then stated "I'm getting my license back in a year, this is my fourth one."

While at headquarters, Meyers was placed into the holding room for observation. Ptl. Haugh #217 responded to headquarters and administered the Alcotest (see supplemental report for further information.) Meyer had a .22 BAC at the completion of said test.

Meyer was processed and released to _____ who took custody of him as per the potential liability warning.

On 12-07-2018 I was dispatched to Police Headquarters to operated the Alco Test. Upon my arrival I began my twenty minute observation period on Daniel Meyer. During this time I advised Meyer of his Miranda rights and he signed the form stating he understood his rights. After reading Meyer the standard statement form he stated he would provide breath samples. After exceeding

the twenty minute observation period I made sure all cell phones, radios and the body worn cameras were taken out of the room.

After providing the samples of his breath, the results came back at .22% BAC. The results were then ran through the New jersey Alcotest Calculator and were within acceptable tolerance.

OfficerID: joliveri, Narrative

On December 7, 2018 at 1701 hrs, while in plain clothes, I was operating my unmarked black Ford Explorer westbound on Birch Bark Drive. In the area of Lakeside Terrace I observed a silver Honda Accord bearing NJ registration U79FWN traveling in front of me at a slow rate of speed. As we approached the left hand bend in the roadway near Birch Ct, the vehicle almost crossed entirely into the oncoming lane as he negotiated the bend in the roadway. The vehicle then quickly accelerated until the operator approached the sharp blind curve in the area of Lake Riviera bridge where he once again slowed the vehicle down dramatically. As he was negotiating the sharp blind curve, he crossed over the double yellow line and his vehicle was once again almost entirely within the oncoming lane of travel. After negotiating the curve the operator once again accelerated quickly. At that time I activated my emergency lights and attempted a motor vehicle stop. The operator made a right turn from Birch Bark Drive onto Sloping Hill Terrace where the stop was conducted. While notifying dispatch of the stop, I also requested a back-up officer to respond to my location for a possible DUI driver.

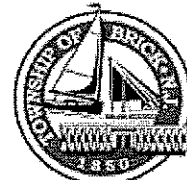
Upon stopping the vehicle, the operator now identified as Daniel Meyer, exited the vehicle and stood leaning against the open door for support. I advised Meyer to have a seat in the vehicle via my PA system. Meyer sat in the vehicle with the door open and his feet on the ground. At that time I approached the driver's side of the vehicle and advised Meyer to shut the door and turn off the car. While speaking to Meyer I observed his eyes to be bloodshot and watery and I detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from inside of the vehicle. I asked Meyer for his driver's license to which he replied that he did not have one do to it being suspended for previous DUI's. As I continued speaking to Meyer, I could smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. When asked if he had been drinking tonight, Meyer stated that he has been and he repeatedly stated he "fucked up". Meyer continually pleaded for me not to arrest him because he has had three previous DUI's. When asked how much he had to drink tonight Meyer stated that he had five or six beers. A short time later Officer Finelli #273 arrived on scene (see her report for details). Meyer was subsequently taken into custody for DUI without incident and escorted to the rear seat of Officer Finelli's patrol vehicle. Meyer was then transported by Officer Finelli to BTPDHQ for booking and processing while I remained on scene until Legacy Towing took custody of his vehicle.

OfficerID: Kdocherty, Narrative

On 12/05/2018 at 2336 hours I, Ptl. Docherty #275 was on stationary patrol in the parking lot of the Shell Gas Station located at 1 Lanes Mill Road. During this time, I observed a silver Nissan Altima bearing temporary NJ registration R831195 parked in the WAWA convenience store parking lot located at 6 Lanes Mill Road. I further observed that the vehicles front windows were illegally glazed/tinted, which is in violation of N.J.S. 39:3-75. A full inquiry search on the vehicle's registration, revealed that the vehicle was unregistered. Dispatch further advised that the vehicles NJ temporary license plate was fictitious and not listed in the New Jersey Department of Motor vehicle database.

Minutes later, I observed an adult black male exit the front entrance of the WAWA convenience store. He then entered the driver side door of the suspect vehicle and began exiting the parking lot. I followed the vehicle onto Herborn Avenue and observed the driver accelerate to a speed of approximately 80 mph, as I paced his speed in my patrol vehicle. I activated my emergency overhead lights and sirens to conduct a motor vehicle stop in the area of Herborn Ave. / Burnt Tavern Road. The vehicle then continued to accelerate at a higher speed as I traveled behind with my lights and sirens activated. The vehicle then continued traveling at a high rate of speed for approximately 200 yards, until coming to a complete stop in the area of Herborn Ave. / South Loop Road. Prior to coming to a complete stop I observed the driver throw a burning object from the vehicles front window, which was later determined to be a burnt cigarette.

I exited my patrol vehicle and made a driver side approach. I gave loud verbal commands for the driver to place both of his hands outside the front window of the vehicle to which he complied. There I made contact with an adult black male driver who was the lone occupant of the vehicle. While speaking with the suspect I detected the odor of burnt and raw marijuana emanating from inside the vehicle's interior. I further observed that his face was flushed and his eyes were bloodshot and watery. Sgt. Dierking #204 and Ptl. Bennett #279 arrived on location at this time to assist. The suspect was then advised to exit his vehicle and walk to the rear of his vehicle. Upon exiting the vehicle I continued to detect the odor of raw and burnt marijuana emanating from the breath and clothing of the suspect. There I advised him to keep his hands on the trunk of the vehicle to which he refused by removing his hands from the trunk numerous times. I asked him if he had any identification on his person to which he related its in my back pocket. I then removed his wallet from his back pocket and he was identified as Aearon Johnson. There I read and explained Johnson his Miranda rights verbatim from a card that I keep in my uniform shirt pocket to which he stated "But I have a lawyer, no".

During this time, I requested dispatch check the vehicles vin number lost or stolen. Dispatch later advised that the vehicle was not listed in any motor vehicle database throughout the United States. While at the rear of the vehicle Johnson admitted to throwing a cigarette out the front window of the vehicle. I then advised Johnson I was going to conduct a search of his vehicle and his person, which revealed the following evidence:

1. Two (2) partially burnt suspect marijuana cigars, containing green vegetation. The cigars were located in an ash tray in the center console of the vehicle.
2. Loose green vegetation, suspect marijuana scattered throughout the vehicle.
3. One (1) open "Arnold Palmer Spiked" alcoholic beverage can. The open alcoholic beverage can was located in a center console cup holder.
4. Ptl. Bennett conducted a search of Johnson's person, which revealed negative results.

I took possession of all recovered evidence and secured it inside a department issued evidence bag. During the time of the search, Johnson had been monitored by Sgt. Dierking. Sgt. Dierking further advised that he had detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the breath of Johnson. As a result, I requested Ptl. Bennett conduct the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test. Ptl. Bennett performed the test on Johnson. Refer to Ptl. Bennett's supplementary case report for further information (same case number).

Upon completion, I advised Johnson I was going to test him on a series of field sobriety tests. The below listed tests were explained and demonstrated by me and were performed on a flat level surface, in a well-lit area free of debris. Prior to Johnson performing the tests, I asked him if he had any type of injuries or disabilities that would affect him from performing any type of physical tests and he related that he had a prior leg injury, which had occurred three years prior. I asked Johnson what his highest level of education was and if he understood the English language and its alphabet. Johnson stated his highest level of education was having a diploma and that he understood the English language and its alphabet.

Walk and Turn: Johnson was instructed to stand with his hands at his sides and place his right foot in front of his left foot and stand in a heel to toe fashion, prior to him being given any further directions. Johnson was instructed to take nine steps heel to toe counting aloud for each step, while keeping his hands at his sides. After his ninth step, he was instructed to plant his front foot and take a small series of

steps to turn around in the other direction and take another nine steps heel to toe.

Johnson did not follow my instructions as he placed his left foot in front of his right foot. Johnson was unable to stand with his hands at his sides in a heel to toe fashion while I explained the instructions to the test. Johnson fell out of position a total of two times during my instructions. Johnson was also unable to keep both of his hands at his sides as he continuously raised them out past his sides to support his balance. Johnson was unable to complete his first set of steps and second set of steps as instructed. His feet were not in a straight heel to toe line as he took each of his steps. During Johnson's first set of steps he took a total of ten steps. Johnson stepped off the line at steps number one (1), five (5) and eight (8) during his first set of steps. Johnson continuously raised his arms out past his sides to support/maintain his balance during the test. Johnson's upper body swayed to support his balance throughout the test. Upon completion, I asked Johnson if he had injured himself during the test and he stated, "No".

One legged stand: Johnson was instructed to place his feet together and keep his arms by his sides. He was to raise his right leg six inches off of the ground in front of him without raising his arms for balance. Once in position, he was to count to thirty out loud by one thousands.

Johnson started the test by lifting his right foot off of the ground. Johnson swayed back and forth and raised his arms out past his sides during the test. Johnson dropped his right foot onto the ground as he reached the count of ten (10). Johnson then attempted to complete the test while elevating his left foot off of the ground. During the second attempt, Johnson dropped his left foot onto the ground at the count of twelve (12). Johnson was also unable to keep both of his hands at his sides as he continuously raised them out past his sides to support his balance during the entirety of the test. Johnson's entire body also swayed back and forth as he attempted to maintain his balance. Johnson was unable to complete the test as instructed.

After totaling my observations, it was in my opinion that Johnson was operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and was subsequently placed under arrest for DWI and possession of suspect marijuana. He was handcuffed utilizing a double locking mechanism and searched. Johnson was seat belted in the rear of patrol car #09 and transported to police headquarters. Sgt. Dierking remained on scene for Lepore's Towing to arrive and impound Johnson's vehicle as per Johns Law, having fictitious plates and not being registered.

At headquarters, Johnson was processed by S.O Squires #134, as per departmental policy. Johnson's personal property was logged and placed into evidence filing cabinet 2. All evidence recovered was placed into property locker #09 located in the departmental intake room. The recovered suspect marijuana was properly sealed and labeled to be tested for a controlled dangerous substance. Johnson was Mirandized by Ptl. Bennett. Johnson was read implied consent and when asked if he would provide samples of his breath to determine his content of alcohol in his blood he stated "no". Johnson refused to provide samples of his breath to determine the content of alcohol in his blood. Refer to Ptl. Bennett's supplementary case report for further information (same case number).

Johnson's girlfriend _____ then arrived at headquarters in order to take responsibility of Johnson. _____ was explained the Potential Liability Form. _____ en signed off on the form stating she understood the Potential Liability Form and took custody of Johnson. He was then released from police custody and advised of his future court date.

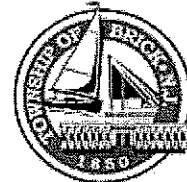
On 12/06/2018 I assisted Ptl. Docherty #275 on a motor vehicle stop. During the course of the stop, Ptl. Docherty requested that I conduct the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test on the driver, Aearon Johnson. Prior to the test, I checked Johnson's eyes and confirmed that both pupils were the same size and there was no resting nystagmus. I then conducted the test.

While conducting the test, I observed a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes. I observed distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes. I observed the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. I did not observe any vertical nystagmus.

Johnson was subsequently arrested on numerous offenses by Ptl. Docherty. I followed Ptl. Docherty and Johnson back to police headquarters to act as Alcotest operator. While conducting the twenty minute observation period, I read Johnson the NJ Attorney General's Standard Statement (Implied Consent) Form, at which time Johnson stated he would not provide breath samples. disorderly person.

On our arrival we met with the complainant.

She stated that her son, Kyle Sherwood is outside talking to himself and acting disoriented. He is a drug addict that takes methadone. He has not eaten in three days and is complaining about his health. She also believes he has taken Crystal Meth because he has not slept in a few days and is separating stones and leaves in the yard according to color and size.

We spoke to Kyle in the front yard and he was walking in circles and talking out loud. He appeared very dirty and was sweating. Kyle got very angry with his mother for calling the police on him. I advised him that his family was concerned for his health.

but he wants to be left alone so he can go see his girlfriend in Jackson.

I drove him because I agreed to drive him, but I would need to check him prior to letting him sit in my back seat for my safety. Kyle repeatedly put his hands in his pockets and I advised him to stop and keep his hands where I can see them. Kyle put his hands back in his pocket and pulled out a hypodermic needle from his right front pocket. He stated "I wanted to show you this before you find it". I advised him to drop it on the ground and he did. Then he went back into his pockets and pulled out a small zip lock bag with green vegetative matter suspected to be Marijuana and handed it to me. I placed Kyle under arrest and handcuffed him (double locked). Prior to placing him into the backseat of my patrol vehicle I checked all of his pockets and patted him down.

I found a clear glass smoking pipe filled with more green vegetative matter (suspected Marijuana) in his left side pants pocket along with an unmarked pill bottle containing six oval pills labeled b974 on one side and 30 on the other (later identified as Amphetamine). Kyle also had three other pill bottles and a bottle of liquid Methadone that were prescribed to him.

I transported Kyle to BTPD Headquarters without incident. He was processed and charged with the following:

- 2C:35-10a(4), possession of Marijuana
- 2C:35-10a(1), possession of medication without a prescription
- 2C:36-6a, possession of a hypodermic needle.

Kyle was transported to the Ocean County Jail after I contacted DEU Detective Alvarado # 221.

The Marijuana, six pills in unmarked bottle and the hypodermic needle were placed into Property according to BTPD evidence procedures.

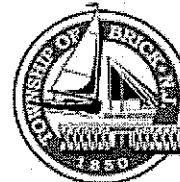

On December 21, 2018 at approximately 2030 hours, Sgt. Olsen #185, Ptl. Talty #250, and I (Ptl. Puccio #259) were assigned to the Selective Enforcement Team (SET) in a plain clothes capacity. We were conducting an area check of the Walmart Store located at 1872 Route 88. This parking lot is known to this unit and department as a high crime area which involves CDS activity and criminal activity.

While in the lot, I observed a blue Kia four door bearing New Jersey registration F39KDT travel through the parking lot and park in row four near the Route 70 entrance. I observed a male passenger, who was later identified as Anthony Bruno, exit the vehicle and enter the Route 70 entrance of the store. Less than five minutes later, the driver of the Kia, who was later identified as Stuart Schmitt, quickly put his vehicle in reverse and almost struck a pedestrian pushing a shopping cart. The Kia traveled to the front of the store, Bruno jumped into the passenger's seat and the vehicle then failed stop at the stop sign leading to Route 70. I advised Sgt. Olsen and Ptl. 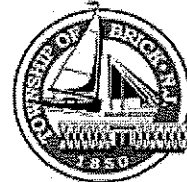

On December 13, 2018 at approximately 1900 hours, Sgt. Olsen #185, Ptl. Talty #250 and I (Ptl. Puccio #259) were assigned to the Selective Enforcement Team (SET) in a plain clothes capacity. We conducted an area check of the Walmart Store located at 1872 Route 88. This parking lot is known to this unit and department as a high crime area which includes CDS and criminal activity.

I observed a silver Nissan Altima bearing temporary New Jersey registration R935813 parked in the front of the Route 70 side entrance/exit of Walmart. This vehicle stopped in the roadway and obstructed other vehicles from passing. I observed a male standing outside of the Nissan and it appeared he was speaking with an unrelated vehicle. I identified this subject to be Isaiah Olden, who is a known offender within this department. Ptl. Talty checked Olden's license through his computer and it alerted him Olden's license was suspended. This vehicle also had tinted windows on the front. Olden entered the driver's seat of the vehicle and drove the vehicle towards Route 70. I requested a marked vehicle to the area to conduct a motor vehicle stop due to the motor vehicle violations.

Olden was issued the following traffic summonses:

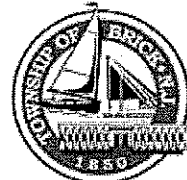

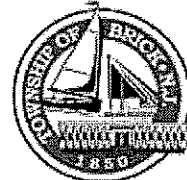

On 12/11/2018 at approximately 1002, I, Ptl. Caulfield #235 initiated a motor vehicle stop on a 2012 Nissan Altima, bearing NJ registration A65KAF, in the area of Route 88/Folsom Drive in reference to a moving violation (Failure to maintain lane).

Upon stopping the vehicle, I approached the front passenger side window, advised the driver as to why I had stopped his vehicle, and requested that the driver/arrestee, identified as Christopher S. Tull, to exhibit his driving credentials. As Tull was retrieving his documents, I detected a strong odor of raw marijuana emanating from the cabin of the vehicle. In addition, I observed, in plain view, loose vegetation, indicative of marijuana, scattered throughout the front passenger compartment. Tull handed me the vehicle's insurance, registration card, and a NY state benefits identification card with his name and date of birth depicted on it.

At that time, I requested another patrol unit to respond to my location to investigate the loose marijuana observed in plain view further. A check of Tull via NJ MVC revealed that his NJ driver's license was currently suspended/revoked. In addition, NJ MVC inquiry of Tull's NJ driver's license revealed that he had an active ATS arrest warrant, E17-1866, issued by Keansburg PD, NJ with bail set at \$1,000.00 no 10% option by the Hon. Michael Pugliese on 12/07/2018. Ptl. Rotondo #252 arrived on scene moments later for assistance.

After Ptl. Rotondo's arrival on scene, I approached the front driver's side window and advised Tull to exit the vehicle. As Tull was exiting the vehicle, I observed a small cellophane baggie containing a small quantity of raw marijuana lying near the center console inside the car. Once Tull exited the vehicle, he was taken into custody (Handcuffs double locked) without incident and placed in the rear of patrol car #33. Once Tull was placed in the rear of my patrol car, I went and retrieved the aforementioned cellophane baggie from inside the vehicle. A closer examination of the cellophane baggie did in fact reveal raw vegetation indicative of marijuana. A search of the interior passenger compartment yielded negative results for any further items of evidentiary value. The vehicle was then parked and left secured in a nearby shopping plaza parking lot. The keys were later turned over to the registered owner of the vehicle at police headquarters.

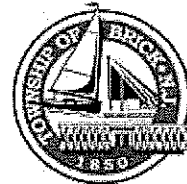
Tull was then transported by me in patrol car #33 to police headquarters without incident. Once at police headquarters, Tull was taken into cell block #1 where he was searched again. A check of Tull's jeans in the cell block revealed a small quantity of raw marijuana inside the right front pants pocket. The loose marijuana recovered from his jeans, as well as, the cellophane baggie containing raw marijuana were logged into property as per policy and placed in evidence locker #8.

Tull was processed, as per policy, and charged with 2C:35-10a(4) and 2C:36-2. I then contacted Donna Mora, Brick Twp. DCA, who authorized said charge be placed on a criminal warrant, 1506-W-2018-1062. Tull was also issued motor vehicle summonses for 39:3-40 (1506-E18-4514), 39:3-10B (1506-E18-4515), 39:4-88B (1506-E18-4516), 39:3-29A (1506-E18-4517), and 39:4-49.1 (1506-E18-4518). Tull was then transported to the Ocean County Jail in Toms River, NJ by Ptl. Demaio #264 and I in patrol car #33 without incident. Det. Mauro #207, Brick PD DEU, was advised of Tull's arrest.

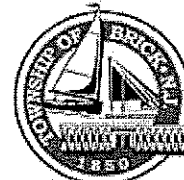

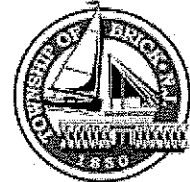

On 12/05/2018 at approximately 0214 hours, I observed a vehicle with its lights on near a closed business, specifically Verizon, located at 481 Route 70. Due to the business. Dispatch was advised of the suspect vehicle, a 2002 Toyota Prius bearing NJREG#R73KMN.

It was at this time Ptl. Catalina #263 arrived on scene as a back officer.

Upon the arrival of Ptl. Catalina, I approached the vehicle on the driver side and observed two male occupants, later identified as Michael Ramirez, the driver, and the passenger Padro Julio. While standing at the driver side window, I immediately detected the odor of both raw and burnt marijuana. Due to the odor, I requested Mr. Ramirez exit the vehicle and escorted him to the rear of it to investigate the odor that was detected. Mr. Ramirez was asked about the odor and advised that he had just recently ingested marijuana. I asked him if he still had marijuana in his possession to which he advised he did and it was either located in the console of his vehicle or on his person. Mr. Ramirez was advised that due to the odor, a search of the vehicle would be conducted. It was at this time I requested the passenger of the vehicle exit and he was then escorted to the rear of the vehicle. Ptl Catalina remained with both suspects, as well as Sgt. Bartolucci #183 and Ptl. Mancini #282 who arrived on scene.

A search of the vehicle lead to locating the following:

- In the dashboard console was one small plastic bag containing suspected marijuana as well as one suspected marijuana cigarette commonly referred to as a blunt.
- In the center console was one package of Dutch Master Cigarillos, commonly used to roll marijuana into the form of marijuana cigarette or blunt.

A search of each of the suspects was due to the odor of burnt marijuana emanating from thier persons, the results were negative for additional evidence.

It was at this time I approached both of the suspects and they were asked who had ingested marijuana. Mr. Ramirez advised that Mr. Julio does not smoke marijuana and that only he did. Due to Mr. Ramirez admission as well as evidence located in the vehicle, Mr. Ramirez was placed under arrest, handcuffed behind his back, double-locked, and transported to Brick Township Police headquarters. While at headquarters Mr. Ramirez was finger printed and photographed per department policy. He was later charged on summons, summons#(1506-S-2018-001040) with possession of marijuana under 50 grams 2C:35-10a(4), possession of drug paraphernalia 2C:36-2. In addition, Mr. Ramirez received a motor vehicle summons for possession of a controlled dangerous substance in a motor vehicle 39:4-491.1 on summons#1506-T-160894 and released.

It should be noted I contacted Detective Sgt. Petrola #201 in reference to Mr. Ramirez's arrest and he chose not to respond at this time.

Evidence of the incident was later logged into evidence and placed into property.

On 12/22/2018 at 1753 hours Ptl. Albanese #257, Ptl. Person #262, and I (Ptl. Gordon #297) responded to 668 Rt. 70 (Shoprite) for a report of theft. Upon arrival, we met with Loss Prevention Officer [redacted] advised us that [redacted] a Shoprite cashier, stole money from a customer.

[redacted] explained a customer checked out at the cash register and was advised by [redacted] that the total for all her items purchased was \$166.09. [redacted] explained the customer handed [redacted] \$100 bill and a debit card. [redacted] stated the customer advised [redacted] she wished to pay the remainder of the bill (\$66.09) on the debit card. [redacted] charged the debit card for the full amount (\$166.09) and handed the \$100 bill to a supervisor to confirm the bill was real. After a supervisor returned the \$100 bill to [redacted] placed the \$100 bill into the bottom of the till at 1533 hours. The customer received the receipt, did not realize they were overcharged, and left the store.

[redacted] stated at 1543 hours, the cash register opened during another transaction. [redacted] retrieved the \$100 bill from the bottom of the till and placed it into his pocket. [redacted] stated the customer, later called the store and advised him she had been overcharged. [redacted] referred to video surveillance and observed [redacted] place the \$100 bill into his pocket. [redacted] advised [redacted] admitted to taking the money, and advised he had done this numerous times in the past and estimated he had stolen approximately \$500 in total. [redacted] stated he was unable to retrieve the stolen \$100 bill as [redacted] already gave it to a friend so it can be used. Ptl. Person [redacted] observed the video surveillance and [redacted] provided us with a DVD of the incident.

I met with [redacted] in the loss prevention office of Shoprite. I asked [redacted] why he thought the police were speaking to him. [redacted] said that he stole one hundred dollars. At this time [redacted] was placed in handcuffs and searched incident to arrest with negative results. [redacted] grandmother [redacted] was contacted immediately at the time of arrest by Ptl. Albanese via [redacted] cell phone and was advised to meet us at headquarters. I placed [redacted] into the rear of marked patrol vehicle #31 and transported him to the Brick Township Police Department for processing without incident. [redacted] was processed without incident and released to his father [redacted], who signed a Brick Township Police Department Juvenile Release Form. [redacted] advised he did not wish for his son to be questioned in reference to the other theft incidents.

[redacted] was charged with 2C:21-6(h) (Fraudulent use of credit card) and 2C:20-3a (Theft of movable property) on a juvenile complaint.

The customer, identified as [redacted] was contacted and advised of the incident. [redacted] told me that Shoprite contacted her and refunded the money back onto her card [redacted] was provided with the case number and advised of complaint procedures.

I placed the DVD into the Brick Township Police Property Room as evidence.
